

DRUG-LACED 'PRASAD' | Victim had approached self-styled tantrik over husband's alcohol addiction

Woman alleges 10-month sexual exploitation by tantrik

A woman has alleged that a self-styled tantrik sexually assaulted her after allegedly giving her a drug-laced ladoo as prasad while she had approached him seeking a remedy for her husband's alcohol addiction.

According to the complaint, the woman met the accused, identified as Kamal Patel, at Hanuman Temple

about a year ago. She allegedly began taking vibhuti from him and the accused later started visiting her home.

In October 2025, the accused allegedly visited her house with laddoos and told her they would help resolve her problems. The woman claimed she became unconscious after eating one of the laddoos, following which the accused allegedly raped her. She further alleged that

the accused threatened to defame her and kill her husband if she disclosed the incident. She claimed he subsequently continued to sexually exploit her, with the alleged last incident taking place on August 8, 2026. The woman told police that she remained silent for months because of Patel's alleged threats, fear for her husband's safety and social stigma surrounding the rape. She finally disclosed the al-

leged ordeal on Sept 6.

After informing her husband and friends, the woman approached police and lodged a complaint against Patel. Police subsequently registered a case and arrested him on Monday night.

Gwalior police station SHO said Patel had been arrested and was being questioned in connection with the case. Further investigation into the alleged sexual exploitation is underway.

Family protests after teenage girl dies during treatment at pvt clinic

A 17-year-old girl died after her condition suddenly deteriorated at a private clinic in Bhind on Tuesday, prompting a protest by her family and action by the district administration.

Jahnvi, a resident of Umri, had been suffering from fever and was undergoing treatment. On Tuesday morning, her family took her to a private clinic in Housing Colony. According to the family, the doctor was not present when they



arrived and Jahnvi's condition worsened soon after, including vomiting.

She was rushed to the trauma ward of the district hospital, where doctors de-

clared her dead.

Following the death, relatives protested outside the clinic, alleging negligence in treatment and demanding action against the doctor. Police and administrative officials reached the spot, after which SDM Akhilesh Sharma ordered the clinic to be sealed.

Officials said further action would be taken after the post-mortem report. The incident has raised questions over the availability of the treating doctor, emergency response and the standards of care at private clinics operating in the district.

Nine injured as bus overturns



Sheopur: Nine passengers were injured after a Balaji bus travelling from Sheopur to Gwalior lost control and overturned in Karahal valley around 4 pm on Tuesday.

Local people helped passengers get out of the bus and the injured were taken to hospital. They were identified as Loharte, Gopal, Baldev Singh,

Sunita, Motilal, Roshanlal, Priyanka, Harpal and Guddi. Some with minor injuries were discharged after first aid.

The driver fled after the accident. Karahal police reached the spot and started an investigation. Police are searching for the driver and collecting information from eyewitnesses and passengers.

Dog beaten to death

Bhind: A dog was allegedly beaten to death with sticks and its body dumped on the bank of Gauri Pond in Bhind. According to a police complaint, Anuj Shrivastava said Anant Sharma, president of Insaniyat Samiti, received a video of a dog being brutally beaten on Sept 8. Committee members reached Vankhandedwar temple and made enquiries. The complaint alleged that Shankar Kushwaha beat the dog with sticks and later tied its body with a rope before dumping it near Gauri Pond. The committee recovered the dog's body and informed police. City Kotwali police registered a case against unknown persons on Tuesday.

Car rams auto, leaves three injured

Three people were injured after a speeding car allegedly hit several vehicles and overturned an autorickshaw near the superintendent of police's office in the University police station area. CCTV footage shows the autorickshaw overturning after being hit by the car. Passersby helped the injured and rushed them to hospital for treatment. Bharat Singh Kushwaha was among the three injured.

Road accident victim's heir gets aid

Morena: Collector Lokesh Kumar Jangid has approved financial assistance of Rs 15,000 to Kamla, legal heir of Ramdutt Rathore, who died following a road accident. Ramdutt was allegedly hit by a speeding Swift car, bearing registration number MP-06-CA-5172, on Jauntai Bypass Road, Ambah, around 8 pm on Dec 26, 2025. He sustained serious injuries and was taken to Gwalior for treatment, where doctors declared him dead. The assistance was approved after the Porsa tehsildar filed a case and the Ambah sub-divisional officer (revenue) submitted a report. Kamla, a resident of Porsa town, will receive the relief from the designated budgetary fund.

Mayor questions BJP over censure motion

Kunwari River swells, 71 villagers of Ambah tehsil rescued

Continuous rain has worsened the situation in Morena district, with the rising water level of the Kunwari River creating a flood-like situation in several villages of Ambah tehsil.

