It's time for the Gulf peace deal

Trump claims accord signing on Sunday, Iran says not yet

THE US and Iran could put to bed an agreement to end the Middle East war within as little as 24 hours, with US President Donald Trump saying on Saturday the deal with Iran would be signed on Sunday and that Strait of Hormuz would be "open to all" immediately afterwards. The momentum came in spite of new skirmishes in the Strait of Hormuz on Saturday. "The Deal is scheduled to get signed tomorrow, and immediately after it is signed, the Hormuz Strait is OPEN TO ALL," he said in a post on Truth Social, signalling what could be a major diplomatic breakthrough after months of conflict. Trump's comments came hours after Pakistan indicated that the US and Iran were in the final stage of negotiations

and that an electronic signing ceremony for the agreement was scheduled for Sunday. However, there is no immediate comment from Iran. Iranian foreign ministry spokesman Esmail Baqaei, however, said the deal was yet to be determined, "although it will not be on Sunday." The warring parties have released conflicting information about the contents of the deal. Tehran has insisted on its right to enrich uranium and maintain control over the Strait of Hormuz. Earlier Saturday, the US said it downed multiple Iranian drones over the Strait of Hormuz. The US military's Central Command posted on X that Iran had "launched multiple one-way attack drones in an attempt to strike commercial ships transiting the Strait".

Modi-Trump bilateral on G7 Summit's sidelines on June 17

PRIME Minister Narendra Modi and US President Donald Trump are set to hold a bilateral meeting on June 17 on the sidelines of the G7 Summit in France, with discussions expected to focus on economic growth, supply-chain resilience, investment partnerships and global security challenges. "This is the 8th consecutive G7 Summit to which India has been invited. At the G7, India will not only speak for itself, but it will also give voice to the aspirations of the Global South," Modi said in a statement ahead of his visit. The meeting with Trump, confirmed by the White House, will take place ahead of a working lunch involving G7 leaders, outreach partners and technol-

ogy executives. A senior US administration official said: "President Trump will meet with G7 leaders to address key issues of shared importance, including economic growth and development, supply chain resilience, illegal immigration, and Artificial Intelligence." The engagement comes during Trump's visit to France for the summit, where he is also expected to hold bilateral meetings with French President Emmanuel Macron, the Emir of Qatar, the UAE President and Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi. The Modi-Trump meeting will be their first in person meeting since India's military operation "Operation Sindoor" against Pakistan last year, although the White House did not provide further details on the agenda of the talks.

SOORYAVANSHI IMPACT

To pursue sports, kids favour open schooling

THE massive impact of teen-age cricket sensations – 15-year-old Vaibhav Sooryavanshi and now-20-year-old Niki Prasad, former U-19 women's T-20 cricket team captain – on young cricketing minds is having a telling effect on the education trends in the country. An increasing number of school and junior college students are quitting conventional education and joining open schooling – especially through the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) – to devote

more hours daily to practice and sharpen their sports skills. R Swaminathan, NIOS Regional Director confirmed this trend, while pointing to a whopping 120% rise in admissions. "Last year, it was 4,600, but this year, it has crossed 10,000 so far," he told *The New Sunday Express*. What is said to have triggered this shift in education trend among youngsters is Sooryavanshi's recent statements that he practises for about 10 hours daily, facing up to 600 balls to hone in his batting skills.



Interactions with several cricket coaches at academies and parents of aspiring young cricketers revealed that this shift to open schooling is fully supported by parents who are themselves impressed by Sooryavanshi's routine, which would not have been possible had he been studying in a conventional school. Tripta (name changed) is a 15-year-old Class 10 student who opted for the NIOS and aims to play for India in the U-19 like Niki Prasad. P7

Officers among 5 IAF personnel killed in transport aircraft crash

FIVE Indian Air Force (IAF) personnel were killed and one was injured when an An-32 transport aircraft crashed after landing at the Air Force Station in Jorhat, Assam on Saturday. The incident took place around 10 am at Rowrah airbase in Jorhat. The aircraft had taken off from the same base for a routine sortie. The deceased personnel are Squadron Leader Prashant Singh, Flight Lieutenant Shubham Kumar, Sergeant Jitendra Sharma, Agniveervayu Khemaram Kumawat and Agniveervayu Danish Alam. A co-pilot survived with injuries. A court of inquiry has been ordered to ascertain the cause of the accident. "IAF extends its deepest condolences to the bereaved fami-

lies and stands firmly with them in this hour of grief," the IAF posted on X. Footage from the crash site showed the aircraft split into two parts. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma mourned the loss of lives. "Deeply anguished by the loss of five Air Warriors in the An-32 accident," Singh posted on social media. The crash has once again drawn attention to the Soviet-era An-32 fleet, which remains one of IAF's most important transport assets despite being in service since the 1980s. With airframes now exceeding 40 years of service, maintaining the fleet has become increasingly challenging, sources said. The Russia-Ukraine conflict has further disrupted the supply of key spares, forcing IAF to pursue indigenous alternatives.

8 KILLED IN SIX SEPARATE ACCIDENTS IN BENGALURU

3-yr-old boy killed in Sarjapur

In a heart-wrenching accident, a three-year-old boy was killed, and his 25-year-old mother was critically injured after the two-wheeler she was riding rammed a goods auto from behind near MRPL petrol bunk on the Attibele-Sarjapur Road between 10.45am and 11am on Wednesday. While the boy has been identified as Iza Adil, his mother is Shaheeba.

"Adil was a pre-school student near Bidaraguppe. Shaheeba had gone on a two-wheeler which belonged to her neighbour. The driver of the goods auto took a sudden turn towards the petrol bunk. The woman and her son were coming from the Attibele side on the Sarjapura Road. The duo sustained severe head injuries. Adil was standing in front of the scooter. Both of them were rushed to a hospital near Sompura Gate, where Adil succumbed to injuries around 11.35 am," the police said.

The family hailed from Mallapuram in Kerala. Shaheeba's 20-year-old brother Mohammed Shiban has filed a police complaint against the goods auto driver.

Mercedes crash kills 2 on Chennai Expressway

TWO people, including a 28-year-old woman travelling in a Mercedes-Benz car, died after the person driving the car crashed into the concrete side wall of the Bengaluru-Chennai Expressway near the Dodda Hulluru bridge at 12.45 am on Saturday.

The woman, identified as Shajia, was a resident of Banaswadi and died on the spot. The body of **Rizwan**, the driver, was found in a water body below the bridge. The police suspect that in the impact of the crash, Rizwan must have been thrown out of the car and died after falling almost 20 feet from the bridge.

Shajia, an employee at a private firm, is said to have gone on a long drive with Rizwan, a second-hand car dealer. The duo was returning home after having dinner at a hotel in Hosakote. Immediately after the accident, only Shajia's body was found. Since Rizwan was missing, it was suspected that he was on the run after the accident. However, his body was recovered later. The impact of the accident was so severe that the front portion of the car was completely damaged.



2 nursing students among 3 dead

In Kengeri traffic police limits, three persons, including two nursing students, have died in separate accidents.

The nursing students are Atul Sibi, 22, from Kannur and Gauri Shankar, 22, from Ernakulam. They were final year students in a private medical college on Uttarahalli Road and were staying in a paying guest accommodation near their college. The duo died after their two-wheeler crashed into a road median near the RR Dental College at Challaghatta on Mysuru Road at 2am on Saturday. The impact was so severe that both of them, who were not wearing helmets, died on the spot due to severe head injuries. Gauri Shankar was riding the two-wheeler.

In another accident, 45-year-old Sukhdev, a carpenter by profession, was killed while six others sustained injuries at Mylasandra Gate on Mysuru Road at 6.45am on Saturday. Sukhdev, along with three others, was travelling in a car. The car driver, who was speeding, lost control and hit two bikes. In the impact, the car toppled, and Sukhdev fell out of the car. The car then landed on him, crushing him to death. Three two-wheeler riders and three others in the car have sustained injuries. The car was going towards Mysuru from the city.



Bus runs over biker avoiding pothole

In a horrific accident, 42-year-old Kantha, a resident of Nallurahalli who was on her way to drop her daughter Neha to college on a two-wheeler, died in front of the latter after she was run over by a school bus.

The incident happened near Meenakshi Layout in Siddapura around 7.45 am on Saturday when the victim was riding towards the Marathahalli side from Varthur.

It is said that heavy rains on Friday night had left the pothole-ridden stretch waterlogged.

Kantha, while trying to avoid the pothole, skidded and fell down along with her daughter. The bus, which was coming from behind, ran over her. The woman was rushed to a nearby hospital where she was declared dead on arrival.

The Whitefield traffic police have registered a case and are further investigating.



Biker hit by lorry dies

K Jayaprakash, 25, a native of Dharmavaram in Andhra Pradesh, died after the two-wheeler on which he was going along with his friend was hit by a container lorry.

The incident happened at the Rani Cross in Devanahalli on the outskirts of Bengaluru on Friday night.

The pillion rider sustained injuries and is undergoing treatment.

The victim was returning to his house in Devanahalli from Electronics City. The driver of the lorry, who was speeding, hit the two-wheeler, killing the driver on the spot.

The Devanahalli traffic police have registered a case.



UPA LOKAYUKTA: 4 MANDYA GIRLS' HOSTELS IN PATHETIC CONDITION

THE four girls' hostels in Mandya town under the Social Welfare Department are found lacking basic infrastructure; torn beds, no bedspreads, pillows, blankets or hot water for drinking and bathing. There are no computer labs, libraries and books to prepare for competitive examinations. Food is not being supplied as per the chart, and what gets served lacks quality. The windows lack mesh and the stinking toilets have broken doors. Two of the four hostels are unfit for human habitation. In all four hostels, the sanitary pads are not distributed since the last two months.

Upa Lokayukta Justice B Veerappa paid a surprise visit and discovered these issues when while he was camping in Mandya to hear grievances of the public in May end.

Taking suo motu cognisance, he registered four separate complaints against the warden, assistant director, deputy director of social welfare department, THO, tahsildar and assistant commissioner, and directed them to take corrective measures immediately and shift the two of those hostels to better buildings with good facilities. The Upa Lokayukta interacted with students and advised them to study well, be honest and bring good laurels to the parents

and the country.

Justice Veerappa directed the authorities to provide nutritious food, make arrangement for consultation with female doctor at the hostels for health check-up at least once a month. He also directed them to furnish the details pertaining to the last two years including how many students were admitted, pass percentage of result in all the hostels.

In Dr BR Ambedkar Pre-Metric Girls Hostel, a total of 144 post-graduate students are accommodated as against the sanctioned strength of 100. Only one 1,000 ltr capacity solar unit is provided for 144 students. More particularly, the inmates complained that there is a stray dog menace around the hostel and no street lights in front of the hostel.

The situation is worsen in the fate of Maharshi Valmiki ST

Government Post-Metric Girls Hostel as it is housed in the rented building with three floors which is not sufficient to accommodate 97 students. Mainly, there is no proper ventilation for air and light which is essential to the living atmosphere for human beings and hence it is unfit to be lived.

Diluted milk and diarrhea:

Dr BR Ambedkar Post-Metric Girls Hostel in Mandya Town is being run in a rented building with three floors, with no proper ventilation and light. The students complained to Upa Lokayukta that atleast once in six months they are suffering from diarrhea. They also said, 'a bucket of water is added for one litre milk'. The students alleged that a woman called Kavitha was visiting the hostel everyday to forge the attendance.

THE High Court of Karnataka has dismissed a public interest litigation (PIL) filed by Karnataka Veterinary Association and three others challenging the state government's January 8 order transferring four acres of land of Karnataka Veterinary Animal and Fisheries Science University (KVAFSU) on the campus of the veterinary college at Hebbal to build residential quarters for HC judges and another

three acres to build a super speciality hospital.

"This is a policy decision of the government for transfer of 4+3 acres... It is well settled that policy decisions cannot be challenged in the absence of arbitrariness, procedural impropriety, perversity so as to shock the conscience of the public and blatant derogation of the governing provisions. So, we do not find that the allotment of 4 acres of land which is adjacent to Nyayagrama (existing residential quarters for judges) in any manner will

impede or is against the public interest, but it is in furtherance of the larger public interest to ensure the independence of the judiciary which is the basic foundation of the Constitution," said a division bench of Justice DK Singh and Justice TM Nadaf in the verdict delivered on June 12.

The court said that when the college has excess land (317 acres), then three acres allotted to construct the hospital for the general public cannot be termed against public interest.

The counsel representing

the HC submitted that the court now has only 48 judges as against the sanctioned strength of 62. Government accommodation has been provided to 19 judges, including the CJ. Eleven judges reside in their houses, 12 in rented houses, one in a guest house, two judges are stationed in Dharwad and one in Kalaburagi.

Two quarters on Sankey Road remain unoccupied because of repair work. At least 30 more residences are required for the HC judges, the counsel said.

