

63 litres of illicit liquor seized in Pipariya ahead of Holi

Narmadapuram: Acting on directives from Superintendent of Police Sai Krishna S. Thota, district police intensified vehicle checking and night patrolling ahead of Holi, leading to a major liquor seizure in Pipariya.

During a late-night patrol, Pipariya police received a tip-off about a dark grey car transporting illicit liquor from Sandia to Pipariya. The vehicle was intercepted near Chaudhary Bear House on Sandia Road. The driver identified himself as Rohit Rai, 32, a resident of Bareilly in Raisen district.

Upon searching the vehicle, police recovered 48 bottles (375 ml each) of whisky and 250 quarters (180 ml each) of country liquor, totalling 63 litres worth approximately Rs 50,000. The car, valued at Rs 2 lakh, was also seized. The accused reportedly admitted he intended to sell the liquor during Holi. A case has been registered, and he was produced before the court. Inspector Girish Tripathi and his team carried out the operation.

PROBE ON | Hostel under scanner Polytechnic student electrocuted

A student of the Government Polytechnic College Nawgong died after suffering an electric shock in the college hostel.

The deceased, Raj Tiwari from Rewa district, was re-

portedly electrocuted on hostel premises. Fellow students rushed him to hospital, but doctors declared him dead.

Police have initiated an inquest, and preliminary findings suggest possible negligence in the hostel's electrical system. Students alleged

that outdated wiring and poor maintenance had long posed risks.

The tragic incident has sparked outrage, with students demanding strict action and urgent safety reforms. Authorities said a detailed investigation is ongoing.

Main accused in fake ‘Sanchi’ ghee racket still absconding

Five days after authorities busted a fake ghee factory in Dodi village of Jawar, the main accused, Gaurav Verma, remains at large, raising questions over administrative action.

Officials seized 792 kg of adulterated ghee branded as Sanchi, along with counterfeit packaging material. The unit was operating from a house owned by Mansingh Sendhav

and has since been sealed.

However, no FIR has been lodged. Food Inspector Kirti Malviya stated that the Act does not provide for filing an FIR, while SDM Nitin Tale said only the Sanchi Milk Union can initiate action as the brand was misused.

With Holi approaching and sampling yet to begin in the district, concerns over food safety are mounting. Residents fear adulterated products may reach markets unchecked.

Consumer panel fines Domino's Rs 8 lakh for serving non-veg food on Diwali

The District Consumer Commission has imposed a penalty of Rs 8 lakh on Domino's Pizza outlet operated by Jubilant FoodWorks in Satna for allegedly serving non-vegetarian food instead of a vegetarian order on Diwali.

The incident occurred on October 31, 2024, when Suraj Tiwari and his wife Nancy Tiwari ordered Korean Paneer Tikka Garlic Bread from the Rewa Road outlet. The couple, lifelong vegetarians, claimed they discovered meat in the dish while dining with family during Diwali celebrations.

They immediately photographed the food and contacted the restaurant but alleged they received no satisfactory response. After sending a legal notice, they filed a complaint with the District Consumer Commission.

The bench, headed by Chairman SC Upadhyay along with members Umesh Giri and Vidya Pandey, directed the company to pay Rs 8 lakh with 9% interest within one month, along with Rs 10,000 as litigation costs.

The company had argued that the photographs were unclear and maintained that separate packaging systems were in place for vegetarian and non-vegetarian items. However, the Commission ruled in favour of the complainants and imposed the penalty.

Police recover burqa from Ahmedabad, 3 at large

Bag Sewania police on Saturday produced the accused Amreen and Chandan Yadav before the court after their police remand ended, following which they were sent to judicial custody. However, the police team reportedly returned empty-handed from Gujarat as no absconding accused could be apprehended. Police also recorded details statement of the victims.

Sub-Inspector Bharat Singh Meena said police searched a rented flat in Ahmedabad's Juhapura area believed to have been used

by members of the racket. During the search, only a burqa was recovered from the premises while other suspects had already fled.

So far, police have arrested only three of the six named accused Amreen, her sister Afreen and associate Chandan Yadav.

Meanwhile, key accused Yasir, Bilal and Chanu who have been accused by victims of sexual assault are still on the run.

Officials said efforts are underway to trace the absconding accused and identify other locations allegedly used by the gang. Investigators suspect the racket had an interstate network.

Metro set for next phase launch after safety review

CMRS junior team completes inspection of 17 km metro stretch between Super Corridor 2 and Malviya Nagar intersection

The Indore Metro project has moved closer to the commencement of operations, as the junior team of the Commissioner of Metro Railway Safety completed its inspection of the corridor. Authorities are now preparing for the final inspection by the CMRS while addressing shortcomings identified during the preliminary review.

