‘I proudly declare India is Naxal-free’

Government fully committed to permanent peace, last-mile development in Bastar.

JAGDALPUR: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday said the government is fully committed to establishing permanent peace in Bastar region and ensuring that development reaches the last person. Shah, who is on a three-day visit to Chhattisgarh since Sunday, paid tributes at Amar Vatika in Jagdalpur, the headquarters of Bastar district, to more than 1,000 security personnel who laid down their lives in the fight against Maoism, an official statement said. Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai was also present on the occasion. “The sacrifices of our jawans in establishing peace, security and development in Bastar region will never be

‘India ‘by and large’ free from three internal security problems’

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday asserted that India is now “by and large” free from three main internal security problems of Naxalism, terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir and insurgency in the Northeast. Shah, who is on a three-day tour of Chhattisgarh, his first after the country was declared free from Maoist violence in March, urged the people of Bastar to “accept” about 3,000 surrendered Naxals and help in their assimilation into the national mainstream.

Woman killed as bus overturns



JAGDALPUR: A woman was killed and more than 20 persons were injured when a bus overturned on a highway in Bastar district on Monday, police said. The accident took place in the early hours when the private bus was heading from the state capital Raipur to Sukma, a police official said. According to preliminary information, more than 35 passengers were travelling in the bus. The vehicle went out of control and overturned after the driver apparently dozed off, he said. Most passen-

gers were asleep when the accident occurred on National Highway-30 in the Bastar police station limits, the official said. A woman, identified as Padmani Chandravanshi, a resident of Kawardha, died on the spot. She was posted as a teacher in the Dornapal area of Sukma district, the police said. More than 20 passengers were reported to be injured in the incident. Locals and police personnel rescued passengers trapped inside the overturned bus, the official said.

A motorcycle was also caught in the pile-up caused by the trailer going out of control, they added. Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis announced compensation of Rs 5 lakh each to the kin of the deceased.

Tourists rush to hill stations in summer

DEHRADUN: More than 45,000 vehicles entered Dehradun over the past two days amid massive weekend tourist-rush towards Mussoorie, Chakrata and Rishikesh, officials said on Monday. Data released by the police showed 13,500 buses and tempo travellers, 26,000 cars and 5,700 motorcycles passed through the district during Saturday and Sunday. A significant



number of these vehicles moved towards Mussoorie, which recorded 2,870 cars, 59 buses and tempo travellers, and 1,700 two-wheelers during the weekend, officials said.

According to officials, the heavy influx on the Delhi-Dehradun Expressway and Premnagar Highway prompted authorities to divide major routes into four super zones, 10 zones

and 19 sectors. Circle officer-rank personnel supervised each super zone, while inspectors and local outpost in-charges managed the individual zones and sectors. Senior police officials prepared a multi-tier traffic diversion plan using three distinct routing strategies, which included a dedicated entry and exit system for vehicles and utilised the alternate Kimadi route for Mussoorie-bound traffic to prevent gridlocks, they said.

Ebola outbreak

Surveillance and preparedness measures are being strengthened at points of entry and across the public health system as a matter of caution amid the recent Ebola outbreak in parts of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and Uganda, official sources said on Monday. They said the Union Health Ministry is closely monitoring developments after the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the outbreak a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC). Senior officials of the Union Health Ministry, including representatives from the National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme (IDSP), ICMR and other concerned divisions, have reviewed the evolving situation and initiated precautionary public health measures, sources said.

Provisional answer key

In a first, the Union Public Service Commission will release the provisional answer key for the Civil Services (Preliminary) Examination 2026 soon after the test. Canal Road expansion triggers protest

Families oppose eviction drive over proposed Canal Road expansion.

RAIPUR: Tension prevailed at the Municipal Corporation office in the state capital on Monday after hundreds of residents from areas falling along the proposed Canal Road 2.0 project staged a massive protest against the planned demolition of their homes. The agitating families gheraoed the Municipal Corporation office and raised slogans opposing the proposed 80-foot-wide road connecting Gurumukh Nagar (Pachpedi Naka) to Bhatagaon.

The protesters alleged that nearly 1,300 families are likely to be displaced under the road expansion project. According to the residents, authorities have already begun conducting surveys in the area without issu-



ing any prior notice to the affected households. The families claimed that preparations for demolition are underway despite the absence of proper communication and rehabilitation measures.

During the protest, residents strongly opposed the proposed 80-foot-wide road, asserting that an existing 30-foot-wide corridor is already available for the project. They questioned the necessity of widening the road further at the cost of rendering thousands

homeless. Protesters maintained that they are not against development, but objected to what they described as “forced displacement” without following due process.

Several women and elderly residents participating in the demonstration alleged that dis-

placement norms and rehabilitation policies are being ignored. They stated that many families have been residing in the locality for nearly four decades and have built their homes and livelihoods there over the years. Protesters warned that they would intensify their agitation if the administration proceeds with demolition without holding discussions with affected residents. The demonstrators reiterated their stand, declaring that they neither want the proposed 80-foot-wide road nor are willing to vacate their homes. The issue has now emerged as a major civic and rehabilitation concern in the capital, with affected families demanding transparency, proper notice, and rehabilitation before any further action is taken.

Police arrest MLA Kaushik’s mobile snatching accused

RAIPUR: Raipur Police arrested the accused involved in snatching the mobile phone of former Chhattisgarh Assembly Speaker and BJP MLA Dharamlal Kaushik within eight hours of the incident. Police also recovered the stolen mobile phone and seized the motorcycle used in the crime. According to officials, the incident occurred on



the morning of May 18 when Dharamlal Kaushik had stepped out from his official residence for a routine morning walk. At around 7:15 am, near the PWD Arch Bridge, a motorcycle-borne youth allegedly snatched his mobile phone and fled from the spot. Following

the incident, senior police officials immediately reached the crime scene and launched an intensive investigation. Joint teams from the Crime Branch and multiple police stations were formed to trace the accused. Police examined footage from hundreds of CCTV cameras installed around the crime scene and nearby routes. Technical surveillance and local intelligence were also used to identify the suspect.

SC grants bail to Anil Tuteja

RAIPUR: In a major development in the high-profile Chhattisgarh liquor scam case, the Supreme Court on Monday granted bail to retired IAS officer Anil Tuteja, who had been in jail since January 2024. The apex court’s decision came during a hearing conducted by a bench headed by the Chief Justice of India along with Justice Surya Kant

and Justice Bagchi.

Anil Tuteja was arrested in connection with the alleged liquor scam that has remained one of the most discussed corruption cases in Chhattisgarh in recent years. During the hearing, the Supreme Court observed the circumstances of the case and granted bail with strict conditions.



Adequate fuel availability assured

RAIPUR: The Chhattisgarh Government has clarified that there is no shortage of petrol or diesel in the state and appealed to citizens not to panic or indulge in unnecessary fuel hoarding. Officials stated that sufficient stocks of fuel are available and continuous supplies are being maintained across all districts to meet rising demand. According to the Food Department, the state currently has around 32.86 million liters of petrol and 77.57 million liters of diesel in stock.

A review meeting was held by the Director of



the Food Department with representatives of oil companies, during which instructions were issued to prioritize fuel supply to petrol pumps facing low stock levels.

Officials informed that 2,516 petrol pumps are operational across Chhattisgarh for uninterrupted fuel distribution. Due to sudden increased demand on May 13 and 14, petrol sales rose by 43 percent, while diesel sales witnessed a 22 percent increase.

Shah launches CG Dial-112 and mobile forensic vans

Chhattisgarh Gets Major Technology Push in Emergency Response and Scientific Investigation.