Ricky Rai's Lambo taped overspeeding

THE white Lamborghini driven to Ricky Rai, son of late reformed underworld don Muthappa Rai, has once again come under the scanner after a video showing the vehicle speeding on International Airport Road went viral.

The video, which also appears to show flames shooting from the car's exhaust, has raised suspicions of speeding. Officials are also examining whether the vehicle was modified in violation of Transport Department regulations. However, it is unclear if Ricky was behind the wheel.

The video surfaced on Saturday, prompting the jurisdictional Devanahalli traffic police to review CCTV footage from the area and examine footage from surveillance cameras installed along the stretch.

The incident comes months after the same Lamborghini was spotted performing doughnuts near Anil Kumble Circle on MG Road on March 21.

RE-REGISTER FOR GUARANTEES, CM DKS TELLS BENEFICIARIES TO CUT BURDEN

₹100 crore Gruha Lakshmi scheme money being drawn even after original beneficiaries dead, says Shivakumar

IN a major decision, Karnataka Chief Minister DK Shivakumar, who also holds the finance portfolio and seems keen on streamlining the five guarantees, declared here on Saturday that the beneficiaries of guarantees have to submit applications again to continue to avail benefits.

This is to remove fictitious beneficiaries and ensure that the freebies reach only genuine people. The move is expected to save a large amount of money to the state exchequer. Shivakumar, even as deputy chief minister, had been campaigning for streamlining the guarantees as some of the beneficiaries are from well-to-do families.

On Saturday, he announced the decision after a seven-hour-long review meeting with all deputy commissioners, superintendents of police, CEOs of zilla panchayats and secretariat-level officers at Vidhana Soudha.

Citing an investigation conducted in parts of the state, Shivakumar noted that around Rs 100 crore of Gruha Lakshmi money has been drawn by people even after beneficiaries were deceased. In Bagalkot and Davanagere, money is deposit-

ed into someone else's account, while original beneficiaries have no clue, he said.

"Beneficiaries will have to re-submit applications. We are not going to stop the schemes to anyone, but they must provide accurate information. We need

to know which bank they are drawing it from, whether it is going to a Karnataka bank, whether the money is moving to another state, or whether that money is being diverted to Ponzi schemes, bribes, loan repayments, or other suspicious

transactions. We need all this information as we are providing the Gruha Lakshmi scheme to give them financial strength so they can survive and sustain their families," he stated.

Even for Gruha Jyothi, where up to 200 units of power is given free to every household, beneficiaries must submit applications, he added. Beneficiaries are 1,64,000 households, but some families have 5, 6, or 7 meters. "We need to verify if they are living there themselves or if someone else is. Are they from Karnataka? What is their setup? We need to gather information on all this, and we must issue identity slips to them. Right now, we are just giving a small slip — a zero bill. There shouldn't be an issue in issuing a card," he said.

He clarified that Gruha Jyothi is meant for residences and not businesses. "The cost of power is rising by the day and the tariff is reaching Rs 10, Rs 12, or Rs 13. We are also purchasing it at Rs 7, Rs 8 or Rs 9 per unit. We must ensure the scheme reaches those who genuinely deserve it. We will start inviting applications within a few days. I have instructed DCs, CEOs and officers, along with our Guarantee Committee members, to coordinate and fa-

cilitate this," he said.

Officials should reach out to beneficiaries and ensure the meter readers' visit them. "Panchayat officers, PDOs and everyone else should get these applications delivered, entered and documented with a photo. If people don't have a photo, we will take a photo ourselves and paste it," he elaborated.

The meeting was also attended by ministers KJ George, MB Patil, Krishna Byre Gowda, Dr Sharan Prakash Patil, KH Muniyappa, Eshwar Khandre, UT Khader, Priyank Kharge, Ramalinga Reddy, Chief Secretary Dr Shalini Rajneesh and CM's financial advisor LK Atheish.

Though Shivakumar did not talk about streamlining the other three guarantees - Shakti, Annabhagya and Yuva Nidhi, they too will see a reduced number of beneficiaries, official sources said. Even when Siddaramaiah was chief minister, ruling party legislators had sought streamlining of the guarantees as the money saved could be used for other development works.

The Congress government which has earmarked about Rs 51,000 crore annually for the guarantees has spent around Rs 1,21,598 crore since June 2023.

DKS sets his sights on 2028; smooths the way ahead

"Should I be Chief Minister for only two years? With your blessings, I have to again win the 2028 (assembly polls). We all need to work together..."

On any other day, it would have sounded like political rhetoric to galvanise workers ahead of the elections. However, Chief Minister DK Shivakumar's statement during one of his thanksgiving rallies in the Kanakapura assembly segment is far more than mere grandiosity. It has a subtle yet striking message for his party leaders, the Vokkaliga community, and the bureaucracy.

In the last few days, the new CM has given a clear indication of his style of functioning, the course he wants to chart for the administration, and his political ambitions. Going by the speed and assertiveness with which Shivakumar has opened his new innings, it appears that he wants to make it clear that his elevation to the top post is not a stopgap arrangement for only two years. He will make all-out efforts to use his short tenure to lay the foundation for the full term after the 2028 polls, although it is not easy to buck anti-incumbency. And the trend speaks for itself — no incumbent government has returned to power in the state since 1985.

By talking about the 2028 assembly polls in his first week in office, that too, even before the portfolio allocation issues are fully sorted out, and with the greater challenge of ministry expansion yet to loom, the CM appears to be sending a message to his political detractors within the party and colleagues in the cabinet to fall in line and align with his vision as he is here to stay. His approach may help preempt the emergence of multiple power centres within the party, which could dent the government's image and impact the administration.

It is too early to say how the situation pans out over the next few months. But for now, it appears that the party high command is in sync with Shivakumar's Mission 2028, an actionable goal that helps strengthen the organisation to take on the BJP-JDS combine, which will be looking to capitalise on any

missteps by the government and the ruling party. Going forward, especially after the full cabinet expansion, handling internal dynamics in the party could be trickier than the external challenges. The sulking of ministers over portfolio allocations reveals early indications of it. Full backing from the party leadership could prove crucial.

Also, the talk of the next elections is a message to the Vokkaliga community. The party has made a Vokkaliga leader the CM, and he would be running for the top post again. In the 2023 polls, the dominant community in the Old Mysuru region backed Shivakumar, then state Congress president, as it perceived him as a potential CM candidate. The community's continued support would be pivotal to Shivakumar to assert his authority within the party. The JDS has a significant presence in the region, and its top leaders, former PM HD Deve Gowda and Union Minister HD Kumaraswamy, would make every effort to retain their base. With Shivakumar's elevation to the top post and his long-term political ambitions, the regional party faces an existential crisis. Recently, the CM openly invited the JDS workers to the party. As expected, it did not go well with the regional party. As the state inches closer to the elections, both sides are likely to pull out all the stops to win over the community's support.

For the bureaucracy, the message seems simple and direct: not to take things lightly or be under the impression that this government's tenure is short and the election session will kick in towards the end of next year. In his first meeting after taking over as the CM, Shivakumar directed senior officers to prepare an action plan within 15 days. Unlike Siddaramaiah, whose tenure marked a confrontational approach with the Union Government, Shivakumar appears keen on maintaining cordial relations with the Centre to push for the state's projects. He is looking for tangible outcomes to prove his leadership and burnish his record card.

In politics, announcing one's long-term strategy comes with its own set of drawbacks, as it ruffles feathers of those within the party. However, given Shivakumar's tenacity to fight the difficult battles, his detractors within the party or those in opposition would do well not to overlook his ambitions for 2028, and after:

Ensure no citizen is stripped of voter rights: CM to ministers, DCs

CHIEF Minister DK Shivakumar on Saturday said he instructed all district in-charge ministers and the deputy commissioners to compulsorily visit every taluk, guide booth-level officers (BLOs) and establish contact with booth-level agents (BLAs) of any political party to ensure that people are not stripped of their voting rights during the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) — a nationwide exercise by the Election Commission of India to clean up electoral lists.

"Right now, what they (Election Commission) call mapping is restricted only to officials. They might have mapping figures like 90%, 98%, 97%, or 86%, but that doesn't count for us," he told reporters after chairing a meeting of DCs, SPs, DFOs and secretariat officers at Vidhana Soudha. SIR is set to begin in Karnataka on June 20.

"If any voter — including DK Shivakumar or any minister sitting here — wants to protect their vote, they must compulsorily fill out enumeration forms and applications provided by the BLO. Only then will their vote be saved. BLOs will visit people's doorsteps three times, and if they find the house locked or the person missing, they will report it. Otherwise, they will put it up on the notice board. If anyone is working outside the state their documents should be collected, their signatures obtained and submitted," he added.

The CM said he instructed officials that everyone must be given a residential certificate. "Whoever does not have a residential certificate, I have told

officials to issue it. This is because if you don't have the right to vote in the future, it will cause problems for the heads of households in receiving the benefits of the five guarantees, pensions, and other government benefits. If they don't keep their vote, they won't get any benefits," he cautioned.

He said under the Corporate Social Responsibility policy, rural schools should be a priority. "We must provide quality education in villages. We have created a design for this, and in future, we will ask corporates to adopt individual schools," he said.

Private Employment Exchange

Shivakumar said that for the first time in India, Karnataka will introduce a Private Employment Exchange for those who want to secure employment in the private sector. "Local youth should get more opportunities, and we will talk to the companies about it. We cannot tell these companies to hire 100% locals because certain technical hands may have to be brought in from outside. For others, we will fix a percentage after discussion. Those who benefit from our state have to hire local people. Even if it is not 100%, we will fix a percentage after discussing it with them," he said.

Ring roads in all taluks

The CM instructed DCs to formulate a mobility plan so that every taluk has a ring road. "We may not be able to execute it in a single year, but we must mark and establish the grid. There might be financial challenges or other issues. A ring road is compulsory for all taluk and district headquarters," he said.

If my proposal is illegal, say no: CM to babus

CM DK Shivakumar said he instructed officials to say no to any proposal that is illegal even if it is proposed by him. He said they should work as a watchdog of the government. The officers should not bow down to pressures of even ministers, he said. "There will be no margin for corruption as we will bring it down to zero per cent," he said, adding that people can file complaints by dialling the numbers displayed at all DC offices. Shivakumar set a 5-6 month deadline to top bureaucrats to adjust to his style of functioning and deliver the goods to the people. He instructed officials to take steps to set up Bharat Jodo Yuva Sanghas at all gram panchayats and they will be given Rs 10 lakh each to distribute among the youths to nurture their talent in sports and other activities. "It is my brain child and a non-political organisation," he said.

CENTRE SUPPLIED ONLY 30% OF FERTILISERS TO K'TAKA: KHANDRE

BENGALURU: Karnataka Rural Development and Panchayat Raj Minister Eshwar Khandre on Saturday said it is the responsibility of the Union Government to supply fertilisers to states as per farmers' requirements. Speaking to reporters in Bengaluru, the minister said that the Centre has supplied only 30% of the fertilisers required by the state, resulting in a shortage. He urged the Centre to supply fertilisers in full quantity to the state without any discrimination. Khandre also said officials have been instructed to take stern action against those selling fertilisers at high prices and in black markets. On the portfolio allocation issue, Khandre said all portfolios are important, and they are there to serve people. It is their responsibility to handle the portfolios honestly and efficiently, he said. The minister said he is satisfied with the work he has done as forest and environment minister in the Siddaramaiah cabinet, and he would continue to do good work in the RDPR department. **ENS**

Byre Gowda: I'm awaiting clarity before taking charge

BENGALURU Development Minister Krishna Byre Gowda continues to sulk as he is yet to take charge of the department. Gowda's portfolio is devoid of the prominent Bengaluru Development Authority (BDA) and Bengaluru Metropolitan Region Development Authority (BMRDA). Chief Minister DK Shivakumar has retained his hold on BDA and BMRDA. Breaking his silence for the first time since the row broke out, Gowda said that to handle the Bengaluru Development portfolio, which is a massive responsibility, structural clarity is required in order to meet the expectations of the residents and also the government.

"Personally, whatever responsibility I take up, there must be accountability to it. If we have to deliver the results that the party and the people expect, there needs to be complete clarity regarding the portfolio and the responsibilities shared," Gowda told reporters at Vidhana Soudha.

"I want to state very clearly, there is no dissatisfaction at all. However, the CM and the party have entrusted me with a very tough responsibility to look after the development of Bengaluru. I do not view this simply as power because it is a massive responsibility," he added.

Since he has not taken charge, the minister arrived in a private vehicle to attend the meeting of top bureaucrats chaired by Shivakumar. After his recent Delhi visit, where he met Congress high command leaders, Gowda is hopeful of Chief Minister DK Shivakumar resolving the issue. He took part in the NITI Aayog meeting along with Shivakumar, besides accompanying him to meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Declared bankrupt, but MLC Naseer unlikely to get disqualified: Horatti

EVEN as Congress MLC Naseer Ahmed has been declared "bankrupt" by the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT), Bengaluru bench, he is unlikely to get disqualified from his MLC post. Naseer will retire on June 30, 2026.

