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10L families set to get houses by year-end

SPEAKING on budgetary allocation for housing in the Assembly on Friday, Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu laid out an ambitious growth vision for Andhra Pradesh. "The coalition government is working to make every poor family's dream of owning a home a reality. Already, over three lakh houses have been handed over to beneficiaries, and by the end of this year, more than 10 lakh families are expected to celebrate housewarming ceremonies," he said.

Naidu urged homeless families to apply for housing benefit, while warning that those indulged in irregularities during the previous regime would face strict legal action. He emphasised that the government's long-term goal is to ensure that by 2029, every poor family will have both a home and a free plot of land. Families without house sites will get two cents in urban areas and three cents in rural areas.

The government has set clear milestones on housing front. Three lakh housewarmings by Ugadi, 2.26 lakh by June, and 2.10 lakh by September. Both the Centre and the State government share the responsibility of providing housing for all, and corrective measures are being taken to address past mismanagement," he explained. **P4**

Kejri, others let off in excise scam

Special judge Jitendra Singh raps CBI for procedural lapses, refuses to put accused on trial

A Delhi court on Friday discharged former chief minister Arvind Kejriwal and 22 others, including deputy CM Manish Sisodia and ex-BRS leader K Kavitha in the alleged excise scam, finding it unworthy of trial as it junked the CBI chargesheet.

Hours later, the CBI moved the Delhi High Court challenging the trial court order.

Trial court special judge Jitendra Singh also pulled up the CBI for procedural lapses, violation of constitutional principles and relying on hearsay evidence. He also found the 'South Group' label for the excise policy accused particularly inappropriate, adding he will recommend a departmental inquiry against the investigating officer of the case.

'Govt plans to clear ₹2,500 cr Aarogyasri dues under OTS'

THE State government is contemplating clearing the ₹2,500 crore dues of the YSR Aarogyasri Scheme (Now, NTR Vaidya Seva) left pending to network hospitals by the previous regime, under the One Time Settlement (OTS) scheme.

In an exclusive interview with *TNIE* to mark the launch of AP Dialogues, Minister for Health, Family Welfare and Medical Education Y Satya Kumar Yadav said the Health and the Finance departments are in consultation with the managements of network hospitals and banks to clear the pending dues under the OTS, exuding confidence that the issue will be resolved soon.

Though the NDA government is making prompt payment to network hospitals for treating patients under the NTR Vaidya Seva Scheme now, dues to the tune of ₹2,500 crore under the YSR Aarogyasri left by the previous regime, are still pending. The network hospitals had threatened to stall the NTR Vaidya Seva services if the YSR Aarogyasri dues were not cleared at the earliest. Hence, the government has come up with the OTS option to clear the dues, he said.

"In fact, the NDA government has cleared the bills to the maximum extent under the NTR Vaidya Seva. As we inherited ₹2,500 crore Aarogyasri dues, we are now focusing on clearing them," he said.

The coalition government has spent ₹7,500 crore on the implementation of NTR Vaidya Seva in less than two years, compared to ₹11,500 crore expended by the previous regime on the YSR Aarogyasri in five years. Quality medical treatment worth ₹350 crore is being extended to patients under the Vaidya Seva per month on an average," he said.

'EXTRA-MARITAL AFFAIR'

Just before polls, Vijay's wife calls it quits

SANKGEETHA Vijay, wife of actor-politician and Tamizhaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) leader Vijay Chandra Sekar, has filed a divorce petition before the Chengalpattu court alleging cruelty and adultery. The family court has summoned Vijay to appear before it on April 20.

Sankgeetha accused her husband of having an extra-marital relationship with an actress and that he has subjected her to "persistent mental cruelty, neglect and desertion".

If required, she said she would implead the actress as second respondent. She urged the court to hold in-camera proceedings to protect the privacy and dignity of the parties and their children.

On December 3 last, Sankgeetha filed the petition before the Principal District Judge Court, Chengalpattu, under provisions of the Special Marriage Act, 1954.

The petition was transferred to the family court on February 24. After

'Withdrew emotionally, distanced himself'

In her petition, Sankgeetha alleged that Vijay "gradually withdrew emotionally, distanced himself from conjugal life and excluded her from his social and professional engagements"

the first hearing in the case on Thursday, the family court adjourned the matter to April 20 and directed Vijay to appear in person.

In her petition, Sankgeetha said the marriage was first registered in the

UK on July 10, 1998, and later solemnised according to Hindu rites in Chennai on August 25, 1999. The petition stated that the marriage was initially cordial and that she devoted herself to family life and raising their children while supporting Vijay's professional commitments.

However, she alleged that in April 2021 she discovered that Vijay was involved in an adulterous relationship with an actress, which caused "deep emotional pain and mental suffering". Despite assurances that the relationship would end, she claimed their association continued. Sankgeetha also contended that attempts to resolve the dispute amicably through legal notices and personal discussions between 2021 and 2025 failed. She alleged that financial restrictions were imposed on her and that the marital relationship had irretrievably broken down.

Seeking dissolution of marriage, she has requested permanent alimony, residence at matrimonial home or an equivalent accommodation.

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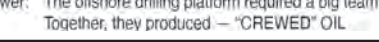
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3 devotees from K'taka die in Nandyal road mishap

Space City Cluster on fast-track in Tirupati

We are developing Block 1 & 2 together to create integrated ecosystem rather than isolated pockets, says Collector

TIRUPATI district has fast-tracked the proposed Space City Industrial Cluster at Routh Suramala near temple town Srikalahasti, positioning it as a flagship project in AP's industrial expansion.

The district administration has placed the project on top priority, following the vision of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, to transform the region into an industrial hub focused on the space and advanced manufacturing sectors.

The proposed cluster lies about 60 kilometres from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre at Sriharikota, offering logistical advantages for space manufacturing, component supply and testing units. Officials expect the proximity to India's key launch centre to attract space-

tech firms seeking seamless integration between manufacturing and launch operations.

