

Man rapes 80-year-old woman in UP's Hathras; arrested

HATHRAS, JUNE 1: An elderly woman was allegedly raped by her 28-year-old neighbour at her residence in Uttar Pradesh's Hathras on Monday, police said. The accused has been taken into custody. According to police sources, the incident took place at around 9 am when the 80-year-old woman was alone in her house. Taking advantage of the situation, the man barged into her room and raped her. Hearing her cries for help, locals rushed to the spot. After which the accused fled, according to residents said. Upon receiving information, a police team reached the spot and rushed the survivor, who was found bleeding, to the district hospital. Sadar Circle Officer Himanshu Mathur said that the police have sent the survivor for a medical examination. "The accused has been taken into custody. Further legal action will be initiated based on the medical examination report and the formal complaint filed by the woman's family," the CO said. Police said a thorough investigation into the matter is underway.

Durganpadpanchayat CEO suspended over misconduct at public grievance camp

RAIPUR, JUNE 1: The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Durganpadpanchayat in Chhattisgarh was suspended on Monday for allegedly misbehaving with the public at a public grievance redressal camp held under the state government's 'Sushasan Tihar' (good governance festival), officials said. The action against CEO Rupesh Kumar Pandey was initiated following directions from Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai, who took serious note of allegations of discourteous behaviour towards citizens and dereliction of duty during the camp, a government statement.

Acting on the Chief Minister's instructions, the Commissioner of Durg Division issued an order suspending Pandey with immediate effect. A proposal received from the Durg Collector and an examination of a video clip purportedly showing Pandey's conduct at a public grievance redressal camp in Thanod village established a prima facie case of negligence in duty and inappropriate behaviour towards citizens during the government-organised programme, it said.

Bengaluru public prosecutor caught accepting Rs 5,000 bribe

BENGALURU, JUNE 1: A public prosecutor attached to a city court here was caught on Monday while allegedly accepting a Rs 5,000 bribe from a complainant, officials said. The accused, identified as Savitha Navens Patil (50), is posted as a public prosecutor at the City Civil and Sessions Court (CCH-54) in Bengaluru, they said. According to Lokayukta officials, Patil had allegedly demanded Rs 5,000 from a Banashankari resident for submitting objections in connection with a case registered at the Chennamma Achechattu police station. Following a complaint by the resident, Lokayukta officials laid a trap and caught Patil while she was allegedly accepting the bribe from the complainant, a senior official said. A case was registered against her under Section 7(a) of the Prevention of Corruption Act, and the accused official was taken into custody, he said.

Maharashtra aims 100 pc electric state transport bus fleet by 2047; CM stresses on charging infra

MUMBAI, JUNE 1: Maharashtra plans to convert the entire State Road Transport Corporation bus fleet to electric in phases by 2047, Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis said on Monday and directed officials to expedite the development of charging infrastructure to achieve the target.

Chairing a review meeting on the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation's e-bus programme here, he said the MSRTC has set a target of converting 50 per cent of its

fleet to electric by 2028, 80 per cent by 2035 and 100 per cent by 2047 under the "Viksit Maharashtra" vision.

According to an official statement issued after the meeting, the chief minister instructed officials to accelerate the establishment of charging stations required for large-scale deployment of e-buses across the state.

Fadnis said routes proposed for e-bus operations should be analysed using artificial intelligence tools to improve planning and efficiency. He suggested that newly supplied buses should be inspected within

seven days of delivery and called for putting in place an ecosystem supporting e-bus operations. The chief minister further asked officials to study routes currently served by private operators and prepare electric bus alternatives for such sectors.

The meeting was attended by Transport Minister Pratapsarkar through video conferencing along with senior government and MSRTC officials.

Under Maharashtra's electric vehicle policy, incentives are being provided to promote the use of e-buses in public

transport. The policy provides a subsidy of 10 per cent of the bus cost, subject to a maximum of Rs 20 lakh per vehicle, for 1,500 electric buses.

MSRTC is currently implementing a project to induct 5,150 electric buses under the Gross Cost model (GCM) model. The initiative is expected to provide passengers with modern, comfortable and pollution-free transport facilities while supporting the state's clean mobility goals, the statement said. Sarmak told the legislative council in March this year that MSRTC currently has 22,000 buses in its fleet.

