Saudi Arabia's low-cost carrier Flyadeal makes India debut

Saudi Arabian low-cost carrier Flyadeal on Monday commenced its India operations with the launch of a daily non-stop service between Hyderabad and Riyadh (using Airbus A320 aircraft), making Rajiv Gandhi International Airport its first destination in the country. The Hyderabad-bound flight departs Riyadh at 11.20 p.m. and arrives at 6.50 a.m. the following day while the return service leaves Hyderabad at 7.55 a.m. and reaches Riyadh at 11.05 a.m.

TG intensifies efforts to complete SLBC tunnel project

The State government has intensified its efforts to complete the Srisailem Left Bank Canal tunnel project within two years. Steps have been initiated to fast track land acquisition, technical approvals and administrative clearances in addition to mobilising funds for ensuring completion within the deadline – June 2028. The project envisages drawl of 40 TMC from Srisailem, to irrigate 4.01 lakh acres and drinking water to 618 fluoride-affected villages.

Custodial torture allegation clouds POCSCO probe in Kerala

A day after the Kerala police concluded that the sexual abuse allegations made by a 13-year-old girl were false, the case has taken a new turn with a 20-year-old youth – one of the 10 accused – alleging custodial torture. The youth, who was taken into custody during the probe, has lodged a complaint with Home Minister Ramesh Chennithala alleging he was tortured by police. The police questioned six persons, including four minors, in connection with the POCSCO case.

Karnataka BLOs on SIR duty not visiting homes, says NDA

BLOs filling enumeration forms in violation of guidelines, NDA delegation alleges in a letter to the CEO; CM rules out intervention, accuses Opposition of depriving minorities of their voting rights

Alleging ‘irregularities’ in the ongoing special intensive revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Karnataka, NDA leaders led by Union Minister H.D. Kumaraswamy have written to Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) V. Anbu Kumar seeking an immediate inquiry into the exercise.

The delegation, including Union Minister Pralhad Joshi, Leader of Opposition R. Ashok, Leader of Opposition in Legislative Council Chalavadi Narayanaswamy, and JD(S) party leader C.B. Suresh Babu submitted a letter to the CEO on

Monday, requesting ‘re-verification’ of all enumeration forms through mandatory door-to-door visits, and strict legal action against those found responsible for irregularities.

The letter pointed out the guidelines require

Booth-Level Officers (BLOs), under the supervision of the District Election Officer, to visit every household, verify the identity of each family member in person, and carry out door-to-door verification. However, this was not hap-

pening in many places, the leaders alleged.

“Instead of visiting homes, the BLOs were filling in enumeration forms from community halls, mosques, and even their own residences,” the letter stated, further claiming that WhatsApp groups had been created to carry out the exercise.

Meanwhile, Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar on Monday ruled out any interference by the government, asserting that the SIR was entirely under the purview of the Election Commission. He also accused the Opposition of attempting to deprive the poor and minorities of their voting rights.

Telangana gears up for second edition of global investors summit

The Telangana government has initiated exercise for successful conduct of the second edition of Global Investment Summit in December this year.

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Monday asked officials to constitute departmental committees for ensuring effective coordination between different departments for hassle-

free conduct of the event. He gave instructions during a meeting while reviewing the progress of initiatives in the Tourism sector of the State.

The first edition of the Global Investment summit ‘Telangana Rising Global Summit’ held at the Bharat Future City on December 8 and 9 last year attracted assurances of ₹5.75 lakh crore investment commitments. The State government signed over 50 memoran-

dums of understanding with interested global majors during the event.

He directed officials of the Tourism and other departments to prepare the environment to boost investor confidence so that more investment could be attracted through the global event.

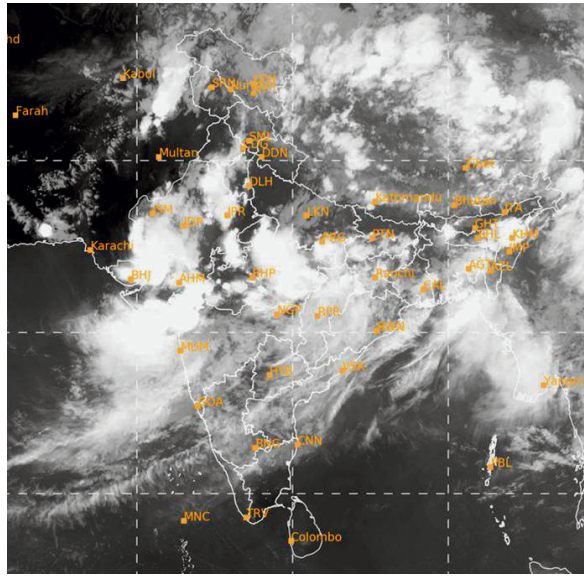
He sought for Taramati Baradari to be further developed and Durgam Cheruvu to be converted into a full scale tourist attraction.

He directed that neighbouring Vikarabad district to be developed under the tourism hub development scheme, and the Veerabhadra swamy temple be developed along with a temple trust board be created for its management on the lines of Yadadri.

Steps should be taken to develop ecotourism in the Forest lands abutting the CURE area in coordination with the Tourism department.