The project will focus on spacecraft and rocket manufacturing, component assembly, electronics and advanced testing facilities. Officials have prioritised low-risk, high-value manufacturing such as precision components and electronics assembly over traditional heavy industries.

The district administration, through the Andhra Pradesh Industrial Infrastructure Corporation (APIIC), has proposed integrated development of Block 1 and Block 2 to create a seamless industrial ecosystem. Authorities have expanded the activation area from an initial 600 acres to 4,800 acres in Phase A, with a long-term concept plan covering nearly 15,000 acres. Officials have planned plot sizes in parcels of 2, 3 and



5 acres to promote multi-sectored industrial structures.

Authorities have proposed inviting the Indian National Space Promotion and Authorization Centre (IN-SPACe) and allocating about five acres within the cluster to boost regulatory collaboration.

Tirupati District Collector S Venkateswar said, "We are de-

veloping Block 1 and Block 2 together to create an integrated space ecosystem rather than isolated industrial pockets. Once the master plans are finalised, we will conduct stakeholder consultations with industrialists, technocrats and space sector experts. The government, along with APIIC, will provide external linkages such as roads, water supply, power infrastructure and trunk utilities as per the master plan. The North Cluster will be reserved for future expansion as growth picks up."

The master plan incorporates expert feedback, including inputs from former ISRO Chairman S Somanath. He has advised that Block 1 and Block 2 be developed together to ensure an integrated ecosystem. He suggested a site visit to the Aerospace Division of Hindustan Aeronautics Limited to as-

sess manufacturing scale and cargo movement requirements.

Phase A includes site assessment, base map preparation, demand estimation, technical assessment of external infrastructure needs and preparation of a detailed master plan for 4,800 acres. It will cover land-use zoning, circulation planning and marketing material development.

Phase B will focus on infrastructure master planning, preliminary design of roads and utilities, power sourcing and distribution plans, financial analysis, bid documentation and node-level concept planning for the larger 15,000-acre cluster. The cluster will include dedicated zones for rocket manufacturing, spacecraft manufacturing, technical and testing infrastructure, and logistics with heavy cargo corridors.

Lokesh to launch Blue Jet proj today

HRD Minister Nara Lokesh on Saturday will attend the ground breaking ceremony of Blue Jet Healthcare Ltd, one of India's leading manufacturers of contrast media intermediates used in medical imaging.

The ₹2,300-crore greenfield pharmaceutical manufacturing facility coming up at Rambilli Industrial Park in Anakapalle, will be a key scale-up of India's specialty pharma and CDMO capabilities.

Spread across over 102 acres near Visakhapatnam, the project will create new production capacities for contrast media intermediates, high-inten-

THE 19-year-long quest for justice in the sensational murder of B-Pharmacy student Ayesha Meera came to a poignant and heart-wrenching close on Friday, as officials of the CBI handed over her mortal remains to her parents for cremation in Vijayawada court.

The development followed the court's acceptance of CBI's closure report in case. Acting on court's direction, the agency returned Ayesha's remains, which had exhumed in 2019 for a re-postmortem exam as part of re-investigation.

Family members said the final rites were conducted in Te-

nali in accordance with Muslim traditions, marking an end to years of legal battles.

The CBI informed the court that it had found no admissible evidence to prosecute any individual in the crime. The court

observed that there was no material warranting probe. It recorded the parents' dissatisfaction with closure report and noted their submission that fiscal constraints prevented them from pursuing legal remedies.

Shamshad Begum said, "For 19 years, I have waited and fought for justice for my innocent daughter. Despite our battle, we have not got justice. I pray that those who killed my daughter should receive brutal punishment."

The family is planning to seek an appointment with CM Naidu to request further action. Meanwhile, mild tension prevailed as Women activists accompanied the family to express solidarity.

Collegium moots Justice Lisa Gill as next CJ of AP HC

THE Supreme Court Collegium has resolved to recommend transfer of Justice Lisa Gill, judge at High Court of Punjab and Haryana, to the High Court of AP and for her appointment as the Chief Justice of that High Court with effect from the date the vacancy would arise.

The recommendation was made at a meeting of the collegium on Thursday.

"The collegium has taken a policy decision that in order to strengthen the efficiency and quality of administration of justice, a judge who is proposed to take over the high court as its chief justice may be transferred well in advance, preferably two months before the vacancy arises, so that such recommendee in the meantime becomes well con-

versant with the affairs of that high court and assumes charge of the office of chief justice, on the retirement of incumbent chief justice," the SC Collegium said in a statement.

In another development, the collegium also approved the proposals for appointment of nine advocates - Md Nadim Seraj, Ranjan Kumar Jha, Kumar Manish, Sanjeev Kumar, Girijish Kumar, Alok Kumar, Raj Kumar, Rana Vikram Singh, and Vikash Kumar - as judges of the High Court of Judicature at Patna.

The Collegium has recommended the appointment of Kerala HC judge Justice Sushrut Arvind Dharmadhikari as the next CJ of the Madras High Court. The decision was taken as the incumbent Madras High Court Chief Justice, Manindra Mohan Shrivastava, is due to retire on March 5.



CM Naidu to launch free HPV vax drive today

Programme to cover 3.45 lakh 14-year-old girls across AP through 1,645 health centres to prevent cervical cancer

IN a major public health initiative aimed at curbing cervical cancer, Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu will inaugurate the free HPV (Human Papillomavirus) vaccination programme for 14-year-old girls across Andhra Pradesh.

The State government plans to vaccinate approximately 3.45 lakh girls, beginning Saturday, with the launch event scheduled at Cheepurupalli in Vizianagaram district. The programme coincides with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's nationwide rollout from Ajmer, Rajasthan.