3 killed, 5 injured as car rams container truck on Agra-Lucknow expressway

AGRA, JUNE 1: Three persons were killed and five others injured when a car rammed into a container truck on the Agra-Lucknow Expressway in the Fatehabad area here on Monday, police said.

The incident took place when the car, carrying eight occupants from Bihar to Rajasthan, crashed into the truck on the expressway, they said.

The deceased were identified as Sunil (28), his elder brother Shankar (30), and Shankar's wife Preeti (20), they said. The injured included car driver Shroff (35), Parmila (31), Pooja Kumari (32), Raju (35) and Ayanah (6). They are undergoing treatment at a hospital, police said.

Assistant Commissioner of Police Imran Ahmad said police teams rushed to the spot immediately after receiving information about the accident. Rescue teams from a nearby toll plaza also joined the operation.

The bodies have been sent for post-mortem, he said, adding that the damaged vehicles were removed from the expressway and traffic movement remained unaffected.

Migrant worker dies as temporary structure collapses at construction camp

CHENNAI, JUNE 1: A migrant worker from Jharkhand was killed, and 35 others were injured after a temporary iron structure collapsed at a transit labour camp at a construction site here, police said on Monday.

The accident occurred late on Sunday night during the IPL final, when more than 100 workers gathered at a temporary housing facility on Shanti Nagar Main Road to watch the match on mobile phones and portable

devices. According to preliminary police findings, a large number of workers had crowded onto an elevated temporary ramp under a temporary iron structure of the two-storey industrial shed.

As the crowd swelled and leaned against the handrails, the structure reportedly gave way under the weight, causing several workers to fall nearly 15 feet to the ground floor.

A rescue operation was launched immediately after

the collapse by emergency responders, police personnel and fellow workers at the camp.

Emergency services shifted 21 injured workers, including Ririn Manjhi (55), anative of Jharkhand, to the Government Kalsangari Centenary Super Speciality Hospital in Guindy. Manjhi was later referred to the Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital due to the severity of his head injuries. Police said Manjhi died in the early hours of Monday while undergoing

treatment there. The remaining injured workers were taken to the Sri Ramachandra Medical Centre in Porur. Another worker, identified as Sukhant from Kolkata, remains in critical condition in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), hospital sources said.

The remaining injured workers are reported to be stable and out of immediate danger. The Nandambakkam police have registered a case and initiated an investigation into the incident.

Chenab-Beas tunnel project will teach Pakistan a lesson: HP Gov

SHIMLA, JUNE 1: The Chenab-Beas tunnel project is of paramount importance as its construction would divert surplus water from the Chenab river through a tunnel into the Beas basin, thereby cutting off the water supply to Pakistan, said Himachal Governor Kavinder Gupta on Monday.

Talking with the media here after taking part in the self-enumeration drive of the census, which commenced in the state on June 1, he said that Pakistan actively fosters terrorism and it is essential to teach it a lesson. He said this initiative represents a necessary step toward rectifying past errors and

emphasised that fulfilling the needs of Punjab, Himachal, Uttarakhand remains a top priority for the government. The governor said that the census data would help the government in formulating schemes related to poverty alleviation, healthcare, education, and infrastructure development.

He urged every citizen to cooperate in this drive by providing accurate information. Himachal citizens can conduct their own self-enumeration via an online portal or a mobile application from June 1 to June 15. During this period, individuals are required to personally fill in the details of all their family members.

Single-screen cinema hall gutted in fire in Chhattisgarh's Champa; no one hurt

JANJIGIR, JUNE 1: A fire gutted a single-screen theatre in Chhattisgarh's Janjigir-Champa district on Monday though no one was hurt in the incident, officials said. Preliminary inquiries suggest a short circuit might have triggered the blaze, which caused thick plumes of smoke to

billow from the structure and drew a large crowd of onlookers, they added. The fire was reported at around 10.30 am inside Padmini Talkies, located in Korva Para, said Ashok Vaishnav, Station House Officer, Champa police station. "Fire tenders from State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), along with firefighting units and from Prakash Industries and

Madwa Power Plant, were pressed into service. The blaze was brought under control at around 1.30 pm," he said. As per preliminary information, the single-screen theatre of Padmini Talkies was completely gutted in the fire, he said.

"While the management suspects a short circuit may have caused the blaze, the actual reason is being

investigated. There was no report of anyone getting injured. The impact of the fire and smoke remained confined to the cinema premises. A nearby nursing hospital was not affected," Vaishnav added.