"We are not concerned about him being declared bankrupt as it is his personal issue. We cannot initiate action suo motu unless someone lodges an official complaint with us. Even then, we will initiate certain procedures by issuing him a notice and giving him three days to reply. The House is supreme than the court," Karnataka Legislative Council Chairman Basavaraj



Horatti told *The New Sunday Express*. Horatti cited a case of a Uttar Pradesh MLA in 1965 insulting the Speaker by saluting the latter showing his back. The issue reached the President, eventually proving that the House is supreme.

Naseer told *The New Sunday Express* that he will challenge the NCLT order before the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT), Chennai bench. He will seek the stay against the proceedings of NCLT. "I will consult legal experts on Sunday to discuss in detail and decide on Monday," he said.

Naseer was declared bankrupt under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code for allegedly failing to repay Rs 1,454 crore outstanding loan of his erstwhile company Scotts Gar-

ments Limited, Bengaluru, which is now liquidated.

NCLT has appointed Insolvency Professional Ravindra Beleyur as Bankruptcy Trustee under Section 125 of the IBC to take custody of all the assets/estates of Naseer, his wife Nuzhat Aisha Naseer and son Awaiz Ahmed, as they are guarantors against the loan. Nuzhat and Awaiz were directors of the company, while Naseer was managing director before it was liquidated following a liquidation proceedings initiated in 2019.

It is said that he may get disqualified as an MLC under Section 140 of the IBC and Article 191(1)(c) of the Constitution, which disqualifies an MLA or MLC if he is an 'undischarged insolvent'.

Naseer was sacked as political secretary by then CM Siddaramaiah for his alleged anti-party activities during the Davangere South Assembly bypolls.

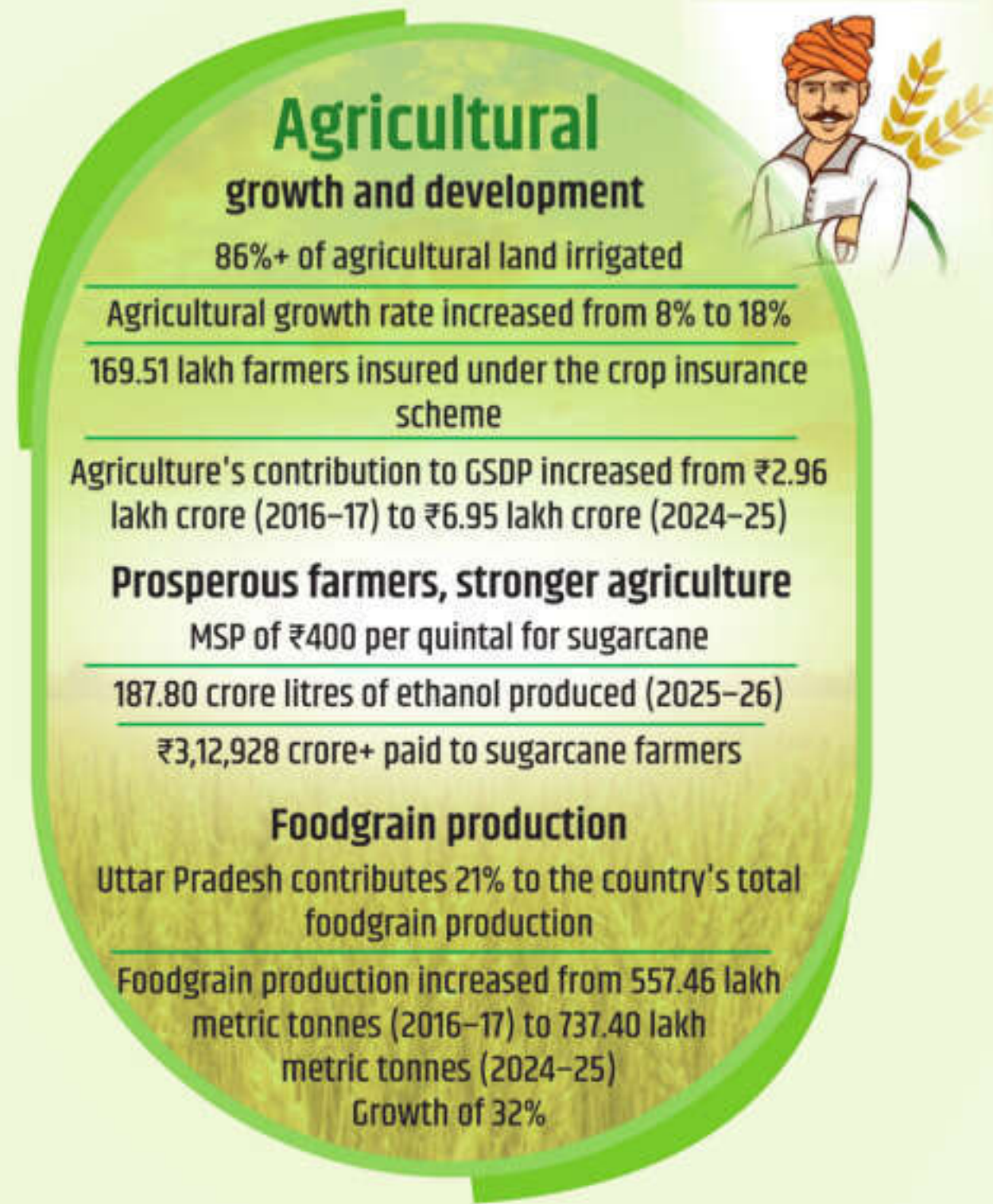

New additions at BBP: Hippo calf, cheetahs

BANNERGHATTA Biological Park (BBP) has announced a series of major developments, including the successful acclimatisation of cheetahs brought from South Africa and the births of a zebra foal and a hippopotamus calf.

The cheetahs, recently acquired from South Africa, have completed the mandatory quarantine period and are now open to public viewing. During quarantine, veterinary and animal care teams closely monitored the animals to assess their health, feeding behaviour and adaptation to local climatic conditions. Following satisfactory evaluations, the cheetahs were shifted to a spacious outdoor enclosure, where visitors can now observe them.

In another encouraging development, a healthy female zebra foal has been born to Zebra Kabini. The newborn has been observed nursing regularly and remains under the care and protection of its mother. With this addition, the park's zebra herd has grown to 11 individuals. The park has also welcomed a hippopotamus calf born to female hippo Dasha. Both mother and calf are being continuously monitored by animal care staff. Special measures have been taken to minimise disturbance in the enclosure and support natural maternal behaviour during the crucial early stages after birth.

BBP authorities said these developments reflect the park's commitment to scientific management, conservation breeding and welfare-focused husbandry practices. The successful introduction of the South African cheetahs and the recent births highlight the park's efforts to create conditions that enable wild-life to thrive under human care.

PRO-Sowjanya campaign activist Girish Mattannavar on Saturday filed a complaint with the Special Investigation Team (SIT) in Belthangady, seeking a probe into claims of Rs 200 crore plot made by Chinnaiah CN, a former sanitation worker in the alleged mass burial case in Dharmasthala.

Chinnaiah had claimed to have buried several bodies in Dharmasthala. He had moved the High Court seeking directions to the SIT to file a final report in the case and sought action against the conspirators named in the preliminary enquiry report.

Mattannavar, in the complaint, said Chinnaiah has vio-



lated the bail terms by releasing the statement made before the court to the media. "SIT officials must apply for cancelling his bail and brain mapping of Chinnaiah should be conducted to bring out the truth. Chinnaiah had said earlier that he was ready to undergo brain mapping," Mattannavar said.

"Being a complainant, I am ready to go through live brain mapping so that the truth is revealed to the public. The SIT must investigate those who instigated Chinnaiah to issue false statements and indulged in conspiracy. In a petition submitted before the High Court, Chinnaiah has made false claims against Mahesh Shetty Timarodi, Vittal Gowda, Jayanth T, Rama Nagaraj, actor Prakash Raj and a few YouTu-

bers, attacking their dignity. Naming Prakash Raj and Youtuber Sameer MD in the case is nothing but a conspiracy to disturb peace and instigate riots in the society. We suspect a conspiracy by influential persons involved in the rape and murder cases, even though false claims are made by Chinnaiah to mislead the public," he alleged.

Mattannavar said the claims made by Chinnaiah before the HC and his written statement to the media in the past are contradictory. "Chinnaiah should be taken into custody and questioned for his claims of a Rs 200 crore plot to tarnish the image of Dharmasthala. The claims made by Chinnaiah gives an impression that he is likely to be under the control of some influential persons. Hence, police should provide protection to Chinnaiah and his family," he said.

FARMER ASSAULTS CIVIC OFFICIAL FOR DELAY IN RELIEF

Bagalkot: A farmer allegedly assaulted an employee of the Bagalkot Town Development Authority (BTDA) on Friday for the delay in receiving compensation for his land acquired for a development project. According to sources, the farmer had been seeking compensation for his land which was submerged for the past four years. He said despite repeated visits to the BTDA office, officials failed to provide either compensation or a clear resolution to his grievance. The incident occurred at the BTDA office in Navanagar during a protest by the Dalit Sangharsh Samiti (DSS), demanding the allocation of residential plots to sanitation workers. The farmer also accused BTDA officials of forcing him to repeatedly visit the office without making any progress in his case. A complaint was registered at the Navanagar police station. **ENS**

India now has over 2.3 lakh startups generating 25 lakh jobs: Jitendra Singh

UNION Minister of State for Science and Technology Dr Jitendra Singh on Saturday said India's startup ecosystem can sustain its growth only through continuous research, innovation, industry partnerships and entrepreneurship, as he inaugurated the RISE Conclave 2026 in Bengaluru.

Addressing startups, researchers, industry representatives and students, Singh said India has witnessed remarkable growth in the startup sector since the launch of the Startup India initiative in 2015. From around 350-400 startups a decade ago, the country now has more than 2.3 lakh startups, generating nearly 25 lakh jobs and

making India the world's third-largest startup ecosystem.

Explaining the concept behind the RISE Conclave, Singh said the platform seeks to bring together four key pillars — Research, Innovation, Startup and Entrepreneurship (RISE) — under one roof. He stressed that startups require constant value addition through innova-

tion and strong industry linkages to remain sustainable and scale successfully.

He said more than half of India's startups now originate from Tier-II and Tier-III cities, dispelling the notion that entrepreneurship is confined to major metropolitan centres. He said the government is working to ensure that opportunities in innovation and startups reach every part of the country.

Singh identified space technology, biotechnology, nuclear energy, artificial intelligence and agri-tech as key drivers of India's future economy. He said reforms undertaken in recent years have opened several sectors to private participation, creating new opportunities for innovation-driven enterprises. Singh also emphasised the need to align research and education with industry requirements and

encouraged young innovators to consider entrepreneurship as a viable career path. He urged parents to support aspiring entrepreneurs and adapt to the rapidly changing technological landscape. The conclave brought together researchers, entrepreneurs, industry representatives, students and policymakers to discuss opportunities in innovation, startups and emerging technologies.

There is no vaccine for the virus that is satire: Adhwaryu

POLITICAL cartoonist Sandeep Adhwaryu said that no vaccine for the virus is satire at the prize distribution ceremony of the Maya Kamath Memorial International Cartoon Contest on Saturday.

The contest, themed "Gender Justice and Women's Rights", was held to commemorate the 75th birth anniversary of noted Indian cartoonist Maya Kamath.

Adhwaryu said satirical cartoons have the power to provoke the public into thinking about politics, unlike some other forms of content that seek to be offensive merely for the sake of virality.

A panel discussion that followed focused on the challenges faced by political cartoonists, particularly censorship.

"As far as Maya is concerned, she never held back any punches, although objections to her work even came from students. Whenever it came to minority issues, they said it should not be included in her book. But divisive art has always existed," said CS Lakshmi, director of the Sound and Picture Archives for Research on Women (SPARROW).

Speaking about self-censorship and the challenges Maya Kamath faced, her daughter and former journalist Deepa Kamath said, "The Emergency, which happened when she was young, influenced a whole generation of human beings and journalists. We were trained as a generation to stop before we said things aloud. Although she grew out of this, she was always aware that there was an editor who would publish her work."

Despite these concerns, the panel remained optimistic about the role of cartoons in reflecting contemporary political realities and encouraging critical thought.

Subhani Shaikh received The Barton Award, which recognises lifetime achievement in cartooning. A political cartoonist who worked with Deccan Chronicle for more than 37 years, he has published over 35,000 cartoons.

The contest received a record 534 entries, with prizes awarded to winners from across the world, including Ukraine, Spain, Turkey and Iran. The first prize went to Valentin Georgiev of Bulgaria for his work depicting the courage of women who challenge religious prohibitions.