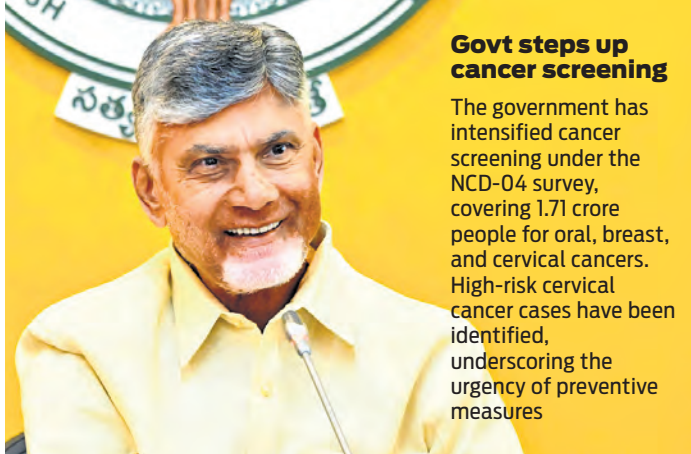
Health Minister Satyakumar Yadav announced that the vaccines will be distributed through 1,645 primary and urban health centres equipped with cold storage facilities. In the first phase, the state has already received 1,90,800 doses, with a total expenditure of ₹14.11 crore earmarked for the campaign.

The vaccination programme

will continue for three months, with certificates issued to all recipients. Coordination between the Education Department, Women and Child Welfare Department, and other agencies will ensure smooth implementation.

According to official data, Andhra Pradesh has 3,45,377 girls aged 14 years. Kurnool district has the highest number at 23,957, while Polavaram records the lowest at 2,777. Vaccinations will be administered on dates fixed by the Union government, and additional doses will be supplied as needed. Parents' consent will be obtained before administering the vaccine.

The initiative comes against the backdrop of alarming cancer statistics. Between 2021 and 2025, the State recorded 75,000 new cancer cases, with an average of 30,000 deaths annually. Of the 38,055 women who died due to breast, cervical, and ovarian cancers during this period, 53% succumbed to breast cancer, while 31% died from cervical cancer.



Govt steps up cancer screening

The government has intensified cancer screening under the NCD-04 survey, covering 1.71 crore people for oral, breast, and cervical cancers. High-risk cervical cancer cases have been identified, underscoring the urgency of preventive measures

Minister Yadav stressed that HPV vaccination would provide long-term protection against cervical cancer, which is the second most common cancer among women in India.

The HPV vaccine, administered in a 0.5 ml dose, protects against four major virus strains (types 6, 11, 16, and 18) that cause cervical cancer.

Officials assured that the vaccine is safe, with only minor

side effects such as mild fever or pain at the injection site, which subside within two days. Recipients will be observed for 30 minutes post-vaccination before being allowed to leave.

The state has established 1,645 cold chain points to store and distribute the vaccine, with the highest number in Srikakulam (85), followed by Kadapa (77). Medical staff have already been trained, and the entire program will be monitored

through the U-WIN digital platform for real-time data tracking.

A State-level control room will oversee the campaign, and citizens can report issues via the 104 helpline, available round the clock.

The government has also intensified cancer screening under the NCD-04 survey, covering 1.71 crore people for oral, breast, and cervical cancers. High-risk cervical cancer cases have already been identified, underscoring the urgency of preventive measures.

Yadav noted that his first official signature as Health Minister was on the cancer survey file, reflecting the government's commitment to tackling women's health challenges.

This initiative marks a significant step in Andhra Pradesh's fight against cervical cancer, combining vaccination, screening, and awareness to safeguard women's health. The government hopes that widespread HPV immunisation will drastically reduce future cancer cases and mortality rates.

VIGILANCE TO PROBE IRREGULARITIES COMMITTED BY AU EX-VC: LOKESH

ALLEGING that Andhra University in Visakhapatnam had turned into an office of the YSRCP during the previous regime, Minister for HRD and IT Nara Lokesh informed the AP Legislative Assembly that a vigilance inquiry is under way to unearth the irregularities allegedly committed by former AU Vice-Chancellor Prasada Reddy.

He said the report would be

submitted within the next 45 days and that stringent action would be taken based on the findings of the inquiry.

Replying to questions raised by Visakhapatnam City MLAs Velagapudi Ramakrishna Babu, Gana Babu and Vamsi Krishna Srinivas during Question Hour in the Assembly on Friday, Lokesh said that over the past five years YSRCP activists were indiscriminately appointed to various posts in government universities across Andhra Pradesh.



He stated that a special manpower audit is currently being conducted. The audit will be completed within the next 30 days, and strict action will be taken against ineligible appointees.

He added that requests have been made for the regularisation of contract and MTS staff. After the manpower audit is completed, the government will consult the Finance Department and take appropriate action.

Alleging that education

standards in the State had declined during the previous YSRCP regime, he said Andhra University was ranked 29th in the NIRF rankings in 2019 but slipped to 76th by 2023. After the coalition government came to power, it improved to 41st rank.

The goal now is to place the university among the top 10 institutions.

Lokesh also assured the MLAs that the centenary celebrations of AU would be conducted in a grand manner.

YSRCP MLCs demand debate on laddu row

YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) MLCs has strongly criticised the ruling TDP-led coalition government for allegedly evading a full-fledged debate on the Tirumala laddu controversy.

Addressing media at the Assembly Media Point, they asked why the government was reluctant to discuss the issue if no irregularities occurred in the procurement of ghee used for laddu preparation.

The MLCs alleged that corruption took place through Indapur Dairy and claimed that Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) funds were diverted to Heritage Foods, a company linked to Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu's family.

They accused the government of violating Assembly conventions by offering only a

short statement instead of permitting a proper debate, despite agreeing to one in the Business Advisory Committee.

For four consecutive days, YSRCP members have demanded a discussion, but they say ruling party legislators created chaos in the House to block it.

They cited the CBI-SIT charge sheet as evidence of wrongdoing and accused the Chief Minister of misleading devotees by raising fears of adulterated ghee. Several MLCs, including Vanka Ravinder Nath, Kumbha Ravibabu, and Ramasubba Reddy, alleged that Naidu politicised the issue for personal gain and must apologise to devotees.

Other members, including Kavuru Srinivas and Parvata Reddy Chandrasekhar Reddy, said TTD's national prestige was at stake.

