

Firing by Punjab tourists rocks Kasol, four arrested

KULLU, MAY 30

A daylight shooting in the popular tourist destination of Kasol in Manikaran valley has left the region in shock.

An argument between some visiting tourists and a local youth at Hotel Green Valley escalated into a violent confrontation that included the discharge of a firearm.

According to Kullu SP Madan Lal Kaushal, the altercation began around 6 pm on Saturday. The situation quickly spiralled out of control when the visiting party allegedly produced a pistol and fired at a local youth, striking him in the leg.

As the injured man was being carried away, the accused reportedly attempted to fire again from behind, creating panic in the area.

The police arrived swiftly

and took four individuals from Punjab into custody. They are Manpreet Singh (29) from Tarn Taran, Aman Randhawa (22) from Amritsar, Sukhman-deep Singh (17) from Ferozepur and Karandeep Singh (22) from Gurdaspur. A fifth suspect, identified as Tarnan from Batala, remains at large.

This incident adds to a troubling pattern of tourist-related violence and hooliganism in Kullu valley. In a remarkably similar case on May 10, a

group of Punjabi tourists reportedly brandished swords and attacked local residents in the Sainj valley after their vehicle struck a pedestrian, injuring two people. On January 13, a group of inebriated Haryana tourists vandalised a roadside dhaba and brutally assaulted its owner near Jarad.

SP Kaushal stated that a case has been registered and further investigation is underway. The injured youth is currently receiving medical treatment.

Heavy hailstorm batters 70% apple crop

Heavy hailstorms have caused substantial damage to the apple crop with orchardists losing almost 70 per cent of the crop.

On May 29 and 30, hailstorms took place in many places of the state, including the apple-growing belts. The fruit, at present, is in the developmental stage.

Orchardists fear that this year, total apple production in the state might not even touch 1 crore boxes, leading to them facing financial distress.

Harish Chauhan, an orchardist from Shimla district, said that this year, the state has witnessed a heavy spell of hailstorms, which is more than normal. He said that earlier, the state used to witness hailstorm, but the total number of spells used to be very less as compared to this year.

"In 2026, the state has witnessed continuous hail-

storms, which has damaged most of the apple and stone fruit crops, causing huge loss to the orchardists," he said.

Chauhan also said that not only apples, but anti-hail nets are also getting damaged due to heavy hailstorms. "The intensity of hailstorms is such that anti-

and has demanded that the government should immediately assess the losses incurred by the orchardists and provide compensation to them.

Sanjay Chauhan, state secretary, CPM, said that apples and stone fruits across the state have witnessed immense damage as a result of a heavy hailstorm. He said that realising the gravity of the situation, the government should immediately release the pending payments, amounting to crores of rupees, for apples procured from farmers under the Market Intervention Scheme (MIS).

"The government should also provide high-quality pesticides and other agricultural inputs available to farmers at subsidised rates to the orchardists and farmers through the Department of Horticulture. Additionally, the government should also immediately disburse all pending subsidy payments owed to farmers," he said.

8 feared dead as tourist vehicle plunges into gorge in Chamba

DHARAMSALA, MAY 30

At least eight persons are feared dead after a tourist vehicle reportedly plunged into a deep gorge near Kalaban on the Bairagarh-Sach Pass-Killar road in Chamba district's Churah subdivision. According to preliminary information, the vehicle had left the Bairagarh check post around noon on Friday for Sach Pass.

Local police said a group of eight people, including seven tourists believed to be from outside the state, had travelled towards Sach Pass on Friday. When the vehicle neither returned by evening nor did it reach Killar in Pangi, authorities were alerted by relatives of the travellers.

While initial reports suggest that all eight occupants may have lost their lives in the accident, officials have not yet issued a formal confirmation. — TNS

Panchayat poll concludes with over 80% voter turnout, results today

The elections to Himachal Pradesh Panchayati Raj Institutions concluded today with over 80 per cent voters exercising their right to vote in the final phase.

The three-phased voting saw a high voter turnout — 78.9 per cent in the first phase, 79.9 per cent in the second and over 80 per cent in the final phase. Even the temperature dip at many places following rain and thunderstorm yesterday, especially in the districts of Shimla and Mandi, did not deter voters.

According to the State Election Commission, the overall voting percentage of the three phases is likely to be around 81 per cent, which is 3 per cent higher than that recorded in the 2021 gram panchayat elections. As many as 31,182 public representatives have been chosen for the three-tier Panchayati Raj Institutions comprising gram panchayats, panchayat samitis and zila parishads.

A total of 3,754 pradhans, 3,754 vice-pradhans, 21,654 ward members, 1,769 panchayat samiti members and 250 zila parishad members have been elected through these elections. 10,854 office-

bearers have been elected unopposed.

Just like in the first phase, the districts of Kullu and Sirmour dominated the voter turnout in the last phase as well. Both the districts recorded around 85 per cent voter turnout. The district of Lahaul and Spiti recorded the lowest voter turnout at 71 per cent. Women continued to log a higher voter turnout than male voters. In the final phase, women voters outnumbered male voters in nine out of the 12 districts.

Voters showed a lot of enthusiasm to cast their vote. Even elderly voters, many above 100 years, reached the polling booth to vote with the help of family members. At a few places, people were seen

carrying their elderly family members on their back or on a makeshift stretcher. The commission said the three-phased voting remained smooth and peaceful.

While the results for gram panchayats were declared on the day of polling, the results of zila parishad, panchayat samiti elections will be announced tomorrow. Besides, the results of elections in four Municipal Corporations — Mandi, Dharamsala, Solan and Palampur — will also be announced tomorrow.

Voting for Municipal Corporations was held on May 17. The MC elections results will be significant in political terms as the election was contested on party symbols.

Dope test to be made must for joining govt service, says CM

Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu has directed to make dope test mandatory for all individuals prior to joining government service.

The Chief Minister gave directions in this regard here last evening while chairing a meeting of administrative secretaries. Reiterating his government's zero tolerance towards drug menace, he said strict action must be taken against government employees found involved in trafficking of 'chitta' (heroin). Sukhu said the state government has launched a mass movement against 'chitta' and was taking stringent action against the drug mafia. He added that protecting the youth from the menace of the drugs remains a top priority of the government.

He also directed that all the departments must ensure early payments of pending gratuity and leave encashment dues of Class-IV pensioners as per his Budget announcement.