COPS: NO FOUL PLAY IN 23 PALAKKAD CHILD DEATHS

AFTER the deaths of 23 minor children in Palakkad district between 2003 and 2023 sparked alarm and prompted the Kerala High Court to seek a CBI probe, Kerala police have now concluded that none of the cases involved foul play.

According to the force, 16 of those deaths were by suicide while seven were accidental. Some involved boys, while the remaining were of girls aged 13 and below. According to a report filed with the HC, investigations revealed the suicides were the result of psychological distress, including emotional disturbance, frustration arising from unmet desires, fear of parental reprimand and other age-related vulnerabilities. Police stated

that no evidence emerged warranting charges of abetment of suicide or any other cognisable offence.

The remaining seven deaths were conclusively determined to be accidental, based on inquest proceedings, postmortem examination and corroborative forensic evidence.

"In none of these cases were any element of criminal culpability detected so as to

attract penal provisions under the Indian Penal Code," the report said.

The first case was reported in March 2003 at Mannarkad police station and involved a 13-year-old boy who died by suicide after hanging himself from the ceiling fan in a bedroom of his house.

The report filed by Palakkad district police chief Ajit Kumar said that after completing investigations into the 23 child death cases, final reports were duly submitted before the respective sub-divisional magistrate courts, seeking sanction to dispose of the cases due to the absence of incriminating evidence. The magistrate courts, upon independent judicial scrutiny of the materials on record, accepted the final reports.

₹92.55 crore foreign funds spent illegally in six months

THE case could be handed over to the National Investigation Agency (NIA) for further investigation, sources said.

"Search and seizure operations were conducted at various locations connected to these individuals and entities. Based on financial transactions, documents and statements recorded during the investigation, it was found that the above individuals and others were associated with TTI. They allegedly used foreign-issued debit cards provided by a bank in the USA to withdraw and utilise foreign funds through ATMs across India," the FIR said.

Between November 2025 and April 2026, foreign funds of approximately Rs 92.55 crore were allegedly utilised in violation of statutory provisions. Between January 2024 and March 2026, nearly Rs 44 crore was withdrawn using foreign debit cards in Karnataka, Chhattisgarh, Assam and other states. On April 18, 2026, Micah Mark was intercepted by ED at Kempegowda International Airport. He was searched and 24 foreign debit cards issued by the bank in the USA were found on him. The ED stated that the investigation revealed he had gone on several foreign trips and brought back these debit cards into India. He is believed to be the key financial operations coordinator of TTI in India, ED said.

Several cards had the name of Santosh Kumar. Regional identifiers were allegedly used to conceal the true identities of cardholders and avoid scrutiny by law enforcement and KYC verification systems. Over 1,000 such debit cards had been distributed in India over the past few years, ED stated.

Following the search operations, the TTI

Global portal was made inaccessible to Indian users, and data maintained on cloud-based systems were remotely deleted from servers controlled by TTI in the US, ED stated. Mark admitted that he deleted his account from the backend system, ED added.

The ED investigation revealed suspicious cash transactions of Rs 6.34 crore in Left Wing Extremism (LWE)-affected areas, including Dhamtari and Bastar regions of Chhattisgarh.

Such cash-based operations in Naxal-affected areas pose a serious threat to India's security and economic integrity and facilitate illegal transfer of funds for unlawful activities, it stated. The cash withdrawals were allegedly supervised by field-level worker Varghese Chacko. During the interrogation, Mathai revealed that he was the overall financial head for TTI's operations in India. Rs 37 lakh was also seized from his office, ED added.

Rajan's examination indicated that he was responsible for overseeing TTI's operations in India. Along with Ajith Varghese, he allegedly coordinated the utilisation of funds withdrawn through ATMs across the country for TTI-related activities, ED stated. Varghese Chacko, Supreme Joy, and Babu Kurmi were identified as field-level workers who allegedly conspired with others to withdraw cash from multiple ATMs. The ED investigation revealed that TTI spent over Rs 95 crore in India.

The accused have also been booked for criminal conspiracy, cheating, dishonestly inducing delivery of property, forgery for the purpose of cheating, forgery of valuable security or documents of title, use of forged documents or electronic records as genuine and creation of false electronic records.

No regret about daughter taking up open schooling: Dad

TRIPTA'S father, who also requested anonymity, told *TNSE*, "It was a difficult decision. To be honest, it was like a toss. But looking at her game and encouragement from her coach, we decided to opt for open schooling. Now looking at how Sooryavanshi and Niki are playing, I think we took the right decision for our daughter."

Another youngster, Adarsh (name changed), an U-19 league player aspiring to play for India, and impressed by Sooryavanshi, said, "With conventional schooling methods, I was unable to put in long hours of practice to pursue my interest in cricket. I opted out of conventional schooling to increase the number of practice hours. And my game and my grades are good."

A Shankar, Honorary Secretary, Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA) – which runs state-sponsored academies to train young cricketers across three main age categories of under-14, under-16 and under-19 – said there is a marked rise in the number of students taking up cricket as a full-time career and preferring open schooling. "The talent is immense. Earlier, children were inspired by Virat Kohli, Sanju Samson and Smriti Mandana; but the latest role models for them are in their own age group – Vaibhav Sooryavanshi and Niki Prasad – who have themselves opted for open schooling," he said.

The latest trend is a game-changer from the earlier understanding that playing for the school – like Sachin Tendulkar, Rahul Dravid and Rohit Sharma – and excelling there is the basic rung for rise in cricket careers. Aarush (name changed), who opted out of regular school after Grade 8, said, "After playing for clubs and getting selected

for league matches, I do not regret my decision. I am getting noticed," he said, adding that there are around 200 clubs in the state, and KSCA is encouraging them. They organise regular matches, from where players are selected for higher levels.

Nisheet Doshi, Administrator, Jawahar Sports Club, one of the oldest cricket clubs in Bengaluru, said the trend of students going for open schooling is picking up as the awareness and options are increasing.

Bindu M, a teacher at Delhi Public School (North) and at NIOS, said open schooling has not only helped students take up sports, but also improve academically. In many cases, it has been observed that the confidence level of students has improved over time. The children, who opted out of conventional schooling because of poor results, are now excelling and getting over 92% under NIOS by choosing subjects of their interest compared to what the schools offered.

NIOS' Swaminathan pointed out that not just for cricket, but even for other sports and cultural activities open schooling is offering a better schedule. "While cricket is popular here, students are excelling even in dance and music internationally," he said.

To further help students, NIOS has started an exam-on-demand schedule, transfer of credit system (where conventional school subjects can be combined with NIOS subjects) and freedom of choosing subjects from a basket of over 20, which helps them make suitable educational choices, he added. Besides, education through NIOS is recognised for medical, engineering, IITs, JEE and other international and competitive boards. "Parents and children have understood this and thus their numbers are increasing," Swaminathan added.

THE ALGO RAJ: POLITICAL RISKS OF TECH OLIGARCHY

ON Thursday evening, he was worth \$696 billion. Roughly 12 hours later, as SpaceX listed on Nasdaq, mercurial genius Elon Musk notched history’s milestone—the world’s first trillionaire. A trillion is eleven digits long. I asked Grok how long it would take to spend it. The answer: 31,710 years, three times longer than recorded human civilisation.

Warren Buffett observed that neither he nor anyone else could have dreamt of the fortunes now attainable. “It has been mind-blowing—beyond the imaginations of Ford, Carnegie, Morgan or even Rockefeller. Billions became the new millions.” A trillion, it would seem, is the new billion.

SpaceX clocked \$2.1 trillion in market cap to join sibling Tesla in the pantheon of a dozen tech hegemony who together command about \$25 trillion. Twelve stocks—Nvidia, Google, Apple, Microsoft, Amazon, SpaceX, TSMC, Broadcom, Tesla, Micron, Meta, Samsung—account for over 40 percent of all US-listed stocks. The SpaceX IPO was oversubscribed four times notwithstanding caveats like only CEO Musk can sack CEO Musk and, warnings about markets that did not exist.

SpaceX will be followed by Anthropic valued at \$965 billion and Open AI at \$852 billion. The rise of Algo Raj, the expansion of moneycracy amid inadequate guardrails, represents a political risk for democracies. Already, the tech hegemon complex is larger than the GDP of Europe and China individually, and even more than the combined GDP of Japan, India and the UK. The cumulative wealth of the Big Tech founders is nearly \$3 trillion.

History shows that empires are built on tangible assets—J P Morgan consolidated railroads, John Rockefeller founded Standard Oil, Henry Ford transformed mobility and Sam Walton created Walmart. The new hegemony leveraged intangible algorithms. SpaceX was valued at \$1.77 trillion despite dismal revenues of \$18.7 billion—less than low-cost retailer Dollar Tree’s \$19.3 billion, though that company has a market cap of \$21 billion. Legendary investor James Chanos calls the gap between revenues and valuation a rush of hopes and dreams.

As with the Gilded Age barons, the new hegemony operates at the choke-points of the economy. Google dominates nearly 90 percent of global search, Nvidia commands 80 percent of the AI chips market, Meta’s platforms reach 3.3 billion or roughly half of humanity, Amazon’s AWS has a third of the global cloud storage clientele, Apple captures half of global smartphone revenues, Microsoft owns the largest enterprise operating system. The hegemony does not compete in the market. They are the market.

Big tech is amassing shadow market power through smart forward-looking strategies. Nvidia’s investment in Thinking Machines Lab, Google’s active support to 400 companies through Google Ventures alongside big-tag venture capital funds like Sequoia, and Meta’s ‘acquihires’ gobbling start-ups for talent.

AI is Manhattan Project 2.0 for the US government—but unlike the publicly-funded 1940s’ project, this one is funded and operated by the private sector. Microsoft, Amazon, Google work with the military and intelligence agencies on billion-dollar projects. Oracle, Microsoft, Google and Amazon are on Pentagon’s joint warfighting cloud capability. OpenAI, Anthropic, Google and xAI have been contracted by the US war department for AI solutions. SpaceX enables satellite launches, secure communications and missile tracking. It is moot if the State dependent on these hegemony can check their advance.

Algo Raj grants the tech oligarchy unprecedented power. Governments across the globe court them, but can scarcely command them. Jensen Huang, Sundar Pichai, Sam Altman, Dario Amodei and others receive red-carpet treatment when they meet heads of State. Apple sources components from 43 countries. Tim Cook, the diplomat-in-chief, carved a reputation navigating the minefields of geopolitics.

Digital dominance is an existential call for countries, companies and individuals. It demands algo-allegiance—who gets heard and what gets seen, or what gets buried, is determined by algorithm. The leaders of governments that find their voice drowned—the UK, for instance—are keeling. At the high table of geopolitics, digital domination dictates the flow of sentiments and plays a critical role in bending outcomes.

In democracies, the contest between the incumbent and the challenger has an unseen player today, called the algorithm—imagine a blend of hegemonic wealth and algorithms to game the rules, as witnessed in the US. As tech hegemony owns the biggest social media platforms, decibels on the public square are controlled in private C-suites.

This new hegemony is verily the Algo Raj. The algorithm can herd voices and orchestrate events to achieve desired outcomes. History has chapters on the perils of untrammelled power, of merchant outfits who dominated the State. The crackdown on Big Tech in China was as much about constraining their influence and disorderly growth as it was about ideology. At the other end of the spectrum, Donald J Trump, who converted a pledge for a 9.9 percent stake in Intel, is pushing for government stakes in AI giants. Is the objective profit or proactive constraint?

The question is not about tech’s utility, but regulating the utilisation. The question before every democracy—including the oldest and the largest—is whether it will write the rules or allow the Algo Raj to write them.

IN the sprawling Rashtrapati Bhawan complex, where Niti Aayog’s national narrative unfolded last week as polite choreography between the Centre and the states, four chief ministers arrived not as supplicants, but as a single, coordinated force. Kerala’s V D Sathesnan, Telangana’s A Revanth Reddy, Karnataka’s D K Shivakumar and Tamil Nadu’s Joseph Vijay walked in together on what was meant to be another routine meeting. They left having altered the grammar of Indian federalism itself. Their combined weight is impossible to dismiss. These four states command 104 Lok Sabha seats, nearly one-fifth of the lower House. They generate close to 26 percent of India’s GDP and contribute roughly 30 percent of the direct tax revenues.

Not one of their governments belongs to the ruling dispensation at the Centre. What they brought to Delhi was not a list of grievances, but individual structural diagnoses delivered with authority. It was the deliberate construction of leverage. For decades, Indian opposition politics has mistaken noise for power. Regional leaders have often confused visibility with influence, treating protest as an end rather than a means. During their first meeting, the southern quartet has broken that pattern. By appearing as an ideologically opposed bloc rather than four separate petitioners, they have rendered southern solidarity legible to the national imagination.