He noted that the distribution process experienced minor delays due to the ongoing agricultural season, but assured that the remaining transformers will be supplied shortly.

The Minister emphasised that the use of covered Fiber Reinforced Plastic (FRP) poles during palm oil harvesting can significantly reduce electrical accidents. He stated that the

coalition government is committed to the expansion of palm oil cultivation and is taking special measures for the welfare and development of palm oil farmers.

Highlighting safety concerns, the Minister observed that most accidents occur when iron poles are used during harvesting operations without proper precautions.

Turning to agriculture, the Chief Minister outlined reforms based on five guiding principles. They include Agri-tech, Water Security, Demand-driven Crops, Food Processing, Marketing, and Government Support. He highlighted that Andhra Pradesh contributes nearly 10% to India's Gross Domestic Product through agriculture.

To support farmers, the government has allocated ₹13,722 crore for free electricity in 2025-26, covering 22.5 lakh pump sets.

Naidu pointed out that transparency in paddy procurement has ensured ₹10,816 crore in direct payments to farmers, while clearing ₹1,670 crore dues left

pending by the previous regime. He also announced plans to introduce mechanisation and AI-driven services to modernise farming practices.

Naidu revealed that Andhra Pradesh has attracted ₹14,230 crore investments in the food processing sector. Natural farming is being expanded to 50 lakh acres, with 15 lakh farmers already practising it across 8,168 villages, he highlighted.

The government aims to transform Rayalaseema into a horticulture hub through a ₹30,000 crore cluster plan, which, combined with private investments, will reach ₹1 lakh crore. Andhra Pradesh also plans to establish the world's largest cocoa city in Eluru and

strengthen aquaculture by providing electricity at ₹1.50 per unit.

The Chief Minister highlighted significant progress in water conservation, noting that groundwater levels in Annamayya district have risen by 6.67 m due to efficient measures. Statewide, average groundwater levels increased by 7.31 m, saving ₹95 crore in electricity charges. Expansion of horticulture crops across 20,000 hectares has contributed to ₹1,634 cr growth in the G SDP.

Naidu assured that tenant farmers and irrigation societies will be fully supported, stressing that farmer welfare is the foundation of AP's development.

He served in different positions including the CCLA and is currently in the position of Special CS (Water Resources Department) and also Ex Officio Special CS to the Chief Minister.

CBI resumes fresh round of inquiry into Viveka case on SC directions

THE investigation into the murder of former minister YS Vivekananda Reddy continues even after eight years, with the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) resuming a fresh round of inquiry following directions from the Supreme Court of India.

Vivekananda Reddy was murdered on March 15, 2019. Since then, the case has been

investigated by both the Special Investigation Team (SIT) and the Central Bureau of Investigation, but a conclusive outcome has remained elusive despite changes in governments over the years.

Dissatisfied with the progress of the probe, Vivekananda Reddy's daughter approached the Supreme Court seeking

a fresh investigation, alleging lapses in the earlier inquiry. Acting on the court's orders,



the CBI issued notices to four individuals.

On February 21, the CBI questioned Arjun Reddy, a close relative of former chief minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, in Hyderabad. As the remaining persons expressed their inability to travel to Hyderabad, CBI officials conducted questioning on Friday at the Pulivendula Town Police station.

Mahendra Yadav was questioned for nearly two hours, while Kiran Yadav was also examined. Bharat Yadav, however, did not appear for the inquiry.

HC to monitor SIT probe into Group-1 Main row

THE Andhra Pradesh High Court on Friday clarified that it would personally monitor the Special Investigation Team (SIT) probe into the alleged irregularities in the evaluation of the Group-1 Main examination papers.

A division bench comprising Justice Battu Devanand and Justice Haranath Sharma observed that it expects the SIT, constituted by the State government following the court's di-

rections, to conduct a sincere and transparent investigation. The bench made it clear that it would continue to oversee the probe until the SIT completes its inquiry and submits a report before the court.

Noting that considerable time had already been devoted to hearing the batch of appeals filed in connection with the alleged irregularities in the Group-1 evaluation process, the court said it would continue hearing the part-heard appeals until they reach a logical conclusion.

SHARP GDP REVISIONS SHOW NEED TO FOCUS ON BETTER DATASETS

THE statistical overhaul India is undergoing will convey more over time than it's doing in the moment. But for now, what appears certain is that growth is strong and broad-based, with consumption and investment on the expenditure side and manufacturing and services on the supply side turning in decent performances. For 2025-26, real GDP growth is pegged at 7.8 percent, up from 7.4 percent estimated in the old series. Sequentially, third-quarter growth printed lower at 7.8 percent as against 8.2 percent seen in the second quarter; but it's higher than the 7.4 percent registered during the same period in the previous year. Soon after the new dataset's release, Chief Economic Advisor V Anantha Nageswaran revised his 2026-27 real growth estimate upwards to 7-7.4 percent. Pegging nominal growth at 10-11 percent, the CEA concluded that the economy would comfortably cross the \$4-trillion mark by next March.

The biggest setback is in the nominal GDP. For 2025-26, it is now estimated at ₹345 lakh crore in absolute terms, down from about ₹357 lakh crore under the old series. It means, in dollar terms, the size of the Indian economy stands at \$3.8 trillion, reduced from \$3.9 trillion, making the wait to emerge as the fourth largest economy a bit longer. That said, what's undeniable is that India has seen consecutive years of 7 percent growth with key components like manufacturing making a strong comeback. Agriculture and mining, however, need to punch higher than the 2025-26 projections, while services growth remains range-bound. Private investments are finally coming around and consumption seems steady with strong rural demand.

Among the various revisions, what stood out was the significant downward revision in 2023-24 numbers. Real GDP growth rates were revised down from 9.2 percent in the old series to 7.2 percent. All three components—agriculture, industry and services—saw sharp downward revisions. It's true that this was due to methodological improvements. But it raises the pertinent question if policy interventions such as personal income tax cuts and GST rate rationalisation came a beat behind the actual music. Sound public policy rests on timely, credible and granular data. It's now evident that we have been reading things wrong. For evidence-based decisions amid rapid changes, we need a harmony of datasets across ministries and states, besides continuous efforts at improving their quality and transparency.

