

US trade deal will destroy India's textile industry, says Rahul

New Delhi, February 14

CONTINUING HIS offensive against the government over the India-US trade agreement, LoP Rahul Gandhi on Saturday said that the deal signed by PM Narendra Modi will "destroy and finish" the textile industry.

In a video statement, Gandhi said that a "visionary government" working for national interest would have negotiated a deal that protects and ensures the prosperity of both cotton farmers and textile exporters. "But exactly the opposite has happened. Narendra 'surrender' Modi and his ministers have made an agreement that is likely to inflict deep damage on both sectors," he said.

Gandhi added that 5 crore families will be hit. "The US trade deal signed by Narendra Modi ji will destroy and finish the sector. The entire country knows this, and so does Narendra Modi. I explained in Par-

liament that Bangladesh got a free pass—zero per cent tax and India got 18% tax. The Bangladesh textile industry will finish off the Indian textile industry."

Gandhi said that when he raised the issue in Parliament, the reply from a minister was India can avail the same benefit if we import cotton from the US.

"If we import American cotton, our own farmers will be ruined. If we don't import it, our textile industry will lag behind and get destroyed," he added.

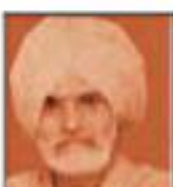

Urban Challenge Fund for cities gets Cabinet approval

A YEAR after it was announced in the Union Budget 2025-26, the Union Cabinet has approved the Rs 1 lakh crore Urban Challenge Fund that will provide 25% of the cost of projects for which at least 50% of the cost has to be raised from the market.

Announcing the Cabinet's decision on Friday, I&B Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Saturday that a "wide range of cities" would be covered by the fund. The investment is envisaged over five years.

The fund will provide Rs 1 lakh crore of Central assistance to projects worth Rs 4 lakh crore in total, with the remaining amount coming from the market and the local bodies/state government's own sources. Cities will have to raise at least 50% of the project cost from the market, including through municipal bonds, bank loans and public-private partnerships.

"The Urban Challenge Fund will leverage market finance, private participation and citizen-centric reforms for delivery of high-quality urban infrastructure. The fund aims to build resilient, productive, inclusive and climate-responsive cities, positioning those as the key driver of the country's next phase of economic growth," a government statement said.

It added that the fund will be operational from this financial year, that is 2025-26 until 2030-31, and can be extended up to 2033-34.

The projects to be funded will be identified by a challenge-based framework, with three kinds of proposals considered (cities as growth hubs,

Resolution adopted hailing shifting of PMO to Seva Teerth

New Delhi: The Union Cabinet, which met under the chairmanship of PM Narendra Modi, has adopted a resolution on shifting of the PMO to Seva Teerth and key ministries to 'Kartavya Bhavans', stating that for a developed future, a modern, technological and environmentally friendly office was needed, moving away from the colonial-era North and South Blocks "which were constructed to keep India in chains".

I&B Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Saturday the Cabinet meeting on Friday (February 13) was the last one at the South Block. The resolution said, "From here, courageous and sensitive decisions of social justice" like abrogating Article 370 and law on triple talaq were taken. "Decisions of surgical strike, air strike and Operation Sindoor were also taken, through which India gave a clear message of its firm and confident security policy to the world," it said.

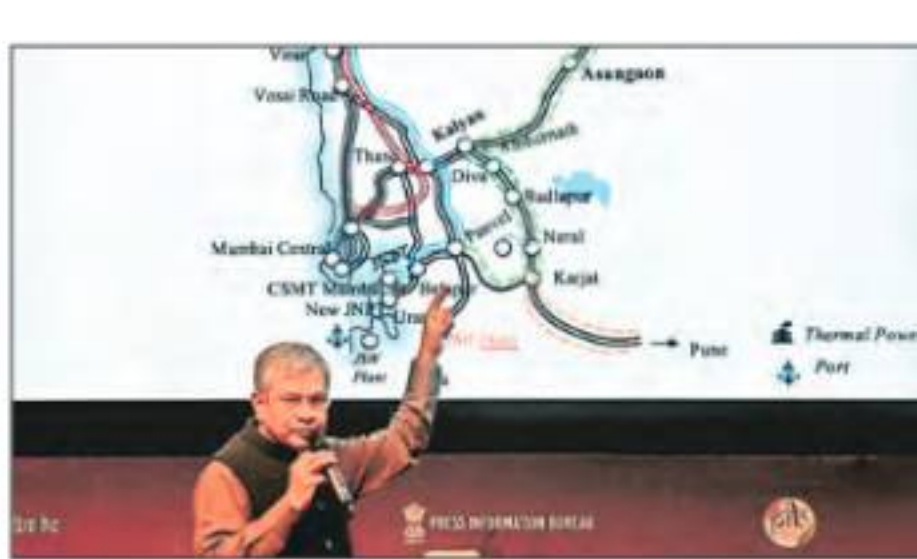

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creative redevelopment of cities and water and sanitation). Among the projects to be covered are urban mobility, retrofitting of legacy infrastructure and upgradation of water supply and sewerage networks.

