

Amit Jogi gets life sentence for NCP leader's murder

THE CHHATTISGARH High Court has sentenced Amit Jogi, son of Chhattisgarh's first chief minister Ajit Jogi, to life imprisonment for the 2003 murder of Ram Avtar Jaggi, a treasurer for the NCP.

Last week, the HC overturned a trial court's acquittal of Amit Jogi in the case. The trial court had convicted all the accused, except for Jogi.

On Monday, Amit Jogi moved the Supreme Court against the HC order. The top court has listed the matter for hearing on April 20.

On April 2, the HC's Division Bench of Chief Justice Ramesh Sinha and Justice Arvind Kumar Verma said, "...we are of the considered opinion that the judgment passed by the learned trial Judge acquitting the accused Amit Jogi is palpably illegal, wrong, perverse, contrary to the evidence available on record and without any concrete basis."

On June 4, 2003, Jaggi was shot dead when he was returning from a meeting over a political rally for NCP. Police had in-



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Initially arrested five persons, including Amit Jogi, were sentenced to life imprisonment for the killing of Ram Avtar Jaggi.

In 2004, the case was handed over to the CBI, which filed a supplementary charge sheet against Amit Jogi and five other accused, including the first chief minister Ajit Jogi, for the murder of Ram Avtar Jaggi.

While initially, the case was handled by the local police, it was later transferred to the CBI. The CBI alleged that the murder of Ram Avtar Jaggi was part of a larger conspiracy involving several NCP leaders.
