arrested while accepting a bribe of Rs 13 lakh and a mobile phone on their behalf, the spokesperson said. “The bribe amount and mobile phone were recovered during the trap proceedings,” the statement read. Raghav, Vikas and Rana ran away after being alerted by their gunmen stationed there to keep a watch.

The CBI team began a hot pursuit and after a dramatic chase nabbed Raghav, Vikas and apprehended their two gunmen near Ambala on the Punjab-Haryana border, the spokesperson said. “Rana is still absconding and efforts are being made to arrest him,” the spokesperson added.

“The wider conspiracy, including possible illegal gratification nexus and the role of other persons, is under investigation. The accused private persons were given police gunmen officially. The role and attachment of these gunmen carrying AK-47 rifles with the private accused persons is also being examined,” the spokesperson said.

Will fully cooperate with CBI: Punjab vigilance

The state vigilance bureau, on its part, said it will cooperate fully with the central agency if the name of anyone from the bureau comes up. “If the name of anyone from the bureau arises, we will cooperate fully with the CBI and let the law take its course,” the spokesperson said. Replying to a question about his reader, VB chief Chau-

han said: “I have no idea. How do I know? You have to ask the investigation agency. We will cooperate fully with the investigative agency.” Chauhan, the 1994-batch IPS officer and one of the contenders for the post of director general of police, on Tuesday attended the Mohali office on Tuesday.

Earlier, the three accused were produced in a special CBI court around 4 pm. A counsel from the legal aid had to be appointed for the trio owing to the ongoing lawyers’ strike at the district courts complex. The CBI lawyer said through WhatsApp chats it had been established that the two were running a nexus with Rana. “To identify the extent of the nexus and who all are involved, the interrogation of the accused was necessary,” he said. The defence counsel argued that a non-arrest warrant or FIR has been prepared, the CBI maintained that all documents along with the grounds for arrest have been provided.

Woman refusing to relocate for husband not cruelty: Top court

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Tuesday ruled that a woman’s refusal to sacrifice her professional career and relocate with her husband cannot amount to cruelty or desertion warranting divorce, delivering a strong rebuke to what it described as “archaic”, “ultraconservative” and “feudalistic” notions of marriage.

Setting aside adverse findings recorded by the Gujarat family court and affirmed by the Gujarat High Court against a woman dentist, a bench of justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta underlined that marriage does not extinguish a woman’s autonomy or individuality.

“A well-educated and professionally qualified woman cannot be expected to be confined within the rigid boundaries of matrimonial obligations alone. Marriage does not eclipse her individuality, nor does it subjugate her identity under that of her spouse. It is for both the husband and the wife to balance their marital ties in a manner that respects mutual aspirations, and not for one to unilaterally dictate the life choices of the other,” the bench observed.

The court said the expectation that a wife must abandon her career and unquestioningly

accompany her husband whenever he is posted reflects a “regressive and feudalistic mindset” that has no place in contemporary constitutional society.

“The expectation that a woman must invariably sacrifice her career and conform to traditional notions of an obedient wife meant for cohabitation, irrespective of her own aspirations or the welfare of the child, reflects a line of reasoning that is archaic, ultraconservative, and cannot be countenanced in the present-day scenario when women are leading various professional fields from the forefront,” the bench observed.

It added that a woman can no longer be treated as a mere appendage to the household of the husband, and that her independent intellectual and professional identity and aspirations must receive due credence and respect.

The ruling came in an appeal filed by a woman dentist challenging a 2024 Gujarat High Court judgment that upheld dissolution of her marriage with an army officer on grounds of cruelty and desertion after she chose not to relocate to Kargil during his posting there and instead chose to stay with her parents in Ahmedabad to provide for better medical care to their daughter and establish her dental clinic.

SC forms panel to prepare roadmap for judicial infra

NEW DELHI: Chief Justice of India (CJI) Surya Kant has constituted a “Judicial Infrastructure Advisory Committee” to prepare a comprehensive roadmap for strengthening judicial infrastructure and evolving what the Supreme Court described as a “unified infrastructural ecosystem” for courts across India.

The move assumes significance at a time when concerns over mounting pendency, shortage of courtrooms, inadequate staffing, lack of basic facilities and uneven technological integration continue to dominate discussions around judicial reforms, even as budgetary allocations for judicial infrastructure have witnessed a decline in the Union Budget for 2026-27.

According to a press statement issued by the Supreme Court, the committee has been constituted “keeping in view the varied infrastructural requirements of different High Courts and District

Courts”, with the objective of ensuring “a unified infrastructural ecosystem on pan-India basis”.

The committee has been tasked with preparing a report on the infrastructural requirements of the Indian judiciary, with a particular emphasis on securing governmental support and adequate financial allocation for courts nationwide. The report will be submitted to the CJI, who will thereafter take up the matter with the Union government and state governments.

Supreme Court judge Justice Aravind Kumar will chair the committee. Its members include

Justice Debangsu Basak (Calcutta HC judge), Justice Ashwani Kumar Mishra (Punjab & Haryana HC judge), Justice Somasekhara Sundaresan (Bombay HC judge), the Director General of the Central Public Works Department (CPWD), while Supreme Court secretary general Bharat Parashar will function as member secretary.

The committee has been entrusted with a wide-ranging mandate extending beyond physical infrastructure. It will identify constraints faced by stakeholders in the justice delivery system and recommend facilities for judges, lawyers, litigants, court staff and visitors. It will also examine measures relating to computerisation of courts, citizen-centric services aimed at bridging the digital divide and improvement of working conditions for judicial officers and administrative staff.

