

New rules to enforce payment discipline on barrier-less tolls

NEW DELHI: People who fail to pay toll or clear pending dues on national highway tolls, will no longer be able to transfer ownership of vehicles, obtain inter-state transfer clearances, renew fitness certificates or secure national permits for commercial operations, under new rules notified by the Centre to tighten toll compliance and curb evasion.

Officials said the changes are designed to support the upcoming roll-out of multi-lane free flow (MLFF) tolling, which will enable barrier-less toll collection on national highways and will depend on high compliance levels for effective functioning. Currently barrier-less tolling is underway only in select toll plazas and the ministry has tar-

geted full coverage by the end of 2026.

The ministry of road transport and highways on Tuesday announced these changes as the Central Motor Vehicles (Second Amendment) Rules, 2026 has been notified, amending the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, to link clearance of unpaid

national highway user fees with access to essential vehicle-related services.

The amendments also introduced a new definition of “unpaid user fee”, referring to toll payable for use of a national highway section where an electronic toll collection (ETC) system has recorded a vehicle’s passage but the applicable fee has not been received in accordance with the National Highways Act, 1956.

The amendments also revise Form 28 — the application form for obtaining an NOC — requiring applicants to declare whether any unpaid toll demand is pending against the vehicle, along with relevant details. The rules further enable electronic issuance of portions of Form 28 through a designated online portal to promote digital processing.

ODISHA MAN HELD FOR ASSAULT OF LIVE-IN PARTNER

BHUBANESWAR: The Odisha Police on Wednesday arrested a man on the charge of sexually assaulting his live-in partner in the state capital Bhubaneswar, police said.

The incident took place at a rented house in Buddhanagar area under the jurisdiction of Laxmisagar police station.

“We have arrested the accused man based on a complaint filed by his 28-year-old live-in partner,” Bhubaneswar DCP Jagmohan Meena told PTI.

The police action followed the woman’s complaint that the accused sexually assaulted her without her consent. The police nabbed the accused from Bada Bazaar area in Bhubaneswar city.

He will be brought to Bhubaneswar and produced in a court.

Meanwhile, the survivor underwent a medical examination, and her statement was formally recorded as part of the ongoing investigation.

Justice, equality, fraternity are soul of democracy: Adityanath

LUCKNOW: Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Wednesday said justice, equality and fraternity are the core values of Indian democracy and asserted that the legislature is its foundational institution and a vital platform for both law-making and comprehensive development planning.

Addressing the concluding session of the 86th All India Presiding Officers’ Conference and the 62nd Conference of Secretaries of Legislative Bodies here, Adityanath said India’s legislatures play a vital role not only in law-making but also in shaping policies for inclusive and comprehensive development.

“The Constitution’s three guiding principles -- justice, equality and fraternity -- form the soul of Indian democracy. Laws to ensure justice are framed on the floor of the legislature, government policies for social equality are discussed there and fraternity is reflected through dialogue even amid agreement and disagreement,” he said.

“The legislature is the foundational unit of democracy. While discharging its role as the custodian of the Constitution, it does not merely frame laws but also serves as an important platform for planning holistic development,” he said.

Adityanath said India is fortunate to have strong democratic institutions that serve as a source of inspiration for the world.

“In our democracy, even the person standing at the last rung of society can have his voice placed before the highest House of the country through his

elected representative, and that voice is heard with strength,” he said, describing elected representatives as the central pillar of this system.

Recalling his own experience as a five-time Lok Sabha member from Gorakhpur, Adityanath said Parliament taught him the values of governance, conduct, procedures and consensus-building.

He said state legislatures could function more effectively by drawing inspiration from parliamentary practices and procedures.

Citing reforms in the Uttar Pradesh Assembly, Adityanath said changes in Question Hour rules were introduced to ensure wider participation by members, allowing more legislators to raise issues and improving the overall quality of proceedings.

The chief minister thanked Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, Rajya Sabha Deputy Chairman Harivansh, Uttar Pradesh Assembly Speaker Satish Mahana, Legislative Council Chairman Kunwar Manvendra Singh and officials associated with legislative institutions from across the country for contributing to meaningful discussions during the three-day conference.

He said such forums strengthen democratic institutions and help align their functioning with public aspirations.

The chief minister further said respect for Parliament was the duty of every Indian, and added that despite India’s diversity in culture, food and attire, the nation thinks and speaks with a shared spirit.

“Parliament is the strongest medium that binds this collec-

tive faith,” he said.

Adityanath welcomed six key resolutions adopted at the conference and said discussions on ‘Developed India -- Developed Uttar Pradesh’ saw participation of over 300 members from both the treasury and opposition benches for nearly 24 hours.

