Sand truck owners deny mafia links, protest against action

Members of Sand Truck Owners Association have denied allegations of illegal mining, asserting that they are transporting sand strictly in accordance with government regulations.

Truck owners from Bhopal, Sehore, Raisen, Narmadapuram, Harda, Dewas, Khandwa, and Indore gathered in Narmadapuram and submitted a memorandum to the managers of Sand Contractor Groups 1

and 2. They alleged that over the past five to six days, joint action by the Mineral, Police, Revenue, and Transport Departments has led to the stopping and parking of dumpers despite valid royalty slips and compliance with rules.

The association claimed that such actions are causing financial losses and mental distress to vehicle owners, drivers, and those engaged in construction activities. They demanded that mineral vehicles should not be stopped arbitrarily and that cases registered despite valid



documentation be investigated fairly at a higher level.

They further urged that Mineral Inspectors verify the actual sand quantity in the presence of vehicle owners and drivers and prepare proper documentation.

The memorandum was also sent to the Principal Secretary of the Mineral Department, the District Collector, and the Superintendent of Police.

The association warned that if their grievances are not addressed, they will raise the issue at the Assembly level.

Film *Yadav Ji Ki Love Story* sparks protests

Those who participated in the rally raised slogans against the administration and handed over a memorandum to the Nayab Tehsildar

Shambhu Singh Meena and demanded a ban on the film.

The posters and trailers of the film, produced by Thakurani Productions Private Limited, have been posted on social media. Those posters tarnish the image of the Yadav community. The way the community has been shown in the film hurt the sentiments of the people, the agitators said. The members of the Mahasabha said their purpose was not to create any rift in the society but to maintain social harmony.

Missing Prayagraj youth's body found in Satna river

The body of a youth, who went missing from the Prayagraj-bound Saket Express on February 15, was found in the Satna River on Friday.

When he did not reach Prayagraj, his family members lodged a missing person report. According to sources in the GRP, the youth, Dheeraj Pandey, a resident of Pratappur Kalan, Prayagraj UP, was going to his home town from Mumbai on Saket Express. But when he did not reach home and his phone did not respond, his brother Pawan Pandey lodged a missing person complaint at the GRP.

When the cyber cell inquired into the complaint, it came to light that his location was between Unchehara and Satna.

Afterwards, the GRP began to search for the body. On Thursday, a body was found near the railway bridge over the Satna river. The body was taken out from the river with the help of SDRF personnel. His family members identified the body.

The police sent the body for a postmortem, and afterwards, they handed it over to his family members. According to preliminary reports, when the train was crossing the river and Dheeraj Pandey, who was standing at the gate of the train, fell into the river.

In Indore, FIR against more than 20 Cong leaders

In Indore the cops have registered an FIR against more than 20 Congress leaders and workers following a complaint by BJYM. The incident also raised a serious question on police intelligence. Those named in the FIR include Chintu Chouksey, Amit Patel (Youth Congress president), Vipin Wankhede (district Congress president), and several other Congress leaders and activists.

According to the FIR lodged by city president of BJYM Saugat Mishra, BJYM workers were holding a peaceful protest at Machhi Bazar Chauraha on PY Road. The protest was organised after BJYM objected to a protest by Youth Congress workers during an international AI conference held in Delhi, which BJYM had criticised heavily.

WHAT THE COMPLAINANT ALLEGED

The complainant alleged that city Congress president and Leader of Opposition Chintu Chouksey, reached the spot with other Congress leaders and workers, abused BJYM women workers and

provoked his supporters. BJYM has alleged that Congress workers then attacked their activists with stones, bricks, bottles, causing serious injuries.

Mishra also claimed that a woman worker Bindu Chauhan suffered a severe eye injury. BJYM rural president Manoj Thakur allegedly sustained serious injuries, while Nitesh Khandekar suffered a rib injury. Several other BJYM workers, media persons and others were also injured.

However, the Congress has denied these allegations and put forward a counterclaim.

In Bhopal, BJP delegation lodges complaint

A BJP delegation, including state general secretary Rahul Kothari, MLA Rameshwar Sharma, and BJP Yuva Morcha state president Shyam Tailor, later reached Habibganj police station and submitted a complaint. They claimed that party workers were holding a peaceful demonstration when they were attacked by Congress workers and supporters. Yuva Morcha president Shyam Tailor alleged that several BJP workers were injured after stones were hurled during the protest. BJP leaders urged police officials to register a case and take strict action against those responsible for the incident.

