

Pathanmajra shifted to Bathinda jail from Patiala

Aam Aadmi Party MLA Harmeet Singh Pathanmajra has been shifted from the Central Jail, Patiala, to the Central Jail, Bathinda.
Pathanmajra, MLA from the Sanaur Assembly constituency in Patiala, was recently sent to the Patiala jail after completing 12-day police remand.
He was arrested by the Patiala police from Gwalior (MP) in connection with a case registered against him under Sections 376(2)(N), 420 and 506 of the IPC on the complaint of a woman. Following his arrest, he was remanded in police custody for questioning and was later sent to judicial custody in the Patiala jail, where he was lodged in a separate cell for security reasons.
Yesterday, he was shifted to the Bathinda Central Jail under tight security. A police

team led by a local DSP, along with five other police personnel, escorted him to the Bathinda jail.
Confirming the development, a senior official of the Jail Department said the transfer was carried out for security reasons.
However, members of the MLA's family and his supporters termed the move discriminatory and vindictive. They alleged the transfer to the Bathinda jail was intended to make it difficult for family members and supporters to meet him due to the long distance from Patiala.
In Bathinda, Pathanmajra has been kept in a special barrack under CCTV surveillance along with three convicts, sources say. Since some gangsters are lodged in the Bathinda jail, security arrangements have been heightened.
Sources said he was shifted from Patiala as it was his home district.

₹500-cr project to tame Sutlej tributary, check illegal mining

CHANDIGARH, APRIL 9
To curb rampant illegal mining in the Swan river, a tributary of the Sutlej, the Punjab Water Resources Department has prepared a Rs 500-crore project to channel a 20-km stretch of the river up to the Swan bridge in Nangal subdivision of Rupnagar district.
Education Minister Harjot Singh Bains, who represents the Anandpur Sahib constituency, told *The Tribune* that under the project, the river would be channelled on both sides and water stored by constructing a dam. "It would automatically check illegal mining," he said.
Officials said the Swan project would help in water storage, flood control and restrict access to the riverbed for unauthorised mining.
Bains' statement came a

day after *The Tribune* published a study by the Punjab Engineering College (PEC), Chandigarh, conducted under the directions of the National Green Tribunal (NGT). The study revealed large-scale illegal sand and gravel mining around the Swan bridge, with an estimated 3.41 million cubic metres of material extracted over the past two decades. Bains said

the government was looking in to the NGT report and suitable action would be taken.
The findings, based on satellite imagery and digital elevation models, form a key part of the NGT's ongoing proceedings in a case related to illegal mining in the area. Field verification has also confirmed active mining and crushing operations, corroborating the remote sensing data.

SACRILEGE-RELATED CASES HC shifts Kotkapura FIRs to Chandigarh

The Punjab and Haryana High Court on Thursday transferred to Chandigarh two FIRs registered at a police station in Kotkapura, including a sacrilege-related case registered for murder bid and other offences against former Chief Minister Parkash Singh Badal and others.
The cases were pending before the Faridkot Additional Sessions Judge. Justice Tibhuvan Dahiya passed the order on petitions filed by Moga's former SSP Charanjit Singh Sharma and then Inspector-General of Police, Ludhiana range, Paramraj Singh Umranganal.
The orders came about two years after the trial of a murder case registered at the Bajakhana police station in Faridkot was transferred to Chandigarh. The case at the

Bajakhana police station was registered after two persons were killed in police firing at Behbal Kalan during a protest against sacrilege incidents.
One of the FIRs was registered on August 7, 2018, at the city police station in Kotkapura, Faridkot. The petitioners through advocates Sangram Singh Saron and MB Rajwade, had contended that the HC had already transferred the connected case to Chandigarh on May 31, 2024. The trial court had made a reference regarding the transfer of the pending trial, which remained undecided.
The HC, while hearing the matter last year, had asserted a free and fair trial was integral to Article 21 of the Constitution, forming the cornerstone of criminal jurisprudence. Ensuring fairness in trial required a process untainted by bias, whether for or against the accused or the victim.

ISI-backed BKI terror module busted in Gurdaspur, 2 held

The police on Thursday claimed to have dismantled an ISI-sponsored Babbar Khalsa International (BKI) terror module operating in Gurdaspur district. Two operatives

were arrested and a cache of explosives and IED components seized from them.
A joint operation was conducted by the Amritsar rural police, Gurdaspur police and the State Special Operation Cell (SSOC) in coordination with central agencies.

Those arrested were identified as Akash Masih and Jablaun, both residents of Dulla Nangal village in Gurdaspur. Both have prior criminal record. Punjab DGP Gaurav Yadav said the seizure pointed towards preparations for high-impact terror

attacks to disturb peace and security in the state.
"The seizures included five hand grenades, two special detonators, a push-to-talk (PTT) timer with coder and decoder, a 9V battery, around 1 kg IED material packed with nails, and a

Baofeng walkie-talkie along with cable and trigger mechanism," he said.
Border Range DIG Sandeep Goel said preliminary investigations revealed that the module was being directed by foreign-based handlers linked to Pakistan's ISI.