The grievance they have placed on the national table is both real and self-inflicted by the constitutional order. Southern states have behaved as model federal citi-

zens by every technocratic metric. They curbed population growth when it mattered most for national development. They built human-capital foundations through education and health. They created export-oriented economies that now feed the Union’s redistributive machinery. Their reward, under the delimitation exercise scheduled after the next census, is a diminished share of parliamentary representation. The current formula prizes raw population numbers above all else. They feel success in governance is penalised; demographic expansion is rewarded. For the South, this is not an administrative footnote. It is a constitutional contradiction that turns federal equity on its head.

Revanth Reddy, 56, has given this contradiction its sharpest national articulation. His proposed hybrid formula—half the seats allocated by population, half by economic contribution—does not invent new principles. It lifts that recognition from budgetary arithmetic into the architecture of the Lok Sabha itself. In doing so, he has transformed a regional anxiety into a constitutional question that any serious federal democracy must eventually confront. He has become the public face of the delimitation argument and possesses both the stamina and the political runway to sustain it across cycles.

Each leader supplies a capability the others cannot replicate. At 62, Sathesnan functions as the bloc’s intellectual and moral anchor. A practising lawyer and six-time legislator who rebuilt the Congress in Kerala through patient, principled work rather than inherited advantage, he carries the authority of demonstrated clean governance. Sathesnan supplies the steady calibration of principle.

Shivakumar, at 64, is the indispensable organisational engine. An eight-time legislator with unmatched command of booth-level mobilisation and alliance arithmetic, he rescued the Congress in

Karnataka from near-extinction and converted survival into stable governance. Karnataka is not merely another southern state; it is the physical and political bridge to the peninsula. Any formation that aspires to national consequence must pass through that gateway. Shivakumar guards it with institutional memory, personal relationships and the unglamorous machinery of power.

Joseph Vijay, at 51, remains the most disruptive element. He entered politics without dynasty, without prolonged apprenticeship inside an established party and without the ideological scaffolding that usually organises Tamil Nadu’s contests. He converted a cultural phenomenon into a governing majority that now controls the South’s largest economy and largest parliamentary contingent—39 Lok Sabha seats. His presence at the Niti Aay-

og table in his first term signals that Tamil Nadu’s historic ambivalence toward active engagement with national structures has shifted. More importantly, he commands a cross-community base that conventional

categories struggle to contain. These four capabilities are not interchangeable.

They form a functional whole: moral legitimacy, galvanising issue-framing, organisational muscle and mass disruptive appeal. When aligned, they produce something Indian opposition politics has repeatedly failed to manufacture, a coherent southern position on representation and resources that carries electoral consequences rather than mere rhetorical force. The BJP’s organisational footprint remains thin across most of the southern theatre. In Telangana, Tamil Nadu and Kerala, its electoral ceiling is structurally constrained. Karnataka is the sole genuine contest. This asymmetry grants the quartet strategic breathing room their Hindi-belt counterparts rarely enjoy.

The real adversary, however, is not the BJP. It is entropy. Regional coalitions in India have a well-documented habit of

fracturing under the pressures of personal ambition, competing state interests and the centrifugal pull of immediate political calculations. Converting a moment of impressive solidarity into a durable institution is a harder task than any single election, and history offers more examples of failure than success. Yet the structural conditions favouring persistence are stronger than in previous regional experiments. The bloc’s economic weight and parliamentary numbers create objective leverage that sentiment alone cannot generate. The delimitation question supplies a durable constitutional grievance around which coordination can crystallise over time.

Given that none of the four leaders is past the conventional peak of an Indian political career means the human capital exists to sustain the project across a decade. If that discipline holds, the implications extend far beyond the next election cycle. A southern formation commanding such economic and parliamentary leverage could, over successive electoral cycles, force a renegotiation of the terms of federalism. National coalition arithmetic would shift permanently from One Nation, One Election and One Party to any party or a combination of many aspiring to govern at the Centre. The old binary of national party versus regional formation would give way to a more genuinely multiple polity.

What the southern quartet has already achieved is the first, and perhaps hardest, step. They have compelled a Centre long accustomed to managing regional dissent through selective concession to treat their argument as structural rather than episodic. Whether this becomes the opening chapter of a lasting reordering or merely an impressive season of solidarity will be decided by what these four men do next. The South has found leaders who appear to recognise the stakes. The centre of political gravity is already beginning to tilt—not through demographic accident, but through deliberate organisation. In that emerging reality, the old assumption that numerical superiority somewhere guarantees national dominance no longer holds as an unchallenged premise. The conversation has changed. The structure of power may yet follow.

LAWYERS sport it. Corporate executives flaunt it. Even callow job aspirants wear it. But when a newly-minted chief minister shows up in one in Tamil Nadu, it can raise eyebrows. On that rests the power of symbolism and context in political dressing.

Power dressing has a whole new meaning in India, thanks to the bittersweet memories of the British Raj. It gets more complicated when dresses reflect contrasting shades of ideology. Given the pluralistic but chequered past of social conflicts in India, outfits can be read like tarot cards, with deep symbolism.

Tamil Nadu’s latest actor-leader thundered that his decision to wear a black jacket over white instead of the traditional ethnic clothes symbolised transparency and simplicity. “Is it meant only for people in positions of authority? There is nothing like that,” he said.

How things have changed, I said to myself in what seemed like the reverse of a reverse swing. Mahatma Gandhi wore his

dhoti after shedding the lawyer suits he had sported for decades. The homespun dress led to Winston Churchill’s infamous description of him as a “half-naked fakir”, which in turn helped Gandhi invoke the spirit of *swadeshi* pride.

Things have come a full circle, because for at least four generations born at the time of India’s independence and later, the black jacket signalled not just British colonialism but a wider sense of authority. In that earlier significance, the choice was not between the East and the West, but between an elite and a commoner.

The Raj gave rise to options that fashionistas might call mix-n-match elegance. We had Nobel-prize-winning physicist C V Raman and engineer-statesman Mokshagundam Visvesvaraya wearing Indian turbans with Western jackets. Many swapped trousers for the more comfortable dhoti or its southern variation, the veshti, tied without the formal folds.

It was different for B R Ambedkar, noted V S Naipaul in *A Million Mutinies Now*. The writer described the Dalit icon as somebody who consciously embraced Western dressing to show an affinity with the British so that it might help lift the depressed classes. Naipaul threw in the fact that most Ambedkar statues in Dalit neighbourhoods show him with a book, representing his wish to educate those left behind in a traditional hierarchy. Of course, the book is the Constitution of India, which promises to empower the disenfranchised.

Tussles continue in some parts of India over Dalit grooms sporting turbans and riding horses during wedding pro-

cessions, which are seen as sartorial markers of upper-caste dominance. Ambedkar’s dress code is thus highly relevant as an iconic assertion. In Tamil Nadu, Ambedkarite VCK leader Thol Thirumavalavan can sometimes be spotted wearing the complete Western ensemble including a tie, inspired by his icon.

The Ambedkar-Gandhi dichotomy in engaging with British rulers persisted after 1947. The corporate culture in ‘box-wallah’ multinationals and the social status commanded by executives in British companies (excellently portrayed in Satyajit Ray’s 1971 film *Seemabaddha*) ensured that the suit endured far beyond the Raj. Officers of the Indian Civil Service and its successor Indian Administrative Service kept up the practice.

Jawahar Lal Nehru, described by some as a westernised oriental gentleman, made his nationalistic style statement with the Nehru jacket, a bandhgala. Its sleeveless variant is increasingly called the Modi jacket in what the ideologically astute might describe as sheer irony.

The combination of the black jacket’s elite symbolism and Vijay’s appeal to Gen Z voters may show what young Indians are looking for today is a modern sense of self-confidence or authority rather than any colonial appeal.

Political symbolism in dressing took a turn in the South when E V Ramasamy Periyar’s Dravida Kazhagam adopted black as its colour of ideological assertion. For Periyar, it was the colour to show the historical enslavement of lower-caste communities. In contrast, leaders of the breakaway parties like DMK and AIADMK embraced the all-white shirt-and-veshti ensemble.

Somewhere along the way, former PM Rajiv Gandhi and DMK leader M K Stalin made everything less fussy. The Nehru family scion was seen occasionally sporting the Western suit, at other times in the Nehru jacket and, for a marathon, even in a round-neck sweatshirt and track pants. Stalin has been photographed in similar outfits during his morning walks and bicycle rides.

By and large, dressing now seems more meant for social media banter than for political or ideological symbolism. A fashion faux pas may invite chuckles, but outfit variations are unlikely to invite a dressing down from Gen Z.

Immaculately dressed leaders like Shashi Tharoor, who sports Western suits and colourful ethnic weaves with equal aplomb, tell us that ordinary Indians are increasingly comfortable with elegance in various forms. The game has shifted from politics to aesthetics.

14 women get permanent commission

First batch of cadets to pass out from IMA following a 2021 Supreme Court directive to admit women into NDA

FOR the first time in the history of India's armed forces, women officers were commissioned on Saturday with permanent commission from day one, joining the Army and Air Force through the NDA pipeline, that for over seven decades had admitted only men.

Nine women were commissioned as Lieutenants at the Indian Military Academy (IMA) in Dehradun, while five were commissioned as Flying Officers at the Air Force Academy (AFA) in Dundigal. Their commissioning marks the culmination of a journey that began after the Supreme Court opened the NDA to women in 2021.

Women officers in the Army and Air Force have until now entered through the Short Service Commission (SSC) route, becoming eligible for permanent commission only after years of service. Officers commissioned through the NDA-IMA and NDA-AFA pipelines receive it from day one. The fourteen newly commissioned officers are thus the first women to enter either service on those terms.

Women have served as permanent commission officers in the Armed Forces Medical Services for decades. Those joining non-medical branches, however, could do so only under Short Service Commission from 1992 onwards, with permanent commission available only after years of service and, in many

cases, only after sustained legal pressure. In 2020, the Supreme Court directed that women officers be granted permanent commission, describing their exclusion as discriminatory. A year later, the court ordered the opening of the NDA to women, paving way for their entry into the tri-services training institution.

The first batch of women cadets joined the NDA in 2022. Of the 17 women who graduated from the academy in 2025, ten opted for the Army, six for the Air Force and three for the Navy before proceeding to their respective service academies

for pre-commission training. Reviewing the Passing Out Parade at IMA, President Droupadi Murmu described the occasion as a "watershed moment" for both the academy and the country's journey towards greater participation of women in national service.

At Dundigal, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said the growing presence of women would make the Air Force stronger and more representative.

At the IMA, 515 officer cadets, including 34 from 16 friendly foreign countries, were commissioned.

Lt Gen Seth named next Army Chief, 1st Armoured Corps officer in 3 decades

Integrated warfare

Known for emphasis on integrated and tech-enabled warfare, Lt Gen Seth has been associated with the Army's efforts to bring together combat arms, emerging technologies and joint operational concepts. The approach gained added relevance after Operation Sindoor.

LIEUTENANT General Dhiraj Seth, currently serving as Vice Chief of the Army Staff (VCOAS), will take over as the next Chief of the Army Staff (COAS) on June 30, succeeding General Upendra Dwivedi, who retires the same day, the government announced on Saturday.

Lt Gen Seth's appointment marks the return of an armoured corps officer to the Army's top post after nearly three decades. The last officer from the Armoured Corps to serve as army chief was General Shankar Roy Chowdhary of 20 Lancers, who retired in 1997.

Commissioned into the Armoured Corps in December 1986 after graduating from the National Defence Academy, Khadakwasla, Lt Gen Seth is affiliated with Skinner's Horse and has held a wide range of command, staff and instructional appointments during a career spanning nearly four decades. He has commanded an armoured regiment in the desert sector, the 98th Armoured Brigade, and a counter-insurgency force in Jammu and Kashmir. At higher levels, he commanded the Sudarshan Chakra Corps, served as General Officer Commanding, Delhi Area, and subsequently headed both the South Western Command and Southern Command before being appointed Vice Chief of the Army Staff.

His staff assignments have included appointments related to operational planning, capability development and force modernisation at Army Headquarters. He has also served with the UN Mission in Angola. Lt Gen Seth takes over at a time when the Army is pursuing a range of modernisation initiatives.

India completes 2nd phase of ballistic missile def shield

INDIA has achieved another milestone in its long quest for a credible missile shield, with the DRDO acing three back-to-back flight-tests of its second-phase, multi-layered ballistic missile defence (BMD) system.

The trials on June 10-11 saw interceptors destroy their targets in both the endo-atmospheric and exo-atmospheric regimes, the first time the layered Phase-II architecture was demonstrated together in quick succession, the defence ministry disclosed on Saturday.

Phase-II is built to defend against faster, longer-range missiles than the original shield, with the system designed to eventually scale up to intercontinental class. The DRDO said the successes had placed India in "the elite group of nations having BMD capa-

bility" to engage threats up to Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles (ICBMs).

The government statement did not specify the range of the targets engaged in the trials. Sources, however, put the latest intercepts in the IRBM-class 2,000 to 5,000-km band.

This is far from India's first tryst with missile defence. The two-phase BMD programme has logged interceptor trials for nearly two decades, beginning with the Phase-I Prithvi Air Defence and Advanced Air Defence systems.

