Granting relief to the manager who had sought parity with the officer, the high court had reduced his punishment from termination of job to compulsory retirement.

"Slight cannot be lost of the fact that the respondent, when he committed the offence, was holding the post of 'Senior Manager in MMSGS-III Scale', which is obviously much higher than the co-delinquents (officer and gun-

man). Authority carries accountability; higher the authority, higher the accountability. The rank of the respondent was not merely titular; it carried with it an increased degree of responsibility and integrity. The role of the respondent not only necessitated personal observation but also supervision of the actions of the subordinates. The co-delinquents, having limited powers and authority, could not have much higher than the co-delinquents (officer and gun-

"The gravity of the misconduct necessarily had to be measured with the nature of the misconduct. Thus, grant of the benefit of parity to the respondent by the High Court merely because the co-delinquents were given lighter punishment was entirely misconceived. The difference in rank coupled with the increased trust of the employer on the respondent certainly constituted a compelling ground for a more stringent punishment to be imposed on him," it said.

He Was Lodged In Prison Since Dec 3 Last Year

Prayagraj: Allahabad high court has ordered the immediate release of a man sentenced to 22 months in civil prison by the family court in Jhansi for failing to pay maintenance to his wife.

Tahir alias Babloo has been lodged in the jail since Dec 3, 2025. Granting him relief in an order passed on April 2, Justice Praveen Kumar Giri of the Allahabad high court said there was no requirement for Tahir to furnish a bail bond or sureties as he was confined in civil prison, a facility where individuals are incarcerated for civil matters rather than criminal offences.

Tahir's wife filed an application seeking recovery of Rs 2,64,000 in unpaid maintenance for 22 months from Nov 2023 to Sept 2025. Subsequently, Tahir was arrested by the police and presented before the court, where he expressed inability to pay the amount, citing his poor financial condition. He prayed for the minimum possible sentence.

However, the family court sentenced him to a 22-month prison term — one month for each month of default. Tahir challenged the ruling in the high court. His counsel submitted that as per section 125(3) of the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPc), if a person fails to make a payment without sufficient cause, the court

Court seeks arms licence data from UP govt

Prayagraj: Expressing concern over display of firearms on social media platforms, Allahabad high court has sought data on arms licences in UP, saying they are being misused to project power and influence. Highlighting the dangers of unregulated firearms, Justice Vinod Dixit noted that individuals with political ambitions are misusing licensed weapons to assert authority, cultivate a dominant image, and indirectly intimidate others, thereby fostering an atmosphere of fear. The court observed that this behaviour is used to seek attention, gain social validation, and reinforce identity through the amplification of gun culture. Such misuse contributes to a culture of fear rather than adherence to the rule of law. It undermines public confidence in legal institutions and normalises violence within society," the HC remarked in its March 23 order.

30-year-old woman immolates self, hubby dies trying to save her

Meerut: A couple from Rahmapur village under Dibal police station limits in Bulandshahr died after sustaining severe burn injuries following a domestic dispute on Wednesday night.

Rinku Singh (35), who worked as a labourer at a factory in Delhi, allegedly had an argument with his wife, Ruby Devi (30). "Rinku returned from Delhi three days ago to visit his ailing mother. An argument occurred between them after Rinku learned that Ruby skipped his mother's medicine," said SHO Vishal Pratap Chauhan.

Following the altercation, Ruby allegedly poured kerosene on herself and set herself on fire inside a room on the first floor of their house. Seeing her engulfed in flames, Rinku rushed to save her but sustained critical burn injuries in the process.

Hearing the commotion, local residents rushed to the spot and took both of them to a nearby Community Health Centre. They were later referred to All India Institute of Medical Sciences for treatment. The couple is survived by their four children — three daughters and a son, all below 10 years. The bodies have been sent for postmortem examination, and further investigation is underway. As of now, the children are staying with relatives, but their fate is uncertain.

2 drivers charred to death as dumpers collide & catch fire

Agra: Two drivers were charred to death after their vehicles collided head-on and caught fire on the Tundla-Etawah road in Uttar Pradesh's Firozabad district around 4 pm on Friday afternoon.

A sand-laden dumper was heading from Firozabad's Tundla towards Etah when it collided head-on with another dumper coming from the opposite direction. The impact triggered an explosion in the diesel tanks, engulfing both vehicles in flames within minutes. The incident occurred on the Etah border under Rajawala police station.

The drivers, Surendra Singh (39) of Morera, Madhya Pradesh and Bharat Lal (35) from Dholpur in Rajasthan, got trapped inside their cabins and could not escape. Two boys were rescued by the locals and police.
