

Forest dept team fired upon by wood smugglers in Hoshiarpur

Hoshiarpur, June 10

A FOREST department team was allegedly fired upon by suspected 'khair' wood smugglers during an operation here, officials said on Wednesday.

The forest department, however, managed to seize a vehicle loaded with illegally felled khair wood after a chase, while the ac-

cused escaped under the cover of darkness. Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Dharamveer Dairu said the incident took place in the Chohal-Salem forest area on late Tuesday night after the department received information about illegal felling of khair trees.

Acting on the tip-off, a forest department team reached the spot and found smugglers loading 'khair' wood into two ve-

hicles. One vehicle had already been loaded, while another was still empty, he said.

According to the DFO, the suspects fled after spotting the forest team. While one vehicle managed to escape, the forest personnel chased the loaded vehicle. "During the chase, the smugglers attempted to run over forest department staff and also opened fire," Dairu said.

Cabinet approves Rs 2,169-cr Ahmedabad Metro Phase 2A

THE UNION Cabinet in a meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday approved the Phase 2A of the Ahmedabad Metro rail project, covering 6.032 km and five stations at a cost of Rs 2,169.04 crore. The new corridor will connect Koteswar Road to the Airport, with stations at Ashram Road, Koteswar Prachin Mandir, Sabarnati River, Sardar Nagar and Airport.

Announcing the decision, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the new corridor would also give a boost to the city's infrastructure for the Commonwealth Games 2030. Once completed, the new corridor would increase Ahmedabad and Gandhinagar's Metro network to 77.63 km. "This phase aims to seamlessly integrate key zones, including residential and commercial hubs, with the existing Ahmedabad-Gandhinagar corridor. Further, likelihood of sports facilities also being developed in the vicinity for the World Police Games 2029 and Commonwealth Games

2030... Phase 2A will not only enhance connectivity, but also stimulate economic activity, tourism, and ease urban mobility for residents and visitors," a government statement said.

It added that the project would generate employment for around 2,000 people during the peak of the construction phase and 500 people for operation and maintenance of the system.

In another decision, the Cabinet approved the construction of a Central government General Pool Office Accommodation in Amravati, Andhra

Pradesh. The project will be spread over 5.53 acres, with two blocks. "It is designed to accommodate approximately 8,000 officials and staff members... The estimated cost is Rs 1,299.08 crore...." another statement read.

The Cabinet also approved a General Pool Residential Accommodation campus for Central government employees in Amravati. The campus would be spread over 17 acres and have 11 towers with 1,504 dwelling units. The estimated cost of the project is Rs 1,234.91 crore.

Effort on to bring Tatas back, says BJP minister 18 years after Nano exit from Singur

IN HIS first remark after taking charge as the Industries Minister of West Bengal in the newly formed BJP government, Tapas Roy has said his priority would be to convince the Tatas to invest in Bengal.

The remark is significant because it comes 18 years after an agitation led by Mamata Banerjee forced the Tatas to abandon their Nano project in Bengal's Singur. The Banerjee-led TMC reaped political dividends from the movements against land acquisition in Singur and Nandigram and came to power in Bengal in 2011. Fifteen years on, they have been voted out and lack of industrialisation in Bengal has been one of the BJP's key political planks this poll season.

And now, a month after the BJP came to power and hours after he got his new charge, the Bengal minister has set the tone of the state government's stand on industrialisation.

"Bringing in big industries is the priority for the govern-

ment. We have to do what is needed towards this. Industry and businesses have left Bengal during the former government's tenure. Industry will usher in more job creation in Bengal," Roy told *The Indian Express*. "Our priority is to bring back the Tatas. Look what happened to Singur. If needed, I will personally go and hold a meeting (with them). We will try and convince them to return to Bengal." Roy has earlier been with the Congress and TMC and was also a minister in the Mamata Banerjee government. He joined the BJP in 2024.

ACCUSED PROMISED PERMANENT RESIDENCY OR WORK VISA

'Posh office, accent': How family lost Rs 1.8 crore chasing the Canadian dream

RICHA AND Prem Ahuja were a successful couple in their early 30s, running a profitable business in Delhi.

Around 2019, they began exploring the possibility of getting a Permanent Residency (PR) in Canada. Speaking to The Indian Express, Richa said, "I craved a fresh start. My daughter was born in 2019. I wanted to move away from the pollution and all."

But then the Covid-19 pandemic struck, and international travel came to a standstill as countries shut their borders. Their plan was put on hold. In 2021, as restrictions began easing, their business had taken a hit during the pandemic, and they saw an opportunity to begin anew.

In February that year, Richa and Prem arrived at GIES Immigration Inc in East Delhi's Laxmi Nagar, where they met one Dharmendra Sharma who assured them of help in realising their Canadian dream.

"I asked him how long it would take. He said years. I asked what's the shortest way to get in. He said PR," said Richa.

Five years later, however, the couple is still in their Malviya Nagar apartment. They were allegedly conned of Rs 1.8 crore, after investing in a restaurant, in what police now describe as an elaborate fraud. On Richa's complaint, Delhi Police registered an FIR and arrested Dharmendra in May.

