

JPC reviews key constitutional bills during Delhi visit

A Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) on Wednesday met Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta at the Delhi Secretariat and briefed the Chief Minister on the objectives, key provisions, and proposed changes contained in the three Bills. The visit forms part of the committee's ongoing consultations and study process before finalising its recommendations on the three Bills currently under examination. The proposed legislation is expected to play a significant role in shaping future governance frameworks, accountability mechanisms, and constitutional processes in the country.

The committee, chaired by Member of Parliament Aparajita Sarangi, is examining the Constitution (130th



Amendment) Bill, 2025, the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation (Amendment) Bill, 2025, and the Union Territories Government (Amendment) Bill, 2025.

The JPC also handed over copies of the proposed legislation and related documents to the Chief Minister.

According to the committee, the proposed amendments are aimed at strengthening accountability and

transparency in public life, reinforcing constitutional values, and enhancing public confidence in democratic institutions.

The meeting brought together several Members of Parliament from across party lines.

Apart from Chairperson Aparajita Sarangi, those present included Dr K Laxman, Ujjwal Nikam, DK Aruna, Parshottam Rupala,

Asaduddin Owaisi, Dr Indra Hang Subba, Anurag Thakur, Brij Lal, Brijmohan Agrawal, and Manan Kumar Mishra. Senior officials from the Lok Sabha Secretariat also attended the discussions.

Welcoming the committee, the Chief Minister highlighted the importance of public trust, accountability, and ethical conduct in a democratic system.

She said the strength of Indian democracy depends not only on constitutional provisions but also on maintaining transparency and credibility in governance.

During the interaction, the Chief Minister briefed the committee on Delhi's administrative structure, its unique constitutional position, and the measures being undertaken by the Delhi Government to improve governance standards. She said the Government is working

to build a transparent, accountable, and citizen-focused administrative framework.

The Chief Minister noted that strengthening democratic institutions and public confidence in governance is a shared responsibility.

She said efforts to improve accountability and transparency in public life are essential for ensuring effective governance and maintaining trust between citizens and institutions.

Speaking about the Constitution (130th Amendment) Bill, the Chief Minister said the proposal seeks to further strengthen public confidence in individuals holding public office.

She described the proposed amendments under consideration as an important step towards reinforcing constitutional morality, accountability, and trans-

parency in public affairs.

She also said that the suggestions and input received by the committee during its consultations would help strengthen democratic institutions and improve governance systems.

According to her, continuous dialogue, consultation, and reforms are necessary for the healthy growth of democracy.

After the meeting, Sarangi interacted with media and said the committee has held 11 meetings so far and visited nine states and Union Territories, including Rajasthan, Haryana, Delhi, Chhattisgarh, Telangana and Punjab. Sarangi said that the stakeholders extended support to the bill and also submitted some written comments and suggestions.

The joint committee was constituted in November 2025 to examine the Bills.

CM issues Flood Control Order 2026, makes Nodal officers accountable for waterlogging

Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Wednesday issued the Flood Control Order-2026 at a high-level apex committee meeting at the Delhi Secretariat. High-level sector committees have been constituted under Ministers Parvesh Sahib Singh, Ashish Sood, and Manjinder Singh Sirsa, each including three to four District Magistrates responsible for flood management and coordination in their areas.

nisms, operational plans, machinery deployment, and control room contact details.

She directed all departments to keep teams on alert and prepared for emergencies, with relief and rescue equipment inspected according to prescribed checklists, and adequate arrangements made for safe evacuation in the event of flooding. PWD and other departments were directed to inspect all permanent pump houses and deploy mobile pumps in waterlogging-prone areas.

Officials informed the



The Chief Minister directed that a nodal officer be appointed for every identified waterlogging point in the city. She further warned that the concerned officer will be held directly accountable if waterlogging occurs in their designated area, with negligence of any kind during the monsoon season ruled out as acceptable.

The meeting was attended by MPs Yogender Chandolia, Ramvir Singh Bidhuri, and Manoj Tiwari, Cabinet Ministers Parvesh Sahib Singh, Ashish Sood, Manjinder Singh Sirsa, and Ravinder Indraj Singh, MLAs Anil Sharma, Jitender Mahajan, and Shikha Roy, along with senior officials from the Irrigation and Flood Control Department, PWD, MCD, and Delhi Jal Board.

