Suspected shooter among two arrested in Jammu

SUSPECTED SHOOTER among two accused arrested in the Jammu region four days after the murder of a cashier at a chemist shop at Sector 11 in Chandigarh, the UT Police said on Wednesday.

Chandigarh Inspector General of Police (IGP) Pushpendra Kumar said, "The accused, Sunny Mehra and Aryan Sharma, have been apprehended by teams of the Operations Cell and Crime Branch."

Police sources said Sunny was inside the shop when the incident took place, and could be the shooter, but since he and his accomplice had their faces covered with masks, the exact identity of the shooter could only be established during their questioning.

According to police sources, investigators have also identified a third suspect, and raids are underway to arrest him.

The arrested accused are being brought to Chandigarh and will be produced before a court, where police will seek their remand, they said.

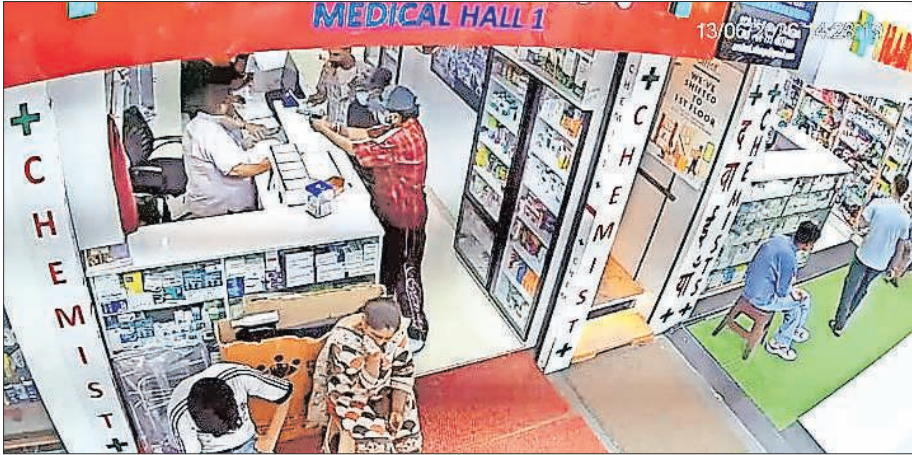
Investigators are, however, yet to establish the motive behind the killing.

Police sources said the circumstances leading to the murder and the role of each accused are expected to become clearer during their custodial interrogation.

The victim, Janki Das (45), a native of Himachal Pradesh, was employed as a cashier at Shri Kumar Medicos in Sector 11. Das suffered multiple bullet injuries in the shooting on June 13 and later succumbed to his injuries at Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER) in Chandigarh.

According to the police investigation, two young men with their faces covered with masks and wearing caps entered the chemist shop posing as customers. The duo stayed inside the store for some time while staff attended to customers, apparently waiting for

an opportunity to strike, police said.

At the time of the attack, Das was speaking with another employee near the counter when one of the assailants pulled out a firearm and opened fire at Das from close range, according to the police investigation. Das suffered multiple gunshot wounds and collapsed.

After the shooting, the assailants fled on a motorcycle parked outside the shop, where the third accomplice was allegedly waiting.

Senior police officers, forensic experts and crime scene teams rushed to the spot soon after the incident.

Earlier, the IGP had said that the motorcycle used by the assailants was found abandoned near the Bougainvillea Garden in Sector 3, providing the police with a crucial lead in the case.

Police said further investigation is underway.

Five cops on naka duty suspended for laxity

The Chandigarh Police on Wednesday placed five of its police personnel under suspension with immediate effect



after they were found deficient in the performance of their duties during surprise inspections of law-and-order nakas across the city,

According to the suspension order issued by Chandigarh SSP Sumer Pratap Singh on Wednesday, surprise checks were conducted at various nakas, during which five personnel were found deficient in the discharge of their duties. The suspended personnel include one sub-inspector, two lady constables and two senior constables posted at different police stations and units, it stated.

The order, however, did not specify the exact nature of the deficiencies that led to the disciplinary action.

The personnel named in the order are SI Bachittar Singh of Police Station-11, Lady Constable Suman of Police Station-11, Senior Constable Robbin of Police Post Lake, Lady Constable Deeksha of Police Station-3, and Senior Lady Constable Jaspal Kaur of Police Station IT Park.

According to the order, "During the suspension period, all five personnel will remain attached to the District Police Lines at Sector 26 in Chandigarh. Their service conditions during suspension would be governed under the applicable provisions of the Punjab Police Rules, and they would be entitled to subsistence allowance as admissible under the rules."

TWO HELD AFTER ENCOUNTER: PANCHKULA POLICE

4 accused in Pinjore abduction case arrested

‘One accused is linked to Rohit Godara gang’

FOUR ACCUSED were arrested separately in connection with the abduction and robbery of a Pinjore resident, with two of them, including an alleged arms supplier linked to the Rohit Godara gang, after an encounter on Wednesday, Panchkula police said.

A Crime Branch team arrested two accused, Viren and Ashish, both residents of Charkhi Dadri, in Phase I here on Tuesday (June 16), while the search for other accused persons continued.