RAIPUR: In a significant step towards strengthening public safety through advanced technology and evidence-based policing, Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah on Monday launched Chhattisgarh Police's next-generation CG Dial-112 emergency response service and flagged off a fleet of modern mobile forensic vans at Mana Police Parade Ground in Raipur.

Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai, Deputy Chief Minister and Home Minister Vijay Sharma, Chhattisgarh Assembly Speaker Dr. Raman Singh, Director General of Police Shri Arun Dev Gautam, MLAs, public representatives and senior police officials were present on the occasion. The initiative aims to strengthen emergency response systems, expand scientific investigation capabilities and modernise law enforcement infrastructure in the State in line with the new criminal laws.

During the programme, the Union Home Minister flagged off 400 advanced Dial-112 emergency response vehicles and 32 mobile forensic vans for deployment across the State. Additionally, 33 specialised surveillance vehicles and 60 highway patrol vehicles were also

launched to strengthen field-level monitoring and emergency response operations. Launched under the theme "Ekke Number, Sabbo Bar", the upgraded Dial-112 system integrates police, fire and medical emergency services under a single platform to ensure faster and more coordinated assistance during emergencies.

Operational since 2018, the Dial-112 service has now been expanded to all 33 districts of Chhattisgarh from its earlier coverage of only 16 districts. The new and upgraded system has been technologically enhanced to provide quicker response and greater operational

The integrated Dial-112 service and mobile forensic laboratory initiative is being viewed as a landmark step towards modernising policing systems, expanding scientific investigation infrastructure, ensuring transparent and time-bound investigation and further strengthening public confidence in law enforcement and justice delivery across Chhattisgarh.

As part of the technological upgrade, Artificial Intelligence-based location identification technology has been integrated into the system, enabling authorities to accurately identify the real-time geographical location of people in distress. The service will operate round the clock through GIS-based monitoring systems, advanced vehicle tracking systems, SIP trunk technology and automatic caller location identi-

cation mechanisms. All 33 district coordination centres across the State have been connected to the integrated network for seamless communication and coordination.

To ensure uninterrupted operation of emergency calls and data systems, a second control centre based on an alternate backup mechanism has also been activated at Police Headquarters in Nava Raipur in addition to the primary control centre at Civil Lines.

Residents swelter under intense heat, humidity

RAIPUR: Residents across Raipur and several other parts of Chhattisgarh reeled under intense heat and highly humid weather throughout Monday, even as the Meteorological Centre in Raipur issued a mixed forecast predicting immediate thunderstorms followed by a severe heat wave later this week. Despite a minor drop of 1 to 2°C in maximum temperatures over the past 24 hours, oppressive humidity kept residents highly uncomfortable. Bilaspur recorded the state's highest maximum temperature at 39.5°C, while Raipur's Lalpur station hit 38.7°C with relative humidity peaking at 63%.

RMC demolishes illegal structures, reclaims land

RAIPUR: The Raipur Municipal Corporation (RMC) launched a major anti-encroachment drive across multiple zones today, demolishing illegal structures and reclaiming valuable government land following directives from Municipal Commissioner Sambit Mishra. In Zone 3, the Town Planning Department deployed JCB machines

to demolish an illegal structure built over 750 square feet of government land near Jal Bhole Complex on Pandri Main Road, located within Guru Govind Singh Ward Number 29. The action was taken under the guidance of Zone Commissioner Preeti Singh, Executive Engineer Ishwar Lal Taware, Assistant Engineer Naresh Sahu, and Sub-Engineer Poonam Sahu.

Raipur-Tadoki MEMU train gets more coaches



RAIPUR: The railway administration has announced a significant capacity upgrade and extended stoppage times for the Raipur-Antargarh-Tadoki MEMU Passenger Special (Train No. 68764/68765), effective May 18, 2026. Fulfilling a primary demand from commuters on this route, the train will now operate with 12 coaches instead of its previous eight-coach composition to provide much-needed relief from overcrowding. Local traffic and commercial inspectors are currently gathering direct passenger feedback to help guide future operational choices. In addition to the expanded seating capacity, the railways have extended the stoppage duration by an additional two minutes at four key stations with shorter platform lengths: Risama, Gunderdehi, Latabor, and Kusumkasa. Previously, the train halted at these stations for just one minute; with this adjustment, it will now stop for a total of three minutes, allowing passengers to board and de-board safely.

Stolen Rs 19-crore Avalokiteshvara idol returning to Ch'garh from US

RAIPUR: On the occasion of World Museum Day, a matter of immense pride has come to light for the cultural heritage of Chhattisgarh. The rare bronze idol of Lord Avalokiteshvara, which was stolen from the Mahant Ghasidas Memorial Museum in Raipur, is all set to return to the state. Valued at approximately Rs 19 crore, this historic idol is currently being brought back to India from the United States, and the state government is actively taking steps to reinstate it in the Raipur museum.



Chhattisgarh Tourism, Culture, and Endowment Minister Rajesh Agrawal has written a letter to Union Culture Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, requesting the return of the idol to the

state. While the artifact is yet to arrive in India, the state government will expedite the process of bringing it to Raipur once it lands. Minister Agrawal is also preparing to visit Delhi to personally receive the idol.

In recent years, the United States has returned 657 ancient and historic artifacts valued at around 14 million dollars to India. This rare bronze idol of Avalokiteshvara, stolen from the Raipur museum and smuggled to the US, is part of this precious returned heritage.

Police bust multi-crore IPL betting racket in Hyderabad

Police detected transactions worth over Rs 5 crore across multiple bank accounts, alongside 63 pending cyber complaints linked to these accounts.

BHILAI: The Chhawani Police and the Anti-Crime and Cyber Unit (ACCU) of Durg dismantled a major inter-state IPL betting syndicate, arresting 13 individuals operating out of Hyderabad. Acting on a tip-off following the initial arrest of two suspects in Charoda, authorities uncovered a highly organized network utilizing fraudulently obtained bank accounts for illegal gambling operations.

SSP Vijay Agrawal informed that the mastermind, Kunal Verma,

orchestrated a system where locals from slum areas were paid Rs 25,000 per bank account. These “mule accounts,” along with associated SIM cards, ATMs, and cheque books, were then used

to facilitate high-volume deposits and withdrawals for online betting platforms like Sat Sport and Crack Plus.

A subsequent raid at residential complexes in Alkapuram and Shamsha-

bad, Hyderabad, led to the arrest of 13 accused, including Verma and key operator Rohit Chauhan. Other accused are Vicky Kumar Sahu (24); Abhishek Bharti (23), Gufran Khan (32), Rajkumar Paswan (27), Tukeshwar Sahu (21), Zed Khan (25), K Srinu (25), Sheikh Saddam (24), Vikas Rai (21), Vikas Nishad (20) and Pratik Patel (20).

Police seized 9 laptops, 46 mobile phones, 107 ATM cards, 23 passbooks, and Rs 2.57 lakh in cash, total assets being valued around Rs 10 lakh. Financial audits revealed

Sufficient crude oil stock available in country: Govt

Government assures stable fuel supply, sufficient reserves, and normal refinery operations despite West Asia crisis-related import disruptions.