The panel has been asked to submit an interim report by August 31, 2026.

The initiative comes amid increasing concern within the

judiciary over the mismatch between judicial workload and financial support available for courts.

The Ministry of Law and Justice has been allocated ₹4,509.06 crore in the Union Budget for 2026-27 — nearly ₹400 crore lower than the previous year’s allocation of ₹4,998.24 crore. The revised estimate for 2025-26 stood even higher at ₹5,189 crore.

The allocation for the judiciary constitutes barely 0.08% of the total Union Budget, while the Centre’s contribution to overall judicial expenditure remains limited to around 8%, leaving states to shoulder nearly 90-92% of the burden.

Significantly, allocations under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Development of Infrastructure Facilities for the Judiciary have dropped to ₹810 crore from ₹998 crore in 2025-26, which is the lowest level since 2022-23. At the same time, funding for the ambitious e-Courts Phase III project has remained stagnant at ₹1,200 crore.

AIIMS-DELHI TEAM IN RAJ TO PROBE MATERNAL DEATHS

KOTA (RAJ): An expert team from the AIIMS-Delhi and other central medical institutions will investigate the deaths of postpartum women and reported infections at Kota’s New Medical College Hospital, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla said on Tuesday.

Chairing a high-level review meeting, Birla termed the deaths “an extremely sensitive matter” and said negligence in treatment would not be tolerated. He told officials to fix accountability and ensure strict adherence to medical protocols to prevent a recurrence.

According to an official statement, the AIIMS-led team will inspect operating theatre infection-control systems, surgical procedures, and overall hospital management practices in hospitals in Kota and Bundi districts. The team will also recommend institutional reforms and frame new Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for hospitals in the region. The meeting was attended by Principal Secretary of Medical and Health, Gayatri Rathore, Divisional Commissioner Anil Agrawal, District Collector Piyush Samaria, senior doctors, hospital superintendents, and medical officers from Kota Medical College Hospital, JK Lone Hospital, and other government health institutions.

PCOS now PMOS: Disease renamed after global effort

NEW YORK: A disorder that affects 170 million women worldwide and is the leading cause of infertility known as polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS) is being renamed to improve diagnosis and care, researchers announced on Tuesday at a medical meeting.

The new name, polyendocrine metabolic ovarian syndrome (PMOS), was chosen by a global coalition of patients, clinicians, and medical organisations to better reflect the condition’s wide-ranging hormonal and metabolic impacts, according to a report in The Lancet published to coincide with a presentation at the European Congress of Endocrinology in Prague.

The name polycystic ovary syndrome often lead women and their clinicians to mistakenly associate it with ovarian cysts, which are not necessarily present in every patient, Dr Terhi Pitlönen of the University of Oulu in Fin-

land wrote in a research letter published on Monday in JAMA Internal Medicine.

Pitlönen was lead author of the Lancet paper.

The focus on ovarian cysts has led to delays in diagnoses and fragmented care, while the new name aims to improve how the condition is detected, treated, and explained, the researchers said.

The consensus to rename the condition, led by several research groups and the Androgen Excess and PCOS Society, was based on more than 14,000 survey responses from patients and

health professionals worldwide, as well as 20 international workshops and input from 56 academic, clinical, and patient organizations, researchers said.

Symptoms of PMOS include irregular or absent menstrual cycles, infertility, pregnancy complications, excess hair growth, acne, anxiety and depression, weight gain, obesity, diabetes and other disturbances in insulin, and cardiovascular disease. In the ovaries, rather than cysts, women often have an excess of so-called antral follicles — small, fluid-filled sacs containing immature eggs.

While the condition is not curable, symptoms are treatable with medications and changes in diet and exercise, according to the Endocrine Society.

Plans to transition to the new terminology over the next three years are already in motion, including integrating PMOS into health systems, clinical guidelines, professional training, and disease classification, the researchers said.

Four newborn cheetah cubs found dead at KNP

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BHOPAL: All four cubs of cheetah KGPI2, born in the wild at Kuno National Park (KNP) in Sheopur, were found dead on Tuesday, senior KNP staff aware of the matter said, adding that a leopard allegedly killed them.

The carcasses of the cubs, born a month ago on April 11 and celebrated as the country’s first wild-born cheetahs, were discovered near their den, and the monitoring team found their half-eaten bodies in the forest. Their mother was located roaming nearby, according to an official.

“The cubs were constantly

monitored. On May 11, they were alive and healthy. But on Tuesday morning, they were found dead with deep wounds and partially eaten bodies. Prima facie, a leopard attacked them,” said KNP field director Uttam Sharma.

KGPI2 is the offspring of Gaminia, a South African-born cheetah. Her litter marked the first time an Indian-born cheetah raised in the wild had given birth outside an enclosure.

Currently, forest officials are monitoring the area and the other 14 adult cheetahs in the wild. Over the past three years, 57 cubs were born at KNP.

Of the 37 remaining, only four were born in the wild, 33 were raised in an enclosure.

INTRODUCE LOCAL LANGUAGE IN ALL SCHOOLS: SC TO RAJ

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Tuesday directed the Rajasthan government to formulate a policy for introducing Rajasthani as a subject in all schools across the state in a phased and progressive manner, underscoring that the constitutional vision of mother-tongue education and the National Education Policy, 2020 cannot be allowed to remain “dormant for want of executive action”.

A bench of justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta held that the state must take “affirmative and time-bound steps” towards providing Rajasthani language education in both government and private schools, while rejecting Rajasthan government’s stand that only languages included in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution could be taught as additional languages in schools.