On Wednesday morning, police received information about the two absconding accused being present in the Ali-pur Industrial area under the jurisdiction of the Barwala police outpost. Acting on the tip-off, a Crime Branch team reached the spot and asked the

suspects to surrender.

According to police, the accused, however, opened fire at the police team, and two bullets struck the bulletproof jackets of policemen. In retaliatory firing, both accused suffered injuries in the legs and were arrested, police said.

Police said a .32-bore pistol and two live cartridges were seized from their possession, and a black Scorpio SUV used in the crime was impounded.

Police identified the injured accused persons as Yogesh Kumar from Bhiwani and Deepesh Kumar from Charkhi Dadri, both undergoing treatment at the Sector 6 Civil Hospital.

Yogesh is suspected to have supplied weapons to the Rohit

Godara gang and faces cases related to organised crime and violations of the Arms Act in Gurgaon, while Deepesh has cases of abduction and assault lodged against him, police said.

Police said all four accused are students.

Addressing mediapersons, DCP (Crime and Traffic) Amrinder Singh said the case originated from a complaint filed by a resident of HMT, Pinjore, alleging that he was abducted and robbed by four men on June 15.

According to the complainant, he was on his way home after refuelling his scooter at HMT petrol pump around 5.30 pm when a black Scorpio stopped near Gauri Shankar temple. Four occupants of the vehicle allegedly

asked him for directions before threatening him with a knife and forcing him into the SUV, he said. The complainant said the accused drove towards the highway, crossing the Chandimandir toll plaza and the Barwala toll plaza, and allegedly snatched Rs 12,000 in cash and his mobile phone.

The complainant further said the accused used his mobile phone to make a UPI payment for fuel and withdrew additional money before abandoning him near the Barwala grain market hours later.

Based on the complaint, Pinjore police registered a case under sections 140(3), 309(4), 351(2) and 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and launched an investigation.

Police said that they examined CCTV footage from toll plazas and other locations, and alerted various police stations.

Police said the injured accused persons would be questioned in detail after being discharged from the hospital, while both accused arrested on Tuesday were produced before a court, which sent them into two days of police custody.

Enhance security across markets: traders’ body meets UT chief secy

THE MURDER of an employee at a chemist shop in Sector 11 has triggered fresh concerns over the safety of traders and market staff in the city, with the Chandigarh Beopar Mandal (CBM) urging the administration to strengthen security arrangements across markets.

A delegation of the traders' body met UT Chief Secretary H Rajesh Prasad on Wednesday and submitted a memorandum, demanding immediate measures to improve security, particularly in markets where businesses operate late into night.

Led by CBM president Sanjeev Chadha, the delegation said the incident had created an atmosphere of fear among traders and employees. CBM members stressed the need for increased police deployment, regular patrolling and round-the-clock presence of Police Control Room (PCR) vehicles at vulnerable marketplaces.

Traders pointed out that while Chandigarh has an extensive CCTV network, several market pockets continue to witness incidents of theft, snatching and other crimes, especially during late evening and night hours. They said visible policing and quick response mechanisms are essential to reassure shopkeepers and workers.

The delegation highlighted that chemist shops often remain operational till late at night and, in some cases, round the clock to cater to medical emergencies. Employees working during

these hours are particularly vulnerable and require enhanced security cover, they said. CBM chief patron Satpal Gupta told the chief secretary, "Market associations have repeatedly raised concerns about security and the Sector 11 shooting underlines the need for preventive measures rather than reactive action after a crime has occurred."

The traders' body sought a comprehensive security audit of all major markets in the city to identify vulnerable locations. It also demanded installation of additional CCTV cameras at blind spots, improved streetlighting, regular monitoring of surveillance systems and closer coordination between market welfare associations and the police.

CBM general secretary Balwinder Singh said, "Ensuring the safety of traders, employees and customers should be a priority for the administration. A sense of insecurity among market workers could adversely affect commercial activity and business confidence."

Chadha said swift action against the accused would send a strong message and help deter similar crimes in the future. The delegation also requested financial assistance for the victim's family.

CBM chairman Charanjiv Singh said the deceased employee was the primary earning member of the family, and immediate support was necessary to help the family cope with the loss. According to CBM representatives, the chief secretary

assured them that the Administration was treating the matter with utmost seriousness. He said the police had been directed to intensify security measures in markets, expedite investigation and action against the accused, and examine the issue of compensation to the victim's family on priority.

The traders' body welcomed the assurance and expressed hope that concrete steps would be taken soon.

"A safe and secure environment for traders and employees is essential for the smooth functioning of Chandigarh's commercial centres and for sustaining public confidence in the city's markets," members said.

According to the delegation, the chief secretary said the administration was committed to ensuring the safety and security of traders, employees and the general public. He assured the delegation that directions had already been issued to the Police Department to strengthen security arrangements in markets, enhance patrolling and closely monitor vulnerable areas.

He also said the investigation into the Sector 11 murder case was being pursued on priority and that all necessary steps would be taken to prevent such incidents in the future, according to members.