NEW DELHI: The government has said that refineries in the country are operating normally and India has sufficient crude inventories despite the import disruption due to the ongoing West Asia crisis. Addressing the Inter-Ministerial Briefing in New Delhi today on Recent Developments in West Asia, Joint Secretary in the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas, Sujata Sharma said that the country has sufficient stock of petrol, diesel, LPG and natural gas. She

highlighted that no dry outs have been reported in any LPG distributorship but due to the spreading of rumours, panic buying has been observed in some parts of the country. She informed that immediate actions are being taken to replenish the supplies at the identified retail LPG outlets. The Secretary said that over seven lakh PNG connections have been gasified since March, adding that infrastructure has been created for two lakh seventy six thousand connections. The Secretary also highlighted that in



the last four days around one lakh seventy two thousand domestic LPG cylinders were delivered in the country. She said that since the start of this month, around one lakh eight thousand tonnes

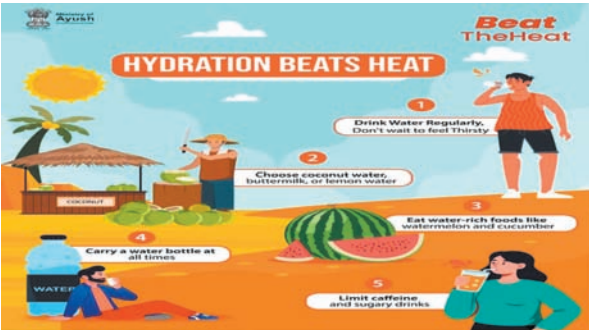

Heatwave advisory issued as temp soars in north India

NEW DELHI: Amid rising temperatures and intensifying heatwave conditions across several parts of the country, the Ministry of Ayush, in coordination with the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), has issued a comprehensive public health advisory

to help citizens protect themselves from extreme heat and heat-related illnesses.

The advisory comes as the India Meteorological Department (IMD) forecast severe heat and dry weather across Delhi-NCR and several northern and central states till May 23, with temperatures in the national capital region (NCR) likely to touch 45 degrees Celsius.

Major cyber fraud racket busted

Delhi Police has busted a large interstate cyber fraud racket operating through fake investment schemes and online trading platforms. According to official inputs, the accused allegedly targeted individuals across multiple states by creating fraudulent applications promising high returns on stock and crypto investments. Victims were induced to transfer money into multiple shell accounts controlled by the gang. Police officials stated that the network used sophisticated digital tools, VPNs, and fake customer support numbers to avoid detection.

MUMBAI

Drug trafficking module exposed

Mumbai Police has uncovered a drug trafficking module operating through courier networks and private delivery channels. Officials reported that the gang was allegedly involved in distributing banned narcotic substances across Maharashtra and nearby states. Acting on intelligence inputs, police carried out coordinated raids in multiple city locations. Large quantities of suspected narcotics, packaging materials, and digital transaction records were seized. Investigators believe the network was operating in a structured manner using coded communication to evade surveillance. Preliminary interrogation indicates that the group sourced drugs from outside the state and distributed them through small local agents.

ATM fraud gang busted

KOLKATA: The state police have arrested members of an ATM fraud gang involved in cloning debit cards and stealing cash from unsuspecting customers. The gang allegedly installed skimming devices on ATM machines to capture card data and PIN information. According to officials, the accused were operating across multiple districts and using fake identities to withdraw money from victims’ accounts. Several cloned cards, electronic devices, and cash were recovered during police raids.

Cyber-crime police get breakthrough: Online betting racket busted

HYDERABAD: Cybercrime police in Hyderabad have successfully dismantled a large online betting and gambling racket that was operating across multiple digital platforms and targeting users through social media advertisements and messaging applications. According to verified reports from law enforcement agencies, the racket had been functioning through a network of coordinated handlers who promoted



illegal betting applications disguised as investment or gaming platforms promising high returns. Following weeks of surveillance and digital tracking, police arrested several individuals linked to the operation and seized mobile phones, laptops, bank account details, and digital

payment records used for collecting funds from victims. Investigations revealed that the network was operating across multiple states and had created a structured system for onboarding users, processing payments, and distributing illegal profits among operators.

Tribunal orders Rs 30.44 lakh compensation to kin of man killed

THANE: The Motor Accident Claims Tribunal in Maharashtra's Thane has awarded a compensation of Rs 30.44 lakh to the family of a 37-year-old man killed in a road accident in 2022. In its order of May 11, a copy of which was made available on Sunday, the tribunal directed an insurance company to release the amount to the claimants first and



subsequently recover it from the party at fault. Victim Hazrat Ali Ishtiyak Ahmad, a driver, was hit by a motorcycle while walking along the Bhiwandi-Wada road on July 11, 2022. He succumbed to his injuries the next day. Advocate UR Vishwakarma

appeared for Ahmad's family, while Advocate HG Patil represented the owner of the vehicle. The insurance company was represented by Advocate KV Poojari. The insurer claimed pedestrian negligence, but the tribunal dismissed the argument, noting that no evidence of contributory negligence on the part of the deceased was presented to it.

Ultrathin films may power future electronics

NEW DELHI: Scientists from Institute of Nano Science and Technology have developed an ultrathin flexible film embedded with nano-gold particles that can convert tiny temperature changes into electrical signals, opening possibilities for self-powered sensors and wearable electronic



devices. The research, supported by the Department of Science and Technology, focuses on developing lightweight, flexible and low-

power materials capable of harvesting thermal energy for next-generation smart devices. The team, led by Prof. Dipankar Mandal along with researcher Sudip Naskar and collaborators, engineered ultrathin films using polyvinylidene fluoride (PVDF), a flexible polymer commonly used in electronics and sensing technologies.

Dalit women denied PM-AJAY bank benefits

The PM-AJAY scheme, designed to help Dalit women financially, is not being implemented efficiently.

CHHURA: Under the directions of the Prime Minister for the upliftment and economic empowerment of Dalit women, the “Pradhan Mantri Anusuchit Jati Abhyuday Yojana” (PM-AJAY) is being implemented in Gariaband district of Chhattisgarh through the District Antya Vyavasayi Cooperative Society Ltd. Application forms under the scheme are currently being distributed to eligible beneficiaries. Applicants are required to submit several documents, including an affidavit, Patwari report, income certificate, caste and domicile certificates verified by the village Sarpanch, Aadhaar card, ration card, bank passbook, and a notarized declaration along with a photocopy of the receipt of the 11 application fee. These applications are deposited in the concerned bank branches where the applicants maintain accounts.

The matter has also been brought to the attention of the Director of the Chhattisgarh Antya Vyavasayi Cooperative Finance and Develop-



ment Corporation, Raipur, and the Lead Bank, Bank of Baroda, Gariaband. Under the scheme, the District Antya Vyavasayi Cooperative Development Committee facilitates loans for small business activities such as vegetable vending, fancy stores, food stalls, and clothing shops.

Several Dalit women from Barhali village in Devbhog Block, including Nu Wadi Pradhan, Lalit Bai Pradhan, Lalit Harpal, Hara Bai Pradhan, Ash-tami Pradhan, and Palo Bai Pradhan, submitted their loan applications through Chhattisgarh

Gramin Bank. Similarly, in Manpur Block, applicants Sangita Sona from Dhodra village and Namita Pradhan from the Scheduled Caste community submitted applications through Union Bank’s Urmal branch.

According to the applicants, Chhattisgarh Gramin Bank Branch Manager Varun Dewan-gan visited Barhali vil-lage for inspection. Dur-ing the visit, the women reportedly showed their shops, vending carts, and the places where they intended to run their businesses. Despite this verification, the

applicants allege that the Branch Manager has been refusing to approve the loans based on personal assumptions and doubts.

The applicants further claim that the manager raised concerns over incomplete housing work in the village, including unfinished toilets and drainage systems, and expressed apprehension that the beneficiaries might use the loan amount for house construction instead of business purposes. Villagers argue that such reasoning is delaying financial support meant for poor Dalit women trying to become self-reliant.

