

Mosque built on Meerut police station land sparks row; imam gets notice

Meerut: A dispute has emerged over a mosque here, with authorities alleging the shrine was constructed on a police station land while the mosque management maintains the structure was built on a Waqf property.

Police said a seven-day notice has been served to the mosque's imam seeking ownership documents and removal of the purported encroachment.

According to police, a revenue department survey found that the

Jama Masjid, locally known as the "Thane Wali Masjid" and situated within Kharkhoda police station premises, had allegedly been built on police station land. Following the survey, police sought ownership-related documents from the mosque's

imam Abdul Ghaffar. However, officials claimed that no valid records had been produced till Sunday evening. The mosque management rejected the allegations saying the land was recorded in the name of the Waqf Board. PTI

Stones pelted, trains stopped: Chaos at Patna rly station ahead of police exam

TENSIONS PREVAILED IN Patliputra Railway Station in Patna on Sunday after a large crowd of those travelling to appear for the Bihar Police Examination (Excise) Constable examination gathered at the station in the early hours of the day, leading to disruptions, stone-pelting and damage to property. Police later used force to disperse the crowd and restore normalcy.

According to officials, the unrest began when a group of exam candidates and others assembled at the station in large numbers. Authorities said some individuals repeatedly pulled the emergency chains on trains and demanded special trains. Officials also alleged that candidates who were willing to travel for the examination were being prevented from boarding trains.

Patna District Magistrate Dr. Thiagarajan S.M. said authorities received information late at night about disturbances at the station and rushed to the spot. "Late at night, we received information that some people were creating unrest at the railway station. We reached the spot and dispersed the crowd using mild force. The situation is now completely peaceful and under control, and there is no further problem," he said.

Thiagarajan said some people were protesting over issues related to train arrangements. "Although special trains had been arranged and

two special trains were already stationed there, some anti-social elements reportedly mixed in with the protesters and began pelting stones," he said, adding that peace was restored after police intervention.

Central Range (Patna) Inspector General of Police Jitendra Rana said around 200 to 250 students had gathered and were preventing a train from departing. "When police, along with the RPF, GRP and district police force, tried to persuade them to clear the way, some of them resorted to stone-pelting," Rana said.

He said police then took necessary action to prevent harm to life and

property.

East Central Railway (ECR) Chief Public Relations Officer Saraswati Chandra said a large number of candidates appearing for the Bihar Excise Constable examination had assembled at Patliputra station and stopped Train No. 12488 (Seemanchal Express). While many students had boarded the train, a section of "so-called students" allegedly attempted to create disturbances. He said railway authorities had anticipated heavy passenger movement and had arranged a special train for Kathbar as early as 2.30 am. The train subsequently departed at 5.47 am.

Demolition drive: HC orders status quo on three premises at Varanasi's Dalmandi

THE ALLAHABAD High Court has directed Varanasi's municipal commissioner and other respondent authorities concerned to maintain status quo as regards three premises in the city's Dalmandi area and not to carry out any demolition drive in pursuance of a notice dated May 25.

The demolition drive in the Dalmandi area is primarily aimed at widening the road to the Kashi Vishwanath temple. The project is part of a broader initiative to improve access to the temple and enhance the infrastructure around it.

The drive involves demolishing structures that are deemed unsafe or unauthorised, with the aim of reclaiming encroached land and ensuring better access for visitors and residents.

Alimun Nisha, Rashid Zafar and Zul Kamain have filed three separate writ petitions challenging the May 25 notice issued by the assistant municipal commissioner of the Varanasi Nagar Nigam under section 331 of the Uttar Pradesh Municipal Corporation Act, 1959.

Directing the authorities concerned to file their respective counter-affidavits, a bench of Justices Sallu Kumar Rai and Swarupama Chaturvedi fixed July 20 for the next hearing in the matter.

The demolition drive has sparked protests and concerns from locals who argue that the action is illegal and threatens their livelihoods and heritage. The Varanasi district administration has identified 187 buildings in the Dalmandi area for demolition, with the project being supported by the Public Works Department (PWD) and the Varanasi Development Authority (VDA).

According to the petitioners, no final order has been passed or served on earlier objections filed by them to the notice issued under section 331 of the 1959 Act.

Therefore, the notice to demolish the premises of the petitioners is illegal, their counsel contended. Observing that the matter requires consideration, the court directed the counsel for the Uttar Pradesh government, the Nagar Nigam and other respondents to file their replies within three weeks.

Meanwhile, parties shall maintain status-quo regarding premises which is subject matter of the notice dated May 25, 2026, and the respondents are restrained from carrying out demolition in pursuance to notice dated May 25, 2026, "the court said in its order passed on June 12.

2 held for operating fake common service centre

Meerut: Two persons were arrested on Sunday for allegedly operating a fake Common Service Centre (CSC) and opening bank accounts in the names of unsuspecting people for online frauds, police here said.

The arrests were made during a joint operation by the Cyber Cell and Laxmi Gate police station team here, they said. Police said the accused have been identified as Arkam and Nizamuddin, both residents of Ansar Colony in the Gola Kuan area under Kotwalli police station area. PTI
