

Businessman gets Rs 2 crore extortion threat in Lawrence gang's name

THE HINDI ANDRIAL Police has registered a new FIR in connection with an alleged extortion threat issued to a Khatri-based businessman in Mohali in the name of the Lawrence Bhai Singh gang, demanding Rs 2 crore and threatening to kill him. The investigation has now been transferred to the Mohali Police.

The complainant, Lovepreet Singh, a resident of Sector 22, Mohali, runs an office under the name of Waheguru Productions in Sector 22-B, Chandigarh. In his complaint submitted to the Chandigarh SSP, he stated that he received a threatening voice message from an unknown number on the morning of April 14.

According to the complaint, the caller identified himself as "Harry Boxer" and allegedly claimed links with the Lawrence gang while demanding Rs 2 crore as extortion money. He accused allegedly warned the complainant of "serious consequences" within 24 hours if the payment was not made.

Rohit Sud elected HC Bar president; Ashish Bishnoi wins vice-president post

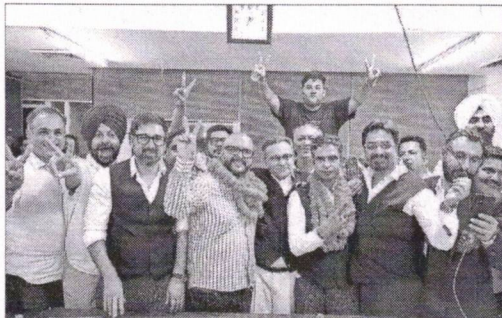

ADVOCATE ROHIT SUD was elected president of the Punjab and Haryana High Court Bar Association and Ashish Bishnoi was elected vice-president at the 15th Annual General Meeting of the Executive Body of the Association on Friday, May 15, with the counting of votes continuing till around midnight.

Sud secured 1,483 votes and defeated his nearest rival, Senior Advocate Parampreet Singh Sekhon, by a margin of 96 votes. Sekhon polled 1,387 votes. A total of six candidates were in the fray for the post of president.

Sud had earlier served as secretary of the High Court Bar Association during 2019-20. Following his election, Sud said he would work towards getting a resolution passed for an advocates society at Sarangpur. He also said that facilitating an easy loan facility for young lawyers would be among his priorities.

The newly elected office-bearers of the P & H Bar Association include Rohit Sud as president, Ashish Bishnoi as vice-president, Parampreet Singh Sekhon, as honorary secretary, Dr. Kirandeep Kaur as joint secretary, Ashish Rana as treasurer, and Kamla Malik as lady member.

Advocate Ashish Bishnoi was elected vice-president after securing 1,856 votes. He defeated Advocate Kamla Malik who polled 1,346 votes.

Advocate Parampreet Singh Sekhon (Harry) was elected honorary secretary with 1,827 votes, while Dr. Kirandeep Kaur was elected joint secretary after securing 1,321 votes.

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The final results were declared on Saturday morning after the vote count concluded Friday night.

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Yograj Singh moves anticipatory bail plea, notice issued for May 20

FORMER INDIAN cricketer and actor Yograj Singh has moved an anticipatory bail application before the Chandigarh District Court.

The Court District and Sessions Judge has issued notice to Chandigarh Police for May 20.

Meanwhile, the police have also added Section 61(2) of the Bhatnagar Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) in an FIR registered against him over alleged derogatory remarks against women in a purported viral clip from a web series.

In his anticipatory bail plea, Yograj Singh, through his counsel,

has argued that the clip in question is from a web series in which he had played a character.

It has been submitted that he was bound by an agreement executed for the web series, which was launched on an OTT platform.

The plea has further argued that the FIR has been falsely registered against him.

Chandigarh Police had earlier registered the FIR against Yograj Singh at Sector 36 police station under Section 79 of the BNS and Section 67A of the Information Technology Act, 2000.

The case was registered following a complaint submitted by advocate Ujjwal Bhasin.

According to the complaint addressed to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Chandigarh, Yograj Singh allegedly used language that was insulting and derogatory towards women in a viral social media clip linked to a web series.

It further stated that such statements were inappropriate, particularly when allegedly made by a public figure with significant public influence.

The complaint alleged that the remarks had hurt public sentiment and undermined the dignity and respect of women. He encouraged mothers to acknowledge the issue as it is not limited to young adults—the 10-17 age group now faces heavy consumption rates.

Hobnob 2026 sparks dialogue on warfare, governance, tourism and digital influence

STRATEGIC AFFAIRS, modern warfare, governance reforms, tourism revival, podcasting and women's leadership in the armed forces dominated discussions at "Hobnob 2026", a multi-sector networking and dialogue summit organised by Vibrant Networking Forum at Hyatt Centric, Sector 17, Chandigarh.

The day-long conclave brought together decorated armed forces veterans, bureaucrats, policymakers, tourism stakeholders, entrepreneurs, educators, media professionals and digital creators for discussions on geopolitics, defence preparedness, economy, leadership and emerging communication platforms.