DIET NO MORAL TEST, DON'T POLICE PLATES

BIHAR'S Deputy Chief Minister Vijay Kumar Sinha sparked a row when, while banning the open sale of meat near religious places and schools, he said such visibility hurt the “purity of our sentiments” and could foster “violent tendencies” among children. He insisted the government was not against anyone's right to eat what they chose; yet the order casts ordinary dietary practice as a moral and social threat.

The political backdrop made the statement more charged. In Bihar, food habits of leaders such as Lalu Prasad, Tejashwi Yadav and Rahul Gandhi have in recent times been amplified into campaign controversies. The BJP has accused them of eating meat during ‘auspicious’ days to allege disrespect to Hindu sentiments. With Holi coming up and elections due in several states including West Bengal next door, the timing of Sinha's remarks has led the opposition to question his intentions.

If this is about sending a majoritarian cultural signal, it is on a weak ground because, within Hinduism, Shakta traditions and numerous sub-groups have included meat in their diets for long. Data also exposes the rhetoric. The National Family Health Survey 2019-21 showed that just 16.6 percent of Indian men and 29.4 percent of women aged 15-49 had never consumed meat. Yet, ‘non-vegetarian’ is a social label used with an arguably pejorative slant in many contexts.

The episode fits a wider pattern. Across India, food culture has been increasingly politicised—from school mid-day meals to food served in hostels or on trains. What's lost in this noise is the individual's right to choose. Vegetarianism works well for those who practise it. But a shift from animal-based food can worsen poverty and malnutrition among communities used to it as an affordable source of protein. When these foods are left out of government schemes, it sends the message that their habits are inferior or avoidable.

The Constitution protects personal freedom, including the right to choose what one eats. Governments should ensure hygiene and follow the law without turning food into a tool of moral policing. Social harmony cannot grow by limiting diversity—but only by accepting others' choices. A confident society does not feel threatened by its constituents' food choices.

A GLOBAL FORCE FOR GOOD

THE Trump administration has a new enemy: Cuban doctors. Since 1963, the communist nation has sent out over 400,000 healthcare professionals to serve in more than 160 countries. Today, it brings in more than \$8 billion for the island nation's beleaguered economy. Guatemala gave in to American pressure last week and closed its three-decade-old programme hosting Cuban doctors, whereas Italy's Calabria province resisted it, as did several Caribbean nations last year. The need for having an international medical force is felt more acutely today than ever before. India, which is still remembered in China for sending Dwarkanath Kotnis and four other doctors to treat soldiers in 1938, should take the lead in such a global initiative. It's a cause that should not face ideological frontiers.

AS overweight and obesity levels rise in populations the world over, they pose much more than cosmetic and mobility challenges to people. Body fat, especially visceral fat which is stored within the abdomen, is a factory that churns out an army of pro- and anti-inflammatory chemicals. As visceral fat deposits rise, they release a flood of tissue-damaging pro-inflammatory chemicals, while reducing the production of anti-inflammatory chemicals like adiponectin. This chronic assault on body tissues increases the risk of cardiovascular diseases, diabetes, cancer and dementia.

Development and clinical deployment of several anti-obesity drugs has recently provided powerful interventions to reduce body weight and confer protection against the cardio-metabolic hazards associated with obesity. After years of limited success in providing effective medical treatments for obesity (beyond invasive surgical treatments), these drugs demonstrated dramatic results. A booming global market has emerged over the past few years, with clamour for these ‘miracle drugs’ going beyond clinical use to cosmetic transformation.

This was made possible by pathbreaking advances in biomedical research which helped to identify many hormones that are produced naturally by the body to regulate appetite, gastric motility and blood glucose levels, with brain signalling acting as a powerful communication tool to coordinate physiologic functions across a complex web of neuro-endocrine and metabolic pathways.

Among these, recently-discovered glucagon-like peptide (GLP-1) and glucose-dependent insulinotropic polypeptide (GIP) have emerged as key players besides well recognised hormones like insulin and glucagon. GLP-1 is a natural hormone produced mainly by the L-cells of the ileum (lower part of the small intestine). GIP, also known as gastric inhibitory polypeptide, is produced by the K-cells of the jejunum (upper part of the small intestine).

This surge in knowledge about the intricately designed and harmoniously coordinated human physiology enabled the development of drugs that may act as agonists (binding to a specific cell, producing a biological response mimicking a naturally occurring substance) of these hormones, to serve diverse clinical needs. At the forefront of this are the GLP-1 and GIP agonists (like semaglutide, liraglutide and tirzepatide). Apart from influencing insulin release and glucose homeostasis, these agents also have favourable effects

Studies show that many of the medicines that help cut flab may trigger side effects like gastrointestinal trouble, heightened anxiety and skeletal muscle loss. They must be used with extreme care

on lipid metabolism and inflammation. GIP has also been recently shown to have a major influence on bone remodelling.

Euphoria about these miracle drugs has started dissipating in the last two years. While clinical trials are very good for demonstrating efficacy in sampled populations studied for a limited time period, adverse drug effects emerge more clearly over a longer time period when a large number of persons have started using the drug.

This has happened with the anti-obesity drugs. Initial reports reported gastrointestinal side effects (ranging from abdominal bloating due to delayed gastric emptying to disrupted intestinal muscle movement). While some initial reports of increased suicidal ideation have not been corroborated, anxiety and depression have been reported.

More serious adverse effects have emerged with increased global use. Sarcopenia, or loss of skeletal muscle, is a

serious problem which can lead to falls. Apart from a direct action of the drugs on skeletal muscle, decreased appetite leads to low protein intake affecting muscle mass. Decrease in physical activity may also contribute. High-protein diets and protein supplements have been advocated to prevent or treat sarcopenia among users of GLP-1 agonists.

