GUWAHATI, May 11: Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma will take the oath as the Chief Minister of Assam on May

12 for the second term in a row. This marks the NDA's third consecutive term in power in Assam since 2016.

Dr Sarma wrote on his X handle late at night, "Happy to announce

that the following four colleagues of mine will take oath as ministers tomorrow along with me in the august presence of the honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi

Ji - Rameswar Teli, Atul Bora, Charan Boro and Ajanta Neog. I am also happy to share that Ranjeet Kumar Dass will be our candidate for the post of Speaker of the Assam Legislative Assembly."

Governor Lakshman Prasad Acharya will administer the oath of office to Chief Minister Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma and other ministers at the College of Veterinary Science playground at Khanapara in Guwahati at 11 am tomorrow. Apart from Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, national BJP president Nitin Nabin, and the chief ministers and deputy chief ministers of twenty-two NDA-ruled states will attend the event, along with several top-level industrialists from the country.

The College of Veterinary Science playground has been decked out for the swearing-in ceremony, apart from giving a facelift to Guwahati. Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma inspected the preparations in the

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VADODARA, May 11: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday appealed for greater self-reliance in consumption habits and financial discipline, including reduced dependence on imported goods, gold purchases, and fuel consumption, during his address in Vadodara.

He urged citizens to support domestic products and strengthen local industries, stating, "Today's need is to make 'Vocal for Local' a mass movement."

He said increased use of foreign goods places pressure on India's foreign exchange reserves. On gold imports, he said a large amount of national resources is spent on the metal.

He appealed for restraint in nonessential purchases, stating, "Gold is not necessary at this time," and suggested postponing such



expenditure until global conditions stabilize.

He also mentioned edible oil consumption, urging moderation due to its impact on both health and imports. He said reducing consumption could benefit both individuals and the national economy. On fuel usage, he reiterated his appeal to reduce dependency on petrol and diesel.

He encouraged citizens to use public transport, electric vehicles, and shared mobility options.

He also suggested carpooling as a practical step for households with multiple vehicles.

The Prime Minister further spoke about overseas travel and destination weddings, saying, "Such practices lead to significant foreign exchange outflow." People must consider India for weddings and holidays."

He stated that India has many culturally significant and scenic locations

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Dispur notifies emergency air pollution action plan for five cities

GUWAHATI, May 11: The Assam government has issued a notification introducing an emergency response action plan to tackle the rising air pollution in five non-attainment cities (NACs) of the state—Guwahati, Nalbari, Nagaon, Silchar and Sivasagar.

The notification, issued by the Environment, Forest and Climate Change Department, follows directions of

the National Green Tribunal (NGT) in connection with application (681/2018), dated November 20, 2019. Under the new framework, authorities will implement graded emergency measures depending on the Air Quality Index (AQI) categories—moderate to poor, very poor, severe, severe+, or emergency.

For the most serious situation, severe+ or emergency, which happens when PM2.5 levels go over 300 µg/m³ or PM10 levels exceed 500 µg/

m³ for more than 48 hours, or when the AQI goes over 500, authorities will stop trucks from entering the city except for essential goods, pause major construction projects, and ban heavy diesel vehicles from entering the affected cities. District administrations will also be empowered to take additional steps, including closure of schools, if required, the notification said.

During the Severe category (AQI 401-500), operations

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Will raise tea workers' wages: Sarma

GUWAHATI, May 11: Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma said that the NDA government would continue to prioritise the welfare of tea garden workers in the state and promised a phased increase in daily wages up to Rs 500 in the coming years.

Highlighting the BJP-led government's initiatives for the tea community over the last decade today, Sarma said the NDA has worked extensively for the holistic development of 'cha shramiks', whom he described as the backbone of Assam's 200-year-old tea legacy.

Taking to social media, the Chief Minister said, "For the last 10 years, the NDA government has worked for the holistic development of Assam's Cha Shramiks, who are the backbone of our 200-year-old tea legacy. In NDA 3.0, we will further strengthen the lives and livelihoods of every Cha Shramik with a phased 'wage increase to Rs 500.'"

The Chief Minister also highlighted several welfare and educational measures



undertaken by the government for tea garden communities. According to official data shared by the Chief Minister's Office, the Assam government has established 118 model high schools in tea garden areas between 2021 and 2026 to improve access to quality education for children from tea worker families.

The government has now set a target to establish 100 more model high schools in tea garden regions in a phased manner between 2026 and 2031. (IANS)
