

SIT arrests ex-prez of TDB in Sabarimala gold theft

Hours before arrest, Prasanth alleges political conspiracy in online post

FORMER Travancore Devaswom Board (TDB) president P S Prasanth and board member A Ajikumar were on Thursday arrested by the High Court-appointed Special Investigation Team (SIT) probing the Sabarimala gold theft case, giving a new impetus to the investigation that had apparently lost verve after a wave of arrests in the initial stage.

Prasanth was taken into custody from his residence in Thiruvananthapuram in the morning and taken to the Kollam Police Club, where his arrest was recorded after interrogation by the SIT led by S Sasidharan. Ajikumar had turned up before police officers after being summoned, and he too was arrested following a few hours of questioning. The duo were remanded to judicial custody for 14

days by the Kollam Vigilance Court.

Prasanth and Ajikumar were arrested after being arraigned as accused in the case related to the missing of gold from the dwarapalaka idols in 2019. The SIT had informed the High Court that Board president Prasanth and other members had given the nod to move the gold-plated covering of dwarapalaka idols to Chennai for electroplating in 2025 without prior approval from the court and informing the special commissioner.

The SIT had told the court that re-electroplating was done with the intention to cover up the gold theft that occurred in 2019. The plan was executed to destroy evidence in the past gold theft, the probe team had alleged. The SIT claimed to have stumbled upon incriminating evidence against Prasanth during

its investigation into cases pertaining to the disappearance of gold from the dwarapalaka idols and the door frames.

Prasanth rejected the charges levelled by the SIT and said he had met Unnikrishnan Poti, the main accused, only once and never met Govardhan or Pankaj Bhandari, the other accused in the case. In a social media post hours before his detention on Thursday, Prasanth reiterated his innocence and alleged that the move to implicate him and the 2025 board was a political conspiracy. He wrote that the temple did not incur a loss of even one rupee owing to the shifting of the dwarapalaka idols for re-plating to Chennai in 2025.

Prasanth had unsuccessfully contested the 2021 assembly elections as a Congress candidate before switching over to the CPM. He was appointed the TDB president in 2023. The SIT had earlier arrested former TDB chiefs N Vasu and A Padmakumar in the case.

CWRC to fix TN's water share on July 28

THE government on Wednesday urged the Cauvery Water Management Authority (CWMA) to direct Karnataka to release Cauvery water in accordance with the Supreme Court's 2018 judgment.

At the 53rd CWMA meeting in New Delhi on Wednesday, Water Resources Department Principal Secretary Satyabrata Sahoo said Tamil Nadu had received only 3,442 tmcft at Biligundlu between June 1 and July 19 against the mandated 28,337 tmcft, leaving a deficit of 24,896 tmcft. Karnataka cited poor rainfall and drinking water needs,

particularly for Bengaluru. The CWMA decided that the Cauvery Water Regulation Committee (CWRC) would determine the pro-rata water share at its July 28 meeting.

Meanwhile, DMK president M K Stalin on Thursday asked six questions to CM C Joseph Vijay over the government's handling of the Cauvery water sharing dispute. In a statement on X, Stalin questioned why the CM had not taken up the state's demand with Prime Minister Narendra Modi despite the CWMA repeatedly rejecting the state's requests for water release. He also asked

what the state's water resources minister had done to secure Tamil Nadu's share of Cauvery water and why the government has not openly confronted the Karnataka government over its refusal to release water.

Stalin further asked why an all-party meeting had not been convened to discuss the issue and asked when the leaders of all political parties would jointly meet the PM to submit the Tamil Nadu Assembly's resolution against the proposed Mekedatu dam. Stalin also sought to know when the government would announce a relief package for distressed

farmers in the Cauvery Delta.

Meanwhile, PMK president Dr Anbumani Ramadoss, in a statement on Thursday, criticised the CWMA for refusing Tamil Nadu's request to direct Karnataka to release water to save the kuruvai crop in the Cauvery delta districts. He urged the Tamil Nadu government to press the centre to set up a strong Cauvery Management Board with powers to control reservoir operations, as recommended by the Cauvery Tribunal. He called Karnataka's claim on drinking water needs "incorrect", saying that four major Cauvery reservoirs in Karnataka together has over 60 tmcft of water.