Phase-II opened with the maiden AD-I interceptor test in November 2022, followed by a full network-centric system trial in July 2024 that demonstrated a capability against 5,000-km class missiles. The systems lean on indigenous long-range tracking radars, low-latency communication links and ad-



vanced kill vehicles and are tailored to counter China's Dongfeng family and Pakistan's Shaheen-III missiles.

In a third, separate trial, the DRDO carried out the maiden flight-test of the Naval Anti-Surface Missile-Medium Range (NASM-MR), a subsonic, sea-skimming weapon with a strike range of around 300 km.

Geared to arm MiG-29K fighters, frontline warships and P-8I patrol aircraft, the NASM-MR

will progressively replace the navy's ageing Russian-origin Kh-35 anti-ship missiles.

India's BMD testing began in the mid-2000s as a two-layered answer to Pakistan's expanding missile inventory and later re-calibrated against China's far deeper arsenal.

Phase-I paired the Prithvi Air Defence missile for high-altitude exo-atmospheric kills with the Advanced Air Defence missile for lower endo-atmos-

pheric intercepts.

The DRDO has also begun work on Phase-III, anchored by two next-generation interceptors internally designated AD-AH and AD-AM. These are being developed to defeat a tougher class of weapons. The first is the hypersonic glide vehicle, which travels above Mach 5 and changes trajectory mid-flight to dodge interception. The second is the missile carrying Multiple Independently Targetable Re-entry Vehicles (MIRVs), where one launch releases several nuclear warheads, each programmed to strike a separate target. The Phase-III interceptors are at an early conceptual stage, with the DRDO yet to begin flight-testing.

China is fielding hypersonic systems and a growing fleet of long-range missiles led by the DF-41, while Pakistan has tested the MIRV-capable Ababeel.

Shah reviews meeting on demographic change

UNION Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday chaired a meeting of senior MHA officials and directed them to ensure all support to the committee on demographic change.

The panel, headed by retired Supreme Court Judge Justice Prakash Prabhakar Naolekar, will study demographic changes, especially in border areas. It will also visit metropolitan areas and industrial towns to assess the changes, officials said.

"The MHA will provide logistical and other necessary support for proper functioning of the committee," a ministry spokesperson said, adding that agenda has been formulated at first meeting of the committee.

According to the government, the committee has been tasked with conducting a comprehensive and scientific as-

essment of demographic changes occurring in different parts of the country. It will examine the causes behind such changes, identify emerging trends and recommend measures to address them.

The panel's mandate includes studying the impact of illegal immigration, cross-border activities, economic opportunities and socio-environmental factors that may influence population movements. It will also investigate what the government describes as abnormal settlement patterns.

The committee will analyse demographic shifts across communities, particularly in areas where population trends diverge significantly from broader patterns. The panel has been asked to propose a streamlined, permanent mechanism for identification, detention and deportation of illegal immigrants.

EAM raises killings of Indian sailors off Oman with Rubio

EXTERNAL Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Saturday raised the killing of three Indian mariners in a US military strike on a merchant vessel in the Gulf of Oman with US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, saying "such lethal actions against commercial shipping are not justified." The US, however, signalled no change in its position, with the State Department readout of the call saying Rubio underscored that violations of the US blockade and the illicit transport of Iranian oil "will not be tolerated."

Jaishankar, who is on a visit to Europe, spoke to Rubio over the phone amid growing concern in New Delhi over a series of US military actions against commercial vessels carrying Indian crew members in the Gulf region. "Spoke to US Secretary of State Marco Rubio this evening. I reiterated India's strong protest at the attacks by the US Navy in the Gulf that killed three Indian mariners," Jaishankar said in a post on social media. "Such lethal actions against commercial shipping are not justified," he added.

According to a readout issued by Principal Deputy Spokesperson Tommy Pigott, Rubio and Jaishankar discussed recent developments in the Strait of Hor-

Hours before leaving for France, PM Modi, in a post on X, said that the NDA government is working to support youth-led development. muz. "The Secretary stressed that all commercial vessels should immediately comply with orders from US forces as they seek to uphold peace and security in the Strait," the State Department said.

"He underscored that violations of the US blockade and the illicit transport of Iranian oil will not be tolerated," it added. The call came a day after India summoned US Charge d'Affaires Jason Meeks for the second time and conveyed that American military strikes on commercial vessels carrying Indian crew members

off the coast of Oman were unacceptable.

Three merchant vessels with Indian crew members have come under attack in recent days. A Palau-flagged oil tanker, Marivex, carrying 24 Indian seafarers, was disabled by US forces on June 8, though all crew members were rescued safely. On June 10, another Palau-flagged tanker, Settebello, was struck, killing three of the 24 Indian sailors on board. A third vessel, Jalveer, a Guinea-Bissau-flagged tanker carrying 20 Indians, was attacked on Thursday.

SHINES BRIGHT AND BEAUTIFUL

SOMETIMES words from legends surmise the raw potential of an up and coming player quite succinctly. And if it is from the legendary Rahul Dravid, a former player, coach, mentor all rolled into one, those words would carry weight in gold. "He is a unique player. Fifteen years after Sachin Tendulkar (retirement), we have new talent. It took 40 years (after Tendulkar's emergence) to find someone this special. Maybe in another 40 years, we may have another Vaibhav Sooryavanshi," Dravid told reporters in good humour whilst talking at an event in Bengaluru a few days ago. And he too has a hand in grooming this prodigiously talented batter.

Two seasons and this is what the teenager had managed to evoke in this cricket-crazy world. It is both romantic and ethereal. And has all the ingredients of a Shakespearean play with five Acts. We have just witnessed the first two—his rise from a nondescript town to Rajasthan Royals and finally the India team. Perhaps, it has entered Act 3, the turning point of his career that would see a legitimate climax soon.

Barely 15, the teenager from Tajpur, a small village 12km from Bihar's Samastipur, has stirred the imagination of the world. He has sneaked into not just the households in India but also into the most media outlets in the world. Just like his other-worldly bat swing, the numbers supporting his ludicrously crazy form too seems surreal: 776 runs at 48.50 average and 237.30 strike rate in IPL 2026 for RR. What stood apart was the disdain with which Sooryavanshi took on some of the bowlers with impressive CVs to the cleaners.

In a span of two months, the teen sensation's face was everywhere. On the cover of magazines to promote every match in the IPL. He was right up there alongside Virat Kohli and Shubman Gill. In a team that includes the likes of Ruturaj Gaikwad, Tilak Varma, the official broadcaster led the promotions with the 15-year-old for the tri-series in Sri Lanka. Days before the series began, one of the social media graphics read—"Ruthless Boss Baby and the Men in Blue in action". The tag continued as he was called-up for the senior team tour of Ireland, England and Asian Games. Sooryavanshi was the talking point during one of the morning shows for the England-New Zealand Test match at Lord's. His rise was being discussed by pundits on a broadcast channel from England and one of them jokingly said, "The ECB are delighted as well, he should help shift a few

tickets."

Put it simply, Sooryavanshi is literally the newsmaker. And it was there to see when he landed in Sri Lanka. The 15-year-old had fans swarming around him for pictures and autographs. The viewership numbers are yet to come, but social media was buzzing for the brief while he batted in the first two India A games. Cricket Ireland officials are giving interviews about their excitement around Sooryavanshi becoming the youngest male debutant in their country. And understanding the attention of the 15-year-old, the BCCI have decided to send his parents along with him to the UK.

However, for the minor, much like the bowler in front of him, the fanfare, craze, everything becomes

secondary. His father Sanjeev and coach Manish Ojha have made sure this tenet would survive while growing up no matter how successful he would become. Ojha credits his father Sanjeev, and former India coach Dravid for keeping him on track when he first entered the IPL last year.

"Every player, when he gets to that level, he has to face all the attention, media, glamour. And each player is built differently. Vaibhav has two important things. His father is always with him. Also, Dravid had given him the best possible lifestyle management advice. He is one of the legends. He has the biggest example in Indian cricket with the likes of Sachin Tendulkar, MS Dhoni, Virat Kohli, Sunil Gavaskar in how they handle themselves. Vaibhav lives in the same players' pool. That is also a very big guiding factor for him," Ojha told this newspaper.

For those who grew up watching Tendulkar and saw the baton being passed on from the legend to Kohli while Dhoni lifted India multiple titles, it may feel like an exaggeration. That Sooryavanshi is yet to prove himself at the international stage in different conditions. That it may be too soon to call him an "once in a generation" talent. Dravid, however, acknowledges him as one.

As for Sooryavanshi, the third Act in his career would define where he finishes.

LOOKOUT FOR AIDE

Police raid TMC's Abhishek's residence

THERE was high drama at the residence of Abhishek Banerjee, national general secretary of the Trinamool Congress, as a large police team raided it in the wee hours of Saturday to nab his long-time trusted secretary Sumit Roy.

The police were looking for Roy in connection with a case involving the alleged transfer of crores of rupees to his bank account by Sujoy Hazra, a former Trinamool lawmaker.

The police zeroed in on Abhishek's house after tracking Roy's mobile tower location. They arrived around 2.30 am but were not let in. They then broke the lock inside the steel gate using a gas cutter to forced their way in, which took four hours. Roy was not found.

In Delhi, there was speculation on further Trinamool desertions after another party Lok Sabha MP Sudip Bandyopadhyay, met the BJP's West Bengal in-charge Bhupender Yadav. He later called on home minister Amit Shah and is understood to have joined the rebels, taking their strength to 20. The meeting came a day before CM Suwendu Adhikari is due to meet the rebel group.

Assam tightens Aadhaar norms to check influx: CM

Divyang, SC, ST and tea garden communities kept out of ambit

THE Assam government on Saturday decided to stop issuing Aadhaar cards to those aged above 18 years to prevent illegal immigrants from getting the document.

The Cabinet, chaired by Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, exempted differently abled people, scheduled castes (SCs), scheduled tribes (STs), and tea garden communities. The exemption for applicants from these communities will remain valid up to March 31 next year. The restriction will not apply to people below 18 years.

Sarma said although Assam has already reached saturation in terms of Aadhaar enrolment, the cards are still being issued. He added that some districts have crossed 100% of the targets, registering figures as high as 114% and 115%.

"As Assam has already achieved 100% Aadhaar saturation, there are apprehensions over who are taking Aadhaar cards. We want that no illegal immigrant can take advantage of Aadhaar," the Chief Minister said, briefing media persons on the cabinet decisions.

"If there are at all genuine applicants aged above 18 years, the Deputy Commissioners will

have to send a proposal. The government will approve. However, no more Aadhaar cards will be issued at the Deputy Commissioner's level to people aged above 18 years," Sarma said, adding, "We want to stop the leakage in issuing of Aadhaar."

The CM had earlier said the state government would be "very strict" in issuing Aadhaar cards, and it would not be easy to get the document in Assam. Last year, he had said the Assam government was mulling stricter rules for the issuance of Aadhaar cards for adults as part of its efforts to

curb illegal immigration from Bangladesh.

The Assam cabinet approved the implementation framework of the Viksit Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (Gramin) (VB-G RAM G) Act, 2025, for the state. The Act will be implemented from July 1. "The budget allocation for the Act is ₹2,000 crore and 125 man-days will be provided for direct wage employment under the Act. Moreover, under the Act, besides providing employment, importance will be given for creating assets as a result of the man-days," a government statement said.

Row over Rabri's diamond bracelet gift to folk singer

RJD chief Lalu Prasad's 79th birthday celebration has triggered a controversy after ex-CM Rabri Devi gifted a diamond-studded golden bracelet to a Bhojpuri folk singer as JD(U) on Saturday wrote to Bihar police's Economic Offences Unit (EOU), demanding a probe.

In his letter, JD(U) principal spokesperson Neeraj Kumar sought to know the price of the bracelet and how it was paid for. "On Lalu Prasad's birthday, Bhojpuri singer Chhotu Chhaila was given a bracelet by Rabri Devi. Chhaila stated that it was a diamond bracelet. Where did this diamond bracelet come from? What is its source? Where is its receipt? What is its market value?" Kumar asked. He said the EOU should investigate the matter based on Income Tax Act 1961, Benami Transactions Act 1988, Prevention of Money Laundering Act 2002, and available evidence. Copies of the letter has been given to principal chief election commissioner (Bihar Jharkhand), ED Director (Patna) and Lokiyukta.

RJD MLC Sunil Singh said Rabri never wears diamond jewellery. When Chhaila began singing a folk song dedicated to Tejashwi's son, Rabri, in her enthusiasm, gifted her bangles to the singer as a reward.

BJP prepares to go solo in Punjab polls, Shah wants outreach at booth level

THE BJP is likely to contest the next Assembly election in Punjab without entering into an alliance. The decision to field candidates on all 117 seats was deliberated upon at a two-hour brainstorming session between Punjab leaders and Union Home Minister Amit Shah, BJP national president Nitin Nabin and party's national general secretary B L Santhosh on Friday night in Delhi. Before meeting the state leaders, Shah met Punjab Governor Ghulab Chand Kataria.