In Jhinna Pura, 40 villagers trapped by floodwaters were rescued. Rescue teams braved challenging conditions to safely evacuate them.

Meanwhile, the situation in Madiya village of Ambah tehsil became critical due to the rising water level of the Kunwari River. Here, 31 people trapped in the water were safely rescued.



A total of 71 villagers were evacuated to safety during rescue operations at both locations. Timely action by the administration averted a major tragedy.

In view of the continuously rising water level, the administration has increased surveillance along riverbanks and in

low-lying areas. Administrative staff in sensitive villages are on alert, while teams are on standby for immediate relief and rescue operations if needed.

The administration has appealed to villagers to avoid going near rivers, streams and waterlogged areas.

Woman seeks police protection from family

Gwalior: A woman approached the Gwalior Superintendent of Police's office with her husband, seeking protection from her family and alleging that her parents were trying to marry her off to a man in exchange for Rs 3 lakh. Ankita Prajapati, in her complaint to the SP, alleged that her parents had accepted Rs 3 lakh and wanted her to marry a man who already has two children. She said that after informing her acquaintance Rahul Batham about the situation, the two decided to marry at an Arya Samaj temple.

Cattle get radium belts for safety

Lumpy skin disease hits cattle

Cases of lumpy skin disease (LSD) have been reported among cattle in several rural parts of Bhind district, raising concerns among livestock owners.

The district has around 1.25 lakh cattle, with the Animal Husbandry Department estimating that 2-3% are currently affected. Deputy Director Aneesh Sharma said the department is monitoring infected animals and has begun measures to contain the spread.

The department plans to vaccinate around 5,000 cattle in affected areas and has ad-



vised owners to isolate sick animals and report suspected cases to veterinary officials.

Villagers and cow-protection groups in areas such as Rawatpura Kalan have also reported severe cases and alleged deaths of some cattle. They have called for faster vaccination, treatment and door-to-door surveillance to prevent the disease from spreading further.

Milkman killed in bull attack

A milkman died after being attacked by a stray bull in Jabalpur. The horrifying Jabalpur bull attack, captured on CCTV, shows the animal goring and tossing milk vendor into the air before trampling him as he lay on the road. The milkman's death in Jabalpur has triggered panic among residents and renewed concerns over stray cattle on city roads.

The incident took place opposite Gate No.1 of Khhermai Temple under the Hanumanthal police station area Jabalpur.

According to information, the deceased, identified as Ravi Yadav was walking through the Khhermai area of Jabalpur after delivering milk when the bull suddenly attacked him.

CCTV footage of the Jabalpur bull attack shows Ravi Yadav, wearing a white shirt,

walking along the road when the bull charges towards him and strikes him with its horns.

The impact throws the Jabalpur milk vendor into the air before he crashes onto the road. The bull then moves forward and tramples Yadav as he lies on the ground following the stray cattle attack.

Ravi Yadav, son of Tulsiram Yadav, was a resident of the Tamerbhita area under the jurisdiction of Gora Bazar police station.

Woman duped of Rs 1.7L in investment fraud

A 27-year-old woman was duped of Rs 1.77 lakh in an online investment fraud through a Telegram trading group in New Kanchanpur area.

According to police, Mitali Yadav complained to Adhartal police that she was added to a Telegram group promising high profits on investments.

The fraudsters initially provided profits on smaller investments to gain her trust. Believing the platform to be genuine, Yadav subsequently transferred larger sums.

The fraudsters induced her to transfer a total of Rs 1,77,700 through multiple transactions. After realising she had been cheated, Yadav approached police. A cheating case was registered.

Auto vandalised with sticks, rods

Jabalpur: An auto was vandalised with sticks and rods in the Belbag police station area of Jabalpur. CCTV footage of the incident has surfaced.

Police said the incident appears to have been triggered by a mutual dispute. The suspects involved in the vandalism were identified on the basis of CCTV footage.

Fraudster dupes professor of Rs 79k

Jabalpur: A woman professor was duped of Rs 79,783 through multiple unauthorised transactions while she was away on a family trip. According to police, Deepti Dixit had travelled to Jagannath Puri, Odisha, with her husband, Dheeraj Dixit. After returning to Jabalpur, she was unwell and did not check her phone for several days. Later, she found multiple fraudulent debits from her Union Bank account. Police registered a cheating case against an unidentified person and initiated an investigation.

Women break shutter, steal auto parts

Jabalpur: Two women allegedly broke into Indira Automobile Pickpart Smart Garage at Tibude Complex in Vijay Nagar and stole automobile parts and aluminium scrap. CCTV footage shows the two suspects inside the garage, with one using a mobile phone light while stealing parts. The women had allegedly attempted to break the locks of two shutters before breaking the lock of one shutter and entering the garage.