"There will be a strong thrust on reforms across urban governance, market and financial systems, operational efficiency, and urban planning. Private sector participation will be encouraged through structured risk-sharing frameworks and benchmarking of service delivery standards," it said.

The government will provide the guarantees for cities in the north-east/hilly states and those with populations below 1 lakh. A credit repayment guarantee scheme of Rs 5,000 crore for this has been approved, which will give Central guarantee of up to Rs 7 crore or 70% of the loan amount (whichever is lower) for first-time borrowers.

Greenlight to first road-cum-rail tunnel under Brahmaputra

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has approved the construction of India's first underwater road-cum-rail tunnel under Brahmaputra river between Gohpur on NH-15 and Numaligarh on NH-715 in Assam.

The Cabinet on Friday also approved three Railways multi-tracking projects at a cost of Rs 18,509 crore and three highway projects at Rs 11.079 crore.

The 34-km four lane project, which includes the 15.8-km of twin tube tunnel, will be developed at a cost of Rs 18.662 crore in Engineering procurement Construction (EPC) mode, with Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) officials saying the tunnel project will be a milestone for developing Northeast as a gateway for 'Act East Policy'.

The project will cut down the distance between Gohpur and Numaligarh from 240 km to 34 km, and whittle down travel time from six hours to just 20 minutes.

"Currently, the connectivity between Numaligarh on NH-715 and Gohpur on NH-15 is 240 km from the existing Kaliabhabhara road bridge near Silghat on NH-52 which takes 6 hours passing through Numaligarh, Kaziranga National park and Biswanath town. To address these challenges, the project is proposed to be developed as 4-Lane access-controlled Greenfield connectivity from Gohpur on NH-15 to Numaligarh with road-cum-rail tunnel below the Brahmaputra river. This would be the first underwater road-cum-rail tunnel in India and second in the world," said the MoRTH in an official release on Saturday.

Apart from two NHs, the project alignment integrates with two railway lines Rangia-Mukongselek Railway Section under Northeast frontier Railway (NFR) on Gohpur Side and Furkating-Mariani loop line section under Tinsukia Division of NFR on Numaligarh side.

The project will improve connectivity to Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland and other Northeast states.

The Cabinet also approved the widening of NH-167 from Gudebellur to Mahabubnagar on the Hyderabad-Panaji economic corridor to four-lane standard in Telangana. The total cost of the 80-km project is Rs 3,175 crore.

The upgradation of the Ghoti-Trimbak (Mokhada)-Jawhar-Manor-Palghar section of NH-160A in Maharashtra and construction of 4-lane sections of Dhamasiya-Bitarda/Movi (47.46 km) and Nasarpore-Malotha (60.21 km) in Gujarat are the other two highway projects approved by the Cabinet.

Peon caught accepting bribe at Mantralaya: FDA official likely to be summoned by ACB

AN OFFICIAL linked to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is likely to be summoned by the Maharashtra Anti Corruption Bureau (ACB) in connection with the arrest of a peon from the department for allegedly accepting a Rs 35,000 bribe at Mantralaya — the seat of the state administration that has offices of the CM and other ministers — on Thursday evening.

Sources said it was after questioning peon Rajendra Dherange (40) that the name of a person related to an important official in the FDA came to the fore. So far, the person has not been named as an accused.

As per the ACB, Dherange allegedly demanded Rs 50,000 from a Mumbai-based medical storeowner to restore a suspended licence. After negotiations, the amount was allegedly reduced to Rs 35,000.

The ACB laid a trap on the second floor of Mantralaya where FDA Minister Narhari Zirwal's office is located and caught Dherange red-handed while accepting the money.

The official said the last time an ACB trap was laid in Mantralaya was nearly 10 years ago.

A team of five ACB officials made three trips to the Mantralaya to set the trap for the FDA peon after receiving a complaint. They entered the office on visitor's pass.

Meanwhile, sources said searches were carried out at an outhouse in the Haffkine institute in the city where Dherange resided with another person.

"His family is based in Nashik and a search was carried out at his Nashik residence as well but nothing substantial was found," the source said. Dherange has been remanded in ACB custody till Monday.

Five officials made three trips to Mantralaya earlier this week to set the trap. "Five persons made three trips to Mantralaya during the week after we got a complaint on Monday and verified it to be a bribe demand. On all three occasions, our staff took a visitor's pass through the Digi Praveesh app and claimed to have some work at Mantralaya," an official said.
