Tiger attack near Satpura reserve claims first human life, villagers block road in protest

Panic gripped areas bordering the Satpura Tiger Reserve on Saturday after a tiger killed a young man near Jhiria village along the Pipariya Matkuli road.

This is the first confirmed human fatality due to a tiger attack in the region, triggering fear, anger, and protests among local residents, said officials.

The deceased has been identified as Kamal Thakur (22), a resident of Bari Devi village s Dam Mohalla and a member of the tribal community. According to eyewitnesses, the tiger suddenly attacked Kamal near his hut, dragged him into the forest, and later his badly mutilated body was recovered from bushes inside the forest area.

Following the incident, teams from the Forest Department and police rushed to the

spot. As a precaution, authorities restricted public movement in forest-adjacent areas and deployed heavy police force.

Forest officials stated that tigers frequently move in this buffer zone, but no human death had been reported earlier, raising concerns that the animal may have turned man-eater.

Angered by the incident, villagers staged a road blockade on Pipariya Matkuli road, demanding immediate compensation for the victim s family and permanent safety measures. Traffic remained stalled for several hours as long queues of vehicles formed on both sides.

Police attempted to pacify the protesters, while forest officials appealed to residents to stay away from the forest. Fear continues to prevail, with locals questioning the safety of those living near the reserve boundary.

Abortion at hospital, inquiry finds nurse guilty, action allegedly suppressed

A shocking case of illegal abortion performed on an unmarried girl by a contract staff nurse at Badamalhari Civil Hospital has surfaced, with allegations that officials are delaying action despite the inquiry confirming serious violations.

According to the investigation, Preetu Dubey, a contract nursing officer, performed an abortion on a young woman from Tikamgarh district in May 2025, charging Rs 16,000. During the procedure, the girl s condition worsened, and she was referred to another hospital using forged signatures.

Subsequent treatment in Jhansi and Gwalior revealed a ruptured uterus, requiring surgery. The victim remained hospitalised from May 28 to June 6.

Following a complaint by Ramkumar Kushwaha, an inquiry was ordered by the Joint Director (Health), Sagar. The committee found that the nurse violated the Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) Act, 1971, accepted money, and gave false statement. Forged signatures of a doctor on referral documents were also confirmed, and an audio recording allegedly proves the monetary transaction. Despite the inquiry concluding over two months ago, no FIR has been

Staff nurse, store incharge suspended after vet's death

Collector Anju Pawan Bhadoria on Saturday suspended two officials following the death of an assistant veterinary officer, Dr Ravindra Kumar Maravi, on Thursday night.

Maravi, who fell ill, was taken to the district hospital, from where he was referred to Jabalpur government hospital.

The family members of Maravi said he had breathed his last on the way to Jabalpur after the oxygen cylinder emptied.

After his death, his family members blocked traffic outside the hospital, demanding strong action against those who provided a half-filled oxygen cylinder.

The collector also set up an inquiry committee consisting of the chief medical and health and officer, Dr Manoj Pandey, civil surgeon Dr Ramesh Maravi, and sub-divisional magistrate Bharti Maravi.

According to a complaint submitted by the family members of Ravindra Kumar Maravi and other reports, Bhadoria found that the nurs-

ing staff of the Dindori district hospital, Jaimati Nandeha and Vimala Dwivedi, had neglected their duties and suspended both of them.

Both employees have been attached to the main office of the block medical officer in Bajag.

Dr Pandey, however, said the death occurred primarily because of chronic alcoholic cirrhosis and peptic ulcers.

He also said that the oxygen cylinder, which was given to Maravi, was full to its capacity, and there was no proof that it was half-filled.

Wedding of 36-year-old man with minor girl stopped

A 16-year-old girl was being married off to a 36-year-old man in the Nagod area of Satna district on Saturday.

But as soon as the officials of the district administration came to know of it, they rushed to the spot and stopped the wedding.

When the officials tried to convince the man to keep away from marrying a 16-year-old child, he did not agree with them.

Then police swung into action and convinced him not to marry the girl who was a child.

According to reports, the youth, a resident of Rahikwara village, was marrying the girl, a resident of Surdaha village.

Two held with brown Sugar worth Rs 2L

Indore: Two men were arrested in the Hira Nagar area with brown sugar valued at approximately Rs 2 lakh, police reported on Saturday.

According to authorities, a patrolling team spotted the men behaving suspiciously and attempted to flee upon noticing the police. They were subsequently caught. Over 13 grams of brown sugar were recovered from their possession. The accused have been identified as Rohan Kadan and Gopal Ahirwar, both residents of Hira Nagar.

Collectors asked again to identify land for helipads

The aviation department has planned to develop helipads at block and tehsil level in the state. It has planned that a helipad should be available for the use of VIPs and in emergency situations at every 50 km.

In this regard, it had long ago written missives to collectors asking them to identify the suitable land for helipads and inform the aviation department.

So far, only a few collectors have given the desired information. Peeved over the cold response, the department has once again sent a reminder to all the collectors of the state, asking them to provide the information related to availability of land for helipads.

An officer of the aviation department said that there was emphasis on having helipads even on premises of educational institutions and other private institutes so that they could be

used as per need. Additional chief secretary for aviation department Sanjay Shukla told the Free Press that helipads were of two types: concrete and temporary. The emphasis was to have as many as helipads in the state as possible so that they could be used during the visits of VIPs and in emergency medical situations. Sources said that with the help of the public works department, data of helipads was being collected from across the state.

Two stabbed in separate incidents

Two youths were critically injured in two separate incidents of knife attacks under Chunabhatti and Nishatpura police stations on Friday night. Police have registered case in both incidents.

In the first incident, a youth was attacked near a marriage function in Baba Nagar in Chunabhatti over an old rivalry.

According to reports, there was enmity between Sumit Bairagi and Sachin Mahale. During a wedding in the locality, the duo confronted each other and had an altercation. It is alleged that Sachin and his aides Bhura and Sumit Malviya attacked Mahale with a knife resulting in injuries to him. All three accused were arrested by police.

In another incident in Nishatpura area, three youths allegedly carried out a planned attack on a youth due to per-

sonal enmity. The assailants surrounded the victim and stabbed him on the head, leaving him critically injured before fleeing the spot. He was rushed to hospital where his

condition remains serious. Police have registered a case and launched raids at suspected hideouts. Officials said efforts were underway to arrest all accused.

Fire guts cotton factory, no casualties

Indore: A massive fire engulfed a cotton factory near Tata Steel in the Kila Maidan area on Saturday afternoon, causing extensive damage to the structure, machinery and stored cotton. No casualties were reported as all workers evacuated the premises in time. According to the fire brigade, a call was received at 12:09 pm reporting a blaze at KB Industries. The fire spread swiftly through the tin-shed factory, sending thick black smoke billowing into the sky.