Meanwhile, residents have also alleged that officials of the Union Bank branch in Urmal have not conducted proper site inspections. The beneficiaries say that delays in loan approval are affecting their chances of starting small businesses and improving their financial condition.

JCB, four hyvas seized illegal mining

RAJNANDGAON: Acting on the directives of Collector Jitendra Yadav, the Department of Minerals has intensified action against illegal excavation, storage, and transportation of minerals in Rajnandgaon district. As part of this drive, surprise inspections were carried out in Dhara and Mohara villages (Dongargarh Development Block), and Thelkadih, Iraikala, and Ghumka areas under Rajnandgaon tehsil. During the inspections, officials seized one JCB machine and four Hyva trucks involved in the illegal extraction and transportation of sand and murrum.

Worker removed after viral alcohol video

Police arrest two youths for committing armed robbery case

KHARORA: Raipur Rural Police have busted a robbery gang involved in targeting passersby and have arrested two biological brothers in connection with the case. The police have also recovered stolen mobile phones, an ATM card, the motorcycle used in the crime, and an illegal knife used to threaten victims during the incident.

According to police, the case was reported at Kharora Police Station on May 15. The complainant stated that on May 14 at around 9:30 pm, he and his companion Shubham Dhruvanshi were travelling on a motorcycle from Saragoan to Pavni after refuelling. Near Nilja Mod close to a bamboo depot in Saragoan village, two unidentified men on a motorcycle intercepted them. The accused allegedly threatened them and robbed a Vivo Y181 mobile phone worth about 8,000, an SBI ATM card kept in its cover, and 1,200 in cash. They also snatched a Vivo Y31 Pro mobile phone worth around 12,000 from the complainant’s companion before fleeing the spot.

Following the complaint, senior police officials directed a special team under the Kharora Station In-charge to investigate the matter.

CONGRESS’ NOVEL PROTEST IN DHAMDHA Congress stages unique protest with oxen and motorcycles demonstration



DHAMDHA: In Dhamdha, Congress workers staged a strong protest against rising prices of petrol, diesel, and overall inflation. District General Secretary-in-charge Rajiv Gupta stated that farmers are already facing a shortage of fertilizers during the crucial agricultural season, and rising diesel prices have further worsened their situation. He said inflation has severely affected farming operations and accused both Central and State governments of failure.

Block Congress President Shivkumar Verma also criticized the government, saying the rising cost of fuel has led to increased prices of essential goods, impacting farmers, labourers, and small traders the most.

Three arrested, including minor, robbery attack

Around 3 pm near the Mokhla road canal embankment at Sonpairi Bhantha, three youths allegedly blocked his path, stabbed him with a knife, and looted his mobile phone and cash. Following the complaint, police formed a special team and arrested Mukesh Nagar-chi alias Kumkum (20) of Shitalapara, Kuleshwar Dhruv (22) of Paragaon, and a minor from Gobra Nawapara area.

Bulldozers demolish illegal structures in Khairagarh crackdown

KHAIRAGARH: A major anti-encroachment drive was launched in Khairagarh on Saturday amid growing concerns over illegal occupation of public spaces and worsening traffic congestion in the city. Acting under directives from the district administration, a joint team comprising officials from the Revenue Department, Municipality, and Police conducted a large-scale operation to clear encroachments from key roads and public areas.

The drive covered several busy stretches, including the area near the Court Complex, Atal Chowk, and the route from Durga Chowk to Tempo Chowk. During the operation, officials removed temporary structures such as roadside platforms, pushcarts, and other unau-



thorized setups that had been occupying public land and obstructing traffic movement.

Particular attention was given to the area surrounding a premium liquor shop on the main road, where the growing number of illegal snack stalls and pushcarts had led to severe congestion in the evenings. Officials reported that crowds gathering at these “chakhna” stalls were disrupting vehicular movement and increasing the risk of road accidents. As part of the action, both temporary push-

carts and permanent concrete platforms built illegally in front of shops were demolished. Street vendors, including fruit sellers operating along the roadside, were also cleared.

The Municipal administration has issued a final warning to vendors operating gupchup (pani puri) stalls and other temporary shops along main roads, directing them to voluntarily remove their encroachments by Sunday. Chief Municipal Officer Puneet Kumar Verma stated that strict

action, including fines and demolition, will be taken against violators after the deadline.

Sub-Divisional Magistrate Tankeshwar Prasad Sahu said the drive will continue in the coming days under the guidance of Collector Indra-jit Singh Chandrawal. He added that special enforcement operations will also be conducted on holidays, and penalties will be imposed for illegal parking and roadside encroachments. Officials have also instructed removal of improperly parked passenger buses at Tempo Chowk, directing them to use designated stops to ensure smoother traffic flow.

India stands firm on Russian oil imports: Sujata

India signals uninterrupted Russian crude purchases, citing stable supplies, affordable pricing, energy security priorities, and compliance with non-sanctioned trade channels.

NEW DELHI: India has been purchasing Russian oil irrespective of US sanctions waivers and will continue to do so based on commercial viability and energy security needs, a senior petroleum ministry official said on Monday. “Regarding the American waiver on Russia, I would like to emphasise that we have been purchasing from Russia earlier,

before waiver also, during waiver also, and now also,” Sujata Sharma, joint secretary in the petroleum ministry, told reporters at a media briefing. Sharma said India’s crude sourcing decisions were driven primarily by commercial considerations and adequate supply availability. “It is basically the commercial sense which should be there for us to purchase,” she said, adding that there was no short-

age of crude supplies and enough volumes had been tied up through long-term arrangements.

A temporary US sanctions waiver allowing the sale and delivery of Russian seaborne crude expired on May 16, marking the second time Washington has allowed the relief measure to lapse without clarity on an extension.

The general licence, first issued by the US Treasury Department in mid-March and extended in April, was meant to ease pressure in global energy markets after the

US-Israeli war against Iran triggered the largest-ever oil supply disruption.

“Whatever waiver or no waiver, it (availability) will not affect,” Sharma said. Discounted Russian crude had risen to become the core of India’s oil import basket since 2022, when Moscow’s invasion of Ukraine triggered sweeping western sanctions and disrupted Russia’s traditional export markets.

HDFC Bank may seek extension for Interim Chairman Keki Mistry

HDFC Bank likely to seek RBI approval for chairman tenure extension.

MUMBAI: HDFC Bank is likely to approach the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) seeking a 90-day extension for interim chairman Keki Mistry, as the bank has yet to finalize a successor for former chairman Atanu Chakraborty. Sources said Mistry’s current tenure is scheduled to end on June 18, and the proposed extension would allow him to continue till October 18. Mistry was appointed interim chairman on March 19 following the sudden resignation of Atanu Chakraborty, who stepped down nearly a year before completion of his tenure. Chakraborty



reportedly cited “fundamental incongruence” between his personal ethics and the bank’s internal practices over the past two years in his resignation letter submitted to the Nomination and Remuneration Committee (NRC).

According to sources, HDFC Bank’s board is yet to arrive at a unanimous decision regarding the next chairman. Informal discussions have reportedly taken place during NRC and board-level meetings, but no final name has emerged so far.

Indian markets resilient amid West Asia crisis: SEBI Chief

SEBI chief says Indian markets can withstand global geopolitical and economic shocks.

BHUBANESWAR: Volatility has shot up in the financial markets due to the ongoing West Asia conflict, but the Indian bourses have the capacity to “absorb different types of shocks”, Sebi Chairman Tuhin Kanta Pandey said on Monday. When there is a crisis in one part of the world, it also impacts the rest of the globe, Pandey told reporters here on the sideline of the Regional Investors Seminar for Awareness.