The trap According to the FIR, GIES Immigration, a Nysa Group offshoot, helped clients settle abroad through work visas and permanent residency programmes. The couple were interested in the latter. Police said Dharmendra, listed on Nysa's website as Director, Canada Immigration, told the Ahujas that obtaining Canadian PR would take time because of pandemic-related delays, but assured them they would eventually succeed if they remained patient.

According to the FIR, Richa was willing to wait for two to three years if necessary. "Dharmendra said I needed to own a business in Canada to bolster my chances for a PR... I had already paid about 30,000 CAD (Canadian dollars) as service fees," she said.

Police said Dharmendra and GIES's Canada-based representative, Gaurav Verma, advised the couple to establish a Canadian firm that would employ local residents, strengthening their immigration application. The Ahujas incorporated Aadya Hospitality, named after their daughter.

As per the FIR, the company was to acquire a restaurant, Gong's Grill, on Brady Street in Sudbury, Ontario. The restaurant was owned by Cuzak Hospitality, run by local businessman, Dan Cuzak, the FIR stated. "Dharmendra introduced me to Cuzak. We had multiple meetings on Zoom," said Richa. "My husband and I could see that the restaurant's books were off. It seemed to be running at a loss. But my husband felt we could turn it around. Our main objective was to get to Canada, so we negotiated a deal," she said.

As per the FIR, under the proposed arrangement, the

Ahujas would pay 250,000 CAD (around Rs 1.73 crore) to acquire the restaurant. The money was deposited into an account in Canada. Cuzak was expected to reinvest 50% of it into Aadya Hospitality and become a partner in the venture.

"The documents relating to these transactions were overseen by a Canadian law firm, but were not shared with the Ahujas. An application was submitted to the Canadian embassy," said a police officer.

"He (Dharmendra) had been assuring us of a PR. Then he said we would get a work visa. We were disheartened... but I said fine. At the start of 2022, he told us the visa would come in 10 days," Richa said.

He asked us to fill out some forms and, at the start of 2022, told us the visa would come in 10 days

But it didn't. Dharmendra became increasingly difficult to reach, she claimed.

According to the FIR, the couple's application was rejected by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) on July 6, 2022.

Police said Gaurav allegedly told them there must have been a mix-up and filed a reconsideration request on July 12. That was also rejected.

The FIR states that another application was submitted on January 28, 2023, but it too was denied. Dejected, the Ahujas, on May 17 that year, sought a refund of 250,000 CAD invested with Cuzak, and the 45,000 CAD (around Rs 30 lakh) paid to GIES for immigration services.

"Cuzak said he would return my money after selling my share in Aadya Hospitality. But I was supposed to get back the money if the work permit did not come through," Richa claimed in the FIR.

In September 2024, she filed a police complaint.

When Crime Branch officials approached the Canadian Embassy, they discovered the reason behind the repeated rejections. Officers said Aadya Hospitality had only one director — Dan Cuzak.

"The funds transferred by the Ahujas were withdrawn almost immediately, leaving the company's bank account empty," another officer said.

"Dharmendra and Gaurav allegedly created documents showing that Richa would become a director/shareholder in a Canadian hospitality company. However, she was never inducted as a shareholder or director," officers said.

"After receiving the funds, the accused allegedly siphoned off the money through cash withdrawals, debit transactions and transfers routed through multiple accounts," said DCP (Crime) Aditya Gautam.

An officer said Dharmendra hails from Punjab, spent several years in the US, and joined GIES in 2020 after returning to India. Another officer said a Look Out Circular has been issued against Gaurav. The Indian Express sent an email to the Nysa Group seeking comment but did not receive a response.

Police also said that GIES' operations have now been shut.

Looking back, Richa said, "Dharmendra had a posh space, big brand... his accent, his knowledge. He made us feel secure."

Man who crashed through Assembly gate in SUV hid in Speaker's car before fleeing: Police

WEEKS AFTER a 37-year-old man forced his way through the VIP entrance to the Delhi Assembly complex in an SUV, police said that the accused hid in the Speaker's official vehicle before fleeing the spot in his own car. Delhi Police filed a chargesheet in the case last week.

Police said that when accused Sarabjeet Singh — who is currently in jail — reached the Assembly, he found Gate No. 2 closed and security personnel stationed there. He allegedly crashed through the boom barrier at the gate, drove his Tata

Sierra car to the porch area, got off and put down a bouquet of red flowers.

When security officials H C Jai Prakash (CRPF) and ASI Raj Kumar (Security) tried to stop him, he allegedly attempted to run them over with his

vehicle, police said. They said that he hid in the Speaker's vehicle, got back into his own car shortly after and sped away.

Police said investigation revealed that the accused's nephew, Harman, had gone missing from New Delhi on

April 1. Extensive efforts to locate him went in vain.

Police also stated that Singh held the administration responsible for his nephew's disappearance, and also believed that proper action was not taken. Police said that the investigation revealed that he wanted to draw the attention of the government so that serious efforts are made to find his missing nephew.

He travelled to Delhi from Punjab on April 6, the day of the incident, in his car, police said, adding that he bought the bouquet near Panipat that he intended to present to a senior official in the Assembly while expressing his anguish.
