

Adani One crosses 5 million members within 10 months

AZARA, July 13: Adani Airport Holdings Limited's (AAHL) consumer app, Adani One, has crossed the five-million-member milestone within just 10 months of the launch of Adani Rewards, one of India's first integrated airport loyalty programmes. The loyalty programme is currently available across all eight airports managed by AAHL in seven states, including the Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport (LGBIA) in Guwahati. It allows passengers to earn and redeem reward points on shopping, dining and a range of airport services through a single digital platform.

According to AAHL, the rapid growth reflects increasing demand for seamless digital services that enhance the airport experience while rewarding everyday spending. The company also announced plans to introduce a tier-based membership model later this year, offering frequent flyers personalised privileges, exclusive rewards and enhanced benefits.

Passengers can join the programme instantly using their mobile number while shopping at participating airport outlets. Reward points can be redeemed for benefits such as complimentary food and beverages and premium airport experiences through the Adani One app.

Zubeen death case trial resumes

Zubeen will get justice, says Dr Palme Borthakur

GUWAHATI, July 13: Proceedings in the Zubeen Garg death case resumed on Monday before the fast-track court, with key witnesses Dr Palme Borthakur, Zubeen's sister, and Jayanta Kakoti appearing to record their statements.

The recording of Jayanta Kakoti's testimony remained incomplete during the day's proceedings. The

court directed him to appear again on Tuesday, when Dr. Palme Borthakur is also expected to depose after her statement could not be recorded on Monday.

Meanwhile, the Gauhati High Court deferred the hearing of a petition, (Crl. Pet. No. 983/2026), filed by Sandipan Garg. The matter has now been listed for hearing on July 21. Sandipan Garg had approached the High Court seeking relief in

connection with the case. In a related development, the High Court heard one of the four petitions, (Crl. Rev. P. No. 341/2026), filed by Siddharth Sharma. The remaining proceedings in the matter have been scheduled for August 13.

Speaking to reporters outside the court, Dr. Palme Borthakur expressed confidence in the judicial process, saying she was certain that Zubeen Garg would receive justice.

Missing youth found dead in Garbhanga Reserve Forest

GUWAHATI, July 13: A 25-year-old youth from Guwahati's Fatasil area, who had gone missing during a visit to the Garbhanga Reserve Forest, was found dead on Monday.

The deceased was identified as Nikhil Jha. He had visited the forest on Sunday along with his

friends Devesh Asopa, Padam Asopa and Aman Chettri. According to preliminary information, the group had entered the forest for an outing and was bathing in a water body when Nikhil suddenly disappeared. Although his friends returned safely, he remained untraceable.

Acting on the complaint, Rani Police launched a search opera-

tion in the forest area to trace the missing youth. The search ended on Monday after police recovered Nikhil's body from the forest. Officers completed the required legal formalities at the spot before sending the body to a hospital for post-mortem examination. Police have launched an investigation to ascertain the exact circumstances and cause of the youth's death.

Car overturns on Guwahati-North Guwahati bridge, driver unhurt

GUWAHATI, July 13: A four-wheeler overturned on the Kumar Bhaskar Varma Setu on Sunday evening, causing a traffic disruption but leaving the driver without major injuries.

According to a traffic police official from Bharalumukh Police Station, no casualties were reported in the incident. The driver, identified as Dhruvajyoti Das, was the only person travelling in the vehicle at the time of the accident.

The official said the car was heading towards North Guwahati when it overturned on the bridge at around 6 pm.

Police registered a case in connection with the incident and initiated further investigation.

Assam extends revised tea garden working hours due to ongoing heat wave

GUWAHATI, July 13: The Assam Government has decided to continue the revised working hours for tea garden workers across the state in view of the persisting heat wave conditions.

According to a notification issued by the Labour Welfare Department, the existing revised work schedule—from 6:00 AM to 2:00 PM instead of the normal 8:00 AM to 4:00

PM—will remain in force until further orders.

The decision has been taken in continuation of the department's earlier notification dated May 13, 2025, with the aim of protecting the health, safety and welfare of tea garden workers who are exposed to extreme day-time temperatures.

The revised timing comes into effect immediately and will continue until the government issues fresh instructions.

Santaneer organises free eye screening camp for the elderly and other villagers