Over 22 percent of individuals using GLP-1 receptor agonists develop at least one nutrient deficiency within 12 months, driven by severe appetite suppression and delayed gastric emptying. Common deficiencies include vitamins D, B12, folate, thiamine, iron and calcium.

More disconcerting information has emerged from studies of persons who have discontinued the medication after using it for a prescribed period and losing weight. Studies showed that over 40-50 percent of lost weight was regained within 28-52 weeks of stopping. Some re-

century anchoress Julian of Norwich can be found there (I know, I bought a copy). The fair also features literary entertainments like readings and discussions by prominent writers and publishers, and Kolkata's significant set circulate freely. So do phalanxes of pamphleteers selling crank treatises proposing a geocentric universe or divination by observing crows (*Kak Charitra*). It's a mixed bag, like a country mela, which is where it gets its Bengali name from—Boi Mela.



Before jamborees like the Jaipur Literature Festival were established, there were large book fairs like the one in Kolkata offering eclectic fares. When we complain about the country's low readership and relatively small publishing industry, we are mostly talking about English language publishing

A mela suggests not a trade fair for bookish audiences and writerly stars, but rural harvest festivals. There's the Poush Mela in nearby Santiniketan, for instance, where highbrow and lowbrow mingle in a strangely uplifting cloud of food, music, poetry, handicrafts, activism and pot. In India, the traditions of the deadly-serious book fair and the entertaining festival have merged. People who don't like this say it devalues books. The rest say that it brings more people into the fold of readers. These are opinions, not facts.

The older allegations which started this thread—books don't sell in India and

there's hardly a culture of reading—must be inconclusive because, invariably, the discussion is about publishing in English, which is a fraction of the Indian publishing landscape. The whole vista is very varied, from risk-averse publishers who print textbooks to offset speculative losses in literary publishing, specialists like Amitav Ghosh's publisher Ravi Dayal and Vikram Seth's publisher P Lal, and idealists running small presses, usually into the ground.

Besides, in Indian publishing, for every fact there's an alternative. The industry formalised only recently and it is still normal for writers to submit a manuscript without a contract and to hand over rights during a casual phone call, with no written record. Frames of reference also matter. In response to the article in *The Guardian*, which stated that Indian print runs are low and that 10,000 copies make a bestseller (a fact in English publishing), HarperCollins India CEO Anantha Padmanabhan pointed out that the Malayalam novel *Ram C/O Anandhi* by Akhil P Dharmarajan and *Too Good to be True* by Prajakta Koli sold 3 lakh and 2 lakh copies in a year (an alternative fact). The context: both are young social media phenomena and Koli works in OTT cinema. Of course they'd have the numbers. Amish pioneered that strategy when he embraced digital media promotion.

Beyond English, on which the spotlight is fixed, Indian publishing is a vast landscape. If you consider sellers of used books—who often participate in trade fairs—you'll find the numbers climbing fast. And if you look into the darker corners of this world where the pirates are silently at work, you'll find hoards that go uncounted. That's why, when no one's looking, many writers ask the bootleggers at traffic lights how their novels are doing. The pirate estimate can be more revealing than formal sales figures. A market with such varied cultures of reading, and so many languages, styles and niches, can't be treated as a single, orderly entity bound by universal rules.

turned to their starting weight within 1.5 to 2 years. If that was disappointing, more disconcerting was the fact that benefits related to blood pressure, diabetes and blood lipid control dissipated fast after the drugs were stopped.

Researchers at Oxford University reviewed 37 studies with over 9,000 patients to compare the blockbuster weight-loss jabs with conventional dieting or other pills. The study found that individuals stopping GLP-1 weight-loss drugs regain weight about four times faster than those stopping traditional diet and exercise programmes. Patients typically regained most lost weight within two years, averaging 0.4-0.8 kg per month, with positive health indicators fading away in a year.

Reasons for this reversal could be many. When these drugs are given in larger than naturally produced hormones, without harmonising with the dietary fluctuations that occur over the usual course of a day, production of the natural hormone may be suppressed and may not readjust later. Exuberance over achieved weight loss may lead to dietary indiscretion in the belief that the ‘meds will take care of it’. Loss of skeletal muscle may lead to physical inactivity.

For young- and middle-aged persons who wish to use GLP-1 agonists to ‘look good’, there is a caution they must heed. While erectile dysfunction may improve alongside vascular function in elderly persons with diabetes, there is a 22 percent higher probability of developing that unwanted side effect among other males too. Among women users, the risk of inability to experience an orgasm is doubled. Ophthalmic complications of a serious nature have also been reported in a small proportion of users.

While dramatic weight loss and impressive metabolic gains have been demonstrated with these drugs, undesirable side effects and rebounds after discontinuation raise questions on their introduction into routine clinical practice. Amid those dilemmas, we must remember that GLP-1 agonists and GIP are natural hormones which nature has perfected for our bodies to produce and use.

Fruits like apples and guavas, nuts and seeds have been shown to increase their production and diets. Ultra-processed foods derange that capacity with adverse health effects. Perhaps it is best to promote healthy, wholesome traditional diets for the population, while reserving these drugs for clinical use in persons with extreme obesity or severe cardio-metabolic impairments of health.

Home Affairs Dialogue: India raises security of diplomats, K-links in UK

INDIA and the United Kingdom, during the 6th edition of Home Affairs Dialogue on Friday highlighted pro-Khalistani extremism and the activities of anti-India groups operating in Britain as key areas for closer co-operation and coordination.

During talks, India raised concerns over recent security breaches affecting Indian dignitaries and diplomatic premises in the UK, underlining the need for stronger measures and enhanced cooperation. Both sides acknowledged the importance of safeguarding diplomatic missions and maintaining public order, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) said in a statement.

As Union Home Secretary Govind Mohan has been traveling to Bihar along with Union Home Minister Amit Shah, the Indian delegation at



the meet was led by Secretary (Border Management) Rajendra Kumar, while the team from UK's Home Office was led by Second Permanent Secretary Simon Ridley, it said.

