Twelve people were injured after a violent clash broke out between two groups in Pachokhara village under the Indargarh Police Station area on Friday. Police said the dispute, linked to an old rivalry between members of the

ONE KILLED, TWO INJURED IN FIRING OVER LAND DISPUTE

Morena: A long-running land dispute turned violent in Ratiya Pura village under the Sabalgarh Police Station area on Friday, leaving one person dead and two women injured. Police said two families clashed over land demarcation and possession when members of one side allegedly opened fire using illegal weapons. The man died on the spot, while the injured women were admitted to the hospital for treatment. The suspects fled after the incident. Police reached the spot, sent the body for post-mortem and deployed additional forces in the village following tension. Officials said raids were underway to trace the suspects, and an investigation had been launched into the incident.

tion House Officer Gaurav Sharma said cross cases had been registered against both sides and an investigation

was underway. Additional police personnel were deployed in the village following tension.

Police arrest suspect in cow death case

Morena: Devgarh police arrested a 19-year-old suspect in connection with the death of cows behind a school post in Tussipura village. The case was registered after Panchayat secretary Khandauli filed a complaint under relevant sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act and the Cow Slaughter Prohibition Act.

Superintendent of Police Dharamraj Meena ordered immediate action. During investigation, police identified Rahul Gurjar of Upper Bahara village and arrested him after raids at possible hide-outs. The suspect told police he had locked 15-20 cows in a cowshed on May 18 before leaving briefly and later found them unconscious. Investigation is underway.

Excise dept destroys illicit liquor worth Rs16 lakh

The Excise Department destroyed illegal liquor worth more than Rs16 lakh during a raid in the Seondha excise circle with police assistance. Officials said around 8,000 litres of country-made liquor stored in 40 drums were destroyed after samples were collected. Police also seized

49 litres of liquor and registered two cases under Section 34(1) of the Madhya Pradesh Excise Act, 1915. One suspect was arrested on the spot. According to officials, the estimated value of the seized and destroyed liquor was Rs 16,49,800. The liquor drums were allegedly buried underground and were destroyed on-site during the operation.

Sand trader shot dead over rivalry

Bhind : A sand trader from Bhind was shot dead in Gulab Bagh Colony of Lasudia area, allegedly over an old rivalry linked to a 2024 murder case. The deceased, Abhayendra Singh Tomar, was attacked by unidentified assailants and shot four times, police said. Investigators said Tomar, recently released from jail, had been living in Indore and working as a contractor. Police suspect the killing was linked to the murder of Vishnu Yadav in Bhind, in which Tomar was allegedly involved. Based on statements from family members, police registered a case against Gulshan Yadav and his associates. Search operations are underway. The incident has triggered concern among residents from the Chambal region living in Indore.

Man alleges attempt to murder by wife, brothers-in-law

A man on Friday accused his wife and brothers-in-law of attempting to kill him after allegedly luring him to his in-laws' residence on the pretext of a compromise meeting. The incident took place in the Hazira police station area.

According to the complaint lodged by Rahul Singh Rajawat, he had gone to his in-laws' house following assurances of a settlement in an ongoing family dispute. However, soon after reaching there, he was allegedly assaulted by his wife's family members. Rajawat alleged that he was brutally beaten, and during the attack, one of his brothers-in-law bit off a portion of his ear, leaving him seriously injured.

After the incident, the victim approached the police



and narrated the sequence of events. Acting on the complaint, police registered an FIR and initiated an investigation into the matter. The injured man was also sent for medical examination.

Rajawat has further alleged that he faces a threat to his life from his wife and her relatives and has sought police protection. Police officials said the matter is under investigation and statements of the concerned parties are being recorded.

Security railing at Dandaraua Dham temple triggers protest in Bhind

A controversy has erupted at the famous Dandaraua Dham Hanuman Temple in Bhind district over the installation of security railings at the temple premises. The temple management has begun placing railings near Gate No. 1 and Gate No. 2 to manage the massive inflow of devotees, but the move has sparked protests from local vendors and resi-



dents. According to temple authorities, more than one lakh devotees visit the shrine every Tuesday and Saturday, making crowd management and safety a major concern. Officials said the railings are being installed

to streamline movement and prevent accidents during peak rush hours. The administration has also clarified that the work will continue in view of public safety.