Punjab BJP president Kewal Singh Dhillon later said that discussions were held about the political scenario of the state in a healthy atmosphere. "We will fight on all the 117 seats in Punjab. The meeting was about the party strategy for the upcoming assembly elections." He added that Nabin would visit Punjab from June 20 to 22. 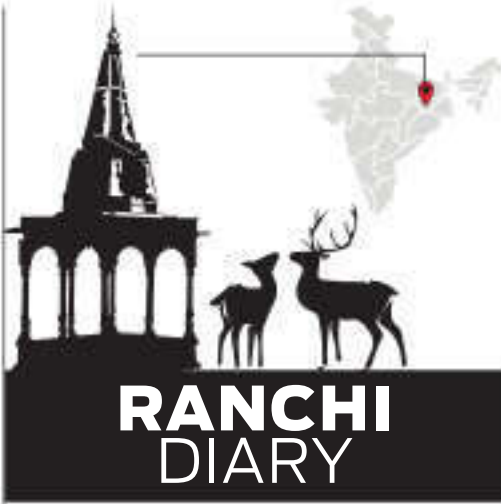
In the meeting, Shah reportedly asked the state party leadership to work hard on the ground to "win the hearts of people and disseminate the party's narrative across the state".

Sources said the agenda of the meeting included an analysis of the political climate, organisational strength and the current situation in Punjab.

State set to get first prison only for women

Jharkhand is set to get its first exclusive women's prison, with plans underway to transform Sakchi Jail in Jamshepur into a dedicated correctional facility for female inmates. A proposal has been submitted to the state government by Jail (IG) Sudarshan Prasad and is awaiting approval. Once sanctioned, the prison will serve as a centralised facility for convicted women inmates from across the state, offering specialised infrastructure and services designed to meet their specific needs. The proposed facility will be modelled on women's prisons operating in other parts of the country, where functions are managed by women staff.



Palak creates history with India U-19 call-up

In a landmark achievement for Jharkhand cricket, Kumari Palak has been named in the India Women's Under-19 squads for the upcoming ODI and T20 series against Sri Lanka. With this, she becomes the first woman cricketer from the Ranchi District Cricket Association (RDCA) to earn a place in a national team. BCCI has announced the squads for the IDFC First Bank Sri Lanka Women's Under-19 tour of India, which will comprise three T20 Internationals and three One-Day matches. Palak has been included in both the T20 and ODI squads, marking a milestone in her crickering journey and bringing pride to Jharkhand and Ranchi cricket.

CID begins profiling fugitives abroad

In a major push against organised crime and overseas-based offenders, Jharkhand CID has directed the SPs to compile detailed profiles of fugitives who have fled the country and are evading arrest. The information will be submitted to CID headquarters to support extradition efforts. The profiles will be used to prepare dossiers for forwarding to Interpol, enabling the issuance of international notices and facilitating the arrest and extradition of the accused to India. The move comes amid growing concerns over Jharkhand-linked criminals operating from foreign countries. More than half a dozen fugitives are running extortion networks.

Toxic gas leak in abandoned coal mine, 4 killed

FOUR people were killed due to a toxic gas leak in an abandoned coal mine in Ramgarh. The incident took place in the Chapri-Bumri area under the Ramgarh forest zone, where few people had descended into the closed coal mine with an intention to extract coal.

Ramgarh DSP, Dr Harendra Kumar Mahto, has confirmed the deaths of all four individuals. According to reports, the individuals had entered the abandoned mine with an intention to extract coal but were exposed to the toxic gas leaking inside the coal mine.

An eyewitness said one man entered the mine first and collapsed due to a suspected gas leak. In an attempt to rescue him, three others descended into mine one after another and also lost consciousness, he said. Another companion then raised an alarm. As locals got to know about the incident, they gathered at the site. Police and CCL (Central Coalfields Limited) teams were informed, following which a rescue operation was started. Four people were rescued and rushed to the hospital; two were declared brought dead, while the other two passed away during treatment.

The deceased have been identified as Deva Kumar Bedia and W Bedia, Ashish Rajwar and Kishore Ravani.

MBBS student from KEM sent on 15 days' leave over her comment on cadavers

DAYS after a video clip of a female MBBS student from Mumbai's KEM Hospital, Sejal Pawar, joking about the size of male cadavers' private parts sparked controversy, the hospital and its attached medical college on Saturday placed her on compulsory leave for 15 days.

She reportedly made the remark around three months ago at a show by stand-up comedian Pranit More. A clip doing the rounds on the Internet shows Pawar making the comment while recounting her experiences from anatomy training.

The latest action comes after the civic-run hospital formed a two-member committee to probe the controversial remark made by Pawar, a third year MBBS student, during the show.

"Pawar has been placed on compulsory leave for a period of 15 days, with effect from June 13, pending detailed inquiry and further orders. At 10.30 am today, she was entrusted to the care and supervision of her parents/guardians during the said period," a statement issued by the office of the Dean of Seth G S Medical College and KEM Hospital said.

She has also been directed to cooperate fully with the institutional inquiry and to remain available as and when called by



the inquiry committee, it said. It further stated that a proposal has been submitted for the constitution of a comprehensive five-member inquiry committee. The All India Medical Students' Association has also condemned her remark.

Notably, Pawar is not the only person who has landed in soup over remarks made at More's show. Himanshu Jangra, a web developer, recently lost his job after suggesting at the comedian's show in Gurugram that spending on a date entitled men to physical intimacy. The Maharashtra cyber police have registered a case against More, Jangra and others for allegedly disseminating "obscene and objectionable" content on social media. The National Commission for Women has also summoned both of them.

Meanwhile, Mumbai Mayor Ritu Tawade has called for a complete ban on More's shows.

AMID reports of a TMC split, Uddhav Thackeray on Sunday convened his party's parliamentary board meeting, which was attended by senior party leaders besides Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha members.

Consent for merch

Anyone intending to manufacture merch carrying the image of the "King of Salangpur" idol will have to obtain written consent.

A controversy has erupted around Gujarat's pilgrimage town of Salangpur in Botad district after the temple trust secured copyright and trademark protection for the 54-foot-tall "King of Salangpur" Hanuman statue and his sacred idol with 13 monkeys installed inside the temple's sanctum sanctorum.

What was projected as a step to protect the temple's spiritual identity has now snowballed into a heated religious debate, with saints and Akhara heads openly challenging the move.

According to the temple administration, the decision was driven by the increasing commercial exploitation of the temple's identity. Images, logos and three-dimensional models of Salangpur Hanumanji were allegedly being used extensively for business purposes with-



out authorisation, prompting the trust to seek legal protection. Temple authorities maintained that various intellectual property rights were registered with the sole objective of preserving the divine forms of Kashtabhanjan Dev Hanumanji Maharaj for future generations.

With the legal protection now in force, the temple trust has laid down several conditions. Anyone intending to manufacture or sell T-shirts, key chains, pendants, photo

frames or any other merchandise carrying the image or 3D model of the "King of Salangpur" idol will first have to obtain written permission from the temple. The move is also expected to curb digital piracy by restricting social media pages, YouTube platforms and other online channels from commercially using the temple's logo or exclusive artwork without authorisation.

Explaining the decision, temple administrators told local media that the temple's image and logo were being misused at several places and their commercial exploitation had increased sharply.

However, the legal protection has triggered strong resistance from the religious community. Saints from different Sanatan traditions have questioned whether any institution can claim copyright or trademark rights over a deity worshipped by millions.

SIT to probe ₹7-cr Ayodhya funds swindle

Report sought

IN the wake of the demand of Shree Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust and acting on the direction of CM Yogi Adityanath, the Uttar Pradesh government on Saturday constituted a three-member SIT to probe into the alleged embezzlement of donation funds from the Ram Temple in Ayodhya amid mounting calls for a transparent inquiry. Donations to the tune of ₹7 crore were reportedly swindled.

The SIT will be headed by Lucknow divisional commissioner Vijay Vishwas Pant (2004-batch IAS) while comprising Lucknow range IG Kiran S (2008-batch IPS), who recently returned to the UP cadre after stints with the CBI and Interpol, and Neelratna Kumar, special secretary in the finance department with over 36 years of service in the state's finance and accounts cadre.



The panel has been asked to submit a preliminary report within seven days and a final report within 15 days.

The alleged embezzlement from temple donation boxes came to light about a week ago, prompting the trust to initiate an internal probe. Sources said trust officials had begun questioning suspects and attempting recovery of funds. The trust later sought a formal probe, following which the state government ordered the SIT.

Officials said the SIT is ex-

pected to visit Ayodhya to examine records, take over evidence collected so far, question suspects, and interact with trust officials involved in the preliminary inquiry. Officials said the SIT will scrutinise how donation collections were handled, the internal control mechanisms in place, and whether other individuals were involved in the alleged diversion of funds.

Investigators are expected to examine records related to donation counting, cash handling, storage, and supervision, while also questioning employees and former staff members connected with the temple administration. The probe assumes significance given the enormous volume of donations.

Denying allegations about the money donated at the Ram Temple going missing, the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust on Saturday had urged the CM to order an SIT probe into the matter.

Japan vs US: Tale of 2 interest rates

With Japan being the top investor, BoJ rate hike may trigger massive sell-off US govt bonds

ONE of the biggest macro events is barreling towards global markets this week.

Two of the world's most powerful central banks will announce interest rate decisions barely 24 hours apart. One is widely expected to raise rates, the other may indicate its intent to do so. Together, the decisions may set global financial markets on fire and mark the beginning of the most testing times of 2026.

On Tuesday, the Bank of Japan (BoJ) is all set to raise rates by 25 bps from 0.75% to 1%. That's the highest level since 1995! Worryingly though, its impact is likely to be felt beyond Japan, dominantly in the US and broadly in the rest of the world. For over three decades, BoJ held interest rates at zero and even below zero encouraging investors to borrow funds at ultra cheap rates, and invest elsewhere like US equities, bonds, crypto, and so on fetching higher returns.

As a result, Japan ended up as the largest foreign holder of US government debt at over \$1.20 trillion and hence the most vulnerable to interest rate shocks in Japan. Higher rates also firm up Japanese bond yields and as the gap with the US Treasuries correct, investors will be tempted to unwind dollar holdings, and convert back to yen.

For instance, JGBs now offer higher income than stocks for the first time since 2008. In January, the yield on 10-year JGB hit the highest level since 1997 and now stands at about 2.65%. If Japanese investors

liquidate, US Treasury yields will firm up and when that happens, it's the global financial system that wobbles. And here's the biggest wrecking ball. It's not just Japan, but the US Federal Reserve (Fed) too is set to announce its policy decision on Wednesday.

Fed chair Kevin Warsh isn't expected to raise rates in his very first meeting. Markets aren't pricing it either, but they will closely watch the Fed's forward guidance, the dot plot indicating each Fed member's rate forecast opinion for hawkish signs, which in turn can push the dollar higher notwithstanding a dovish statement, and finally, the Fed chair's policy statement.

But the very thought of tightening is pointing to higher borrowing costs. For instance, yields on 2-year Treasury notes (which are most sensitive to changes in Fed policy) jumped to their highest level in over a year. At about 4.15%, the 2-year yield is well above the Fed's 3.5-3.75% rate

band. Likewise, the benchmark 10-year yield is dangerously inching closer to 5% — a level widely considered as suicidal for the US government.

In short, the policy moves from the world's two topmost monetary mandarins are invariably intertwined and may even set off a global financial contagion. Widening interest rate differential isn't the only reason Japan will likely liquidate US Treasuries. Given rising energy costs and higher import bill thanks to the West Asia war, the Japanese currency yen saw sharp depreciation breaking the 160 level against the dollar in April. So Japan did what any central bank does to defend its currency, which is to sell dollars.

In April and May, the BoJ indulged in a record-breaking currency intervention liquidating US Treasuries and spending \$75 billion to resurrect yen. But the sale of Treasuries sent shockwaves through the US' financial system pushing up bond yields, which in

turn raises borrowing costs for American households and businesses and importantly increases the interest burden for the US government.

Put another way, a currency crisis in Tokyo unleashed mayhem in US markets.

Meanwhile, Fed chair Warsh's first meeting comes with an unwelcome backdrop of rising inflation, volatile oil prices, and a jobs market running hot. By all means, markets expect at least one 25 bps hike this year to rein in inflationary pressures.

But expectations of a rate change rattles currencies. When US rates rise, dollar-denominated assets like bonds become attractive. And as interest rate differential between the US and other countries widen, the currencies other than dollar weaken. Which is what is happening in Japan, India and almost everywhere. Alarmingly, for countries with higher import bills, a depreciating currency is a double whammy. Take for instance, Bank Indonesia that was forced to raise rates by 75 bps to 5.5% in just three weeks as the rupiah breached 18,000 to the dollar for the first time in Indonesian history.

