

Tirap strengthens monsoon preparedness, unveils district disaster management plan

KHONSA, Jul 22: In a significant step towards strengthening disaster preparedness and expediting relief measures during the ongoing monsoon season, Tirap Deputy Commissioner Badonlum Tawsik, chaired the District Executive Committee (DEC) meeting at the Conference Hall of the Deputy Commissioner's Office, Khonsa, on Wednesday.

The meeting brought together administrative officers and Heads of Departments to review the flood and monsoon-related damages reported from across the district, assess the overall disaster situation, and chart out coordinated measures for restoration, relief and preparedness.

District Disaster Management Officer (DDMO) Emily Tingkhatra presented a comprehensive assessment of damages, covering losses to residential houses, public infrastructure and sector-wise im-



pacts reported by field officials. Heads of Departments from PWD, RWD, PHED, WRD, Agriculture, Horticulture, Food & Civil Supplies, Education, Power and other line departments briefed the committee on the extent of damages, restoration efforts already undertaken and the present status of essential public services.

Following detailed deliberations, the committee approved eligible pending compensation cases for disbursement in accordance with the prevailing SDRF/NDRF norms, subject to the availability of funds and completion of the prescribed formalities.

Addressing the officers, the Deputy Commissioner directed all departments to accord the highest priority to the restoration of essential services and critical infrastructure. He stressed the need to keep emergency response teams, manpower, machinery and other vital resources on standby throughout the monsoon period to ensure swift response to any eventuality.

The Department of Food & Civil Supplies was instructed to maintain adequate stocks of essential commodities to prevent supply disruptions, while the Public Health Engineering Department was di-

rected to ensure the timely restoration and uninterrupted supply of safe drinking water in all affected areas.

The Deputy Commissioner further instructed all Administrative Officers and Heads of Departments to regularly submit updated damage assessment reports, incident reports and geo-tagged photographs for consolidation and onward submission to the Government. Departments were also asked to maintain close coordination with the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) and promptly report any disaster or emergency situation to the District Emergency

Operations Centre (DEOC) for timely intervention.

A major highlight of the meeting was the official unveiling of the District Disaster Management Plan (DDMP) 2025-26 by the Deputy Commissioner. Copies of the Plan were distributed to all members present to serve as a guiding document for disaster preparedness, mitigation, response and recovery, while promoting greater inter-departmental coordination and institutional readiness across the district.

Emphasising that preparedness remains the key to minimising the impact of natural disasters, DC Badonlum Tawsik called for continuous monitoring of vulnerable locations, timely dissemination of early warning messages, seamless coordination among departments and prompt response to emergencies to safeguard lives and property during the ongoing monsoon season.

Seva Bharati Arunachal Pradesh organises free health camp at Naharlagun



NAHARLAGUN, Jul 22: The Seva Bharati Arunachal Pradesh (SBAP) organized a free health camp at Pachin village, Naharlagun in collaboration with the Regional Ayurveda Research Institute, (RARI) Itanagar on Tuesday.

Around 120 patients suffering from ailments like fever, cough and allergies, were treated at the camp, which was inaugurated by SBAP President Dr. Rinchin Dorjee Megeji in the presence of Sukamarn K.V. State coordinator Arunachal Shiksha Vikash

Samiti, and the other dignitaries.

Senior Research Fellow (Ayurveda) Dr. Joram Jayi and Dr. Tamchi Rohini conducted the camp. During the camps, patients were provided with free health check-up and medicines.

Sikkim tunnel collapse: 13 bodies retrieved so far

GANGTOK, Jul 22: Asphyxiation and burn injuries could be the reason for the death of the labourers who were working in a tunnel under construction, which collapsed two days ago in Sikkim's Namchi district, indicated the postmortem report of one of the deceased.

The body of one more worker was recovered from the NHPC Teesta Stage VI Hydropower Project tunnel on Wednesday during search operations, taking the number of bodies retrieved so far to 13, officials said.

Twenty-five workers were inside the tunnel which collapsed following an explosion suspected to have been caused by methane gas shortly after 1 pm on Monday.

"Out of those 25 trapped inside the tunnel, 20 are confirmed dead," Namchi Superintendent of Police (SP) Sonam D Bhutia said on July 21.

The postmortem report of one of the victims revealed that asphyxiation was the cause of the death, a medical officer of the STNM Hospital here said.

"The asphyxiation could

be due to methane gas which spreads quickly and does not give a chance to survive beyond 2-3 minutes," Additional Medical Superintendent (AMS) Dr Suresh Madan Rasaily said.

There were some wounds as well as burn injuries on the body, he said.

While wounds could have been caused by the rubble of falling debris, the burns might be the result of the explosion.

The senior medical officer said that four bodies were brought to STNM Hospital for postmortem and identification.

Eight bodies have been identified till Wednesday. Of them, four are from Jalpaiguri district of West Bengal while one each

from Punjab, Uttarakhand, Assam and Sikkim.

West Bengal Chief Minister Suvendu Adhikari on Wednesday announced in the assembly that Rs 5 lakh compensation for the next of kin of the deceased belonging to the state.

Efforts are on to establish the identity of the remaining bodies. Rasaily said that if required, DNA tests will be conducted to identify the bodies. (PTI)

TEZU, Jul 22: Kentu Lap, the first judoka from Arunachal Pradesh and the Mishmi community to win a medal at the Asian Cadets & Junior Judo Championships, was accorded a grand and emotional welcome on his arrival in Tezu on Tuesday.

Members of the Lap clan, student unions, well-wishers, relatives and sports



enthusiasts gathered at TCP near the Army Camp

to receive the young judoka with traditional scarves, bouquets and flower garlands in recognition of his historic achievement.

"It's a historic moment for the Mishmi community. We are immensely proud that Kentu has brought laurels to our community and the state," said a member of the Lap clan during the reception. Kentu Lap won the bronze medal in the Under-60 kg category at the Asian

Cadets & Junior Judo Championships, held in Amman, Jordan, from July 16 to 19. According to the Arunachal Judo Association (AJA), Lap displayed remarkable determination and skill throughout the tournament. He secured the bronze medal by defeating I. Shamsov of Tajikistan in the bronze medal bout.

With this achievement, Kentu Lap has etched his name in history as the first

judoka from Arunachal Pradesh and the first from the Mishmi tribe to win a medal at the prestigious Asian Cadets & Junior Judo Championships.
