

Govt docs to face FIR over private practice

Dist Admin Warns Of Strict Action

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Prayagraj: Taking a strict stand against allegations of private practice by govt doctors, the Prayagraj district administration has warned of stringent action, including the registration of FIRs, against violators.

The decision was taken at a high-level meeting chaired by district magistrate Manish Kumar Verma on Friday. The DM made it clear that any govt doctor found practising privately while in service would face strict legal action, as such activity violates service rules.

The administration also issued a stern warning to private hospitals and nursing homes. Officials said if any govt doctor is found practising in a private medical establishment, the registration of the hospital concerned, or nursing home could also be cancelled.

chief medical officer, the principal of Motilal Nehru Medical College, and chief medical superintendents of govt hospitals to ensure strict compliance of doctors allegedly involved in private practice.

"Govt service and private practice cannot continue together. Any doctor wishing to engage in private practice must first resign from govt service," the DM said.

He said surprise inspection drives are expected to be begun soon to monitor compliance.

Additional district magistrates and additional city magistrates have also been instructed to conduct surprise checks, while the Local Intensive Unit (LIU) has been asked to gather information on such cases.

Following the district-level meeting, principal of Motilal Nehru Medical College, Prof V K Pandey, held a separate meeting with department heads and issued a strong message to faculty members.

He reportedly told doctors to either withdraw completely from private practice or resign from govt service and dedicate themselves fully to duties at Swaraj Rani Nehru Hospital.

He asked doctors, who earlier submitted affidavits promising not to engage in private practice, to provide written clarification confirming they had completely withdrawn from such activities.

Prof Pandey emphasised that healthcare services at Swaraj Rani Nehru Hospital are highly challenging and require the presence of experienced senior doctors. He also warned that if any doctor is caught during surprise inspections by the district administration, they would be personally responsible for the consequences.

Chief development officer Harshika Singh said locals can report complaints regarding private practice by govt doctors on the official CUG number 9454464532.

Faults Badaun SSP's Affidavit

Prayagraj: The Allahabad high court has criticized the police's approach to citizens' security, stating that protecting human life should be the state's foremost concern, not just prosecuting murderers.

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May 13 for the next hearing. The affidavit stated that an FIR had been registered against the accused, a charged sheet filed and constables instructed to patrol the village. It concluded that the village was peaceful and that the dispute between the parties stemmed solely from a land partition issue and family enmity.

Taking exception to the affidavit treating these points as a sufficient reply to a life threat claim, the bench observed: "The occurrence of an offence and the maintenance of peace are one thing; the petitioner's alleged threat to his life is another. We find the senior superintendent of police has taken an indifferent stand on the threat perception raised by the petitioner."

The court further remarked that if the petitioner were shot or otherwise assaulted by the fourth and eighth respondents, initiating proceedings under Sections 170, 126, and 135 of the BNS would not bring him back to life.

Stressing that "prevention is better than cure," the HC said that "cure" in this case is nothing but a retributive prosecution against the potential murderer or assassins.

Fatehpur SP holds Jan Sunwai to address public grievances

Prayagraj: In an effort to strengthen community outreach and closely monitor police functioning, Fatehpur superintendent of police, Abhimanyu Manglik, has launched a new initiative under which he will hold Jan Sunwai programme at police stations across the district.

As part of the plan, Manglik will personally sit at a local police station on alternate working days, excluding Saturdays and Sundays, for a period of a little over a month.

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CLAT UG 2026: HC overrules order seeking revision of merit list

Prayagraj: A division bench of the Allahabad high court on Friday set aside an order of a single judge passed in Feb this year directing the Consortium of National Law Universities to revise the merit list for the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) UG 2026.

With this, the bench comprising Justice Saumitra Dayal Singh and Justice Swarnima Chaturvedi restored the final answer key released by the consortium on Dec 16, 2025, after the expert committee reviewed the raised objections.

The HC allowed the consortium's special appeal by observing that courts cannot act as appellate authorities over the decisions of subject experts or judicial review in such evaluation matters is available only under a "very narrow compass".

Earlier, a writ petition was filed by a CLAT underdog candidate before the single judge challenging the final answer key for question Nos. 6, 9 and 13 of Set-C.

The division bench said the final answer key was the outcome of a structured and two-tier scrutiny mechanism involving subject experts and an oversight committee. In this backdrop, the court said: "Such an exercise by experts in the related field establishes a strong presumption of correctness, particularly in academic matters, unless a clear and demonstrable error is established."

Legal luminary shares insight on advocacy ethics

Prayagraj: Dr. Rajendra Prasad National Law University organised the third edition of its interactive series "In Conversation with a Legal Luminary" at the university campus on Friday, featuring Additional Advocate General of Uttar Pradesh, Rabul Agarwal, as the keynote speaker. The session was moderated by Vice-Chancellor Prof. Usha Tandon.

The VCh highlighted Agarwal's academic and professional achievements, including his education at the National Law School of India University and Harvard Law School, along with his legal practice before the Allahabad High Court.

During the interaction, Agarwal spoke on ethics in advocacy, legal education, and the growing role of technology in the legal profession. Speaking on Artificial Intelligence, he acknowledged its usefulness in legal research but cautioned students against overdependence on AI tools, urging them to strengthen analytical thinking and reading habits.
