

MINOR'S RAPE IN SHEOPUR | SP directed SDOP to probe accusations

Victim accuses cops of shielding culprits

A minor was abducted at gunpoint, dragged to a hotel, administered sedatives and raped for several days in Sheopur, as reported on Thursday. According to information, the crime occurred in Sheopur and came to light after her father lodged a complaint with police.

As soon as informed, a team from Vijaypur Police Station located and rescued the victim from a hotel.

However, the case has now taken a new turn when the

Gwalior: Police arrested a man, Vicky Jatav, for allegedly raping a 37-year-old woman after befriending her on Facebook a year ago. The accused reportedly lured the victim to a hotel under the false pretext of marriage.

The exploitation continued until the man eventually refused to marry her and issued death threats. Following the victim's complaint, police apprehended him in Morena.

minor girl and her father filed a complaint with SP Sudhir Kumar Agarwal.

They alleged that the Vijaypur station in-charge and a female constable conspired to shield the accused, failed to conduct a medical examination of the victim, and attempted to

frame them in a false case.

The victim alleges that the accused - identified as Surendra Gurjar, abducted her at gunpoint and, over the course of 2 days, administered intoxicants to her while repeatedly raping her.

She further claimed that the

Station In-charge and the female constable pressured her not to undergo a medical examination, to alter her statement in court, and threatened to implicate her father in a false case.

Succumbing to this pressure, the victim initially provided false statements in court. However, as the matter gained momentum, SP Sudhir Kumar Agarwal directed SDOP Ravhendra Singh Tomar to conduct an investigation and assured strict action would be taken against those found guilty.

Youth shot dead

A youth was shot dead by unidentified miscreants in the Chambal ravines under Ater police station limits, triggering panic in the area. The victim, Nitesh Jatav of Khirika village, was returning home with his wife after shopping in Bhind. Near Ramta village, he stopped to pick up fallen luggage when bike-borne assailants shot him in the head at close range and fled. He died on the spot.

The incident occurred in front of his wife, who is in shock. Police reached the spot and sent the body for post-mortem. SDOP Ravindra Vas-kale said a murder case has been registered against unknown suspects and a search is underway. Police suspect prior enmity.

Forest guard's murder sparks crackdown on sand mafia

The police have registered a case after a forest guard was crushed to death by a tractor team, operated by a driver and two unknown accomplices. Authorities are searching for the driver, his companions, and the tractor trolley owner, reportedly a resident of Kuthiyana under Ambah police station area.

Following the incident, the forest department intensified action along the Chambal river banks. Operations are underway at half a dozen ghats in the National Chambal Gharial Sanctuary, where sand is being removed with JCB machines. Locals, however, have termed the department's efforts as



merely a formality.

The police have seized the tractor trolley involved as investigations continue.

In addition, police and district administration have launched a strict crackdown on sand mafia operations. A joint team from Devgarh police station, forest department, and the district mining department conducted raids at Barhana, Nandpur, Khulawali, and canal banks, identifying and

destroying illegally dumped Chambal sand.

Around 200 trolleys of sand were demolished by mixing soil using bulldozers. Over 100 police personnel were deployed for the operation. The team razed the sand islands illegally created on the Chambal riverbanks. Officials estimate the destroyed sand to be worth around Rs 4 lakh.

At Holapura Ratanvasai Ghat, near the Chambal River in Ambah, illegal mining routes were closed with JCBs, and roadside sand dumps were mixed with soil.

Notably, an on-duty forest guard was run over and killed after a tractor-trolley driver, allegedly transporting sand illegally, hit him and fled the scene.

45YO woman shot at tailoring centre

A 45-year-old woman was allegedly shot by a bike-borne attacker due to an old rivalry at a tailoring centre in Bhind on Thursday.

The incident took place in the Bhimnagar area on Thursday. The injured woman, Neelam Jatav, was later referred to Gwalior for better treatment.

Just hours earlier, another man was shot dead in the Ater area.

According to police, Neelam Jatav was sitting at her tailoring centre in Bhimnagar when a man arrived on a motorcycle and suddenly opened fire with a country-made pistol. Before she could react, one bullet hit her in the stomach. The attacker, identified as Majnu Ojha, quickly fled the spot on his bike.

After the incident, local people rushed Neelam to the hospital. Police reached the spot soon after receiving in-

formation and recorded her statement at the district hospital. In her statement, the woman identified the attacker as Majnu Ojha and said the attack was due to an old rivalry.

Doctors said the bullet is still stuck in her stomach and her condition remains serious. Due to her critical condition, she was referred to Gwalior for better medical care. Kotwali police have registered a case and started searching for the accused.

Just about 16 hours before this incident, another shooting took place in the Ater police station area. In Khirika village, a young man named Nilesh Jatav was shot dead by unknown attackers.

Nilesh was returning from Bhind with his wife Ruby after shopping when bike-borne criminals opened fire on him in the Chambal ravines. He died on the spot.

Police have conducted the post-mortem and started an investigation.

