

Meghalaya Border Villagers Demand Fencing Along Zero Line, Oppose Current Alignment at Lyngkhong



Shillong, June 8: Residents of Lyngkhong village along the India-Bangladesh border in Meghalaya's East Khasi Hills district staged a demonstration on Saturday, demanding that the proposed border fence be constructed along the zero line instead of further inside Indian territory.

The villagers submitted a memorandum to the Sub-Divisional Officer (SDO) of Pynursla, urging authorities to suspend the ongoing fencing work until their concerns are addressed.

Lyngkhong is one of the border villages where homes are located only a short distance from settlements across the border in Bangladesh. Under prevailing international norms, border fencing is generally erected at least 150 yards from the zero line. Residents fear that the proposed alignment would leave their village outside the fenced area, effectively isolating it from the rest of India.

"We are not against border fencing, but we want the fence to be erected at the zero line so that our village remains inside India and within the fenced area," village head Ramu said.

Villagers pointed out that the settlement has largely remained separated from Bangladesh by a bamboo barrier erected by residents during the COVID-19 pandemic and claimed that little has changed since then. They expressed concern that the current fencing plan could create long-term issues related to accessibility, security and the future of the village.

Echoing these concerns, resident Rima Khongsdir said the proposed alignment could

leave the village outside the fenced zone. She urged the state government to take up the matter with the Centre and address the anxieties of local residents.

Despite the opposition, officials said the fencing project is proceeding as part of ongoing efforts to strengthen security along the India-Bangladesh border. Meghalaya shares a 444-km international border with Bangladesh, with less than 80 km remaining unfenced due to terrain-related challenges and local issues.

A senior Border Security Force (BSF) official said a security outpost has already been established in Lyngkhong and assured that adequate measures are in place to safeguard residents.

Meanwhile, a senior Home Department official said the Government of India has raised with Bangladesh the possibility of constructing a single-row fence along the zero line in areas where settlements may be adversely affected by existing fencing norms. According to the official, discussions on the proposal have begun, although the current government in Bangladesh has yet to take a decision on the matter.



ED Conducts Multi-State Searches in PMLA Case Linked to Major Cross-Border Drug Seizure

Guwahati, June 8: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Sunday carried out searches at four locations across Tripura, Mizoram and West Bengal in connection with a money laundering investigation linked to a large narcotics seizure by the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB).

Officials said the searches were conducted under Section 17 of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002. The case originates from an NCB complaint related to the seizure of 49.101 kg of methamphetamine and 40 grams of heroin in Tripura on August 21, 2025. According to officials, the properties searched are located in strategically sensitive areas near India's international borders. In Tripura, the premises are situated around 200 metres from the Bangladesh border, while one location in Mizoram lies approximately 500 metres from the Myanmar border. Another site in West Bengal was also covered during the operation.

Investigators suspect that an organised cross-border syndicate was involved in sourcing methamphetamine from Myanmar through the Champhai-Zokhawthar route in Mizoram before distributing it to recipients in Tripura. The agency is currently examining the financial network linked to the alleged trafficking operation. Preliminary findings indicate that proceeds of crime worth around Rs 142 crore were allegedly routed through multiple bank accounts and shell entities. The ED is now focused on tracing these funds and identifying the broader financial infrastructure supporting the suspected drug trafficking network.

Further details are awaited as searches continue and officials analyse documents and materials seized during the operation.

BJP Nominates A. Sarda Devi for Rajya Sabha Polls from Manipur

Imphal, June 8: The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Sunday nominated Adhikarimayum (A.) Sarda Devi as its candidate for the upcoming Rajya Sabha election from Manipur, with the former state party chief filing her nomination at the Manipur Legislative Assembly Secretariat.

Sarda Devi submitted her nomination papers before the Returning Officer in the presence of Chief Minister Y. Khemchand Singh, BJP legislators and senior party leaders. Her candidature marks a significant development for the party in the state, as she was the first woman to serve as BJP's Manipur unit president and is now set to

Pradesh, Meghalaya, Mizoram and Rajasthan. The BJP is widely expected to retain the Manipur seat, backed by its numerical strength in the state assembly.

James P K Sangma Files Nomination for Rajya Sabha Election with MDA Backing in Meghalaya



Shillong, June 8 : National People's Party (NPP) leader and former legislator James P K Sangma on Sunday filed his nomination for the Rajya Sabha election before Meghalaya Legislative Assembly Secretary Malthus S Sangma, backed by the Meghalaya Democratic Alliance (MDA). Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma, who is also the NPP national president, accompanied the candidate during the filing of nomination papers, along with cabinet ministers, legislators and representatives of alliance partners.

James Sangma has been named as the consensus candidate of the MDA for the Rajya Sabha seat. Leaders from coalition partners, including the United Democratic Party (UDP), Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Hill State People's