“Due to the prevailing conflict in West Asia, the oil supply chain and its prices got affected

in the rest of the world. All the economies have been affected by this and obviously, there are inflationary risks. Besides, spillover effect and second-order effect will also come in,” he said.

“However, the advantages of a resilient Indian market are that it is able to absorb different types of shocks, and when these end, the market again resumes its normal trajectory,” Pandey said. He also admitted that there have been some foreign portfolio investment outflows since September 2024, but domestic investors have “retained their confidence”. Asked how SEBI is addressing threats from AI tools, Pandey said, “Most of the recent concerns around such tools are related to cybersecurity. As you know, markets rely heavily on software systems, and if cybersecurity is threatened or vulnerabilities are found in the software, there is a risk of attacks. If such attacks are successful, they can pose a serious threat to market integrity.”

Analysts said domestic bullion prices remained relatively resilient despite weakness in global markets.

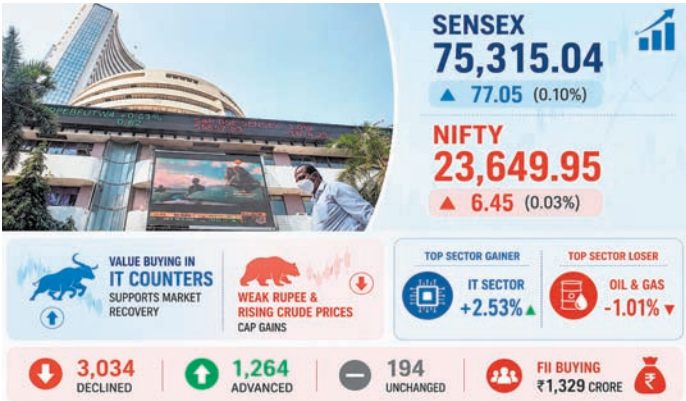
Gold prices in the domestic market traded flat on Monday, following a sharp sell-off in the

Sensex and Nifty end marginally higher on buying in IT counters



MUMBAI: Benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty ended marginally higher on Monday after facing sharp losses in intraday trade, supported by value buying in IT and select blue-chip counters. However, a weak rupee against the US dollar and rising global crude prices amid escalated tensions in West Asia capped the gains, traders said. In an extremely volatile trade, the 30-share BSE Sensex increased by 77.05 points, or 0.10 per cent, to settle at 75,315.04. During the day, it taked 1,134.78 points, or 1.50 per cent, to 74,180.26. A total of 3,034 stocks declined while 1,264 advanced and 194 remained unchanged on the BSE. The 50-share NSE Nifty edged higher by 6.45 points, or 0.03 per cent, to end at 23,649.95. “Market sentiment witnessed a mild recovery from intra-

day lows but remained largely weak due to a mix of global and domestic pressures. The rebound was primarily supported by value buying at lower levels along with selective strength in IT and pharma stocks, which helped the indices trim part of their losses. “However, the upside remained limited as rising crude oil prices, continued weakness in the rupee near record lows, and sustained FII outflows continued to weigh on the market,” Gaurav Garg, Research Analyst at Lemonn Markets Desk, said. From the Sensex firms, Tech Mahindra, Infosys, Bharti Airtel, Bajaj Finserv, Sun Pharma, HCL Tech, Bajaj Finance and Tata Consultancy Services were among the major winners. In contrast, Tata Steel, Power Grid, State Bank of India and NTPC were major laggards.

RUPEE WEAKENS

Rupee settles at record low of 96.35 against US dollar

MUMBAI: The Indian rupee weakened further and closed at a record low of 96.35 (provisional) against the US dollar on Monday, pressured by rising crude oil prices on the back of ongoing geopolitical tensions and a strong dollar. Forex traders said the global market sentiments continue to dampen amid simmering tensions between the US and Iran.

Moreover, emerging market economies, including India, continue to feel the pressure of rising crude oil prices, as elevated rates increase the outflows of US dollars, along with the outflows already happening due to FPIs, traders said. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the rupee opened at 96.19, then fell further to 96.39 against the US dollar, registering a fall of 58 paise from its previous close. At the end of Monday’s trading session, the rupee was quoted at 96.35(provisional), down 54 paise from its previous close. On Friday, the Indian rupee crashed below the 96/USD mark on Friday before closing at an all-time low of 95.81 against the US dollar.

DEDICATED ELECTRIC TRUCK FLEETS 1,000 Eicher electric trucks for Amazon Now operations

MUMBAI: Amazon India announced plans to deploy around 1,000 electric trucks, developed in collaboration with Eicher Trucks and Buses, a business division of VE Commercial Vehicles (VECV), to support Amazon Now’s operations across the country. The deployment is expected to be one of India’s largest dedicated electric truck fleets in the ecommerce and quick commerce sectors and further strengthens Amazon’s efforts to build a more sustainable transportation network.

As part of this collaboration, VECV has developed the Eicher Pro-X small truck— a compact electric truck purpose-built for high-frequency, intra-city operations. These vehicles will move goods between Amazon’s fulfillment hubs, typically located in the outskirts of the city and Amazon Now micro-fulfillment centres closer to customers. Amazon has already deployed around 50 of these trucks and plans to scale the fleet to over 1,000 electric trucks by 2028. In daily operations, these trucks are expected to cover 100-180 km and support multiple trips between facilities, with a fast-charging time of around 50 min-



utes. The fleet will be deployed across key cities starting with Delhi-NCR, Bengaluru and Mumbai, supporting the rapid expansion of Amazon Now, that delivers thousands of everyday essentials—from groceries and personal care items to electronic accessories and festive supplies, within minutes.

The company recently announced plan to expand Amazon Now to 100 cities across India and scale up its network to more than 1,000 micro-fulfillment centers (MFCs), bringing the ultra-fast delivery service to customers across cities including Pune, Hyderabad, Chennai, Kolkata, Jaipur, Lucknow, Kochi, Mangalore, and Vizag. Abhinav Singh, VP Operations Amazon India and Australia said.

Scindia, Rio launch cluster-based coffee project in N'land

Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia launched Nagaland's coffee value chain project alongside Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio on Monday.

KOHIMA: Union DoNER minister Jyotiraditya Scindia and Nagaland Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio on Monday jointly launched a project to develop a cluster-based coffee value chain in the state. The e-launch of the project under the broader mission 'Coffee of Nagaland' was held in New Delhi. It was attended by Union Minister of State for DoNER Sukanta Majumdar, Nagaland Deputy Chief Minister T R Zeliang, representatives of Coffee Board of India, while state government officials, farmers and entrepreneurs joined the programme from the Deputy Commissioner's office in Niuland district and Toupheema Village Council Hall in Kohima district.

The project will initially focus on two pilot clusters - Tuophema in Kohima and Ghotovi in Niuland for Robusta coffee. These clusters are expected to serve as model centres for future expansion across the state. Key components of the project include the establishment of five hi-tech nurseries, expansion of 400 hectares of plantation area, construction of washing stations and roastery-cum-cafés, and setting up of a coffee quality control laboratory.

The project also includes internal roads, drip irrigation systems and blockchain-based traceability with QR codes for farm-to-cup authenticity. Addressing the programme, Scindia said the initiative marks the beginning of a transformative journey to position coffee as Nagaland's true Unique

Selling Proposition (USP) while improving the livelihoods of rural communities. He said the Rs 49.48 crore project would create an end-to-end value chain from cultivation to marketing and help farmers gain better returns from premium-quality coffee. He also stated that the project is expected to increase coffee yields and generate employment opportunities in processing, roasting, brewing, tourism and related sectors.