The dialogue provided a platform for reviewing ongoing collaboration and identifying new avenues for joint action on security-related challenges, the MHA noted in the statement.

"The two nations identified several other priority areas for proactive engagement. These included tackling drug trafficking networks, addressing migration-related issues, strengthening criminal justice partnerships, deepening law enforcement cooperation, and enhancing collaboration in cyber security," the MHA statement read, while adding that both sides agreed that emerging threats in the digital domain require sustained information-sharing.

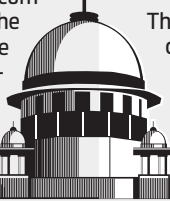

SC: Submit report on farmers' agitation

The Supreme Court on Friday asked the high-powered committee constituted earlier, to amicably resolve the grievances of the farmers who held an agitation at the Shambhu border between Punjab and Haryana in 2024, to submit its report-cum-recommendations. The bench said that the report-cum-recommendations should not be divulged public domain until further orders of the court.



Doctor gets bail in Pune Porsche crash case

The Supreme Court on Friday granted bail to a doctor arrested for allegedly tampering with the blood samples of a 17-year-old boy, accused of crashing a Porsche car into a motorcycle in Pune and killing two persons. The incident dates back to May 19, 2024, when the car allegedly driven by an allegedly drunk 17-year-old fatally knocked down two IT professionals in Pune. A bench of Justices B V Nagarathna and Ujjal Bhuyan granted the relief.

SC agrees to hear plea against SHANTI Act

The Supreme Court on Friday agreed to hear a plea challenging several provisions of the SHANTI Act, 2025, saying the main dispute raised is between an actual, visible and tangible national interest versus an unfortunate hypothetical loss. A bench of Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justice Joymalya Bagchi termed the matter as "extremely sensitive issue" requiring detailed hearing.

THE Supreme Court on Friday said Parliament retains the "absolute prerogative" to enact a law and it is not bound by the undertaking which may have been given by the Centre.

The observations came from a bench of Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justice Joymalya Bagchi which was hearing a batch of petitions challenging the constitutional validity of Section 152 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). Section 152 deals with the acts endangering sovereignty, unity and integrity of India.

A lawyer appearing for the petitioners said Section 152 introduces Section 124A (sedition) of the erstwhile Indian Penal Code. In May 2022, a three-judge bench of the apex

court had put on hold the colonial-era penal law on sedition till an appropriate government forum re-examines it and directed the Centre and states to not register any fresh FIR invoking the offence.

The lawyer said that in 2022, the Centre had given an undertaking before the top court that they would review the sedition law. The counsel said the government cannot re-introduce the provision in BNS after giving an undertaking before the court.

"An undertaking by the executive does not curtail Parliament's legislative powers. The Union of India may have given an undertaking before the court but Parliament is not bound by it," the bench said, adding, "Parliament has the absolute prerogative to enact a law."



During the hearing, the petitioners also questioned Section 173 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), saying it violates the apex court's Lalita Kumari judgement which mandates registration of an FIR if the information discloses commission of a cognisable offence.

The bench, however, said the Lalita Kumari judgment has been abused, leading to proliferation of frivolous FIRs. "Sometimes judgments are given sitting on ivory towers. Have you seen what kind of litigation it has generated? Once cognisable offence is disclosed, FIR has to be registered. How much that judgment has been abused in this country?" the bench asked.

The bench also said many times courts are abused.

The Supreme Court on Friday refused to entertain the West Bengal government's objections over the training module issued by the Election Commission (EC) for judicial officers deployed to verify voter claims as part of the special intensive revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in the state.

A bench of Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justice Joymalya Bagchi said judicial officers would not be "influenced by anything" and the apex court orders in the matter were clear.

Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for West Bengal, said, "Something strange has happened. While your lordships passed the order that all modalities will be settled by the chief justice (of Calcutta HC) and the committee, what they have done is, behind the back, they have issued directions to judicial officers and issued a training module saying this is what they should accept and this is what they should not accept," Sibal said. He argued that the ECI issued a "clandestine" training module to judicial officers.

The Chief Justice said judicial officers would take a call. "We can't hear like this. There has to be an end to it," he said.



A glimpse of Op Sindoor at Indo-Pak border

THE Indian Air Force on Friday recreated key elements of Operation Sindoor at Pokhran during Vayu Shakti on Friday, laying out how it carried out strikes and countered aerial threats during last year's hostilities with Pakistan.

President Droupadi Murmu, as the Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces flew a sortie in the indigenous Prachand before witnessing the FPD (Force Protection Detachment). The sortie was undertaken as a two-aircraft LCH formation, with Chief of the Air staff Air Chief Marshal AP Singh flying the second helicopter.

With a deafening supersonic boom, a Rafale under the call sign "Brahmastra" opened the FPD, signalling its key role in the IAF's future force structure after the government's nod earlier this month for 114 additional aircraft.

The sequence began with ISR (intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance) inputs from RPAS (remotely piloted aircraft system), which identified and tracked targets in real time, with simulated terror camps

and radar installations adding operational realism.

This was followed by simulated suppression and destruction of enemy air defences, overseen by the IAF's Integrated Air Command and Control System (IACCS) and executed using loitering munitions.

The integrated air defence

grid was demonstrated through coordinated firings by Akash surface-to-air missiles, the Spyder system and upgraded L-70 guns, mirroring the layered approach adopted during the conflict. The IAF had played a central role on May 7, striking two of the nine designated targets and then countering Pakistan's

aerial incursions using a mix of legacy Soviet-origin systems and modern indigenous and imported platforms, including Akash, MR-SAM, Pechora and Osa-AK. During the hostilities, the S-400 system carried out the longest-range ground-to-air kill in military history, taking down a SAAB 2000 Erieye. The force inflicted damage on at least 11 Pakistani air bases, after which Islamabad desperately reached out for a ceasefire despite initially declining a call from Indian DGMO Lt Gen Rajiv Ghai on May 7.