The Chief Minister said the Government's objective is not merely to respond during disasters but to identify potential risks in advance and ensure preventive measures are in place. The Flood Control Order-2026 will serve as a guideline document for all departments, covering drainage systems, river embankments, pumping stations, regulatory mecha-

meeting that the Central Flood Control Room has been functioning 24x7 since June 15.

The Irrigation and Flood Control Department reported that embankments and regulators along the Yamuna have been strengthened, and upgrades of major pump houses have been completed. A new digital system will provide real-time information on water released from the Hathnikund Barrage, water flow at Palla, and Yamuna water levels. The department has exceeded its desilting target, removing more than 30 lakh metric tonnes of silt from 77 drains, including 22 major drains, with remaining work continuing on a war footing.

The number of pumps has increased to more than 243, including permanent, mobile, and tractor-mounted units, compared to last year. Available boats have increased to 41, alongside 31 motorboat engines and 12 boat-carriage trolleys. Joint inspection committees have been formed with PWD and MCD to clear obstructions at junction points where drains maintained by different agencies meet.

Bishnoi Gang associates held for firing outside gym linked to Guru Randhawa

The Delhi Police Crime Branch arrested two alleged associates of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang for allegedly opening fire outside a gym linked to Punjabi singer Guru Randhawa in Delhi's Paschim Vihar earlier this month. One of the accused had returned from Russia less than two weeks before the incident, police said on Wednesday.

The accused, identified as Arman (19) and Tushar alias Tashu alias Pinku (21), both residents of Haryana's Sonapat district, were arrested from Bahadurgarh following a manhunt. Investigators alleged that the duo worked as shooters for gangster Anil Pandit, a member of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang who is believed to be operating from the United States.

According to police, two motorcycle-borne assailants opened fire outside a gym located on Outer Ring Road in Paschim Vihar at around 4 am on June 11 before fleeing the spot. No injuries were reported in the inci-



dent, though seven empty cartridges were recovered from the scene.

A case was registered at the Paschim Vihar East police station. The firing attracted widespread attention after a social media post allegedly made by Anil Pandit went viral, claiming responsibility for the attack on behalf of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang.

Police said the post suggested the gym was targeted because of its alleged association with Randhawa and referred to the singer's purported proximity to Bollywood actor Salman Khan, who the Bishnoi gang has repeatedly threatened in the past.

Given the suspected organised crime angle, the investigation was trans-

ferred to the Crime Branch. Officers reconstructed the escape route of the shooters, analysed technical evidence and tracked their movements across nearly 100 kilometres.

The probe led investigators to four suspects, Sahil, Sagar, Arman and Tushar. Acting on specific inputs, police conducted raids in Bahadurgarh on June 15 and arrested Arman and Tushar. During interrogation, both allegedly confessed to their role in the firing, police said.

Investigators said Arman is a cousin of the two absconding suspects, Sahil and Sagar. Tushar had recently returned from Russia, where he had been working after travelling on a study visa. Police alleged that shortly after his return, he came in contact with Sahil and Sagar and became part of the conspiracy.

Both accused have been remanded to police custody. Police said efforts are underway to apprehend the remaining suspects, identify other members of the network and recover the firearm used in the attack.

Delhi BJP holds cleanliness drives across all 256 mandals, ministers lead campaigns

Sirsa joined a cleanliness drive in the Model Town Assembly constituency alongside local MLA Ashok Goel, councillors, and residents, cleaning parks and public spaces.

Kapil Mishra, participating in a cleanliness and plantation drive in Kalkaji along-

side South Delhi MP Ramvir Singh Bidhuri, used the occasion to address the ongoing opposition signature campaign on the O-Zone issue.

Health and Transport Minister Dr Pankaj Kumar Singh, who participated in a drive at Sai Baba Mandir in Najafgarh with MP Kamaljeet Sehrawat, linked cleanliness directly to public health.

Delhi Jal Board Vice Chairman Satish Upadhyay and MLA Kartar Singh Tanwar swept the floor and railings at the Katayani Devi temple and dharamshala in Chhatarpur.
