Ex-AAP MPs Pathak, Gupta get HC relief

CHANDIGARH: The Punjab and Haryana high court on Friday granted interim protection to Rajya Sabha MP Sandeep Pathak and relief to MP Rajinder Gupta's company Trident, directing the Punjab Pollution Control Board (PPCB) not to take coercive action against the company's Baranala unit without giving it 30 days to rectify any deficiencies.

In a separate plea filed by Pathak, the court directed that no coercive steps be taken against him without its permission till Monday. In response to this, the Punjab government on Friday assured the HC that no coercive steps would be taken against Pathak, without its prior permission.

Pathak had approached the court seeking details of purported FIRs registered against him in Punjab, while the state's counsel maintained it had no information regarding any such FIRs.

A bench of chief justice Sheel Nagaria and justice Jyoti Singh passed the directions while hearing petitions related to Trident Group. Gupta is the Chairman Emeritus of the company. He is one of those MPs who recently quit the AAP and joined the BJP.

Disposing of a plea by Trident managing director Deepak Nanda, the court held that the company had failed to demonstrate any emergent environmental threat or the presence of poisonous effluents at the Baranala unit.

The court said that in the absence of any immediate environmental crisis, the company should be given a reasonable opportunity to rectify "minor deficiencies" before any closure or coercive action is initiated.

The bench also granted liberty to the petitioner company to approach the National Green Tribunal in case any coercive steps are taken by the PPCB.

The bench also directed the Punjab government to ensure security for Gupta and his family after he challenged the withdrawal of his Punjab Police security cover.

The dispute stems from a PPCB raid at Trident's Baranala unit on April 30, days after Gupta resigned from the AAP and joined the BJP.

CJI Kant recalls why he never joined district judicial service

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Friday witnessed a rare personal moment from Chief Justice of India Surya Kant, who recounted how a senior high court judge once dissuaded him from joining the judicial service at the very start of his career, telling him that "the Bar is waiting for you."

The anecdote unfolded during the hearing of a plea filed by advocate Prerna Gupta, an Advocate-on-Record (AoR) in the Supreme Court, who sought re-evaluation of a paper in the Delhi Judicial Services Commission.

The bench, led by the CJI also comprising Justice Jyoti Singh, asked her "Then why didn't you go to become a judicial officer?"

The petitioner responded that she intended to appear for the judicial services interview and called for the future but had not yet attained the minimum age of 35.

Justice Kant recalled that when he was in the final year of law school, students were permitted to opt for judicial services or to continue with their studies.

SC NUDGES BAR BODY TO CREATE A PERMANENT WOMAN VP POST

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Friday pushed for deeper structural reforms within the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA), urging the lawyers' body to consider creating a permanent vice-president post exclusively for women 2027 onwards, even as it directed that the post of secretary remain reserved for women in the SCBA elections.

A bench comprising Chief Justice of India Surya Kant and Justice KV Viswanath said the proposed reform could eventually pave the way for the SCBA to have its first woman president.

Letting the General Body Meeting of SCBA be convened where the desirability of creation of one more post of Vice President be considered, the bench said that the reform should be more explicitly earmarked for women from 2027-28 onwards.

1 YR AFTER ARREST, RAPE ACCUSED OUT ON BAIL KILLS VICTIM

BHOPAL: A 26-year-old rape accused was arrested on Friday in Madhya Pradesh's Raisen district for allegedly killing the minor victim after being released on bail, police said.

The accused, Mansi Ahirwar, resident of Bhalpur in Sehore district, had been pressuring the 17-year-old girl to withdraw her complaint and marry him as his second wife, said officials.

According to police officers, Ahirwar had lured the girl with promises of a better life and later raped her.

"Preliminary investigation revealed that Ahirwar, already married, had lured the girl with promises of a better life and later raped her. The victim was rescued by police and subsequently a complaint of rape and abduction under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act was filed a year ago. Ahirwar was arrested but released on bail two months ago," said Sheela Surana, sub-judicial officer of police (SDPO).

"On Thursday, he reached the victim's home and again tried to force her to withdraw the case and marry him. When the girl and her mother resisted, he attacked them. The girl died on the spot, while her mother sustained injuries and was rushed to hospital," Surana added.

Police said the accused was arrested from Bhopal on Friday. A case has been registered in the matter under Sections 103 (murder) and 109 (attempt to murder) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), said police, adding that further investigation is underway.