However, protesters allege that the railings could affect the livelihood of small shopkeepers and prasad vendors operating near the temple for years. Protester Anil Gurjar claimed that several poor families depend on these temporary stalls for survival and

fear displacement once the barricading is completed.

The dispute intensified on Thursday night as demonstrations continued late into the evening, prompting police and administrative officials to remain deployed at the site to maintain order. SDOP Sanjay Kochha stated that protesters are demonstrating outside the temple premises, but the administration remains committed to completing the railing work to ensure the safety of devotees.

Scindia urges supporters to avoid petrol, diesel vehicles ahead of MP tour

Gwalior: Ahead of his two-day tour of Guna, Ashoknagar and Shivpuri, Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia has made an unusual appeal to supporters, asking them not to bring petrol or diesel vehicles during his visit.

In a Facebook message described as an "earnest appeal," Scindia urged party workers and supporters to avoid large vehicle convoys, a move being seen as an effort to promote fuel

conservation and discourage VIP culture. Political visits in the region are typically marked by long cavalcades and heavy traffic movement, making the minister's request a notable departure from convention.

The appeal has triggered widespread discussion in political circles and on social media, with many praising the initiative as a symbolic step towards environmentally conscious and people-centric politics.

Minor alleges rape, blackmail

Datia: Police registered a case after a 17-year-old girl alleged that a youth raped her twice and threatened to circulate her photos and videos. According to the complaint, the suspect allegedly first assaulted the girl on a deserted road near a farm two months ago and later raped her again while threatening to make the visuals viral. The girl alleged that the suspect also threatened to kill her family.

UPSC Civil Services preliminary examination on May 24

The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) will conduct the Civil Services Preliminary Examination 2025 on May 24 across 21 examination centres in Gwalior district, with a total of 6,652 candidates set to appear.

The examination will be held in two sessions — from 9:30 am to 11:30 am and from 2:30 pm to 4:30 pm. To ensure transparency and prevent unfair practices, jammers have been installed at all examination centres. According to Joint Collector Vinod Singh, entry for candidates will begin at 8 am, while gates will close 30 minutes before the commencement of each session. Candidates have been advised to reach their centres well in advance. A control room has been set up at Room No. 113 of the Collectorate office to ensure smooth conduct of the examination. It will remain operational from 7 am until the completion of the exam.

Ramji Lal Pachauri alleged that officials were giving repeated assurances without improving ground conditions. Councillor Kailash Chand Bansal said the agitation would continue until residents received relief from civic problems. Senior social worker Nathmal Gupta, Mohit Gupta and several residents joined the protest in support of the movement.

31 NCC cadets hospitalised after suffering heatstroke at training camp

In a concerning incident amid the ongoing severe heatwave sweeping across central India, more than 31 National Cadet Corps trainees fell seriously ill with symptoms of heatstroke and dehydration at a training camp held at the Indian Institute of Information Technology Design and Manufacturing campus on Duma Road.

The incident triggered panic within the camp premises late on Thursday evening, with all affected cadets im-

mediately rushed to the District Hospital for urgent medical care.

According to officials, the cadets began complaining of dizziness, vomiting, diarrhoea, and extreme weakness around 8 p.m on Thursday.

CMHO Dr Naveen Kothari told IANS, "After the incident, children from the NCC camp being held at IIITDM started arriving here. So far, 31 children have been brought in, including 15 boys and 16 girls. When they were brought to Victoria Hospital, some had stomach pain, some were feeling anxious, some complained

of chest pain, while others showed symptoms like drowsiness and semi-consciousness." He also said, "Primarily, we have treated them for heatstroke, but our food safety officer will also make sure if it was a case of food poisoning or heatstroke. We will check the food at the camp."

Dr Kothari said almost all children have recovered. Medical teams at the hospital confirmed that while most are stable and responding to treatment, the condition of three to four cadets remains serious, with at least seven admitted to the intensive care unit.

Jabalpur ranks third in PM Svanidhi scheme
