Mysterious disease kills over 3 kids, hits 20 in Balaghat areas

Medical teams camps in the affected villages

A mysterious disease has spread in the Baiga-dominated villages of Baihar and Birsia tehsils in Balaghat district.

The disease afflicts the children who experience fever, body ache, and rashes

on their bodies. In the past 25 days, the disease affected a large number of children in Bodari, Machhurma, Limhoti, and Jalda villages.

Family members sent over 20 children to the district hospital, and three of them died. According to parents, they suffer from high fever, body ache, and red rashes on their bodies.

Baiga tribal families believe supernatural forces cause the disease, and they have sought faith healing.

When a resident of Bodari village, Chain Singh Markam, had his four-year-old son, Sachin, fall ill, they could not receive immediate medical attention due to a lack of ambulance service.

They somehow hired a vehicle to take the ailing child to the hospital, Markam said, adding that his condition remains critical.

Similarly, Chaitu Singh Dhurve from Lihoti village said he admitted his four-year-old son whose condition improved.

In the same way, a six-year-old girl from Lihoti village, Damini, got well and returned home from the hospital.

A resident from Jalda village admitted his children Anjali (nine), Varsha (three), and Anuraj (six) to the district hospital.

The husband of the Sarpanch of Machhurma village, Shriram Tilgam, claimed that the number of dead may have been higher than the

official figure. According to him, one died in Machhurma, one in Kundekasa, six in Matla, two in Bodari, and one in Limoti.

Chief medical and health officer (CMHO) Dr Paresh Uplab said the health department camped in the affected villages and provided medical aid.

The department will examine the facts about deaths and the shortage of ambulance services through field staff, he said.

11 LPG cylinders being used for business seized

A joint team of the food department and the district administration has seized 11 domestic LPG cylinders from the Chowpatty food market, Itarsi.

The officials carried out raids after a domestic cylinder exploded on the handcart of an egg seller in Itarsi Tehsil.

The incident put up a question mark on the food department's ability to check the use of domestic cylinder for commercial purposes.

The raid followed repeated complaints about the illegal use of domestic LPG cylinders at fast-food stalls and other



shops operating in the area.

The residents complained to the district administration about the use of domestic cylinders for commercial purposes. According to official sources, the team members took the seized cylinders into their custody and began the process for registering cases against the guilty. The food department also clarified that such surprise inspections would continue.

Teen killed, sister critically injured as car overturns on Bypass Road

BHOPAL: A 17-year-old boy was killed and his elder sister critically injured after the car they were travelling in overturned on Bypass Road in the Katara Hills area on Wednesday. The deceased was identified as Samarth Dubey, son of CM Dubey and a resident of British Park Colony on Bhojpur Road under the Misrod police station limits. His 20-year-old sister is undergoing treatment at a private hospital. According to police, Samarth was driving his sister to college when the accident occurred near Balaji Warehouse on Bypass Road. Preliminary investigation indicates that a truck suddenly came in front of the car. In an attempt to avoid a collision, Samarth reportedly swerved, causing the vehicle to lose control. The car hit the road divider and overturned. Both occupants suffered serious injuries and were rushed to a nearby hospital, where doctors declared Samarth dead. His sister remains in a critical condition.

Leopardess enters village with cubs

Sironj: A leopardess together with her cubs has entered a human settlement near the forest, causing fear among the residents. According to officials of the forest department a leopardess becomes dangerous when she moves with her cubs and can attack anyone. They advised the residents not to come out of their homes alone and use light. The officials found the pug marks of the leopardess and her cubs. Forest range officer Braj Meena said the employees of his department continued to search for the leopardess.

Congress demands end to power cut

Schore: The Congress has demanded the DISCOM to immediately stop power cut which has affected the students, farmers, and the daily life of the citizens.