Voters' list released in Umaria after SIR

Umaria: Collector Dharnendra Kumar Jain held a meeting with the recognised political parties in the district after the final list of voters was released following the SIR on Friday. He said there were 4,58,493 voters. After the final list was released, the number of voters is 4,66,863. Now, there are 2,22,140 voters in Bandhavgarh, and the number of voters in Manpur is 2,44,723.

During the SIR, the number of forms six, seven, and eight received was 17,402. The number of eligible voters four after the scrutiny was 15,901, and number of ineligible voters was 1,504. The number of service voters is 212. Similarly, the number of PWD voters is 3,557, official sources said, adding that the number of senior citizens is 2,499.

Dilapidated buildings to be dismantled, says collector

Collector Saket Malviya removed a kiosk that was selling tobacco and other items near a school om Shadaura area and to dismantle all dilapidated buildings across the district.

Malviya said the administration would not allow the opening of Gutkha shops near schools. He issued the instructions during an inspection of the Shadaura area and took feedback on the development work in the Semri Shahbad village Panchayat. He also directed the

officials to give benefits of the government schemes to the villagers. He also said the work on welfare schemes should be done on priority basis. At the Semri Shahbad Anganwadi centre, he found that the records were not kept properly. He directed the officials to issue

show-cause notices to the sector supervisor. Malviya also inspected a school in the Kushwaha colony in Jhagar village and asked the officials to dismantle the dilapidated kitchen without delay. He said all dilapidated buildings across the district should be dismantled.

Women vow to fight liquor sale, give memo to cop

The women in Piplani village, fed up with the sale of liquor, have resolved to fight against this evil. They submitted a complaint to the Gopalpur police station in charge, demanding him to stop the sale of liquor.

The women mentioned their pains, saying their husbands beat them up in a drunken state. The situation

has come to such a pass that their husbands attack them with burning wooden branches, stones, and sickles.

They expressed their concern over the sale of gutkha because children are also consuming it. The complaint, signed by the Sarpanch of Piplani village Panchayat Duniya Bai and other women, warned the administration. They said if the officials did not act against the sale of liquor, they would launch a stir.

Guest teachers may lose job if absent for a week

The Directorate of Public Instruction (DPI) has issued an order stating that guest teachers (Atithi Shikshak) absent from school for more than a week should be immediately relieved.

It is directed that if guest teachers posted through the portal 3.0 of the department re-

main absent for over a week, the school in-charge must relieve them. Failure to do so will attract accountability," the DPI order states. Ravikant Gupta, State Secretary of Atithi Shikshak Samanvay Samiti, Madhya Pradesh, called the order impractical and inhuman, warning it carries a serious risk of misuse. He said principals or officials could dismiss teachers arbitrarily without fair investi-

gation, written notice, or an opportunity to explain, violating natural justice principles.

Gupta demanded that the order be withdrawn or amended to make written notice, explanation, and impartial investigation mandatory before any action. "If the government does not reconsider, guest teachers will be forced to fight democratically to protect their rights," he said.

Pilgrims allege illegal extortion

Allegations of illegal extortion have surfaced in the Narmada Parikrama area of Amarkantak, where a group of pilgrims claimed they were overcharged for river crossing and local sightseeing tour.

According to information, 50 pilgrims from Kolkata were staying at a Gurudwara on the northern bank of the Narmada on Tuesday.

They alleged that a local agent ap-

proached them and demanded Rs 750 per person for a trip to the southern bank of the river and visits to nearby pilgrimage sites.

The devotees claimed that 10 passengers were accommodated in each vehicle and five vehicles were arranged for the group. However, instead of a comprehensive tour of major religious sites, they were reportedly taken only to the river crossing and later dropped at Aranya Sangam. The pilgrims alleged that they were unaware of the pre-

scribed rates and later suspected they had been overcharged after making inquiries from other sources. Terming the incident as "open loot," the group has demanded a thorough investigation and strict action against the agent involved. Discussions regarding the incident are ongoing locally, and a video related to the episode is reportedly expected to surface soon. Administrative officials stated that action would be taken once a formal written complaint is submitted.

Original copy of Bhopal merger demanded

BHOPAL: Social activist Amitabh Agnihotri on Saturday, handed over a memorandum to the nodal officer regarding enemy properties and stressing that the original copy of the Bhopal Merger be demanded from the Nawab family containing the list of movable and immovable properties for accurate assessment. He demanded that properties of Nawab be declared as enemy property. He also demanded action on the basis of former principal secretary Mala Shrivastava's report. As per report, 1395.00 acre land was mentioned as personal property.
