Blast outside BSF Hqrs sparks panic, 2 detained

Package on delivery boy’s scooter blows up, vehicle goes up in flames

A DELIVERY package kept in scooter parked outside the Border Security Force (BSF) headquarters in Jalandhar “blew up” leading the vehicle to burst into flames late on Tuesday, prompting an immediate response from authorities who cordoned off the area and detained two persons for questioning. Police Commissioner Dhanpreet Kaur said that the incident took place around 8 pm. The two wheeler — a Honda Activa — belonged to a delivery boy, identified Gurpreet Singh, a resident of Garha in Jalandhar. “Gurpreet and one more persons has been taken into custody for preliminary investigation,” she said. According to the police Gurpreet had come to deliver a parcel at the BSF headquarters complex. As he was reportedly

not allowed entry into the premises for not wearing a helmet, he parked his scooter outside and proceeded on foot. The blast took place while he was returning and was around 50 to 60 metres away from the parked scooter. The explosion was so powerful that it was heard about a kilometre away. Gurpreet’s father Kashmiri Singh, a retired BSF personnel, said his son had been working as a delivery boy with an e-commerce giant for the past 2-3 months. He told the media that his son called him shortly after the incident, informing him that his scooter had caught fire following an explosion and that the police had taken him into custody. “He is my only son and regularly goes to the BSF headquarters to deliver parcels. I do not know what exactly happened or how the explosion took place,” he said. Kashmiri Singh added that

he has been trying to contact police officers to speak to his son, but has not been allowed to do so so far. “I am completely in the dark about the situation,” he said. Meanwhile, police cordoned off the area. A forensic team, a dog squad and a bomb squad have also arrived at the spot. Officials said it was too early to draw conclusions and that the exact cause and nature of the blast would become clear only after a detailed investigation. Reacting to the incident, senior Congress leader Sukhjinder Singh Randhawa said that the ongoing tussle between the Centre and the state government was affecting peace in Punjab. He said an explosion near a highly sensitive installation raised serious questions over intelligence gathering and security arrangements. Leader of Opposition, Parth Singh Bajwa, said “The explosion... points to serious lapses in safety and vigilance. The government must stop reacting after the fact and start

taking proactive, visible steps to secure lives and restore public confidence”. Punjab Congress chief Amrinder Singh Raja Warring claimed that an “explosion” near the BSF headquarters in Jalandhar is deeply alarming. In an X post, he said, “A blast in a delivery scooter in a crowded area exposes a serious collapse of law and order. Punjab is a sensitive border state; such incidents raise grave national security concerns. Yet, while the AAP-led Punjab government is busy parading its MLAs before the President, the BJP-led Centre is equally distracted and failing in its responsibility to ensure security. People deserve safety, not political theatre.” Shiromani Akali Dal leader Birkam Singh Majithia asked if law and order in a border state has collapsed. “From the Shambhu railway track to the busy BSF Chowk in Jalandhar, continuous blasts within a week -- has Punjab’s security completely failed?” he asked.

Ludhiana becomes third Punjab city to adopt AI-driven intelligent traffic management system: DGP

LUDHIANA BECAME the third city in Punjab, after Jalandhar and Mohali, to implement the Intelligent Traffic Management System (ITMS), Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav Tuesday said as he inaugurated the futuristic Integrated Command and Control Centre (ICCC). Yadav said that under the ICCC project as many as 1,700 high-resolution cameras have been installed at 259 locations to strengthen the city’s surveillance grid. The ITMS, which has been installed at 46 locations across the city, can detect upto nine traffic violations including red light violation, stop line violation, driving without helmet, pillion rider without helmet, triple riding, overspeeding, zebra crossing violation, wrong side driving and wrong parking. By integrating Traffic, PCR, Safe City, District Control Rooms, and Wireless units, the ICCC ensures a lightning-fast response to any crisis. Key highlights of the technological rollout include Artificial Intelligence (AI)-driven enforcement, said Ludhiana Police in a statement. The ITMS is now live across 46 locations, capable of automatically detecting 9 types of traffic violations. Another feature is life-saving infrastructure: A dedicated Green Corridor provision has been established to ensure the unimpeded movement of organ transplant teams and

emergency vehicles. The new system also provides Enhanced Surveillance. An advanced vehicle tracking system is now operational, significantly boosting the department’s ability to detect and intercept suspicious vehicles in real-time. Yadav, who was in Ludhiana, termed the upgraded state-of-the-art ICCC a major step towards preventive policing. “The newly inaugurated ICCC integrates multiple units under one roof, including Traffic, Police Control Room (PCR), Safe City, and Wireless units, which has significantly enhanced synergy and coordination in police working and reduced PCR response time from 15 minutes to just 7/8 minutes,” he said. Speaking to the media, DGP Yadav appealed to the youths to not get lured and commit crimes by falling into the trap of gangsters sitting abroad. “Punjab Police has zero tolerance towards organized crime and gangsters. No matter in which part of the world these criminals are hiding, we will catch them and bring them back to face punishment. Punjab Police’s arms are very long. I strongly appeal to the youths that please don’t get lured by the false promises of these criminals sitting abroad... You commit crime by falling into their trap. Focus on studies and employment... 80-90% extortion and threat calls come out to be fake. I appeal to public to report to police as we take action and register FIR on each and every such complaint,” said the DGP.

