

Brahmaputra Board Reviews Flood Management, River Basin Planning and Sustainable Development Initiatives in North East

Guwahati, June 19 : The 88th Meeting of the Brahmaputra Board was held in Guwahati today under the chairmanship of the Chairman, Brahmaputra Board. Representatives from the Ministry of Jal Shakti, Central Water Commission, NITI Aayog, Government of Assam, other basin states and experts from various national institutions attended the meeting. The Board reviewed the progress of ongoing programmes related to integrated water resources development and management in



the Brahmaputra and Barak river basins. Discussions focused on river basin master planning, flood and erosion management, springshed development, sediment management and strengthening coordination among basin states for sustainable use of water resources. The Board noted the progress made in the preparation and updation of river basin master plans across the North Eastern Region. Work covering 15 river sub-basins in Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Mizoram and Nagaland is underway, including surveys, modelling and GIS-based planning activities. New packages covering additional river basins have also been taken up. The meeting reviewed the ongoing study on soil ero-

sion and flood management in the Barak Basin and the sedimentation study in the Siang and Dibang river basins being carried out by IIT Guwahati. The Board stressed the need for timely preparation of Detailed Project Reports for vulnerable locations and highlighted the importance of scientific approaches to sediment management and river stabilization. The draft policy framework for the riverine islands of the Brahmaputra River was also

discussed. The proposed framework aims to support sustainable development, ecological conservation, livelihood enhancement and disaster resilience of communities living on the islands. Progress in preparing Standard Operating Procedures for river basin master planning and springshed management was also reviewed to promote scientific and participatory planning processes across basin states. Financial and administrative matters, including the Annual Accounts and Annual Report for 2025-26, revised budget allocations and the Annual Action Plan for 2026-27, were also considered during the meeting.

National Panel Raises Concerns over NCAHP Regulations on Nutrition Education

Guwahati, June 19 : A National Panel Discussion on "Multidisciplinary Nutrition in Transition: Opportunities, Risks, and the Way Forward" was jointly organized by the Home Science Association of India (HSAI) and the Department of Home Science, Banaras Hindu University, on June 16. The session was led by Prof. Madhu Sharan, President, HSAI, and coordinated by Prof. Suman Singh, Honorary Secretary, HSAI. The panel featured eminent experts including Prof. Jagmeet Madan, Prof. Pulkit Mathur, Prof. Usha Antony, and Prof. Mamoni Das, along with participation from around 200 academicians and stakeholders across the country. Prof. Jagmeet Madan highlighted that the formation of NCAHP is a welcome move towards standardization and informed that provisions regarding equivalence for students who graduated prior to 2026 are currently under draft and expected to provide clarity. However, other panelists and the wider participant group raised serious concerns that the current framework, if implemented without adequate transition mechanisms, may adversely impact thousands of students enrolled in Home Science and Food & Nutrition programmes across universities. Key issues included lack of clarity on recognition, possible exclusion from employment opportunities, and challenges in aligning diverse academic systems under a uniform regulatory model. The panel emphasized that Nutrition is a multidisciplinary field and should not be restricted to hospital-based dietetics alone. It called for safeguarding existing programmes, ensuring equivalence for current students, and protecting diverse career pathways in public health, food science, research, and community development. The panel recommended introduction of bridge courses, clear equivalence criteria, and a consultative approach involving UGC, NCAHP, ICAR, and other stakeholders. It also urged explicit recognition of Home Science graduates for relevant positions across sectors. The event concluded with a Vote of Thanks by Prof. Mukta Singh from the host institution, BHU. The programme was efficiently coordinated by Prof. Neeru Shama and Dr. Komal Chauhan. The discussion concluded with a strong call for collaborative and inclusive policy implementation to ensure that standardization does not compromise academic diversity or student futures.

Dr Ranoj Pegu launches Operational Details of FYUGP Fourth Year, NEP Ready Reckoner 2026 and FAQ Booklet at GU

Guwahati, June 19 : Dr. Ranoj Pegu, Hon'ble Education Minister, Government of Assam, on Friday released the Guidelines for Operationalisation of the 4th Year of the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) for affiliated colleges under Gauhati University, along with the NEP Ready Reckoner 2026 and an FAQ Booklet on FYUGP Fourth Year. The release was held at the University campus in the presence of Vice Chancellor Prof. Nani Gopal Mahanta, representatives of the Assam College Principals' Council and other dignitaries. Speaking at the event, Dr. Pegu congratulated Gauhati University on preparing the guideline, calling it the first such guideline prepared by the university, and thanked the team behind the accompanying FAQ booklet. "Whenever we face any complication, or a crisis, or a confusing matter, we will not react. We will act," he said, adding that addressing such issues called for calm deliberation, identification of stakeholders, and timely consultation before matters move into the public debate. He further described the State government as a responsive one, stating that it would intervene promptly wherever advance indication of an issue was received. The welcome address was delivered by Prof. Upal Sarma, Registrar and the inaugural address was delivered by Prof. Nani Gopal Mahanta, Vice Chancellor followed by the address by Dr. Ranoj Pegu. The vote of thanks was proposed by Prof. Rajib Handique, Academic Registrar. In his inaugural address, Prof. Mahanta acknowledged that the transition to the Fourth Year had brought genuine operational challenges, but described these as an opening rather than an obstacle. "A challenging situation can be approached in two ways: one way is that we give in and let the challenge overtake us. But the challenge also gives us an opportunity — an opportunity to redefine, an opportunity to reroute. We have

taken this challenge as an opportunity," he said. The guidelines provide a clear roadmap for the introduction of the 4th year through two pathways, Honours and Honours with Research, in line with the vision of NEP 2020. A key provision allows all colleges offering Major programmes to begin the 4th year even without post-graduate programmes. For the 2026-27 academic session, special relaxations have been built in to ensure a smooth transition, including admission to the Honours pathway for students with backlogs, and simplified provisions for research supervision and infrastructure. The guidelines further enable eligible students completing the 4th year to pursue direct PhD admission, opening up new pathways for higher learning and research. Dr. Pegu also spoke on the State's broader higher education reforms, including the rationalisation of outdated academic programmes and the introduction of in-