The District Congress Committee, led by its president, Rajeev Gujarati and city unit president Ghanshyam Yadav, submitted a memorandum to the collector on Tuesday, highlighting three issues. The memorandum demanded an end to unscheduled power cuts in the district, the cancellation of the proposed Sulabh Complex construction inside Gandhi Park, and the immediate release of old-age pension payments pending for several months. According to the memoran-

dum, DISCOM has cut electricity for hours without prior notice across. This has adversely affected farmers, students, and the daily life of the citizens. The party demanded regular power supply and the removal of these additional surcharge. The memorandum described Gandhi Park as the city's major natural and historical public space, and the construction of a Sulabh Complex within the park would damage its beauty. The Congress urged the administration to stop the construction and relocate the project to another place. The District Congress Committee urged the administration to take prompt and effective action on all three demands.

Law college teachers, students remember Kargil martyrs

A newly wed 23-year-old woman committed suicide by hanging herself from the ceiling of her room in ward number five under the Kotwali police station late Monday night.

The suicide by the woman identified as Khushboo Sahu, who got married on May 6, 2026 with Ankit Sahu, raised many questions.

She returned from her parents' house with Ankit on Saturday. Her parents alleged that

the in-laws of Khushboo used to torture her for her failure to bring enough dowries.

According to her parents, her in-laws informed them about the illness of Khushboo.

When her parents reached her in-laws, they found her dead. The police reached the spot and sent the body of the woman for a postmortem.

An FSL team also visited the spot to collect evidence. Sub-divisional officer of police Satish Dwivedi said he would question her husband, and in-laws to arrive at a conclusion of her death.

54-year-old man found dead in hotel bathroom

The body of a sub-engineer was found under suspicious circumstances in the bathroom of a hotel under the City Kotwali police station on Tuesday. The police identified him Gaurav Dubey (54), a resident of Indrapuri, Bhopal.

After receiving information, the police reached the spot. The police said he may have died because of heart failure.

Police sent the body to the district hospital for a postmortem. The exact cause of death is under investigation,

the police said. According to police, the hotel room was locked from the inside, and Gaurav Dubey's phone rang non-stop. The hospital staff broke open the door in presence of the police officers.

Station House Officer (SHO) Roshanlal Bharti said he could confirm the actual cause of death after receiving the postmortem report. He worked on contract under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA).

According to police, Gaurav Dubey stayed in the hotel for 15 years.

Heritage conservation: MANIT to revive 400-year-old Khooni Bhandara

A team of experts from the Maulana Azad National Institute of Technology (MANIT), Bhopal, along with water management specialists, has launched an initiative to conserve and rejuvenate Burhanpur's historic Kundi Bhandara, also known as Khooni Bhandara.

The 400-year-old underground water management system was built by Abdul Rahim Khan-I-Khana during the Mughal era to supply drinking water from the Satpura range to Burhanpur and



nearby army camps.

At the initiative of the Direc-

torate of Archaeology, Archives and Museums, the technical team, led by Rutuja Chavan, assistant professor in the Civil Engineering Department at MANIT, conducted an extensive site inspection. The experts assessed the condition of the underground water system, evaluated its water flow mechanism and carried out preliminary studies to identify opportunities for technical restoration, structural improvement and rejuvenation.

Chavan said the assessment marked the first step towards the scientific conservation and revival of the Bhandara's

underground water structures and interconnected supply network. Based on the findings, a comprehensive technical survey, formal documentation and a detailed conservation roadmap will be prepared.

She said the initiative aims to scientifically understand the hydraulic mechanism of the Bhandara, preserve its historical authenticity and heritage value, and identify suitable engineering interventions for its sustainable revival. The project will subsequently move to detailed technical modelling, structural analysis and conservation work.

Further investigations are underway. In another incident, a newly-wed woman drowned in a well in Berasia area. According to reports, resident of Congress Nagar area Rehman Ali and some of his friends had gone to the pond at Newri area on Tuesday morning. Rehman went into the deep waters and started drowning. His friend immediately raised an alarm following some locals reached the spot. However, the boy had drowned by then. Nishatpura police reached the spot and called the divers to take out the body.