The indigenous Tejas MK-1 LCA was missing from the FPD after the entire fleet was grounded following a runway incident earlier this month. Rafale, Su-30MKI, Jaguar, Hawk and Mirage 2000 formed the fighter package, with Rafale and Su-30MKI demonstrating air-to-air engagements.

A C-295 transport aircraft carried out a night assault landing, while a C-130J Super Hercules landed on a short strip, inserted Garud commandos into a simulated combat zone and took off within minutes, as attack helicopters secured the area.

NCERT orders immediate recall of Class 8 textbook after SC verdict

A day after the Supreme Court imposed a blanket ban on the new Class 8 social science book, the National Council for Educational Research and Technology (NCERT) on Friday asked individuals and organisations that have copies of it to return it to its head office in Delhi. The education body said that it sold only 38 copies of the book on Monday, the only day it was sold from its Delhi office.

Its advisory said, "The NCERT requests any individual or organisation in possession of the NCERT textbook 'Exploring Society: India and Beyond', Social Science Grade 8 Part 2, or any material related to it, to return it to the Head, Department of Education in Social Sciences or the Publication Division, NCERT, Sri Aurobindo Marg, New Delhi, at the earliest."

The advisory further said, "We also request that any content related to the chapter 'Role of Judiciary in our Society', if posted on any of the social media or digital platforms, be de-

leted at the earliest."

A senior official told this newspaper that 2.5 lakh copies of the book had been printed. "Only 38 of them were sold at our head office on the day of release on Monday. We stopped the sale the following day. The

buyers have been tracked down and only 10 copies are yet to be taken back by the Publications Division of the NCERT," he said, adding that following the ban, the buyers must return their copies, as it is illegal to possess it now.

The education body quoted the Thursday order of the court in its advisory: "A complete blanket ban is hereby imposed on any further publication re-printing or digital dissemination of the book titled 'Exploring Society, India and Beyond'. ... Any attempt to circumvent this order through electronic media or alternative titles, containing the same contents, shall be treated as a direct interference, willful breach and defiance of the directions issued herein above."

The controversy part of the chapter spoke of alleged corruption in the judiciary and provided supporting data from a five-year period since 2017. The NCERT later apologised for what it called an inadvertent mistake, while the Ministry of Education assured a probe and punishment for the guilty.

Canadian PM arrives in Mumbai for 4-day India visit to reset bilateral ties

CANADIAN Prime Minister Mark Carney arrived in Mumbai on Friday, commencing a four-day visit to India that is seen as a pivotal effort to reset bilateral ties and expand economic engagement between the two countries.

He will pay homage to the victims of 26/11 Mumbai terrorist attack. His visit begins with meetings scheduled with leading business figures in Mumbai, India's financial capital, before he travels to New Delhi on March 1.

Carney will hold talks with PM Narendra Modi on March 2. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will call on the Canadian PM who will also address the India-Canada CEO Forum in the national capital prior to returning to Canada.

"The visit marks a significant step in further strengthening India-Canada ties," a spokesperson for the Ministry



No visit to Punjab

Carney is not scheduled to visit Punjab, a region that has historically been central to Indian migration to Canada. Observers say the focus this time is squarely on recalibrating diplomatic channels and rebuilding economic confidence.

of External Affairs said, underscoring that the partnership is rooted in shared democratic values, and expanding cooperation across sectors.

The trip comes at a sensitive juncture for Ottawa. With relations between Canada and the United States under strain, Carney has pledged to diversify trade partnerships and identify new markets for Canadian exports. India, with a population of 1.4 billion and one of the

world's fastest-growing major economies, is seen as a potentially crucial destination for Canada's petroleum, natural gas and other resources.

Bilateral ties have been strained in recent years following allegations by former PM Justin Trudeau that the Indian government was linked to the killing of a Canadian citizen associated with Sikh separatist activism. India has strongly denied the accusations.

When Modi speaks, the world listens, says BJP

PRIME Minister Narendra Modi addressed 19 foreign parliaments between 2014 and 2026, which is a record for an executive head of India. Hailing the milestone, the BJP claimed on Friday that Modi addressed more foreign parliaments than any previous Indian prime minister, and notably more than all Congress prime ministers combined.

"When PM Modi speaks, the world listens. He had addressed 19 foreign parliaments—right from addressing the joint session of the US Congress to the Knesset of Israel," the BJP posted on 'X'. It called the achievement "a reflection of India's growing global stature, diplomatic credibility, leadership and moral authority."

According to available information, former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh addressed seven foreign parliaments, Indira Gandhi addressed four and Jawaharlal Nehru addressed three. Former Prime Ministers Rajiv Gandhi and Atal Bihari Vajpayee addressed two foreign

In 2014, shortly after assuming office, Modi addressed the parliaments of Australia, Fiji, Nepal and Bhutan. The following year, he addressed the National Assembly of Mauritius in March and Sri Lanka's Parliament. In the same year, he delivered a widely noted address in the Parliament of Mongolia and later spoke at the UK Parliament in November.

In December 2015, Modi addressed the Parliament of Afghanistan. In June 2016 came the mother of all addresses when he spoke at the joint session of the US Congress. In

2018, he addressed the Parliament of Uganda, and in 2019, the Parliament of the Maldives. In 2023, Modi once again addressed a joint session of the US Congress.

In the second address to the US Congress, he had said, "Democracy is the idea that welcomes debate and discourse. Democracy is the culture that gives wings to thought and expression. India is blessed to have such values from times immemorial. In the evolution of the democratic spirit, India is the Mother of Democracy."

According to the BJP, in 2024, he addressed the Parliament of

Guyana. In July 2025, he addressed the Parliament of Ghana, followed in the same month by addresses to the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago and the Parliament of Namibia. Later that year, he also addressed the Parliament of Ethiopia. Most recently, he addressed the Knesset in Israel and was honoured with the Israeli Parliament's highest award. Addressing the Knesset, PM Modi raised the October 7, 2023, Hamas attack and consoled the death of Israeli citizens.

As of February 2026, Modi has undertaken 99 international visits to 79 countries.
