

Workshop for NE college principals underway

IMPHAL: A five-day orientation-cum-workshop on leadership development for college principals from the North East began on Monday at the DM College of Arts auditorium. Inaugural programme of the workshop jointly organised by the National Institute of Educational Planning and Administration (NIEPA), New Delhi, and Dhanamanjuri University (DMU) was attended by Indian Council of Social Science Research, Shillong director Prof Bhagirathi Panda as chief guest and DMU vice-chancellor Prof W Chandrabu as functional president while NIEPA Higher and Professional Education head Prof Aarti Drivastava and coordinators Dr Sangeeta Angom and Prof Manilei Serto were the guests of honour.

Addressing the gathering, Prof Chandrabu expressed gratitude to



NIEPA for organising the workshop at the university and announced that sessions would be shifted to Hotel Imphal from the second day for convenience of the delegates.

The programme aims to strengthen leadership skills among institutional heads and reflect on significant transformation in India's higher education sector following the implementation of the National Education Policy 2020, he said.

Pointing out that the policy focuses on improving institutional capacity, academic direction and global collaboration, Prof Chandrabu highlighted the need to align Indian institutions with international standards. He cited examples of global universities generating revenue through allied institutions such as hospitals, factories and hotels, which also provide hands-on training to students. "Such models help strengthen skill devel-

opment and financial sustainability," Prof Chandrabu said, while noting that universities in Manipur largely depend on government funding, which often delays implementation of developmental initiatives. He stressed the need for generating additional resources to undertake innovative projects. Dhanamanjuri University has strong manpower, with more than 430 faculty members against 541 sanctioned posts and over 16,000 enrolled students, making it the largest university in the state in terms of faculty strength and student intake.

He further said that the workshop would deliberate on academic leadership, curriculum reforms, research advancement and strengthening governance and management systems in higher education institutions.

Altogether, 42 principals representing six north eastern states are participating in the five-day programme.

Awareness prog on forest conservation held

IMPHAL: Ishikha Village Development Committee organised a one-day awareness programme on conservation of forests and protection of wildlife, at Ishikha on Sunday.

In his speech as the chief guest, 'Angom Ningthou' Angom Poiraiton said that there is no other way to prevent environmental degradation than conservation of forests. Protecting wildlife including birds will help in insect infestation, he stated, and urged against setting

wildfires and deforestation in the hills.

As per the Manipur State Gazette June 5, 1933 (Sambei Purum Reserved Forest Darbar Resolution 10-A-7 1932-1933), protection of the forests located opposite to the village and conserve the overall environment was mandated.

At the end of the programme, two forest conservation boards inscribed with four resolutions were erected at the location. The resolutions included no poaching or killing of wild birds including migratory

birds from the Protected Hill Area Patlou Chingjin till Ishikha Makha Ching, no felling of trees without reasons, no earth quarrying in the hills and prohibiting any wildfires in the area.

Presided over by Ishikha Village Development Committee president O Khamba Meitei, the programme was attended by NB College lecturer O Nilachandra, Sana Konung 'Sanglakpa' Yumnam Dijen, social workers K Bojendro Meitei and N Phunindro, and Chanura Marup, Ishikha member N Sanahanbi Leima as guests of honour.

Ima Keithel inauguration soon: Hiyanglam MLA

KAKCHING: Hiyanglam MLA Dr Yumnam Radheshyam has announced that the ongoing construction of the first floor of Hiyanglam Wabagai Lamkhai Ima Keithel under Kakching assembly constituency is nearing completion.

Speaking to media persons during assessment of work progress of the Keithel on Sunday, Radheshyam recalled that construction of the market shed commenced in February 2019 and completed in 2022 with expenditure of Rs 4 crore.

He continued that as the Keithel faced space crunch the ground floor was expanded with additional cost of Rs 2 crore,

and completed in 2023. However, in sync with the public's proposal for utilising the first floor, he approached the then chief minister who approved the construction, the work for which got slightly delayed due to non-sanctioning of fund.

Radheshyam maintained that as the first floor construction is nearing completion plans are afoot for its inauguration before the golden jubilee celebration of the Hiyanglam Wabagai Ima Keithel which falls on February 27.

Pointing out that the Keithel has total of 322 vending slots contrary to 440/450 vendors, he confided about setting up a temporary market shed using his MLA Local Area Development Fund.

Sugnu residents welcome CM, seek fair rule

KAKCHING: Residents of four Gram Panchayats under Sugnu assembly constituency expressed happiness over the appointment of Yumnam Khemchand as the chief minister, while also cautioning against favouritism in local governance.

Addressing media persons at Wangoo Laipham community hall, here, on Sunday, representatives from Wan-

goo, Pangantabi, Chairen and Serou Gram Panchayats said the formation of a new BJP-led government had raised hopes of stability following a period of President's Rule in Manipur.

According to one Sanamas Birchandra of Wangoo, people were encouraged that the oath-taking ceremony was followed by assurances to conduct Gram Panchayat elections and improve basic infrastructure, including roads and bridges.

While welcoming the decision to constitute Administrative Committees as an interim arrangement before the issuance of official election notifications, he urged the government to ensure that committee members are selected based on commitment to public service rather than party affiliation or political considerations.

Birchandra also called on the government to take into account the views of residents

before finalising the committees.

He also warned that if favouritism or divisive politics prevail over public interest, more than 5,000 BJP workers across the four Gram Panchayats may reconsider their political stance.

Several former members of Administrative Committees from the four Gram Panchayats under Sugnu Assembly Constituency also attended the press briefing.