Scindia further said the initiative aligns with the vision of Viksit Bharat

2047 and promotes sustainable agroforestry practices while reducing dependence on jhum cultivation. The project also includes state-wide capacity-building programmes in collaboration with the Coffee Board of India. Farmers and entrepreneurs will receive training in plantation management, post-harvest techniques, roasting, brewing and barista skills, along with exposure visits.

An umbrella branding initiative titled 'Coffee of Nagaland - Taste of Eminence' will also be promoted through digital outreach, e-commerce and participation in national and international fairs. Speaking on the occasion, Rio thanked the Ministry of DoNER for supporting the initiative and described coffee as the USP of Nagaland. He said coffee cultivation in the state has seen steady growth since the revival of plantations in 2014-15, with production increas-

ing from 21 metric tonne in 2021-22 to nearly 73 metric tonne in 2024-25.

Rio said the state has set a target of bringing 50,000 hectares under coffee cultivation by 2047 under the vision of Viksit Nagaland. He stated that the project would help create sustainable livelihoods, promote value addition at the farm level and strengthen Nagaland's identity as a premium coffee-producing state.

The chief minister also highlighted the integration of experiential coffee tourism through farm stays and farm-to-cup experiences, which he said would create additional opportunities for youth and entrepreneurs. Assuring full support for implementation, Rio urged farmers to adopt new technologies and actively participate in training programmes to make Nagaland coffee globally recognised.

Private bus operators seek fare hike after Kerala announces free travel for women

PALAKKAD: Hours after Kerala Chief Minister V D Satheesan announced free travel for women on state transport corporation buses from June 15, private bus operators sought government intervention to ensure their businesses are protected. Representatives of the All Kerala Bus Operators Association told reporters that they would meet the CM and the transport minister in the coming days to present their concerns and seek government support, including a revision in bus fares.

They said they were not opposed to the travel concession for women but wanted measures to ensure the survival of private operators. They

argued that their operations are regulated by the government and that they provide various concessions and implement welfare measures as directed by the state. "We want the government to take steps to ensure our survival.

We will seek an increase in bus fares, as fares have not been revised in the last four years, while diesel prices have increased twice during this period. The proposed hike would also include student fares," association

members said. "As operational costs have increased, if women—who constitute a significant portion of our passengers—shift to state transport, it will become difficult for us to continue services," they added.

India's Economic Shield Under Strain, Rupee Battles Volatility

India's foreign exchange reserves, long regarded as the nation's financial shield, have dipped by 5% to \$690 billion. The Reserve Bank of India has been actively selling dollars to stabilize the rupee, but the fall raises urgent questions about resilience in an increasingly volatile global economy. Reserves are not just numbers on a balance sheet; they represent the nation's ability to withstand external shocks. Every litre of imported fuel, every ounce of gold, every smartphone assembled with foreign components depends on this cushion. When reserves shrink, the rupee weakens, inflation rises, and households feel the pinch. The recent surge in fuel prices – petrol and diesel up Rs. 3 per litre, CNG climbing Rs. 3 per kilo – is a direct reminder that global tremors ripple into the kitchens and commutes of ordinary Indians. The symbolism is stark: our “national savings account” is under strain at the very moment when geopolitical tensions and energy crises are intensifying. Drone strikes in West Asia, Brent crude crossing \$100 a barrel, and escalating US-Iran hostilities all feed into the uncertainty. India's forex reserves, once celebrated as a bulwark of stability, now demand careful stewardship. The rupee, often seen as a symbol of national pride, must not be allowed to falter under external pressure. Yet this is also a test of confidence. India's economy remains robust, with strong exports, resilient remittances, and a growing services sector. But resilience cannot be taken for granted. Policymakers must balance intervention with long term reforms: diversifying energy sources, strengthening domestic manufacturing, and curbing dependence on volatile imports. Citizens, too, must recognize that economic sovereignty is not abstract – it is lived daily in the price of fuel, food, and medicines. The fall in reserves is not a crisis, but it is a warning. A shield is only effective if maintained. India must treat this moment as a call to reinforce its economic armour, ensuring that the rupee remains a symbol not of vulnerability, but of strength. Only then can India claim true stability in both its economy and its democracy. The reserves are more than figures – they are the heartbeat of national confidence.

Animal Cruelty: A Wake Up Call for India

In an inclusive and cultured country like India, the recent animal cruelty data is shocking. Maharashtra alone accounts for 3,000 cases out of 9,000 reported nationwide. This raises urgent questions: why is such brutality rising in a land where food is traditionally prepared for cows and dogs? Disturbingly, cruelty is not limited to domestic animals – wild creatures too suffer. Recently, a leopard mother and her four cubs were poisoned, with authorities suspecting foul play. How did we reach a point where such atrocities are becoming normalized? The scale of violence reflects a sickening loss of empathy and co existence. Do we always need laws to enforce basic human behaviour? Punishments remain too weak to deter offenders. As an animal lover, I plead for compassion. With violence already rampant among humans, must we extend it to animals too? Denial – “Maine nahikiya” – only deepens the crisis. The level of atrocities committed shows our sick mindset and how we are losing empathy for coexistence. This issue deserves urgent attention, even in forums like Mann Ki Baat. If cruelty persists, India will face grave environmental and psychological consequences beyond repair. We must act now, with empathy and responsibility, to restore harmony. Sparing animals is not charity – it is civilization.

The stray dog population in cities has increased dramatically, becoming a serious threat to public safety. Children are bitten on their way to school, senior citizens fear morning walks, and two wheeler riders are injured when dogs chase them. This is no longer a minor nuisance – it is a public health emergency demanding urgent, lawful action. Municipal Corporations must implement sterilization and immunization programs in partnership with animal welfare organizations, NGOs, and responsible citizens. The law is clear: only humane, government approved Animal Birth Control methods are permitted. Culling is illegal. The Supreme Court has directed that stray dogs must be released back into their original territories after sterilization, deworming, and vaccination. Only rabid or unprovoked aggressive dogs may be housed in shelters. Killing strays does not work – when one pack is removed, another moves in to exploit the food source. Globally, the only proven method is systematic sterilization of at least 70% of dogs in an area, stabilizing and reducing the population within three to four years.

Some imagine they have a “right” to remove animals without moral responsibility toward

creatures that share this planet. But we are a nation that believes in ahimsa and rejects cruelty. The earth is not for humans alone. Ironically, many who tolerate spitting and urinating in public cannot accept harmless species struggling to survive. Most strays lead miserable lives, scavenging rotten food, starving, and suffering from painful diseases like mange. Some, including rabies, are communicable to humans. Hungry and territorial, many dogs chase and bark at people, creating fear and risk. Yet the root cause of the menace is our garbage, not the dogs' nature. The problem is worst where food waste is dumped on roadsides. Thus, the first step is waste management, not dog catching. Municipal authorities must clean streets daily, penalize open dumping, and encourage door to door collection of wet waste instead of roadside bins that become feeding stations. In line with Supreme Court directives, municipalities must create designated feeding areas in each ward and prohibit feeding on public streets to prevent packs near schools, markets, and hospitals. Dedicated helplines should be established for reporting bites, aggressive dogs, and violations of feeding rules, with strict action against individuals or NGOs

who defy directives.

