

CM to perform bhoomi poojan for LiuGong India's plant today

▶ 272 Cr project to come up on 20 acres

Bhopal: Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav will perform the Bhoomi Poojan for the new manufacturing Unit of LiuGong India Private Limited on Wednesday, July 8, at the Pithampur Industrial Area in Dhar district. The expansion by the Indian subsidiary of Guangxi LiuGong Machinery Co. Ltd., one of China's leading multinational construction equipment manufacturers, marks a significant step towards establishing Madhya Pradesh as a major hub for construction equipment manufacturing.

The new manufacturing facility at Pithampur will be developed over approximately 20 acres with an investment of around Rs 272 Crores. In its initial phase, the plant will have an annual production capacity of 6,500 construction equipment units, primarily excavators. The project is expected to strengthen domestic manufacturing, reduce dependence on imports, and generate new employment opportunities in the region.

MP Congress chief warns of farmers' distress

Bhopal: Madhya Pradesh Congress Committee president Jitu Patwari has written to the Chief Minister and the Union Agriculture Minister, urging them to ensure 100 per cent procurement of the state's summer moong crop at the Minimum Support Price (MSP) and to address the grievances of farmers without delay.

In his letter, Patwari said Madhya Pradesh is India's leading pulses-producing state and that farmers had invested heavily and achieved a record moong harvest after responding to government appeals to boost production. However, he alleged that many growers are now struggling to sell their produce at MSP, with protests being reported in several districts, including Harda.

He claimed that procurement targets have been fixed far below the actual production, raising fears that thousands of farmers would be compelled to sell their crop to private traders at prices below the MSP. He also alleged shortcomings in registration, slot allocation, procurement capacity, quality inspection and payment procedures.

EOW receives complaint seeking probe into enemy property land deals

▶ Activist Amitabh Agnihotri alleges Pakistan-resident Aftab Jahan Begum sold hundreds of acres of prime land

Bhopal: The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of Madhya Pradesh has received a memorandum from social activist Amitabh Agnihotri seeking a detailed investigation into the sale of prime land allegedly owned by Aftab Jahan Begum, the second wife of the erstwhile Nawab of Bhopal, Hamidullah Khan. Agnihotri has claimed that Begum, who was allegedly residing in Pakistan, sold hundreds of acres of land in Bhopal despite the provisions of the Enemy Property Act, and has urged authorities to examine the legality of the transactions. Probe sought into whether Begum disclosed her alleged Pakistani residency: According to the memorandum, one such transaction involved the sale of 30.55 acres of land in Behta on May 31, 1994, for Rs 30.55 lakh. The complaint alleges that only Rs 1.55 lakh was initially paid through cheque, while the remaining Rs 29 lakh was to be paid in four quarterly instalments.

Agnihotri has questioned whether Begum disclosed her alleged Pakistani residency at the time of the sale and has sought an inquiry into the valuation of the property.

Citing the 1959 khasra records, the memorandum claims that Aftab Jahan Begum owned around 655 acres of land in Behta and another 102 acres in Borban. It argues that if she had migrated to Pakistan, the properties should have been examined under the Enemy Property Act and, if applicable, vested with the government. The complaint also seeks an investigation into the bank accounts where the sale proceeds were deposited, the issuance of mutation records, NOCs and building permissions by the Revenue Department and the Municipal Corporation.

Copies of the memorandum have also been sent to the President of India, the Prime Minister, the Union Home Minister, among others.

Indian knowledge tradition advances through fundamental questions

Bhopal: A one-day orientation lecture on the theme "From Shashtra to Culture: The Nature of the Indian Knowledge Tradition in Cultural Literature" was organized jointly by the Dattopant Thengadi Research Institute (DTSS) under the Indian Knowledge Tradition Division, Ministry of Education, Government of India, and the National Institute of Technical Teachers' Training and Research (NITTTR), Bhopal.

The keynote address was delivered by Dr. Vishvabandhu, Associate Professor, Department of Sanskrit, Tripura Central University. Beginning his address with a quotation from Mahakavi Kalidasa, he highlighted the responsibility of an educated person and stated that true knowledge is attained through experience, assimilation, and meaningful transmission to society. Speaking

on the Indian Knowledge Tradition, Dr. Vishvabandhu explained that Shastra and culture are inseparable, as culture emerges from scriptural knowledge and shapes social life. Addressing the gathering, Dr. Mukesh Kumar Mishra, Director, Dattopant Thengadi Research Institute, stated that the Indian Knowledge Tradition extends beyond ancient scriptures and represents the broader spectrum of Indian cultural literature.

Dr. P. K. Purohi, head of IKS department NITTTR Bhopal stated that while the West was teaching us about the 'Future of Science, the 'Science of the Future' was already present in our Vedas. The lecture was followed by an interactive question-and-answer session. The programme was attended by faculty members, research scholars, students, and academicians. The programme was anchored by Dr. Soumi Chatterjee.

Police recover over 2,000 lost phones

Bhopal: The Madhya Pradesh Police have intensified their technology-driven policing efforts under the statewide Safe Click 2.0 campaign, combining cybercrime awareness with the recovery of lost and stolen mobile phones to enhance public confidence in digital safety.

Launched on June 24, 2026, the campaign is being conducted across schools, colleges, banks, hospitals, government offices and other public institutions to educate citizens about safe online practices. Police officials

are advising people to avoid clicking suspicious links, never disclose OTPs or banking credentials, exercise caution during digital transactions, and immediately report cyber fraud through the national helpline 1930 or the National Cyber Crime Portal.

Alongside awareness initiatives, the police have recovered 2,094 lost and stolen mobile phones across the state since June 13 using the Central Equipment Identity Register (CEIR) portal, technical analysis and coordinated operations by district cyber teams.

distribution company of failing to address persistent electricity-related grievances. Led by Bhopal Rural District Vice-President Prince Singh, hundreds of supporters submitted a memorandum highlighting prolonged unscheduled power cuts, inflated electricity bills and the alleged forced installation of smart meters.

The delegation claimed residents and farmers have been facing frequent outages lasting several hours without prior notice, causing severe inconvenience. The memorandum demanded an immediate end to unscheduled power cuts and repeated tripping across the city. It also sought a re-audit of allegedly inflated electricity bills issued over the past three months, with a demand that disputed bills be reduced by half. The protesters further called for an immediate halt to the smart meter installation programme and replacement of meters already installed. Prince Singh warned that if the authorities fail to provide a written response and take corrective action within seven days, the Youth Congress would launch an intensified agitation.