“Suggestions were insightful, reflecting collective responsibility towards building a developed India,” he said.

He praised the proposal of holding at least 30 sittings of the legislature annually, calling it an inspiration not only for Parliament and state assemblies but also for local bodies. He highlighted UP’s transition to paperless proceedings in the Assembly, Council, Cabinet and Budget, stressing the need for legislators to remain technologically updated.

The chief minister said the UP Assembly and Legislative Council consistently debated pressing issues, including sustainable development goals, with discussions extending over 37 hours.

The CM added that public consultations for the ‘Developed India -- Developed Uttar Pradesh’ vision received suggestions from nearly 98 lakh people through an online portal, which are being consolidated with the help of AI tools in collaboration with IIT Kanpur.

Adityanath described the approach of the Chair and the government as proactive rather than reactive, praising the balanced role played by presiding officers in giving space to both the ruling side and the opposition.

stands as a lesson which will go down in history that this is one war that was started with a very clear objective, and it was terminated in a quick time without just prolonging it,” he said.

The Indian Air Force Chief also said that Pakistan’s claims of shooting down Indian fighter jets lacked any evidence and were made only to save face, dismissing them as “Manohar Kahaniyan” (fanciful stories).

The ACM added that there was no evidence to support Pakistan’s claims, while India had shared images of damage caused to Pakistani targets. “If they think they shot down 15 of my jets, let them think about it. I hope they’re convinced about it, and they will cater for 15 less aircraft in my inventory when they come to fight again. So why should I talk about it? Even today, I won’t say anything about what happened, how much damage was done, how it happened, because let them find out...” the Singh said.

“Have you seen a single picture where something fell on any of our airbases, something hit us, a

hangar was destroyed, or anything like that? We showed so many pictures of their places,” the Air Force chief said.

modate. To avoid trouble. To hope that compliance will buy safety,” Carney said. “It won’t.”

“Middle powers must act together because if you are not at the table, you are on the menu,” the prime minister added.

Canada and Mexico are also preparing for negotiations with the White House on the North American trade pact, and American officials have publicly mused about breaking up that accord and pursuing bilateral talks instead.

Trump is scheduled to attend the summit Wednesday, the same day Carney is leaving. It’s not yet known if the two leaders will cross paths.

Carney called on world leaders and companies to start “naming reality.” He cited a famous essay from Czech dissident Vaclav Havel that described how the communist system sus-

tained itself because people were willing to lie to each other, and to themselves, about its realities.

International leaders shouldn’t fall into that trap when talking about the geopolitical landscape, Carney said. While Carney didn’t directly name the US — apart from a brief reference to “American hegemony” — his remarks clearly took aim at some of Trump’s preferred pressure tactics, including “tariffs as leverage, financial infrastructure as coercion, supply chains as vulnerabilities to be exploited.”

Canada has shifted its strategic posture, Carney argued, citing the trade deal with China.

ELDERLY MAN DIES OF HEART ATTACK IN BENGAL, FAMILY BLAMES SIR

KOLKATA: An elderly man died in West Bengal’s North 24 Parganas district, with his family alleging that anxiety over the SIR exercise led to a fatal heart attack, police said on Wednesday.

The deceased, identified as Sahar Ali Mondal, was among five members of a family who had received notices to appear for a hearing under the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls scheduled for Wednesday, a senior police officer said.

The incident occurred on Tuesday night at Purba Madartala village in Haroa, he added.

Family members claimed Mondal had been under severe mental stress since receiving the notice, worrying about the status of his sons’ names on the voters’ list and possible legal or administrative complications.

The incident has escalated into a political controversy in the state.

Will make govt in Bengal, TN: BJP after Nabin-led meeting

NEW DELHI: The BJP on Wednesday asserted that it will form its government in West Bengal and Tamil Nadu for the first time by defeating the ruling TMC and the DMK respectively in the upcoming assembly polls.

In a statement, the saffron party said based on the ground reports presented by the party’s state units here at a meeting chaired by BJP national president Nitin Nabin, it is confident of dislodging the Mamata Banerjee government in West Bengal and the M K Stalin government in Tamil Nadu in the upcoming polls.

At the meeting, Nabin reviewed the BJP’s election preparations so far in West Bengal, Assam, Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Puducherry, which go to polls later this year, party national general secretary Arun Singh said.

Representatives from all these states presented their respective “preparedness reports” before the BJP president, he said.

“The national president expressed satisfaction over the party’s preparations,” Singh said.

“Based on the reports submitted by the state BJP presidents and state in-charges, it can be confidently said that in West Bengal, the Bharatiya Janata Party is all set to form the government for the first time with a full majority with the blessings of the people,” he added.