Final safety clearance awaited

Managing Director of Madhya Pradesh Metro Rail Corporation Limited S Krishna Chaitanya conducted a two-day on-ground inspection to assess progress and operational preparedness. During the visit, he directed officials to rectify all observations raised by the CMRS team and em-

phasised strict adherence to safety norms.

Once final approval from the CMRS is secured, the 17 km metro stretch between Super Corridor 2 and Malviya Nagar intersection will open for public operations, marking a milestone for the city's urban transport network.

Stations, systems reviewed in detail

The inspection began at Malviya Nagar intersection on Saturday, where stations, approach roads, passenger facilities and technical systems were reviewed. Operational readiness, safety mechanisms and administrative preparedness were also evaluated.

A review meeting with project officials examined the status of key construction packages IN-02, IN-03, IN-04, IN-05R and IN-07. Officials said the immediate focus is on

rectifying deficiencies flagged by the inspection team before the final CMRS clearance.

The Managing Director instructed teams to expedite pending works, ensure adequate manpower at construction sites, strengthen monitoring mechanisms and maintain coordination with contractors to avoid delays.

Bhopal Metro faces delay

Meanwhile, the Bhopal Metro project is facing delays. The Automatic Fare Collection system remains non-functional at eight stations, even a month after installation began, affecting its readiness for commercial services.

With the final safety clearance pending, the CMRS approval will determine the official launch timeline of Indore Metro's first operational stretch.

Youth arrested for vandalising cars in inebriated state

Indore: A youth was arrested for allegedly vandalising two parked cars while in an inebriated state under Chandan Nagar police station limits, police said on Sunday.

According to police, Kapil Dharva, a resident of Ramnand Nagar, lodged a complaint stating that Neeraj Prajapat arrived in an intoxicated condition and began abusing him. When Dharva objected, Prajapat allegedly assaulted him, picked up a stone and threw it at his car, shattering the rear windscreen. He then allegedly threw another stone, which struck a nearby car belonging to Deepak Tanwar. Chandan Nagar police station in-charge Tilak Karole said police have arrested the suspect, who allegedly committed the offence under the influence of liquor. "We will take preventive action against him as well," Karole said. Earlier, on Feb 24, three bike-borne miscreants smashed the windows of more than a dozen vehicles across the Chhatrapati, Aerodrome and Chandan Nagar areas. The accused in that case had also targeted vehicles in Ramnand Nagar, where the present incident occurred.

Self-service at MYH?

Video from hospital shows relatives moving patients on stretcher, wheelchair

A fresh video linked to the city's government-run Maharaja Yeshwantrao Hospital has surfaced, showing two separate incidents in which patients were moved by their relatives inside the hospital premises.

In the video, family members are seen pushing a patient on a stretcher within the campus. In another sequence, relatives are seen bringing a patient on a wheelchair towards the casualty department. Both the stretcher and wheelchair appear to belong to the government hospital.

Earlier viral video sparks queries

Around 13 days ago, another video from MY Hospital went viral on social media. In that clip, two women were seen pushing a patient on a wheeled stretcher across a busy road near the Government Dental College towards the hospital. The hospital's main gate was reportedly closed at the time, forcing the women, believed to be the patient's relatives, to cross traffic and move towards another gate. The one-minute-and-21-second video triggered concerns about patient safety and hospital access management.

The development comes days after another video from the same hospital went viral, raising concerns over patient handling and management. However, officials said no formal complaint has been

lodged in the latest case so far.

Hospital clarification

Hospital Superintendent Dr Ashok Yadav said the matter had come to his notice and

that the video was recorded on Saturday. "In the first clip, the patient on the stretcher was being brought by relatives from the OPD towards the casualty ward. As soon as the hospital ward boy noticed this, he reached the spot and assisted in taking the patient inside," he said.

Regarding the second clip, Dr Yadav said an ambulance had dropped the patient near the hospital gate. "The relatives were moving the patient on a wheelchair towards casualty. Hospital staff intervened and ensured that the patient was taken inside for treatment," he added.

Labourer killed after rooftop wall collapses during demolition

Indore: A 45-year-old labourer died after being buried under debris while demolishing a roof-top structure with a jackhammer in the Badi Bhamori area under Vijay Nagar police station limits on Saturday. He was rushed to Maharaja Yeshwantrao Hospital, where doctors declared him dead on arrival. Police identified the deceased as Hariom Singh, a resident of Kulkarni Ka Bhatta. His colleagues told police that he was working with them to dismantle the upper floors of a house. After demolishing one structure, the others began clearing debris while Singh started breaking a second structure using the machine.
