

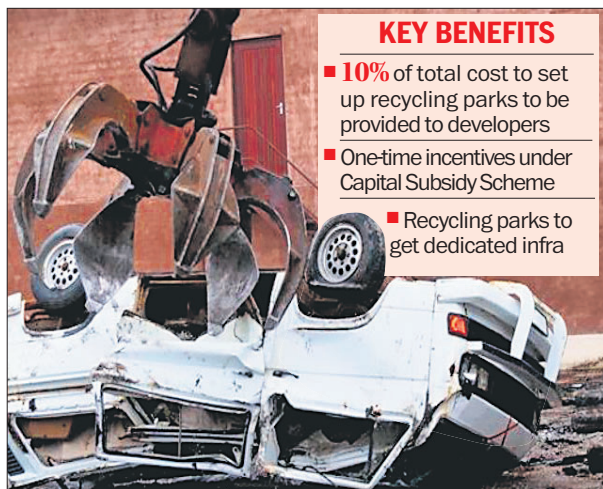
Govt rolls out 5 schemes to promote vehicle scrappage

Haryana has rolled out five incentive schemes to accelerate investment, infrastructure development and skill development in the vehicle scrapping and recycling facilities sector.

The Industries and Commerce Department notified the schemes on July 14. The Registered Vehicle Scrapage & Recycling Facilities (RVS&RFs) are accorded the status of 'industry' for the purpose of such incentives.

Under the 'Capital Subsidy Scheme', in case of micro and small industry, the first 30 units shall be eligible to receive a one-time subsidy of 25% of capital expenditure or up to Rs 40 lakh in D & C category blocks, and 25% of capital expenditure or up to Rs 35 lakh in B category blocks. The block categorisation is based on the development status. The B-block areas have intermediate industrial development; C-block areas are industrially backward; and D-block areas are the most industrially backward.

Similarly, in medium industry, the first 15 units shall be eligible to receive a one-time subsidy of up to Rs 50 lakh, the first 15

units of large industry shall be eligible to receive up to Rs 10 crore, and the first two mega units shall be eligible to receive up to Rs 20 crore, depending on their location in the category of industrial block.

To develop dedicated infrastructure in recycling parks, the Industries Department has notified the 'Park Developers Scheme'. The developers will receive 10% of the total project cost, excluding land, subject to a ceiling of Rs 20 crore in D, C, and B category blocks for basic and core infrastructure-related facilities.

Besides, there will be 100% reimbursement of stamp duty for the purchase or lease of land for 33-years in D

category blocks, and 75% in C & B category blocks. The park must be developed on a prescribed minimum area of 15 to 50 acres.

Commissioner and Secretary, Industries and Commerce Department, Amit Kumar Agrawal, said, "The objective is to facilitate the creation of a vehicle circularity ecosystem by promoting scientific recycling of vehicles, which have completed their life and cannot be serviced. These policies will go a long way in reducing pollution."

Skill development

The Industries Department has notified the Scheme for Centre of Excellence for Skill Development, under

which three Centres of Excellence (CoEs), set up by government organisations or PSUs or private companies, will be incentivised with a 50% grant of project cost, up to Rs 5 crore.

The grant for running operations shall be released in five annual instalments. For skill development, the Scheme for Financial Assistance for Skill Development has been notified, under which state skilling institutions or government polytechnics will be provided assistance to offer skill development courses on scrappage and recycling. Each such institution has to train a minimum of 125 students per year.

SGST reimbursement

The government has also notified the Net SGST Reimbursement Scheme to reduce the cost of doing business. The first two mega projects, the first 15 large units, and the first 42 MSME units shall be eligible for reimbursement from 15% to 50% depending on scale and investment. Six existing units shall also be eligible for reimbursement for five years from the date of commencement of the policy, provided they have complied with all necessary compliances.

Wildlife Dept teams seize illegally felled khair wood

The Wildlife Department has seized illegally cut khair wood in Darpur village, falling under Pratap Nagar police station of the district. The four large pieces of khair wood were stored in a house constructed in the fields.

Found stored in Darpur village

According to the information, the Wildlife Department received information that khair wood being cut illegally from the forest area and stored in Darpur village. A team of Wildlife department comprising Inspector Leelu Ram, Deputy Ranger Naresh Kumar along with the police raided the house owned by Naseem and recovered four peeled large pieces of khair wood from the bathroom.

Inspector Leelu Ram said the wood was seized after completing the required formalities. "Besides Naseem, two more persons, Irfan alias Pana and Sajid, both residents of Darpur village have been found linked to this case of khair wood theft," he added.

CM warns against glorification of gangsters on social media

CM Nayab Singh Saini on Saturday said strict legal action would be taken against anyone glorifying gangsters on social media, while announcing a series of measures to strengthen the state's anti-drug campaign and policing.

"Glorifying gangsters will invite legal action," Saini said during the "Ek Police, Ek Sankalp - Drug-Free Haryana" programme at the Haryana Police Academy, Madhuban, attended by around 600 Station House Officers (SHOs) and senior police officials.