Singh said that based on the reports presented by the state units at the meeting, the BJP is also confident of forming its government for a “third consecutive” term in Assam.

“In Tamil Nadu also, the BJP-NDA will form the government this time,” he said.

“While the NDA is set to return to power in Puducherry,

the Bharatiya Janata Party is also expected to deliver a very strong performance in Kerala in the upcoming assembly elections,” the BJP leader added.

The TMC had romped home in West Bengal, pocketing 215 of the 292 assembly seats and securing 48.02 per cent vote share in the 2021 West Bengal polls. The BJP secured 77 seats and nearly 37.97 per cent vote share in the state elections and became the main opposition party in the state assembly. The Congress and left parties ended up losing all the seats they contested.

The DMK returned to power in Tamil Nadu after a decade in the opposition, recording a landslide victory in the state assembly polls in 2021. The party led by Stalin secured a two-thirds majority by winning 133 seats in the 234-member legislative assembly, the AIADMK-led alliance comprising the BJP ended up bagging just 75 seats together. While the AIADMK won 66 seats, the BJP pocketed four seats and the PMK five. The BJP had contested 20 seats.

A day after taking over as the BJP chief, Nabin on Wednesday hit the ground running when he held his first strategy meeting with all key office-bearers of the party and upcoming preparations for the scheduled assembly elections in the five states, including West Bengal.

At the day-long meeting, Nabin also asked the party functionaries to further strengthen the organisation at the grass-roots level and instructed them to counter the Congress’ “negative campaign” against the Viksit Bharat-Guarantee for Rozgar and Aajeevika Mission (Gramin) (VB-G RAM G) scheme by intensifying efforts to apprise the people of its benefits.

Bhagwat to deliver lecture series at RSS centenary year event

MUMBAI: Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) chief Mohan Bhagwat will address eminent personalities from various walks of life at a lecture series to be held in Mumbai on February 7-8 as part of the Hindutva organisation’s centenary year celebrations, organisers said on Wednesday.

The two-day lecture series, titled ‘New horizons’, will be organised at the Nehru Centre in Worli, central Mumbai, and will mark the final leg of a four-city programme earlier held in New Delhi, Bengaluru and Kolkata.

The organisers said the programme will have four sessions - two on each day. Bhagwat will deliver a lecture on February 7 and it will be followed by a question-and-answer session the next day.

RSS Kojan Prant Sanghchalak Arjun Chandekar informed that eminent personalities from different fields, including industry, cinema, arts, literature, science, medicine, law,

sports, academia and media, were invited to attend the event.

He noted that the response from invitees has been encouraging and shows increasing participation of people from diverse sections of society in activities of the RSS, which was founded in 1925.

In its centenary year, the Nagpur-headquartered organisation has placed focus on five areas of social transformation -- strengthening family values, promoting social harmony, encouraging civic responsibility, self-awareness and environmental protection.

The centenary year, also known as ‘Sangh Shatabdi Varsh’, is being observed from Vijayadashami (Dussehra) 2025 to the festival in 2026 to mark 100 years of the RSS.

Several programmes, including outreach activities, social and intellectual gatherings and youth conventions, are being organised across the country during the year.

Day, a spokesperson said.

He held a detailed review of law and order management, counter-terrorism preparedness, crime control measures and security arrangements for the celebrations on January 26.

Prabhat stressed the need for heightened alertness, foolproof security planning, intensified area domination and robust intelligence-based operations to ensure peaceful and incident-free celebrations across the state.

2,500 gangsters’ aides arrested in Punjab

CHANDIGARH: Punjab Police carried out raids at locations linked to foreign-based gangsters for the second consecutive day on Wednesday under Operation Prahaar, a statewide drive launched to dismantle the organised crime ecosystem.

Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav launched the 72-hour-long crackdown on Tuesday, deploying more than

2,000 police teams comprising around 12,000 personnel to wipe out organised crime networks.

Special Director General of Police (Law and Order) Arpit Shukla, who personally visited Mohali to supervise the ongoing action, said, “As many as 1,186 associates and abettors of foreign-based gangsters were rounded up on the second day,

taking the total number to 2,500.” He said 1,314 individuals were rounded up on Tuesday.

Shukla said, “Thorough probes are being conducted into various aspects, including financial networks, logistics, weapon supply chains and communication links, to completely dismantle the support system for organised crimes.” Urging citizens to

actively support the campaign, Shukla said, “People can anonymously report information related to wanted criminals and gangsters. They can share tips on crime and criminal activity through the Anti-Gangster Helpline number 93946-93946.” He further declared a cash reward of up to Rs 10 lakh for information leading to the arrest of gangsters.
