

Every person has right to good healthcare, says CM

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Saturday said that every person had the right to good healthcare, and every sovereign nation must ensure such facilities for its citizens.

"Every person has the right to good healthcare, and every sovereign nation must ensure such facilities for its citizens," he said, adding that India has gained a new identity globally under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi over the past 11 years.

The chief minister was addressing a gathering on Saturday after inaugurating Yatharth Hospital in the Sikandra area of Agra.

He mentioned the positive changes that have taken place in the medical sector in Uttar Pradesh over the past nine years and said that nothing was more important than health.

He said healthcare services should be affordable, reliable and accessible, and stressed that the sector should remain a top priority for governments.

The chief minister said the government was making efforts at its level, but when the government and society



work together, results increase many times over. Private investment is essential in this sector today, he added. The chief minister urged the Yatharth Group to come forward to establish a medical college in any district. He added that the Medical Council has simplified its conditions, making this the best time to establish new medical institutions and transform Uttar Pradesh into a centre of top medical education for youth. The government is ready to provide full support.

"Healthy competition requires both government initiatives and participation from the private sector. The government is introducing a new policy for super-spe-

cialty hospitals through private investment. If someone invests in new medical colleges, the government is also supporting them," he said. He said that when society, government and institutions begin thinking together in the same direction, the outcome transforms into trust. Trust should be our greatest capital, and achieving it requires effort from people, he said, adding that today, Uttar Pradesh has become a symbol of trust. He said the country was witnessing the rise of a 'New India', emerging as the world's third-largest economy while simultaneously promoting heritage and development. Highlighting infrastructure

development, the chief minister said highways, expressways, metro networks, new railway lines and modern trains such as Vande Bharat, Amrit Bharat and Namo Bharat reflect the country's rapid transformation.

The chief minister said that earlier, the country had only one All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), which increased to seven during the Atal Bihari Vajpayee government and had now reached 23 under the present dispensation.

Two of these institutes are located in Uttar Pradesh, in Gorakhpur and Rae Bareilly, he added. The chief minister said that before 2017, the state had only 17 medical colleges, but their number had now increased to 81 in the past nine years. "Earlier there was one district, one mafia, but today we have one district, one medical college," he said. He also highlighted several key initiatives undertaken in the healthcare sector. He stated that Centres of Excellence for MedTech are being developed at the Institute of Technology in Kanpur and the Sanjay Gandhi Post-graduate Institute of Medical Sciences in Lucknow to promote innovation and advanced medical technol-

gy. To boost domestic production of medicines, a 1500-acre Pharma Park is being developed in Lalitpur so that drugs can be manufactured within Uttar Pradesh instead of being imported, and a medical device park is also being established on 350 acres along the Yamuna Expressway to encourage manufacturing of medical equipment in the state, he added.

The chief minister pointed out that around 5.8 crore people in the state have been issued 'golden cards' under government health insurance schemes, and the number is expected to rise to 10 crore in the coming years.

He added that Rs 1,300 crore has been provided from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund to assist residents with medical treatment. The chief minister pointed out that coordinated efforts after his government assumed office helped eliminate encephalitis in eastern Uttar Pradesh, a disease that had claimed more than 50,000 lives over the past decade. Earlier in the day, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath also attended a coordination meeting of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh in Agra that was closed to outsiders.

GB Pant's vision continues to guide UP's development: Yogi

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Saturday paid tribute to Bharat Ratna Pandit Govind Ballabh Pant, on his death anniversary.

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath offered floral tributes at Pant's statue located at Lok Bhawan and remembered him as a great son of India, a prominent freedom fighter, an accomplished lawyer, and a capable administrator.

Addressing the gathering, Chief Minister Yogi said that the life and the vision and reforms introduced by Govind Ballabh Pant laid the foundation for the state's development and continue to guide its progress even today.

He described Govind Ballabh Pant as a "great son of Bharat Mata", an eminent freedom fighter, noted jurist and a capable administrator who served as the first chief minister of Uttar Pradesh and later became widely known as the first chief minister of Uttar Pradesh. Chief Minister Yogi said that the achievements of the state in the present time were deeply rooted in the vision and policies introduced by Pant.