The summit opened with a welcome address by former IAS officer and author Vivek Atray, founder of Vibrant Networking Forum, who said the platform aimed to encourage meaningful conversations and collaborative networking among professionals from diverse sectors.

The inaugural keynote session featured former Army Chief General V P Malik, Dr. Madhu Chitkara and Param Vir Chakra awardee Honorary Captain Yogendra Singh Yadav.

Recalling his experiences

during the Kargil War under Operation Vijay, Capt. Yadav said the Param Vir Chakra was not an individual honour but a tribute to the 527 soldiers who lost their lives in the conflict. Referring to the first anniversary of Operation Sindoor, he said India's growing military preparedness and indigenous defence capabilities reflected the country's readiness to tackle emerging security threats.

"Modern warfare has entered a new era shaped by advanced technology, precision weapon systems, cyber capabilities and real-time intelligence," he observed.

Gen. Malik stressed that national security extended beyond military preparedness and required a balanced polity and an aware society. He also underlined the need for better coordination among institutions while framing policy decisions.

Col. Cheema highlighted the rapidly changing nature of warfare on the "Economic and defence manufacturing capabilities." During the session, Rahul Singh announced that Lt. Gen. Dhillion's book on Operation Sindoor was being adapted into a film by T-Series.

Another major discussion centred on "Revitalising Tourism in North India" featuring Pallavi Mehra, Vivek Atray and hospitality veteran Manmohan Singh Kohli, moderated by

Chandigarh Hospitality Association president Ankit Gupta. The panel examined tourism infrastructure, branding failures, over-tourism and regional collaboration.

Atray said north India continued to underutilise its tourism potential despite possessing world-class destinations.

"If you ask for a score, it is 5 out of 10. It could be 4 out of 10," he remarked.

Kohli stressed that tourism should be viewed as an economic engine rather than merely a leisure activity.

"We have to break the mindset that tourism is only leisure. It is economy and employment," he said.

Pallavi Mehra advocated sustainable tourism policies and balanced visitor management in destinations such as Shimla, Manali and Nainital.

The conclave also hosted discussions on governance, entrepreneurship and education, including a panel on "Redefining Good Governance" featuring former Punjab Chief Secretary Vinod Mahajan and former Himachal Pradesh DGP Sanjay Kundra.

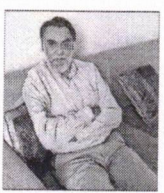
'Mothers Against Drugs': A city writer's initiative aims to inculcate a value system

DRUGS HAVE long been a thorn in Punjab's side. In 2023, as the war recovered from the Covid-19 pandemic, Khushwant Singh — author and former state information commissioner — stumbled upon videos of young boys dying from drugs. Disturbed by what he witnessed, he reflected on the crisis and realised the narrative around it was purely political.

Punjab lacked a social movement against this menace, which led Khushwant Singh to launch People's Walk Against Drugs that every year (now an annual tradition).

Joined by 10-15 people, mostly friends and family, they marched 95 kilometres from New Chandigarh to Kharkar Kalan to demonstrate and propagate the cause. What struck him, walking through multiple districts and villages, was the number of women who approached with questions on



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the issue. He realised mothers could play the "first line of defence" against drugs, as they act like the chief ministers of the house.

In India's current family structures, mothers spend more time with children, raising them and noticing patterns — putting them in the

best place to spot changes and drive the conversation. Singh and Senaa Kausar, co-founder of Punjab Lit Foundation, realised a natural progression was a programme educating mothers on signs of drugs. In 2024, they launched Mothers Against Drugs — an initiative under the Punjab Lit Foundation — as a born.

A preventive measure rather than treatment, the programme's motive is to encourage a value system at home — one that teaches children availability of drugs shouldn't equate to their use.

According to Singh, drug use stems from "a mental state of nothingness." Youngsters learn on drugs for mental and emotional support, a crutch for relief from problems. He encourages mothers to acknowledge the issue as it is not limited to young adults—the 10-17 age group now faces heavy consumption rates.

Excise team seizes cases of UT-Marked liquor, one arrested

ACTIONING a tip-off regarding illicit liquor smuggling from outside the state, the Excise Department set up a task force at Bamur Chowk and seized eight cases of liquor marked "For Sale in UT Chandigarh Only" from an Alto car.

The task was led by Excise Inspector Ashok Kumar of Khari Circle along with the excise staff. During the checking drive, an Alto car coming from the Landran side, was stopped for inspection.

According to Ashok Kumar during the search, the excise team recovered liquor allegedly concealed beneath the seats of the vehicle. The seized liquor included 24 bottles of Blue Stout whisky, 48 bottles of Saunf Ras and 24 bottles of Shaikhan Sattria.

Officials said all the liquor bottles were marked "For Sale in UT Chandigarh Only" and were manufactured by Queen Distillers & Bottlers, Plot No. 41, Industrial Area, Phase-1, Chandigarh. The total recovery amounted to eight cases of liquor.

The accused was identified as Zorawar Singh. Officials further stated that the confiscated liquor bottles were found without holograms and QR codes.