Every sterilized dog should be ear notched and tagged. NGOs must submit monthly data on dogs caught, operated, vaccinated, and released, with third party audits verifying outcomes. Resident Welfare Associations should appoint Dog Welfare Coordinators to identify unsterilized dogs, monitor feeding points, and report sick animals. Public awareness campaigns must teach children not to tease dogs and adults not to abandon pets, as 80% of “strays” are abandoned pets or their pups. Relocating dogs to “far away areas” is both illegal and ineffective. Rabies control requires mass vaccination of dogs where they live, with a target of 70% coverage annually in each zone. Municipal Commissioners should publish quarterly reports on ABC targets, budgets, and bite cases. Small, hygienic shelters must be built only for rabid, terminally ill, or proven dangerous dogs – not as dumping grounds for every complaint. Cruelty must be punished on both sides: dog catchers who use brutal methods and individuals who poison or beat dogs. Dogs have lived with humans for eternity. They guard neighbourhoods at night. As pets they are wonderful; as unmanaged strays they become a threat. But the answer is not hate – it is man-

agement. Stray dogs are part of our urban environment and teach valuable lessons in friendship, co operation, and loyalty. They offer unconditional love that humans often lack. There are countless examples of strays giving their lives for caretakers. Other creatures are not here for our selfishness. We must learn coexistence with compassion. A fistful of rice given regularly ensures a dog will guard your lane, not harm you.

The stray dog menace is grave, but solvable. The solution is not cruelty or mass culling, which is both illegal and ineffective. The solution is scientific, humane, and legally mandated: mass sterilization, mass vaccination, disciplined waste management, designated feeding, community participation, and strict accountability from Municipal authorities. Public safety and animal welfare are not opposing goals – they are achieved together. If the law protects street dogs' right to live, then the Government must ensure those laws are implemented effectively to safeguard citizens. We must act immediately, seriously, and with both sense and humanity. Only when we clean our streets and manage our compassion can we claim to be a truly civilized nation. Dogs can remain man's best friend – if we care for them the right way.

Beyond Courtrooms: Resolving Religious Disputes Through Dialogue and Harmony

India's civilizational ethos teaches that lasting harmony arises not from confrontation or coercion, but from dialogue, dignity, and constitutional respect for all.

India is not merely a land of geographical diversity; it is also a living example of coexistence, dialogue, and cultural harmony. For centuries, diverse faiths, philosophies, and traditions have flourished together on this soil. Alongside being the birthplace of the Sanatan, Jain, Buddhist, and Sikh traditions, India has also provided dignity, protection, and equal opportunities to Islamic, Christian, Parsi, and Jewish communities. The essence of Indian civilization has long been reflected in the principle: “Ekam Sad Vipra Bahudha Vadanti” – Truth is one, though the wise describe it in different ways.

Despite periodic social and political upheavals, the core character of Indian society has largely remained rooted in tolerance, accommodation, and dialogue. Yet history has also left behind sensitive issues that continue to influence public discourse. Along with

the painful memories of Partition, disputes associated with certain religious sites have remained emotionally and politically significant in independent India. Such issues are deeply connected not only with legal claims but also with historical memory, faith, identity, and collective sentiment. In recent decades, India has demonstrated that even centuries old religious and cultural disputes can be addressed within the framework of constitutional values and judicial processes. The judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the Ram Jannabhoomi case stands as one of the most significant examples. The verdict was delivered after examining historical records, archaeological findings, and legal arguments. Equally noteworthy was the restraint, peace, and maturity displayed by citizens across the country after the judgment, which strengthened

India's global image of democratic and social maturity.

Similarly, the recent judgment of the Indore Bench of the Madhya Pradesh High Court regarding the Bhojshala-Kamal Maula complex has once again brought questions related to historical religious sites into national discussion. Based on the archaeological and historical evidence presented, the Court observed the site's association with the temple of Goddess Vagdevi. Naturally, every party retains the constitutional right to challenge or appeal such decisions before higher courts. However, these developments also raise a broader social question: can certain highly sensitive religious disputes be approached not only through litigation but also through dialogue, mutual respect, and consensus building?

The cases relating to Varanasi

and Mathura, presently under judicial consideration, further underline the importance of this debate. These examples reflect the deep faith Indian society places in the Constitution and the judiciary. Yet they also remind us that judicial verdicts alone may not always heal emotional and historical wounds completely. Sustainable peace and lasting harmony often require social acceptance, moral understanding, and constructive engagement among communities.

India's civilizational ethos has always valued dialogue over confrontation. If enlightened and responsible representatives from different communities initiate sincere discussions in an atmosphere of trust and mutual respect, many tensions can be reduced even before legal conclusions are reached. Respect for historical and archaeological evidence,

combined with sensitivity toward religious sentiments, may open pathways toward reconciliation rather than prolonged hostility.

At the same time, any such initiative must remain firmly rooted in constitutional principles, the rule of law, and equal respect for all citizens. No resolution can endure if it emerges from fear, coercion, political polarization, or social pressure. Lasting harmony can only be achieved when solutions evolve voluntarily through mutual understanding and dignity for all concerned communities.

The Constitution of India guarantees equal rights, religious freedom, and dignity to every citizen. The judiciary remains the highest constitutional mechanism for dispute resolution, and its authority must always be respected. However, since legal proceedings in such matters often continue for years, the ideal path may lie in creating a balance between judicial processes and meaningful social dialogue. The need of the present time is not to turn historical grievances into perpetual hostility, but to transform them into opportunities for reconciliation, understanding, and national unity. When society collectively places constitutional values, social cohesion, and national interest above political or sectarian divisions, India moves closer to genuine and lasting progress. Ultimately, the success of any peaceful resolution will not belong to one community alone. It will represent a collective triumph of India's democratic maturity, constitutional wisdom, and timeless tradition of harmony through dialogue.

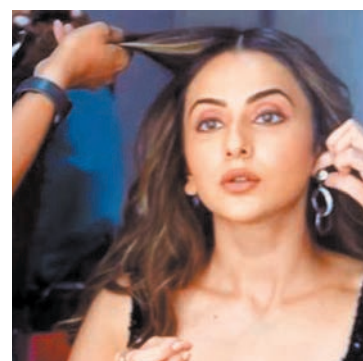

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CIC REVERSES 2018 ORDER; BCCI NOT BOUND BY RTI ACT

The ruling overturned the 2018 order by M. Sridhar Acharyulu that had declared BCCI a public authority under the RTI Act.

NEW DELHI: The BCCI is not a public authority under the Right to Information Act, thus it is not liable to answer any queries under the transparency law, the Central Information Commission held on Monday, overturning its own 2018 order in this regard.

missioner P R Ramesh said that the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), despite performing important public functions relating to cricket administration and India’s representation in international tournaments, cannot be treated as a public authority as it is neither owned, controlled, nor substantially financed by the government “The BCCI cannot be classified as a ‘public authority’ within the meaning of Section 2(h) of the Right to Information (RTI) Act, and the provisions of the

Act are therefore inapplicable to it in the facts and circumstances of the present case,” Ramesh said in the order, dismissing an appeal seeking information about the provisions and authority under which the BCCI represents India and selects players for national and international tournaments. The ruling marked a reversal of a 2018 order of the then-information commissioner and a noted law professor, M Sridhar Acharyulu, who held BCCI to be a public authority and directed its

president, secretary and committee of administrators to designate central public information officers, assistant public information officers and first appellate authorities under the RTI Act. The Central Information Commission (CIC) had also directed the BCCI to proactively disclose information under Section 4 of the law and furnish point-wise replies to the RTI applicant. The BCCI, however, had challenged the 2018 order before the Madras High Court, which, in September 2025, remitted the mat-

ter back to the CIC for reconsideration in light of the Supreme Court’s observations in the BCCI vs Cricket Association of Bihar case and said the Commission should pass fresh orders after re-examining the legal position. Revisiting the issue, the CIC said that the BCCI is a private autonomous body registered under the Tamil Nadu Societies Registration Act, which was not established by the Constitution, Parliament, a state legislature or through a government notification.