28-year-old dies of ‘drug overdose’ sparks fresh anger in Kapurthala

THE DEATH of a 28-year-old youth in Punjab’s Kapurthala district has once again brought the human cost of drug abuse into sharp focus, leaving a grieving family and a shaken community searching for answers. Shamsher Singh, a resident of Chakoke village in the Dhillwan area, died under suspicious circumstances, with preliminary inputs pointing towards a possible drug overdose. However, police officials have said that the exact cause of death will only be confirmed after the postmortem report. According to family members, Shamsher had gone out on Monday to work with friends cutting fodder. By evening, he allegedly consumed drugs along with them and suddenly lost consciousness, the family members said. His brother, Akashdeep Singh, claimed that instead of seeking immediate medical help, his friends tried to revive him by slapping him, leaving visible swelling on his face and

eyes. Later, around 8.30 pm, the youth was dropped home in an unconscious state. The family rushed him to a nearby hospital in Subhanpur, but he died on the way. Police reached the spot soon after receiving information and shifted the body to the Civil Hospital mortuary for post-mortem. SHO Dalwinder Singh said investigations are underway and the actual cause of death will be clear only after medical reports. Shamsher’s death is not an isolated incident. In recent weeks, Kapurthala and nearby areas have witnessed multiple suspected drug overdose deaths. Earlier, two youths — both around 30 years old — from Rapur Araian village reportedly died due to overdose on April 9 after relapsing into addiction. The family and police confirmed the drug addiction. In Sultanpur Lodhi, a heart-breaking case emerged where a mother lost her fifth son to drug abuse. In another incident, a family from Ghazipur village lost second sons on April 24 within six months after the death of first son, both allegedly linked to drug addiction. These repeated tragedies have triggered anger among residents, with some even taking matters into their own hands by blocking routes and intercepting suspected drug users and peddlers. Reacting to Shamsher’s death, Bhola Singh (in Kapurthala) MLA Sukhpal Singh Khaira took to social media, alleging a worsening crisis.

Collegium elevates Haryana AG, 9 other advocates as judges for Punjab & Haryana High Court

Fresh appointments to take judges’ strength to 68

THE SUPREME Court Collegium has approved the elevation of 10 advocates as judges of the Punjab and Haryana High Court. Those elevated include Pravindra Singh Chauhan, who is currently the Advocate General of Haryana. The others cleared for elevation are Harmeet Singh Deol, Rajesh Gaur, Minderjeet Yadav, Monica Chhibber Sharma, Puja Chopra, Sunish Bindlish, Navdeep Singh, Divya Sharma and Ravinder Malik. The Collegium made the recommendations in meeting held on Monday (May 4) and communicated through two official resolutions. The high court has a sanctioned strength of 85 judges, comprising 64 permanent judges and 21 additional judges. Currently, the court is operating with 58 judges. The fresh appointments will take the

strength of the high court to 68. The appointments are expected to provide much-needed relief to the court grappling with vacancies and a heavy pendency of cases across Punjab, Haryana and Chandigarh. As per the high court’s virtual justice clock, there is a pendency of over four lakh cases, and the judges take up more than 6,000 cases every day. Pravindra Singh Chauhan has more than 25 years of experience at the Bar and has also served as a member of the Haryana Electricity Regulatory Commission. Rajesh Gaur is an Additional Advocate General of Haryana while Minderjeet Yadav is a former Deputy Advocate General and a former chairman of the Bar Council of Punjab and Haryana. A notable inclusion is senior advocate Navdeep Singh, a retired Army Major with a distinguished practice in constitutional, service and military law,

particularly in matters involving veterans, defence personnel and persons with disabilities. Monica Chhibber Sharma, a senior advocate known for her work as Senior Deputy Advocate General for Punjab in key cases, is among the women advocates cleared for elevation. Puja Chopra, with a long-standing civil and family law practice, and Divya Sharma, who has served as Senior Panel Counsel for the Union Government, are the other women advocates in the list. Senior advocate Sunish Bindlish represented the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs as standing counsel while Harmeet Singh Deol and Ravinder Malik are known for their extensive practice in civil, criminal and commercial litigation. Several of those cleared for elevation were designated senior advocates by the High Court in October last year.

Shooting at house of singer Fazilpuria’s manager: 4 held

Gurugram: Four people were arrested in connection with firing at the house of singer Rahul Fazilpuria’s event organiser Saurabh Yadav in Kanhai Village in Sector 45, police said on Tuesday. The accused had allegedly provided bikes and weapons to the shooters, who are still at large, they said. On Saturday night, two shooters, belonging to gangster Deepak Nandal, opened fire at the home of Yadav, Fazilpuria’s event organiser, in Kanhai Village, and fled on a motorcycle they had ridden to the house on. Constable Kulbir, deployed for Yadav’s security, received two bullet wounds. A crime unit from Sector 40 Police Station, where a case was lodged, arrested four men from Gurugram on Monday night and Tuesday. They were identified as Ashok alias Pahalwan, 35, and Manoj Kabir, 46, both residents of Rohtak, and Sumit and Vicky, aged 33 and 36, residents of Sonipat in Haryana. PTI