During the interaction, a Special Task Force (STF) officer from Gurugram mentioned the harmful impact of glorifying gangsters, recalling

that the state Assembly had passed a resolution in August 2025 urging media organisations not to glamourise criminals. He said such actions adversely influence youngsters by making gangsters appear as role models.

SP STF, Vikrant Bhushan, also expressed concern over the growing promotion of gun culture and gangster-related content, saying it attracts young people towards crime. He urged the CM to sensitise media organisations through the Department of Public Relations against projecting gangsters in a glamorous manner. Haryana Director General of Police Ajay Singhal also supported stringent action.

Responding to the suggestions, Saini said the issue had already been discussed in the Assembly and direct-

ed the DGP to issue a strong advisory warning of strict action against those glorifying gangsters on social media. He stated that the government would also hold consultations with representatives of print, electronic and social media, along with content creators, before issuing the advisory.

The CM also announced several initiatives to intensify the fight against drugs. Anti-Drug Task Forces will be constituted at the state, district, subdivision, block, village and ward levels. The Investigation Head fund will be increased to Rs 10 crore to facilitate effective implementation of the new criminal laws, while a separate reward policy will recognise police personnel for exemplary action against drug traffickers.

Policy unveiled to regularise illegal industrial colonies

The Town and Country Planning Department (TCPD) has notified a policy framework for the regularisation of unauthorised industrial colonies, offering relief to thousands of industrial establishments operating in such clusters across the state. The policy applies to industrial colonies spread over a minimum contiguous area of 10 acres, comprising at least 50 industrial units, provided the units were constructed before October 3, 2025. An order in this regard was issued on July 17.

A key feature of the policy is the introduction of an "authorised person", who can apply on behalf of entrepreneurs and industrial establishments located within an industrial colony.

Applications will be submitted through an online portal along with essential documents, including layout plans, survey maps, ownership records, proof of production, lease documents, where applicable and statutory clearances such as Pollution Control Board consent, NOC from the Fire Department and factory licence, if available.

After submission, the application will be forwarded to

the Director of Industries for preliminary scrutiny. If the documents are found in order, the applicant will be informed to submit hard copies before the District Level Scrutiny Committee.

Applications with deficiencies will be rejected and returned for rectification, after which they may be resubmitted through the portal for fresh scrutiny. The policy builds on the Haryana Management of Civic Amenities and Infrastructure Deficient Areas Outside Municipal Area (Special Provisions) Act, 2021, enacted to facilitate the provision of essential civic amenities and infrastructure in deficient areas outside municipal limits. To operationalise the Act, the state government had notified a policy on July 19, 2022.

The government issued relaxation guidelines on April 6, 2023, to ease implementation. However, those provisions did not extend to industrial colonies, leaving numerous unauthorised industrial clusters outside the ambit of regularisation. In the Budget for 2025, CM Nayab Saini announced that similar attention would be given to unauthorised industrial establishments to ensure they receive basic civic amenities and infrastructure.

Irked by power outage, residents block roads

Frequent power cuts have sparked outrage among residents across Hisar and Bhiwani districts. Residents of Azad Nagar locality, Gangwa and Chaudhriwala villages in Hisar district and Bamla village in Bhiwani staged protests on the roads, resulting in traffic blockades.

The protesters alleged that despite their villages being covered under the government's Jagmat Yojana and consumers regularly paying their electricity bills, they were still not receiving proper supply, as promised by the government.

Several villagers gathered at the Chaudhriwala power substation complaining of frequent power cuts that extend for hours.

A Sub-Divisional Officer (SDO) of the Dakshin Haryana Bijli Vitran Nigam (DHBVN) reached the spot and held discussions with the villagers. He assured the protesters that power-related issues would be resolved within the next two days.

In Hisar's Azad Nagar locality, the residents gathered at the 33 kva sub-station on Friday night, while a protest was also staged at Bamla village in Bhiwani. — TNS

Refinery employees' hunger strike enters second day

Several rounds of talks between the Indian Oil Panipat Refinery Employees' Union (IPREU) and the administration failed to break the stalemate that began on Friday. The hunger strike by employees, who are demanding better working conditions, entered its second day today.

Union president Sampuran Singh said several rounds of meetings have been held with the administrative officials, but no

proper resolution has been offered for their demands.

Talks were held on Friday for three hours. "The officials assured us that another meeting will be held on Saturday, but no officials showed up," the president said. "The employees will go on a work-to-rule strike from Monday. If our long-pending demands are still not met, we will go on mass leave," he added.

Meanwhile, trade union CITU extended its support of the refinery employees' union. Singh said university employees would join their protest on Sunday.

Addressing the core issues, Singh said the refinery township lacked basic facilities like clean drinking water and demanded that an RO plant be installed immediately. "A large number of stray dogs roam in the refinery township and frequently attack people," he added.

Other demands include a bolstering manpower in the service department, stopping the appointment of EOs in the PP-3 plant and restoring the discontinued benefits provided to employees on Refinery Day and Indian Oil Day.