Hyderabad: Alleging that Globarena Company belongs to a benami of KT Rama Rao, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Thursday said a vigilance enquiry is underway into the firm's alleged role in the 2019 Intermediate examination irregularities. During an interaction with reporters on Thursday, CM Reddy demanded that the BRS leader apologise to the people. "Many irregularities happened in the 2019 Intermediate exam paper evaluation," he said. "But the previous government did not book cases against the company. Later, the same company changed its name and got involved in the CBSE exams also." He challenged Rama Rao to file a complaint with the CCS against the company, adding that the government was prepared to probe. ENS

Migration rises as drought grips undivided Ballari

Ballari: Severe drought conditions have forced over 5,000 residents from tandas across the undivided Ballari region to migrate to neighbouring districts and other states in search of employment, raising concerns over the safety and welfare of migrant families. Ballari and Vijayanagara districts, which together have one of the largest concentrations of tandas in Karnataka, witness seasonal migration every year as members of the Banjarja community travel for work in agriculture, construction and other unorganised sectors. However, community leaders say the number of migrants has increased sharply this year due to the prolonged dry spell, crop failure and the absence of sufficient local employment opportunities. ENS

Cops took victim to hosp before calling us, says family

WHILE police sources claimed that Arunachalam fainted in the lock-up and was enlarged on station bail and his family members later admitted him to the TMCH on July 17, the victim's kin said that police themselves admitted him to the hospital and later shared that information with his mother. Arunachalam's mother, Parameswari, alleged that her son had a severe head injury and was bleeding from the ears due to the police attack. "Police personnel attacked him in custody and later admitted him to the hospital," she said.

In a purported video shot by his family members at the hospital a day before his death, Arunachalam said that he was attacked by three police personnel. After his death, Arunachalam's kin protested on the hospital premises and

refused to accept the body till the policemen were arrested. After the magisterial inquiry, the family agreed to the postmortem and video recording of the entire procedure. Police, however, denied any wrongdoing during custody. In-

spector General of Police (South Zone) Vijayendra S Bidari told *TNE* that all legal procedures were duly followed during the arrest. He was taken to TMCH around 5.50pm on July 17 for a detailed medical examination after his arrest and brought back to the police station to complete further legal formalities. "After being released on station bail, he collapsed again near the hospital and was admitted by his relatives," he claimed.

Arunachalam's kin, however, disputed the IG's version of events. Joint Action Against Custodial Torture (JAAC'T) coordinator Henri Tiphagne raised questions about the suspect being released on station bail hurriedly after collapsing inside the cell. "After the

postmortem report is available, we can further comment on that," he said.

DMK north district secretary Geetha Jeevan and AIADMK district secretary SP Shanmuganathan visited the bereaved family and consoled them. Demanding justice, Geetha Jeevan said that the case should be investigated properly. On the video clip showing Arunachalam collapsing inside the lock-up, she said that it cannot be accepted, as the clip is only eight seconds long and any-

thing could have happened before that, she said.

Thoothukudi MP Kanimozhi Karunanidhi, in a post on X, said, "As the CM, who holds the police portfolio, and other ministers had gone to watch a movie, is there a government today?" she asked.

THE Indian Medical Association's (IMA) Tamil Nadu branch has urged the state to let the alleged medical negligence case of a 10-year-old boy in Karaikudi run its legal course, rather than allow it to be settled through extrajudicial means using political pressure, after doctors told *TNE* that a senior ruling party leader had brokered a ₹50 lakh compensation deal between the boy's family and the doctors involved.

In a statement released on Thursday, the state IMA said it had received information that an influential ruling party functionary from Karaikudi convened a meeting between the two parties, following which the doctors were asked to pay a specified amount to the affected family. Though the doctors sought reasonable time to arrange the payment, the IMA said, they were reportedly directed to pay immediately, leaving them with no choice and the amount was paid accordingly. If these reports are accurate, the IMA said, it raises serious

concerns about due process, fairness and the rule of law, with the potential to set a dangerous precedent.

State IMA president Dr B Sridhar said the individual involved may have acted with the intention of helping the family, but called it an extrajudicial practice that, if normalised, would leave doctors unable to practise peacefully. "Instant justice outside of law will be delivered by every MLA and councillor who think they are helping the poor," he

said, urging the state to issue clear directions to its legislators and ministers that complaints must be routed through administrative and judicial channels alone.

In a video appeal that the boy's mother, Dhanalakshmi, made to CM C Joseph Vijay on July 14, she said her son had complained of itching in his private parts, and that a private hospital in Karaikudi had recommended a safe procedure to remove the penile foreskin and to which the family consented to. "But we don't know what happened, or if it was something wrong

that they did, he lost his penis. We protested, they only arrested us, but let the people who committed the mistake get away," she said. Based on the family's complaint, the Karaikudi North Police has booked two doctors and the health department has opened a separate inquiry. On Wednesday, Dhanalakshmi and her husband Meenakshi Sundaram released a follow-up video thanking the CM and Minister TK Prabhu. Attempts to reach the senior leader in question and Health Minister KG Arunraj were unsuccessful.
