

Power subsidy curbs burn a hole in tenants’ pockets

Many individuals and families living in rented accommodations across Himachal Pradesh have received unusually high electricity bills this May after the state government restricted power subsidies to only two electricity meters linked to a single ration card. The move has particularly affected tenants, who are now being billed at full tariff rates while landlords continue to avail subsidies on the meters used by their own households.

Under the existing subsidy scheme for domestic consumers, households consuming up to 125 units per month are exempt from paying electricity charges. Consumers crossing the 125-unit mark, however, receive subsidies on two consumption slabs — 0 to 125 units and 125 to 300 units. In the first slab, the government provides a subsidy of Rs 3.37 per unit against the full tar-

HIDDEN COST OF THE NEW RULE

iff of Rs 5.44 per unit. For consumption between 125 and 300 units, the subsidy is Rs 1.72 per unit against the tariff of Rs 5.89 per unit. No subsidy is available for consumption beyond 300 units.

HPSEBL Managing Director Aditya Negi said the sub-

sidy was not being extended beyond two meters linked to a ration card and billing on additional meters was being done according to the tariff approved by the Himachal Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission.

Officials in the electricity

board admitted that the impact of the decision could be substantial for many consumers. An official said that a household consuming around 600 units a month could see its bill rise by nearly Rs 700 due to the withdrawal of subsidies.

Meanwhile, the recent KYC exercise conducted by the Himachal Pradesh State Electricity Board Limited has also triggered widespread complaints. Several consumers alleged that incorrect meter details had been linked to their names, resulting in bills being issued for meters they do not own.

Negi acknowledged that complaints regarding faulty KYC data were being received and advised consumers to approach subdivision offices or use the department's website for corrections. Field officials, however, claimed that errors occurred because staff were not given adequate time to complete the verification exercise properly.

Woman's death aftersurgerysparks stiratArki hospital

A controversy broke out at the Civil Hospital in Arki on Thursday after a 44-year-old woman allegedly died following a stone surgery, prompting her family to accuse doctors of negligence.

Seema of Chunari village had been admitted to the hospital on Wednesday for the procedure. According to her husband, Hansraj Gautam, her condition deteriorated during surgery and she was referred to the IGMSC-Shimla. The family rushed her to Shimla, but claimed doctors there declared that she had died nearly three hours earlier.

The deceased's relatives alleged that excessive blood loss during surgery led to her death and staged a protest outside the hospital, demanding action against the doctors concerned. Block Medical Officer Dr Mukta Rastogi said an inquiry committee had been constituted to investigate the matter and further action would be taken based on its findings. Health Minister Dhani Ram Shandil triggered another controversy with his remark that "when people don't drink water they are bound to die." — TNS

POCSO convict dies in D'sala dist jail; family alleges foul play

DHARAMSALA, MAY 21

A convicted inmate lodged in the Dharamsala district jail died under suspicious circumstances on Wednesday evening, prompting allegations of foul play from his family and a demand for a magisterial inquiry.

The deceased, Vivek of Khaniara in Dharamsala, was serving a seven-year sentence in a case registered under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act and Sections 363 and 366 of the IPC.

Jail Superintendent Vikas Bhatnagar said the incident occurred around 5.34 pm inside the barrack where Vivek was lodged. Preliminary findings suggest that he suffered an electric shock after allegedly coming into contact with a live current while touching the iron mesh of a window, possibly linked to a pedestal fan installed in the cell.

"As soon as he screamed, jail staff and nearby inmates rushed to the spot. He had become unconscious and was

immediately shifted to Zonal Hospital, Dharamsala," Bhatnagar said. He added that CCTV cameras installed in the jail had captured the sequence of events and that the inmate was taken out of the barrack within a minute of the incident.

According to the Jail Superintendent, Vivek was administered treatment and CPR at the Zonal Hospital before being referred to Dr Rajendra Prasad Government Medical College and Hospital, Tanda, where doctors declared him brought dead.