Uttarakhand, which at that time was part of the United Provinces and inspired by the call of Mahatma Gandhi, he gave up his legal practice and joined the freedom movement. During the British era, Pant was elected as the premier of the United Provinces in 1937 and later became widely known as the first chief minister of Uttar Pradesh. Chief Minister Yogi said that the achievements of the state in the present time were deeply rooted in the vision and policies introduced by Pant.

The chief minister further stated that Pant also made significant contributions as the Union home minister of India and played an important role in promoting Hindi as the official language of the country. In recognition of his immense contribution to India's freedom struggle and his distinguished service to the nation and Uttar Pradesh, Pant was awarded the Bharat Ratna in 1957. Several dignitaries were present on the occasion, including Minister of State for Agriculture Baldev Singh Aulakh, Mayor Sushma Khurakwal, MLAs Jai Devi and Amresh Kumar, and MLC Mukesh Sharma, among others.

UP SIR: Over 70L forms for inclusion, 2.68L for deletion

Over 70.69 lakh Form 6 claims for inclusion in the electoral rolls and 2.68 lakh objections via Form 7, seeking deletion of names, were received in Uttar Pradesh between January 6 and March 6 as part of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls exercise in 2026, Chief Electoral Officer Naveen Kumar said on Saturday.

Addressing a press conference at the Lok Bhawan here, Rinwa said that during the two-month claims and objections period, 70,69,810 Form 6 applications were received, with 35,72,603 sub-

mitted by women and 34,96,911 by men, indicating that the number of applications by women exceeded those by men. As many as 206 applications were submitted by third gender voters. He said that since October 27, 2025, when the revision exercise was announced, the state had received 86,69,073 Form 6 applications, including 43,06,364 from men, 43,62,323 from women and 386 from third gender voters.

Regarding objections for deletion of names from the rolls, Rinwa said 2,68,682 Form 7 applications were submitted between January 6 and March 6.

Of these, 1,58,027 sought

deletion of male voters, while 1,10,645 of female voters and 10 of third gender voters. From October 27 to March 6, a total of 3,18,140 Form 7 applications were received, including 1,86,362 for male voters, 1,31,766 for female voters and 12 for third gender voters, he said.

Rinwa said the draft electoral roll published on January 6 contained 12.55 crore voters, including 6.88 crore men (54.8 per cent), 5.67 crore women (45 per cent) and 4.19 third gender voters (0.01 per cent).

He said notices were issued to 3.26 crore voters whose details required verification. This included 1.4 crore voters whose details

were not mapped with the 2003 Special Intensive Revision (SIR), and 2.02 crore voters where discrepancies were found, such as a mismatch in names or implausible age gaps between family members.

The first notices were issued on January 14, and hearings began on January 21, he said, adding that 100 per cent notices have now been generated, while about 3.60 crore notices (93.8 per cent) have already been served. "So far, hearings have been completed for around 2.80 crore voters, which accounts for about 85.8 per cent of the cases," Rinwa said. To facilitate the process, the Election Commission

arranged hearings at 5,621 locations across the state and set up help desks to assist voters.

Booth level officers also visited households and carried out verification using a mobile application, he added. "Around 14 per cent of the hearings are still pending, but with the current pace of work, the process is expected to be completed within the stipulated deadline of March 27," Rinwa said. The poll panel's state chief said that a total of 22,55,473 Form 8 applications for corrections, change of address and replacement of EPIC cards were received between October 27 and March 6.

Protest over maulana's remark against Yogi's mother

A protest was staged at Hazratganj crossing in state capital Lucknow on Saturday against the highly objectionable and provocative remarks made by Bihar-based Maulana Abdullah Salim about the mother of Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath during a religious gathering.

Several people participated in the demonstration led by former student leader and advocate Anurag Tiwari, demanding immediate and strict legal action against the Bihar-based Maulana Abdullah Salim. On the occasion the protesters stated that in a democratic society, the use of such indecent and provocative language from a public platform not only hurts social harmony but also poses a serious challenge to law and order.

They alleged that Maulana Abdullah Salim used such language to provoke the Muslim community against the anti-cow slaughter law implemented in Uttar Pradesh.

They described such language as highly condemnable and unacceptable. On the occasion former student leader and advocate Anurag Tiwari said that using insulting words for Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's mother from a public religious platform was not just an insult to an individual but to the dignity of the entire society.

The former student leader further added that such language promotes hostility in society and strict legal action is necessary so that no one dares to make such statements in the future.

