

Historic achievement of ANSS: ‘Madhyamik Nepali Sabdakosh’ released at 212th National Bhanu Jayanti celebrations



The Assam Rising, Biswanath Chariali, July 15: Assam Nepali Sahitya Sabha has achieved an important achievement in the history of Nepali language and literature. The ‘Madhyamik Nepali Sabdakosh (Dictionary)’, institutionally published by the Sabha, was formally released in a grand manner at the 212th National Bhanu Jayanti celebrations organized by the

Sikkim Government by the Chief Minister of Sikkim, Prem Singh Tamang (Golay) on July 13 at Sikkim informed a press release issued by Tilak Sharma, principal secretary of Assam Nepali Sahitya Sabha (ANSS). This historic occasion has further enhanced the dedication of ANSS towards language, litera-

ture and education at the national level. Assam Nepali Sahitya Sabha President Dr Chintamani Sharma, Principal Secretary Tilak Sharma and the main donor of the publication, Sukhdev Tiwari were present at the release ceremony. On this occasion, the representatives of the assembly expressed their belief that this dictionary will make a long-term contribution to the standardiza-

tion, study, teaching and research of the Nepali language, describing it as a proud achievement of the Assam Nepali Sahitya Sabha. The ‘Madhyamik Nepali Sabdakosh’, a Nepali to Nepali dictionary published targeting school-level students, teachers, researchers and Nepali language enthusiasts, is expected to be help-

ful in making the study and teaching of the Nepali language more systematic, easy and effective. The original creator of this dictionary is Yudha Bir Rana, the winner of the 2023 Sahitya Akademi Award. He had prepared its manuscript after nearly three decades of tireless effort and research. After receiving information about the manuscript, the current central leadership of the Assam Nepali Sahitya Sabha took a historic decision to publish it institutionally. After that, the dictionary was finalized and published after meticulous examination of the manuscript, revisions and necessary suggestions from various academics, experts and linguists. The release of the dictionary by the Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang (Golay) at the national function organized by the Sikkim government on the special initiative and request of the Assam Nepali Sahitya Sabha has become a matter of great pride for the Sabha. This has established the institutional publication of the Assam Nepali Sahitya Sabha on the national stage and has also highlighted the

strong role that the Sabha is playing in the prosperity and development of Indian Nepali language and literature. In recognition of the work that ANSS has been doing for the development and promotion of Nepali language and literature for the past five decades, the Chief Minister of Sikkim presented a certificate of appreciation to the Assam Nepali Sahitya Sabha at the 212th National Bhanu Jayanti function held in Soreng, Sikkim. A garland of flowers and a memento as a sign of love were presented to both the President and the Principal Secretary. In another significant moment of the programme, Dr Chintamani Sharma, President of ANSS, felicitated Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang (Golay) by presenting him with the traditional Assamese ‘Phulam Gamosa’ and ‘Jaapi’, symbols of Assam’s rich cultural heritage. This gesture further strengthened the bonds of cultural harmony, mutual respect, and fraternity between Assam and Sikkim.

Citizens Demand Upgrade of Nazira Aided Hospital, Oppose Closure Plan

The Assam Rising, Nazira, July 15 : Citizens of Nazira have urged the government to upgrade the centrally located government-aided hospital into a full-fledged healthcare facility, while strongly opposing any move to shut it down or relocate it. Ensuring public health and access to medical care is a fundamental responsibility of the government. While significant steps have been taken to strengthen the healthcare sector—such as establishing medical colleges and launching schemes for the treatment of critical diseases—the historic health centre in the heart of Nazira town has reportedly remained outside the ambit of such development initiatives. Established in 1944 during the British era, the hospital once had adequate doctors and provided a range of medical services, including maternity care. However, since being designated as a government-aided hospital, it has been facing an acute shortage of doctors, irregular supply of free medicines, and overall decline in healthcare services. Despite these shortcomings, the hospital continues to cater to around 100–150 patients daily and serves as an important centre for primary and emergency care. Concerns have also been raised over the poor condition of its three ambulances, which are reportedly on the verge of becoming unusable due to minor technical faults and lack of maintenance. In view of these issues, civil society groups have appealed to the authorities to upgrade the facility into a full-fledged hospital. At the same time, strong resentment has emerged among residents and various organisations following reports that a section of people has proposed shutting down the hospital and merging it with the Karmashree Hiteswar Saikia Civil Hospi-

tal at Ligitripukhuri. Citing guidelines of the World Health Organization and the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, which recommend at least one health centre for every 5,000 people, locals argued that relocating the hospital would be unjustified, especially when over 20,000 residents depend on it. Demanding immediate intervention, citizens and organisations have called for scrapping the relocation plan and instead strengthening the existing hospital at its current location. On July 14, a delegation led by senior educationist and president of the Sivasagar District Senior Citizens’ Association as well as Nazira Citizens’ Committee, Prabhat Barthakur, along with general secretary Bimal Kumar Agarwala and secretary Wasim Ahmed, met the Joint Director of the Sivasagar District Health Department, Dr. Masan Chandra Kalita. The delegation submitted memoranda addressed to key authorities, including the Chief Minister of Assam, the Health Minister, the district’s guardian minister, the Member of Parliament from Jorhat constituency, the Director of Health and Family Welfare, and the District Commissioner, urging them to upgrade the hospital and cancel any plans for its relocation.

Padma Shri Geeta Upadhyay's last rites performed with state honour in presence of thousands of admirers

The Assam Rising, Tezpur , July 15: The mortal remains of eminent litterateur, distinguished educationist, two-time Sahitya Akademi Award recipient, Padma Shri awardee Geeta Upadhyay was consigned to flames on Wednesday after last rites were performed with state honours by the Assam government at Parowa public crematorium in Tezpur. It may be mentioned that the eminent and illustrious lady passed away on the night of July 13. On Wednesday morning, at the last rites ceremony conducted with state honours, Sonitpur District Commissioner Ananda Kumar Das, Inspector General of Police (North Assam Range) Prashanta Sagar Changmai, along with Senior

Superintendent of Police of Sonitpur district Barun Purakayastha paid floral tributes to the mortal remains on behalf of the Assam government. This was followed by heads of various departments, administrative officers and staff of the district, along with Tezpur University Controller of Examinations Biren Das, distinguished Satriya artist Premananda Mahanta, Sahitya Akademi awardee Chandramani Upadhyay, Gyan Bahadur Chettri, distinguished litterateur Kharga Bahadur Kaushik, representatives of the BJP Sonitpur district committee, Rajior Dal central secretary

Amid this, following a tradition of the Nepali community, a special condolence meeting was also held at the crematorium premises itself. At the meeting, Tezpur University Controller of Examinations Biren Das reminisced about Geeta Upadhyay’s strong role as a former member of the university’s Board of Management, while distinguished litterateurs Kharga Bahadur Kaushik and Binod Khanal also shared their reminiscences.