Police seize hydroponic OG cannabis

Gwalior: In a first for the region, Kampoo police seized OG-grade cannabis grown using hydroponic technology during a routine checking drive on Tuesday. The cannabis, cultivated in water without soil, is considered highly expensive in the international market.

Acting on a tip-off about a drug consignment, police set up a checkpoint near Avadpura Poultry Farm at Kansar Pahadiya. Two youths on a bike attempted to flee but were caught after a cordon was laid.

The accused have been identified as Gaurav Kushwaha and Hemant alias Saarthak. Authorities recovered approximately 1 kg and 438 grams of cannabis, including a quantity of hydroponic OG cannabis. A case has been registered under the NDPS Act. Interrogation is underway to determine the source of the cannabis and its intended supply chain.

Congress stages sit-in over crop damage

Demands farmer compensation

Bhind: The District Congress Committee held a sit-in protest at the old Galla Mandi Gate at Etawah Road on Thursday, condemning widespread crop damage caused by recent hailstorms and untimely rain. Farmers in the district are facing severe losses to wheat, mustard, and other standing crops, protesters said.

Led by District Congress President Dharmendra Singh Bhadouria and Nagar Congress President Santosh Tripathi, party workers accused the

administration of negligence, saying flattened crops now face spoilage risks, wiping out farmers' year-long labour.

Tripathi noted that frequent changes to wheat procurement dates and chaotic conditions at purchase centres are adding to farmers' distress, with traders allegedly exploiting the situation to buy produce at low prices.<The Congress demanded immediate surveys of crop damage, prompt wheat procurement with relaxed moisture norms, a moratorium on KCC and agricultural loan recoveries, and compensation of Rs 50,000 per hectare for affected farmers.

New GDCA team announced

Gwalior: In a significant leadership reshuffle, the Gwalior Division Cricket Association (GDCA) has announced a new administrative team. Sangram Kadam has been appointed as the association's

new President, succeeding the previous office bearer Prashant Mehta.

Meanwhile, Vijay Prakash Sharma, popularly known as "Bettu," will take over as the Secretary from Sanjay Ahuja.

'PUSHPA-STYLE' SMUGGLING BUSTED

Police seize 20 kg cannabis hidden inside oil tanker

Jabalpur police have busted a "Pushpa-style" drug smuggling attempt and seized around 20 kilograms of cannabis that was cleverly hidden inside an oil tanker on Thursday.

The drugs, estimated to be worth nearly Rs 10 lakh in the international market. Those were recovered during a joint operation by the Crime Branch and Khitola Police Station police.

According to police, the smugglers tried to copy tricks often seen in the movie Pushpa, where illegal goods

are transported in hidden compartments to avoid suspicion.

In this case, the accused used a blue diesel-petrol tanker (MP 18 H 5408), believing that such a vehicle would easily pass routine police checking.

Additional SP (Crime) Jitendra Singh said that on April 8, 2026, the Crime Branch received information from a reliable informer that a tanker carrying a large quantity of narcotics was heading towards Jabalpur from the Shahdol side. Acting on the tip-off, a special team was formed and a checkpoint was set up on Pan

Umariya Road near the electricity office.

Soon after, the suspected tanker arrived and police surrounded it.

During the search, officers found a secret compartment built inside the cabin. Inside it, they recovered a sack containing 20 packets of cannabis.

Three men present in the tanker were immediately detained. The driver, Devaraj Yadav (39) from Rewa district, is believed to be the main accused. The other two accused were identified as Mahendra Kumar Patel (34) from Shahdol district and Vinod Kumar Yadav (34) from Satna district.

MPHCBA complains over posters

Madhya Pradesh High Court Bar Association (MPHCBA) Jabalpur president Dhanya Kumar Jain said we request you (the Chief Justice) to personally take cognizance of this issue and help maintain the sanctity of the court premises.

The complaint pertains to defacement of walls in the High Court premises and all district court across the state with posters and banners by candidates contesting the Madhya Pradesh State Bar Council elections and slogans being raised in court premises, Jain said in the complaint.

They (the contesting candidates) are doing this by pasting large quantities of election campaign materials on walls throughout these locations, he said. Furthermore, some candidates are engaging in slogan-shouting within the court premises during court hours while filing their forms, Jain said.

10 hospitals face possible de-empanelment

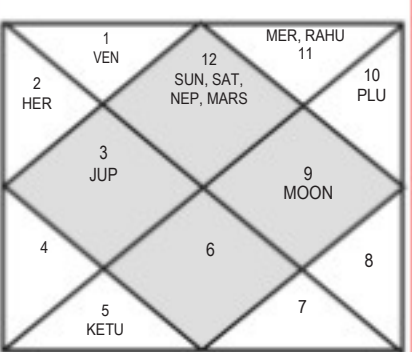
Under the Ayushman Bharat Niramaya scheme in Madhya Pradesh, recognition of 10 private hospitals may be cancelled if they fail to submit valid NABH certification within a 7-day grace period. Authorities warned that free treatment services could be halted for non-compliant facilities. Hospitals with full NABH accreditation will benefit from deemed empanelment, while entry-level certified hospitals will receive 10% higher payments. The new system will also link payments to quality and patient feedback monitoring.