SP wanted Nitish to become PM: Akhilesh

Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav on Saturday said his party had wanted Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar to become the prime minister, but he was now set to become a Rajya Sabha member," Yadav said.

Addressing a press conference at the party office here, Yadav said that while the SP had formed an alliance with the Bahujan Samaj Party earlier, the party had wanted BSP chief Mayawati to become the prime minister. "When the INDIA alliance was formed, we all wanted

Nitish Kumar to become the prime minister. But when the Bihar election took place, we said he would retire as the prime minister and not as the prime minister. The Bharatiya Janata Party has gone a step further, and now he will retire as a Rajya Sabha member," Yadav said. He alleged that the move amounted to an insult to people belonging to the PDA (Pichhadi, Dalit and Aapsankhyak) community. "You tell me which post is bigger - Rajya Sabha member or chief minister?" Yadav asked reporters. PDA refers to 'Pichhadi, Dalit and Aapsankhyak' (backward

classes, Dalits and minorities), a social coalition advocated by the SP. Nitish Kumar belongs to the Other Backward Classes (OBC) community. On Thursday, reacting to reports that Kumar would be sent to the Rajya Sabha, Yadav had written on X that it was the "biggest abduction in the history of Bihar". "It may appear to be a political abduction, but in reality, it is an economic abduction of Bihar. The BJP has demanded the entire state as ransom. The next number! The wise will understand," he had said.

On being asked about the US-Iran dispute, Yadav said

it was a matter of concern if foreign policy appeared to be influenced by external forces. "For the first time, we are seeing how our foreign policy is being decided by people outside the country. This is a serious issue for the nation. India's foreign policy should be decided by the Government of India and its people," he said.

On a query about Indian citizens stranded in Iran countries, the former chief minister of UP said the government should bring back all those who want to return to India. Earlier, several people joined the SP before the press conference.

DyCM's chopper makes emergency landing

A helicopter flying to Kaushambi with Uttar Pradesh's Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad Maurya on board, had to make an emergency landing after it developed a technical snag soon after take off from Lucknow, sources said on Saturday.

According to a Bharatiya

Janata Party leader close to Maurya, the deputy chief minister was going to Kaushambi to attend multiple events.

The chopper, with five persons, including Maurya, his aide Vivek and two pilots, had taken off from Lucknow La Martiniere College ground helipad when it developed a snag. "Smoke was noticed all inside the chopper soon

after take off, forcing the pilots to opt for an emergency landing at the Lucknow airport," the BJP leader said.

Party leaders suggested Maurya was fine and would go to Kaushambi later in another helicopter. A team of experts have been rushed in to identify the causes that led to smoke and forced the pilot to opt for an emergency landing.

Man shares PM's 'objectionable' AI video, booked

Police in Etah district have registered an FIR against a man for allegedly circulating an "objectionable" artificial intelligence-generated video of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, officials said on Saturday.

According to police, the video was created by misusing AI to manipulate the prime minister's image, which was later circulated on social media.

The video, which purport-

edly showed scenes of assault and a person being thrown into water, triggered anger among people after it went viral, they said.

Pilua Station House Officer (SHO) Sandeep Rana said the video was posted on X on Friday. During the investigation, police found that the video was also circulated widely by an Instagram handle linked to Sanjay, a resident of Puthi village within the Pilua police station limits, the station house officer said.

The first information report (FIR) was registered against Sanjay based on a written complaint filed by Sub-inspector Praveen Rana, sub-station house officer. The post and the "original" video have been preserved as evidence, police added.

Circle Officer (Sadar) Sankalp Deep Kishore said the probe had been assigned to the Pilua police station, and action would be taken against those spreading misleading or objectionable content on social media.

Boy dies in leopard attack

An eight-year-old boy was killed in a leopard attack near the Katarniaghat Wildlife Sanctuary, prompting protests by angry villagers, forest officials said on Saturday.

The incident took place on Friday evening in the Karkhan village under the Nishanghar forest range when the child, identified as Raghuveer, was playing outside his house, DFO Apoorva Dixit said. According to Dixit, the leopard emerged from a thicket where it had attacked the boy at around 7 pm. The animal dragged him away but fled into the fields after villagers raised an alarm and chased it. The child, who sustained serious injuries, died shortly afterwards. Family rushed the boy to a government hospital where doctors declared him brought dead.