Ropar MLA serves legal notice on Himachal Govt over entry toll

Ropar AAP MLA Dinesh Chadha has served a legal notice on the Himachal Pradesh Government challenging the imposition of entry toll on vehicles registered outside the state on national highways. The dispute, which has been brewing over allegations of discriminatory taxation, is now poised to enter the judicial arena.
The notice has been addressed to the Himachal Chief Secretary, the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways and the National Highways Authority of India, seeking immediate dismantling of

toll barriers allegedly operating under the Himachal Pradesh Tolls Act, 1975, and the state's 2026-27 toll policy.
Chadha has given a seven-day ultimatum for compliance, failing which he has warned of initiating legal proceedings before the high court or the Supreme Court.
He said national highways fell strictly under the jurisdiction of the Centre as per constitutional provisions. Citing Article 246 of the Constitution, he asserted that any toll imposed by a state on such highways amounted to encroachment upon Parliament's exclusive domain.
Backing his claims, the MLA referred to a recent rul-

ing of the Madras High Court, upheld by the Supreme Court in March 2026, which clarified that only the Centre has the authority to levy toll on national highways. Despite that, the Himachal authorities continue to collect toll, showing wilful disregard for settled law, he said.
A key contention raised in the notice is the alleged discriminatory treatment of vehicles. It claims that Himachal-registered vehicles are exempted, while those from other states, including Punjab, are subjected to toll. This, Chadha argues, violates Article 14 of the Constitution, as the classification lacks reasonable justification.

The Punjab Government has finally been able to capitalise its 26 acre warehousing facility in Navi Mumbai by leasing it out to a private firm for Rs 44.44 crore. For the past many years, the facility was leased out for just Rs 4.50 crore.
The Punjab Infrastructure

Development Board (PIDB) has now awarded a tender to a consortium of three companies for operation and maintenance of the Container Freight Station (CFS) for 15 years (extendable by five years) with a upfront fee of Rs 44.44 crore and annual fixed fee of Rs 19.75 crore, which will be increased every year throughout the lease period.

3 suicides at NIT-Kurukshetra raise alarm over students' mental health

Institute announces key measures to enhance well-being of students

KURUKSHETRA, APRIL 10

The recent spate of student suicides at the NIT-Kurukshetra has sparked serious concerns over the mental health and mounting pressures faced by Gen Z students at one of the country's premier engineering institutions. Three students have taken the extreme step in the past two months, sending shockwaves through the academic community and raising urgent questions about the support systems available on campus.

The victims have been identified as Angoth Shiva (19) from Telangana, who allegedly died by suicide on February 16; Pawan, a third-year B.Tech student from Nuh, who allegedly took his life on March 31; and Priyanshu Verma (22) from Sirsa, who died by hanging on April 8.

Sources indicated that financial distress, including suspected spending on online gambling applications, may have contributed to Pawan's death, while family and financial issues were suspected in Angoth Shiva's case. The exact cause behind

Priyanshu Verma's death is yet to be ascertained.

The incidents have left parents worried. One parent said, "My son is a student of NIT Kurukshetra and we are very much concerned after the three suicides in two months. The students seem to be under a lot of pressure, and the institute must take some

measures to provide a healthy environment to students."

Confirming the developments, SHO KUK Police Station Vishal Kumar said, "Three cases of suicide have been reported from NIT Kurukshetra in the past two months. In the case of Telangana resident, and Pawan, some financial

issues have come to light. An FIR has also been lodged in the suicide case of Pawan. However, since it is a sensitive issue, we are working accordingly. In the case of Priyanshu, the exact reason is yet to be ascertained."

Rattled by the incidents, the institute has initiated several measures to strengthen student support. Dr Tejaswini Ananth Kumar, chairperson of the Board of Governors, interacted with senior authorities, students, faculty and non-teaching staff to seek their views and suggestions.

NIT incharge Public Relations Gian Bhushan said, "The Institute is concerned with well-being of all stake holders, particularly the students who are residing in hostels. The faculty has been directed to increase interaction with the students to know about their feelings and resolve their issues. The teachers have been told to start the mentoring, and every teacher will be assigned a group of 20-25 students so that they can get to know more about them. They will identify the students who need counselling

and further steps will be taken to help them accordingly."

Additional initiatives include appointing section-wise faculty coordinators, organising hostel-wise stress management and sports activities, enhancing surveillance through installation of CCTVs and grills, and closing vulnerable locations. Floor-level student committees have also been constituted to foster peer engagement. An alumnus has offered support by connecting students with expert counsellors and related agencies.

Highlighting broader concerns, Akshay Mahla, state president of the Students' Federation of India, said, "Rising academic pressure, uncertainty over employment and a lack of bonding between the students have become a major concern. The students are confined to their rooms and their mobiles are their only means of interaction and entertainment. The institutions must focus on ensuring participation of every student in different cultural and sports activities, and provide platforms to express their feelings."

PGIMS tightens rules on generic medicines; two docs face action

Action follows Arti Singh Rao's surprise inspection

Six days after Health Minister Arti Singh Rao conducted a surprise inspection at the PGIMS here, the institute has suspended one doctor from the Department of Medicine and issued a warning to a senior faculty member from the same department for failing to comply with directives related to the prescription of medicines and maintenance of sanitation standards.