Rejecting allegations of violence inside the prison, Bhatnagar said no fight or altercation had taken place in the barrack before the incident. While maintaining that it appeared to be an unfortunate accident, he confirmed that a magisterial inquiry

had been sought.

Kangra SP Ashok Ratan said the family had approached the police, raising questions over the delay in informing them and the treatment protocol followed after the incident.

"Prima facie, the information received points towards electrocution, but the exact cause of death will be ascertained only after the post-mortem examination and a detailed inquiry," he said. Family members alleged that they were informed about the incident nearly two hours later and questioned the circumstances surrounding Vivek's death. The police have initiated an investigation and said all concerns raised by the family would form part of the inquiry.

Orange alert as rain, hailstorm set to lash state

After witnessing heatwave conditions over the past few days, Himachal is set to experience widespread rainfall and hailstorms from May 22 onwards, prompting the State Meteorological Centre to issue orange and yellow weather warnings.

According to the centre, a significant spell of rain and hailstorms is likely on May 22 and 23. An orange alert has been issued for Shimla, Kullu, Kangra, Mandi and Chamba districts on May 22, warning of heavy thunderstorms accompanied by hail,

lightning and gusty winds at isolated places.

A yellow alert has also been issued by the Meteorological Centre for Solan, Una, Bilaspur, Hamirpur and Sirmaur districts for the same day, with thunderstorms, lightning and gusty winds expected at isolated locations.

The Meteorological Centre has forecast widespread rainfall across the state till May 23. Light to moderate rain is likely to continue in the middle and higher hills

on May 24, 25 and 26. Weather conditions are expected to remain dry across the state from May 27 onwards.

Meanwhile, weather remained largely dry across Himachal during the past 24 hours, with Shimla, Solan, Sirmaur, Bilaspur and Una districts witnessing intense heat. Minimum temperatures at several stations were 2°C to 7°C above normal, ranging between 6°C and 27°C. Maximum temperatures were also 4°C to

5°C above normal, ranging between 22°C and 44°C.

Among major towns, maximum temperatures were recorded at 30.5°C in Shimla, 36°C in Dharamsala, 28.6°C in Manali, 38.4°C in Kangra, 38.8°C in Mandi, 36°C in Solan, 39.9°C in Sundernagar, 25°C in Kufri, 26.5°C in Kalpa, 21°C in Keylong, 38.7°C in Nahan, 35.1°C in Bhuntar and 34.7°C in Chamba.

Una was the hottest place in the state, recording a maximum temperature of 44.3°C, while Kukumseri in Lahaul and Spiti remained the coldest with a minimum temperature of 6.2°C.

11-year-old's body recovered from Yamuna, probe on OUR CORRESPONDENT

NAHAN, MAY 21

The body of an 11-year-old girl was recovered from the Yamuna river in Paonta Sahib late on Wednesday night, prompting the police to launch an investigation into the circumstances surrounding her death.

According to information, the girl was a resident of Bangala Colony in Ward No. 9 of Paonta Sahib. Her family said she had gone missing from home around 5 pm. After searching for her for several hours without success, they informed the police. Police teams subsequently launched a search operation in the surrounding areas, including along the Yamuna river. During the operation, the girl's body was recovered from the river.

The body has been sent to Dr YS Parmar Government Medical College, Nahan, for post-mortem examination and forensic analysis. Police said the investigation is being carried out from all possible angles. The family has demanded a detailed inquiry into the incident. Local residents and relatives also submitted a memorandum to the SDM, Paonta Sahib, seeking a fair and impartial investigation.

Confirming the incident, SP Nishchint Singh Negi said no visible injury marks or signs of foul play had been found on the body so far. He said the police had registered a case and were examining CCTV footage from nearby areas as part of the investigation.

Police officials added that, besides the postmortem examination, X-ray imaging of the body was also being conducted to ensure that all aspects of the case are thoroughly examined. — OC
