Cops cane-charge linemen in Patiala

Police claim protesters assaulted them

PATIALA, JUNE 5

The police on Friday resorted to a cane-charge to disperse the apprentice linemen who were protesting outside the Punjab State Power Corporation Limited headquarters here. They were demanding regular appointments.

Hundreds of apprentice linemen had gathered outside the Powercom headquarters. They staged a sit-in, leading to a traffic jam. They alleged the management had been delaying their recruitment.

Many protesters sustained injuries during the police action. At least, 10 of them reported to the local government hospital. A policeman received an injury on his fin-

ger. The protesters alleged that many of them were dragged away by the police. Surinder Singh, state president of their union, accused the police of using excessive force despite the protest being peaceful.

DSP City(1) Sanjeev Singla said the police had registered an FIR against the protesters for use of "assault or criminal force to deter a public servant from discharging his duty". "We resorted to cane-charge on the orders of the Duty Magistrate," he added.

SP(City) Palwinder Cheema said the protesters had "locked both gates" of the office and held people and power corporation officials hostage for four hours, leaving them with "no choice". "Minimal force," he claimed.

Move to axe 784 trees sparks row, people vent ire against AAP MLA

An environmental and political row has erupted in Faridkot over the state government's proposal to axe 784 decades-old, full-grown trees standing on the premises of the defunct Faridkot Cooperative Sugar Mill. The move, aimed at clearing the 137-acre site for an industrial park, has met with strong opposition from local residents, farmer unions and environmental organisations under the banner of the Jal Jeevan Bachao Morcha (JJBM).

The controversy has put the ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and its local MLA, Gurdit Singh Sekhon, on the defensive. Protesters at the site on Friday began flashing videos and photographs from May 2021, when Sekhon—then an Opposition leader—alongside former AAP MP Sadhu Singh, led a fast against the erstwhile Congress government's plan to axe 2,100 trees at the same location. While that agitation successfully saved around 800 heritage trees, residents are now voicing disappointment that the same leadership is

seeking approval to cut the remaining canopy.

The scale of the proposed environmental clearance has drawn strict scrutiny from the Punjab and Haryana High Court too.

A week ago, a Division Bench of the High Court, said the court could not "close its eyes" to the large-scale tree felling. Expressing displeasure over the lack of adminis-

trative effort to locate alternative sites for the industrial hub, the Bench directed project proponents to place detailed material on record, including Google satellite imagery and at least 10 high-resolution photographs from multiple angles.

Defending the project, MLA Gurdit Singh Sekhon admitted the plan to develop industrial infrastructure, but

maintained that environmental balance would be preserved. "The development of an industrial park is crucial for local employment. The axing of some trees is necessary to lay roads as per the proposed layout. However, we have a comprehensive plan to plant a large number of trees to compensate for the loss," Sekhon said.

2 killed, 14 of family injured in accident

The injured were shifted to nearby hospitals. The pilgrims were slated to halt at Amritsar from where they were to proceed to Talwandi Sabo in Bathinda district.

The impact of the collision was so strong that the Tempo Traveller was badly damaged.

Afghan national among 6 held as cops bust arms-drug module

With the arrest of an Afghan national along with five others, including two juveniles, the Amritsar police on Friday busted a cross-border drug and weapon smuggling module and seized 1.035 kg heroin, five sophisticated pistols, two live cartridges and Rs 5 lakh "drug money" during the operation.

Those arrested were identified as Baz Mohammad (62), an Afghan national who had been residing in Sonapat, Haryana, and had recently shifted to Lajpat Nagar in New Delhi; Ankush Barthwal (33) of Nawanshahr; Des Raj (32), alias Vicky, of Jalandhar; and Rajandeep Singh (26), alias Raja, of Lopoke here. Two juveniles were also nabbed during probe into the case.

Police Commissioner Gurpreet Singh Bhullar said preliminary investigations revealed that the accused

were working in connivance with foreign-based associates and procuring illegal arms and narcotics through contacts established via social media platforms. The consignments were then distributed on the directions of overseas handlers through a network in the Majha and Doaba regions.

The operation began with the arrests of two juveniles from whom police seized a Glock 9 mm pistol and two live cartridges. Following interrogation, another pistol and 500 gm heroin were seized.

Further investigation led to the arrest of Baz Mohammad, Ankush Barthwal and Des Raj, alias Vicky. The police seized from them three more pistols, 535 gm heroin and Rs 5 lakh in cash. Their interrogation subsequently led to the arrest of Rajandeep Singh, alias Raja.

The total seizure includes three Austria-made Glock 9 mm pistols, one Zigana .30 bore pistol, one china made .30 bore pistol, 1.035 kg

heroin, two live cartridges and Rs 5 lakh in cash.

Bhullar said investigators were also probing the hawala angle and tracing the financial trail linked to the network. The police suspect that proceeds generated from the illegal trade were being routed through clandestine channels.

Investigations further revealed that Ankush Barthwal had recently returned from Uganda, where he was employed. During his stay abroad, he allegedly came into contact with Baz Mohammad through his brother working there. After returning to India, Barthwal is suspected to have joined the network and got involved in the illegal supply of narcotics and weapons.

Police records show that Baz Mohammad, Ankush Barthwal and Des Raj faced multiple cases under the NDPS Act, prompting the police to describe them as habitual offenders.

Not kidnapped, missing girls left home voluntarily: Cops

Facing pressure from the Punjab State Women Commission and public concern over the disappearance of 11 minor girls from Ludhiana during May, the city police on Friday said preliminary investigations suggested that the girls were neither kidnapped nor abducted, but had left their homes voluntarily for various personal

and family-related reasons.

Police Commissioner Swapan Sharma said FIRs had been registered in all 11 cases and four girls had already been traced and reunited with their families.

"These minor girls were not kidnapped or abducted for extortion. Most of them appear to have left their homes on their own. Three girls were recovered from their native village in Uttar Pradesh," Sharma said.