That said, higher inflation and rising rates aren't favourable to anyone. While Japan's \$9 trillion debt is more than twice its economic output at over \$4 trillion, the US' \$39 trillion debt is a known ticking time-bomb. Every 1% increase in borrowing costs adds over 2.5% of annual interest expense to GDP in Japan. In case of the US, it adds \$6 billion debt each passing day.

ICAI to take up Rajesh Exports case suo motu

THE Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) will constitute a separate technical group on a suo motu basis to examine issues arising from the Rajesh Exports case even as the Sebi has referred the matter to the National Financial Reporting Authority (NFRA) for further probe.

"The technical group will do a desktop review without seeking any documents or information from the auditor of the company concerned," said ICAI President CA Prasanna Kumar D to *TNIE*.

SEBI has referred the matter to NFRA for further investigation along with the interim report. Accordingly, another institute or body cannot initiate or continue any proceedings in such matters, unless NFRA specifically approaches for the same.

"The group will review the general purpose financial statements and auditors' report thereon with a view to determine compliance with the generally accepted accounting principles, the disclosure requirements," he said.

Anthropic asked to disable Fable 5, Mythos 5 outside US

DAYS after Anthropic released its Fable 5 and Mythos 5 artificial intelligence models, the US government has ordered to suspend access to these models outside the country.

Anthropic said it received the export control directive on Friday at 5.21 pm Eastern Time and immediately began taking steps to disable the models to comply with it. It said that the directive covered nations outside the US and affected access to the models. Other Anthropic models were not part of the order.

Company disagrees

Anthropic said that the government order did not provide details about the national security concerns behind the decision. In a statement, the company said, "We believe this is a misunderstanding and are working to restore access as soon as possible."

According to Anthropic, officials had raised concerns about a possible method to bypass safety protections in Fable 5. The company said it dis-

agreed with the assessment and maintained that the issues involved previously known and limited vulnerabilities.

Anthropic had introduced Fable 5 on June 9, describing it as a version of the Mythos-class system designed for general use with safeguards. My-

thos 5 continued to be available only to selected organisations under controlled programmes. The company had said the safeguards in Fable 5 were intended to restrict responses in sensitive areas while allowing broader access to advanced capabilities.

Amid developments around advanced AI systems, former Infosys director Mohandas Pai called for a larger national effort on AI in India.

In a post on X addressed to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Pai said India required an AI mission led by the Prime Minister with Infosys co-founder Nandan Nilekani as vice-chair, along with members from the private sector and the government.

"We are way behind and need a national mission to get going quickly. Existing government programs are too slow, way too small to make any large impact. We need an annual ₹50,000-crore fund for deep tech and AI, a ₹200,000-crore ELGS Guarantee Fund to build Hyper cloud, hardware and chips," Pai wrote.

Rack storage to grow into ₹7k cr industry by '30

INDIA'S vertical storage industry, also known as rack storage solutions, is expected to nearly double in size to around ₹7,000 crore by 2030, driven by rising demand from manufacturers for storage facilities located close to production units and supported by government initiatives such as PM Gati Shakti and the development of multimodal logistics parks.

Vikas Choudaha, Business Head, Godrej Storage Solutions Business, part of the Godrej Enterprises Group, said companies are increasingly looking to optimise land use through vertical storage infrastructure.

"We are seeing a growing number of industries wanting to make more efficient use of available land. Many are also considering two- or three-storey facilities. When we started our Chennai facility in 2001,



warehouse heights were typically around 7 metres. Today, they have gone up to nearly 20 metres," he told *TNIE*.

He said the push for efficient land utilisation, coupled with economic growth and supportive government policies, would continue to drive demand for vertical storage solutions.

Recently, the company set up a 120-foot automated rack-clad warehouse for a pharmaceutical major in Gujarat.

"It is not feasible for pharma companies to maintain stor-

age facilities outside their premises. Through efficient land utilisation, we installed a 120-foot rack-clad warehouse for a pharma firm in Gujarat," he said.

Choudaha added that shrinking space availability in key urban locations is also encouraging the adoption of vertical parking facilities by malls and commercial establishments.

The company is witnessing strong growth opportunities in the third-party logistics (3PL) segment, which current-

ly contributes around 7-8% of its revenue.

"We engage with 3PL customers at an early stage and provide customised storage solutions based on their requirements," he said.

Godrej Storage Solutions contributes nearly ₹1,500 crore to the overall revenue of the Godrej Enterprises Group.

According to Choudaha, the 3PL sector is expected to grow rapidly as more industries focus on manufacturing and outsource logistics operations.

The company had earlier planned to establish a second manufacturing facility in Chennai. However, those plans were shelved after the acquisition of Armes Maini in Bengaluru in 2024.

It is now scouting for land near its Ambattur Industrial Estate facility for a new plant. In 2024, the company had proposed an investment of ₹350-400 crore for a second Chennai facility.

SCIENTIFIC CAPABILITIES AS STRATEGIC ASSETS

AS Prime Minister Narendra Modi completes a decade in office, it is an appropriate moment to reflect on a leadership journey that has sought to reshape India's development trajectory and redefine its place in the world.

Building leadership

At a time when AI is rapidly becoming the defining technology of the 21st century, India has recognised that technological leadership cannot be outsourced. The launch of Bharat-Gen, India's first government-funded multilingual generative AI initiative, signals a determination to participate in the global AI race on India's own

terms while addressing the linguistic diversity that is uniquely Indian.

Beyond AI, India has also moved decisively into quantum technologies. The National Quantum Mission, backed by an investment exceeding ₹6,000 crore, reflects an understanding that quantum computing, communications and cybersecurity will profoundly influence future economic and strategic competitiveness.

These investments are helping lay the foundations for a new generation of deep tech enterprises while strengthening India's aspiration to emerge as a leading AI-powered and innovation-driven economy.

Strengthening capabilities

Modi's emphasis on long-term capability building is equally evident in sectors that are fundamental to national resilience. In nuclear energy, India achieved a historic milestone with the first criticality of the 500 MWe Prototype Fast Breeder Reactor at Kalpakkam. Ghana protest over Parthey issue

ACCRA: Ghana said Saturday it has formally lodged a protest over Canada's refusal to issue a visa for the World Cup to player Thomas Parthey, who is facing trial in Britain on rape charges. In a statement the posted on social media by the Foreign Minister Sam Okudzeto Ablakwa, Ghana called Canada's decision "high-handed and extremely unfair", calling Parthey, "a key member of Ghana's senior national team".

Diaspora fans back Congo

HOUSTON: Wearing elegant black suits decked out with leopard-print sashes and matching bags, Congo's World Cup team arrived in Houston despite ebola-related restrictions that have kept fans home from the games. The deadly epidemic that has ravaged eastern parts of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) is continuing to spread, World Health Organization (WHO) officials warned Friday. Members of the Congolese diaspora are ready to cheer the team, noting most fans can't afford to undergo a 21-day quarantine on top of ticket and travel costs for the games.

Kids' nonprofit stands for Somali ref

SEATTLE: Ali Abdulla was over the moon when he learned his youth-soccer nonprofit would receive 20 free tickets to the World Cup. Then the US barred Omar Artan — the first Somali referee set to officiate in the WC — from entering the country. Abdulla, himself a Somali refugee, wanted to do something in solidarity, and first thought of giving up his position as a volunteer FIFA "ambassador." But, he said, when he told parents and coaches about his decision, they suggested something: Give back the tickets.

FIFA blames fans for empty seats

FIFA on Friday blamed the empty seats during the World Cup match between South Korea and the Czech Republic in Guadalajara on fans who watched from the concourses. WHEN Folarin Balogun's mother was heavily pregnant, one of the officials at the airport in New York, refused permission for her to fly back to London. That was how Balogun was born in Brooklyn in the Big Apple and not England. When both the baby and the mother were declared fit for travel, they moved back. Even from a very young age, it was clear that Balogun had something about him. When he was progressing through the ranks at Arsenal as a youth prospect, he broke several age-group goal-scoring records. He was touted to have a big career ahead of him even when he was just a child. He did feature for the London giants as a teen but Arsenal had several older, experienced strikers ahead of him. The club itself was going through an identity crisis so they decided to move on from one of their own rather quickly. First, he went on loan to Stade de Reims in 2022. There, he excelled as he became the top-scoring Under-21 forward across Europe's top-five leagues. Monaco, who feature in the same league as Reims, acted and signed him from Arsenal on a deal worth north of \$35mn. In the city of stars and in front of some of the biggest (Tom Cruise, Bradley Cooper and Leonardo DiCaprio to name just three), Balogun was central to the USMNT's best-ever 45 minute period in their 96-year

World Cup history.

When a 16-year-old Balogun started featuring in England's national set-up (he played for the country's U17 set-up in 2018), it was assumed that he would commit to England. His parents were settled in London. He had grown up in London. He was wearing the colours of one of England's biggest clubs. But the pathway in front of him wasn't too clear even if the English FA were interested in him. So, even as the teen made it all the way to the country's U21 set-up, the US never gave hope; at one point, he was simultaneously playing for age-group sides of both countries. The turning point came in 2023 when US federation officials had meetings with him. It also helped that US fans, who saw him at a basketball game, made their feelings clear. That was the catalyst. "It was a long process," he had told reporters after FIFA had approved his switch to represent the US in senior football. "I was out in Orlando just doing some training (in the break be-

fore the start of the 2024 season) and then the (US) squad was also in Orlando as well at camp, and the manager reached out to me, he said that it'd be good for me to come in and have some food and sit down and talk with him. I was with my agent as well, so the timing was good. We spoke about a lot of things and he just explained the vision for US Soccer. In the end, we had a discussion, I went back home, I still had some time to obviously think and take in what he was saying and then I came to my conclusion." At the World Cup in 2022, he was also drawn by the energy and vigour the squad — the average age made them the second youngest roster in Qatar — had displayed (what was unspoken was also important; while Eng-

land had Harry Kane, a bonafide great, US didn't have anyone remotely as good at centre forward). Mauricio Pochettino has a way with squad profiles similar to that of the US team. He's a coach who likes players who are comfortable pressing. Under him, there can be no passengers because that is the energy he demands. That was the exact template he had when he was at Tottenham and they were flying. US officials had wanted Pochettino to mould the team in his own image but there was a catch. He wouldn't come cheap and the federation couldn't possibly afford him on his terms. So they made a pitch to several billionaires, hedge-fund CEOs. "What the US did have, though, was ambition," the *Athletic* reported on Saturday. "Plus billionaires and corporations willing to fund it." The stage is set for an emotional game for the tiny nation. Just for comparison, Houston houses 15 times as many people as the island. The island was part of the Netherlands Antilles until October 2010, when it became a more autonomous "constituent country" of the Netherlands.

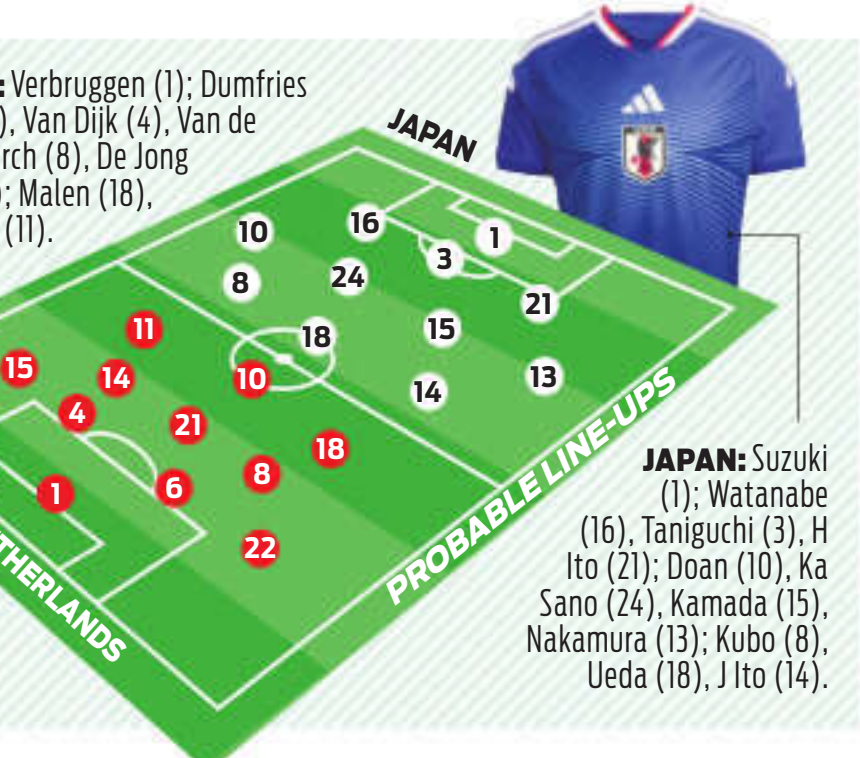