NEW DELHI: Former world blitz and rapid champion Anna Muzychuk has declined to pick favourites for this year’s men’s and women’s world championship titles with Indian players D Gukesh and R Vaishali set to face tough rivals later this year, saying psychological momentum and handling pressure could prove decisive in the summit clash. Muzychuk, one of Ukraine’s finest chess players who will begin her Norway Chess title defence in a few days in Oslo, said the World Championship clashes featuring defending champion Gukesh against challenger Javokhir Sindarov in the ‘Open’ section and Vaishali against five-time world champion Ju Wenjun in the women’s event promise high drama and excitement regardless of who emerges victorious. “It will be

Superstar Virat Kohli, who like Rohit is now a one format player, has shown sublime form in the IPL and is expected to feature in all three ODIs against Afghanistan.

The one-off Test holds more significance considering India's troubles

in the traditional format especially at home.

The batters need to find a way to tackle spin-friendly conditions. It is an aspect that has bothered them for a while now and was thoroughly exposed by South Africa in the home series last November.

India have also not been able to find a stable number three since Cheteshwar Pujara left the scene.



Sai Sudharsan got his chances but could not deliver. And now Devdutt Padikkal is expected to be given a decent run from the start of the home season.

Architect of Jammu and Kashmir's historic Ranji Trophy triumph, Aquib Nabi, is also likely to be a part of selectors' discussion for the Test team. He took 60 wickets in a stellar campaign.

Prince Yadav, who has

impressed with his pace and accuracy in the ongoing IPL, can be tried in the ODI series.

If Bumrah is not part of the side, Mohammed Siraj will be the leader of the attack with Prasidh Krishna too likely to feature in it.

Like Rohit, Hardik Pandya too has been battling to stay fit in the IPL following back spasms. It remains to be seen if he is available for the ODIs.

Israeli troops intercept activist flotilla attempting to breach Gaza blockade

ANKARA: The Israeli military began intercepting boats on Monday morning that are part of the latest wave of flotilla activists attempting to break the blockade of Gaza.

More than 50 vessels departed from the port in Marmaris, Türkiye, last week in what the organisers of the Global Sumud Flotilla described as the final leg of their planned journey to Gaza's shores. The organisation's livestream on Monday showed activists aboard several vessels putting on life jackets and raising their hands before a boat carrying troops approached. Israeli troops wearing tactical gear boarded the ship, and the livestream abruptly ended. Many of the ships are currently off the coast of Cyprus. Other footage showed Israeli troops on speedboats approaching and instructing the activists to move to the front of the boat. An hour before the

interception, Israel's Foreign Ministry called on activists to "change course and turn back immediately."

“Once again, a provocation for the sake of provocation: another so-called ‘humanitarian aid flotilla’ with no humanitarian aid,” the Foreign Ministry posted on X. The Israeli military declined to comment on the ongoing operation.

Russia unleashes massive aerial barrage across Ukraine

Russia targeted eight Ukrainian regions with over 500 drones and missiles, wounding dozens.

KYIV: Russia targeted eight regions of Ukraine in its latest nighttime drone and missile barrage, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said Monday, with local authorities reporting that the strikes wounded more than two dozen civilians, including three children.

Russian forces fired 524 attack drones and 22 ballistic and cruise missiles, Zelenskyy said. The city of Dnipro and the surrounding central region of Ukraine bore the brunt of the attack, officials said. The barrage continued a

recent spiral of long-range strikes that have grown in scale following a May 9-11 ceasefire that US President Donald Trump said he asked Zelenskyy and Russian President Vladimir Putin to observe, but which had little impact. There is no sign that a

peace deal is taking shape despite US diplomatic efforts to end Russia's invasion. Russia hammered Ukraine over several days last week, flattening a Kyiv apartment building where 24 people died. One of Ukraine's largest drone strikes on Russia

killed at least four people, including three near Moscow, and wounded a dozen others, authorities said Sunday. In more than four years of war, Ukraine has built up its own long-range capabilities. It has

been hitting oil facilities that represent a vital part of the Russian economy, as well as other targets deep inside Russia, making the Russian public take notice. That has increased the pressure on Putin, whose army is struggling to make progress on the battlefield and who claimed earlier this month, without providing evidence, that the war is approaching its end. On Sunday, the Russian Defence Ministry said that more than 1,000 Ukrainian drones had been shot down or jammed in the previous 24 hours, with around 80 on their way to Moscow.

ITALY MALDIVES

Italy's foreign minister says divers found bodies of 4 Italians dead in Maldives sea cave

ROME: Italy's Foreign Ministry said Monday rescuers have located the bodies of four Italian divers believed to be deep inside an underwater cave in a Maldivian atoll. The searches had resumed on Monday after being suspended following the death of a local military diver during a perilous mission to try to reach them. Five Italian divers are believed to have died while exploring a cave at a depth of about 50 metres (160 feet) in Vaavu Atoll on Thursday, according to Italy's Foreign Ministry. The recreational diving limit in the Maldives is 30 metres (98 feet). The body of an Italian – a diving instructor – was found earlier outside the cave. Three Finnish divers had arrived in the Maldives Sunday to draw up a fresh plan in the search for the bodies of the other four, who were believed to be inside the cave system. Maldives presidential spokesperson Mohamed Hussain Shareef said the search was suspended after Mohamed Mahudhee, a member of the Maldivian National Defense Force, died of underwater decompression sickness after being transferred to a hospital in the capital on Saturday.

KENYA PROTESTS

Protesters light bonfires during transport strike in Kenya

NAIROBI: Protests erupted in Kenya's capital, Nairobi, on Monday as a nationwide public transport strike kicked off in protest at rising fuel prices. Commuters were stranded in various suburbs and the city centre remained deserted as motorists with private vehicles opted to stay home as protesters burned tyres on major roads. The Kenya Association of Private Schools had advised its members to assess and determine the safety of learners going to school, and most schools opted for online learning. Kenya's fuel prices hit a record high on Friday, with the diesel price increasing by 23.5 per cent and petrol by 8 per cent. President William Ruto, who has been out of the country, has yet to comment on the new prices. In the last price review in April, he attributed it to the Iran war but reduced the taxes to prevent a sharp increase in price at the time. The Kenya National Chamber of Commerce and Industry on Friday said the increased prices would affect all commodities and services in the country.

CONGO EBOLA

Congo health minister announces 3 Ebola treatment centres in Ituri amid ongoing outbreak

DAKAR: The Congolese health minister announced the opening of three treatment centres in the Ituri region in eastern Congo on Sunday evening as he visited the region amid the ongoing Ebola outbreak.

“We know that the hospitals are already under stress because of the patients,” said Samuel Roger Kamba, the health minister, while visiting Bunia, the capital and largest city in Ituri. “But we are preparing to have treatment centres at all three sites in order to be able to expand our capabilities.”

The World Health Organisation declared the Ebola disease outbreak a public health emergency of international concern on Sunday, after more than 300 suspected cases and 88 deaths in Congo and two in neighbouring Uganda. Although the outbreak is centred in Ituri, cases have been reported in the capital, Kinshasa, and in Goma, the largest city in eastern Congo.

In a separate statement on X on Sunday, the WHO Regional Office for Africa said that a team of 35 experts from the WHO and the Congolese Ministry of Health had arrived in Bunia, the capital of Ituri province, along with 7 tons of emergency medical supplies and equipment.

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
