

ECoR regulates train services for modernisation,safety upgradation at Puri railway station

Bhubaneswar, June 15 (Representative)

To facilitate essential safety-related modernisation works at Puri Railway Station, East Coast Railway has announced temporary regulation of certain train services between June 16 and June 20. The temporary changes have been planned to ensure smooth execution of critical infrastructure upgradation works aimed at enhancing operational safety, improving passenger amenities and increasing overall efficiency at Puri Railway Station. As part of the arrangements, Train No. 68450 Das-palla–Puri MEMU, Train No. 18401 Bangriposi–Puri Express and Train No. 18417 Puri–Gunupur Ex-

press will be short-terminated at Khurda Road from June16 to June 19. Similarly, Train No. 68449 Puri–Daspalla MEMU, Train No. 18402 Puri–Bangriposi Express and Train No. 18418 Gunupur–Puri Express will originate from Khurda Road instead of Puri during the same period. In addition, Train No. 68404 Puri–Khurda Road MEMU will remain cancelled from June 16 to June 19, while Train No. 68403 Khurda Road–Puri MEMU will remain cancelled from June 17 to June 20. The ECoR has advised the passengers to take note of the changes and plan their journeys accordingly. It has asked the, passengers to visit the National Train Enquiry System (NTES) or use official railway enquiry services for updated train information before commencing their journey.

Rajasthan: Cockroach Janta Party chief Dipke slapped, manhandled at demonstration in Jaipur

Jaipur, Jun 15 (Representative)

Cockroach Janta Party (CJP) founder Abhijit Dipke was allegedly manhandled by some miscreants during a demonstration held by the party at the Shaheed Smarak here today. The party had organised the demonstration against the recurring incidents of paper leaks and the weakening of the Educational Administrative system in the country while demanding resignation of union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan. As the CJP leader reached the venue of demonstration at Shaheed Smarak here, his followers-

supporters lifted him on shoulders. While Dipke was carried on shoulders of supporters some miscreants tried to manhandle and pulled his scarf. One youth emerged from the crowd, roughed him up and slapped Dipke while his supporters were carrying him on their shoulders.. The cops deployed at the venue overpowered the attacker and took him into the custody. The youth reportedly was calling himself a ‘nationalist’ (Rashtrawadi). Despite being assaulted-slapped, Dipke maintained his cool, urging his supporters not to retaliate. “No matter how many attacks take

place, we shouldn’t raise our hands,” he said while pacifying demonstrators. As per the conditions of the permission by the police for holding demonstration, the protesters holding banners and placards in their hands, assembled at the venue this afternoon, raised voice in favour of their demands. They chanted slogans such as “recurring paper leaks are not acceptable, degradation in the education system is worrisome”. Their core demand was resignation of union Education Minister Pradhan.