In a separate action, a General Duty Medical Officer (GDMO) posted at the Trauma Centre has also been placed under suspension for allegedly uploading posts on social media critical of the PGIMS administration.

Confirming the development, PGIMS Director Dr SK Singhal said the measures were aimed at strengthening the system and improving the institute's functioning. He acknowledged that the action followed the Health Minister's recent visit, during which she flagged several concerns, including a shortage of medicines,

inadequate manpower at blood sample collection centres, and insanitary conditions in toilets and other parts of the campus.

During the inspection, the Minister ordered the formation of a committee to investigate the shortage of medicines after a patient complained about the non-availability of prescribed drugs. Officials informed her that more than 200 varieties of medicines were available at the institute, but she expressed concern, noting that the government provides 540 varieties and questioned the limited availability at the premier institution.

Sources indicated that some doctors were prescribing medicines not available in PGIMS stock, forcing patients to purchase them from private pharmacies. "Following the inspection, the Health Department too wrote to PGIMS authorities asking them to address the issues flagged during the visit. Subsequently, the institute administration initiated disciplinary action against those found

responsible," sources said. Meanwhile, the PGIMS Director issued a warning to all doctors against prescribing branded medicines. A communiqué to all Heads of Departments said: "It has been observed that doctors of various departments are prescribing branded medicines, which is contrary to instructions to prescribe generic medicines. Despite repeated circulars, some doctors continue to violate these directions. This issue was viewed seriously by the Health Minister during her recent visit to the OPD."

He further directed that all doctors must prescribe medicines available at the Central Dispensary and, if additional drugs are required, only their generic names should be written on OPD slips. He warned that disciplinary action would be taken against those violating the instructions.

Separately, Dr HK Aggarwal, Vice-Chancellor, University of Health Sciences, conducted a surprise inspection of various branches on Friday and reviewed the sanitation conditions across the campus.

Top cops meet ahead of protest call by kisan morcha

CHANDIGARH, APRIL 10

The Haryana Police have made extensive arrangements to maintain law and

order across the state in view of the Sanyukt Kisan Morcha's call for a protest on April 11. A high-level

meeting was held under the chairmanship of DGP Ajay Singhal in this regard.

Singhal said the possibility of anti-social elements attempting to disrupt law and order during the proposed blockade by farmer organisations could not be ruled out. Hence, it was essential to formulate an effective strategy to control any untoward situation, he said. —TNS

Rampal out of jail after over 11 yrs

Engineer-turned-self-styled 'godman' Rampal on Friday walked out of the Central Jail No. 2 here after over 11 years, following the granting of bail by the Punjab and Haryana High Court in a case on April 8.

Two of his aides, Manoj and Babita, were also released on bail. Manoj was granted bail in 2016 while Babita got bail in 2021. However, they did not avail of the bail, reportedly to be in Rampal's company. They also furnished the bail bonds, along with Rampal, to pave the way for their exit from the jail.

Rampal's family and lawyers arrived at the jail to receive him this afternoon, and left for Dhanana in Sonapat district. The police made elaborate arrangements and put up barricades to maintain law and order.

Rampal's lawyer submitted jail bonds of Rs 1 lakh each for the three of them.

CM defends suspension of IAS officers in bank scams

Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini on Friday invoked Prime Minister Narendra Modi while defending the suspension of two IAS officers in connection with two major banking frauds — the Rs 590-crore IDFC First and AU Small Finance Bank scam, and the Rs 150-crore Kotak Mahindra Bank scam.

Saini reiterated the state government's commitment to accountability and transparency, asserting that strict action had been taken in line with its anti-corruption stance.

"The state government has a zero tolerance against corruption," he said. "We are answerable towards people of the state. It is the hard-earned money of the Haryana people." Emphasising the govern-



ment's governance approach, he said, "We keep informing people about the steps taken for the state. This government runs on the tradition set up by PM Modi. This state has to be taken forward."

Addressing the media, the Chief Minister said a major fraud had occurred involving IDFC First Bank and AU Small Finance Bank. "But we got our money in 24 hours. Then scam in Kotak Mahindra Bank took place. They have also returned the

money," he claimed.

However, in the Kotak Mahindra Bank case, the bank has so far reimbursed only Rs 127 crore, representing the principal amount.

To probe the lapses, the state government constituted a committee under the Principal Secretary to the Chief Minister and Additional Chief Secretary (Finance), Arun Kumar Gupta. The committee has since submitted its report to the government.

During Wednesday's administrative reshuffle, the government withdrew key departmental responsibilities from several IAS officers who had previously headed the departments where the irregularities occurred. However, only two officers — Pardeep Kumar and Ram Kumar Singh — were placed under suspension.

Thikri Pehra panel faces 'threat' from mining mafia

YAMUNANAGAR, APRIL 10

A sarpanch and members of the Thikri Pehra Committee—a village-level vigilance committee formed to check illegal mining—have been facing serious threats reportedly from the mining mafia.
