Caste returns to census...

Currently married, widowed, divorced and separated women will be asked for the number of children surviving at present, the number of children in the current marriage, and the number of children born alive in the last one year.

According to a gazette notification issued earlier this month, population enumeration in Lakshadweep is now bound non-synchronous areas of Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand, will take place from September 1 to 10. In the rest of the country, the population enumeration (PE) will begin next year. In January, the RGI had notified 33 questions for the first phase of Census 2027, covering housing, listing and household details. The questionnaire included a query on whether the head of the household belonged to the SC, ST or "other" category.

President promises ...

Highlighting the spirit of enterprise among young citizens, the said youths are increasingly embracing a culture of job creation rather than job seeking.

"Many of our youth are embracing the culture of job creation as they pursue the path of self-employment. The participation of young entrepreneurs has led to the creation of a strong start-up ecosystem in our country. Major global enterprises are impressed by the talent and dedication of Indian youth and entrust them with leadership roles," she added.

President Murmu also lauded the "unmatched valour" of the Indian Armed Forces, saying Operation Sindoor demonstrated the country's capability to execute precision counter-terror operations and sent a firm message that terror elements and their backers will face consequences regardless of where they hide.

She recalled the anniversary of the military operation alongside historic odes, waxes like Kargil Vijay Diwas, reaffirming India's tradition of overcoming forces hostile to humanity.

The President also highlighted the strategic measures accompanying the counter-terror posture, describing the decision to suspend the Indus Waters Treaty with the nation harbouring terror networks as a "decisive step in the interest of our nation, especially the farmers."

On internal security, she termed the eradication of Naxalism a monumental achievement for the country after decades of struggle. Highlighting the nation's civilisational heritage, the President said that Samarth, the site of Lord Buddha's first sermon, was included in the UNESCO World Heritage List this year, following the listing of 12 Maratha military forts last year.

Addressing foreign policy, she reiterated that peace, dialogue, cooperation, and the ideal of *Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam* (the world is one family) remain the bedrock of India's international relations.

The President also touched upon senior care, pointing out that alongside the world's largest young population, India is also seeing a rise in senior citizens and noted that about six crore senior citizens aged 70 and above can now avail of free healthcare services up to Rs 5 lakh per year under government initiatives, urging society to remain sensitive and uphold their dignity.

Airbus flags rare triple hydraulic failure...

The simultaneous failure of all three hydraulic systems was considered an unusual development and is now a central focus of the investigation. Airbus has not yet established what caused the systems to fail in such rapid succession. Hydraulic power is essential to the operation of the

A320's primary flight controls. The elevators control the aircraft's pitch, the ailerons control its roll, and spoilers alter lift and drag to help control the aircraft's speed and descent. Airbus said the A320's hydraulic systems are designed with redundancy, meaning the loss of one system would not normally cause a significant loss of flight control. The unusual feature of this incident was the near-simultaneous disruption of all three systems. But has not yet established why the three hydraulic systems were affected. The aircraft's autopilot subsequently disconnected as the flight-control systems were disrupted. The co-pilot, who was flying the aircraft, then pushed his side-stick forward after stall warnings were reportedly generated in the cockpit. A stall occurs when an aircraft's wings are no longer producing sufficient lift. In such a situation, pushing the nose down is a standard recovery action designed to reduce the angle of attack and restore airflow over the wings.

However, the co-pilot's control input initially produced no corresponding nose-down movement because the aircraft's hydraulic systems were unavailable. The aircraft's flight controls became responsive only after all three hydraulic systems recovered several seconds later. The findings provide the clearest indication so far of what happened during the critical seconds of the August 4 incident, but investigators are still examining the aircraft's systems, sensors, wiring, maintenance history and recorded flight data before determining the underlying cause.

The incident injured 24 people, with 17 requiring hospitalisation. The aircraft was carrying 137 passengers and eight crew members.

The manufacturer has asked Air India to conduct further inspections, including checks of the hydraulic systems, pressure sensors, switches and wiring. Recent maintenance involving the hydraulic systems is also being examined. Airbus has additionally asked for inspections for possible structural damage after the aircraft experienced forces above specified limits.

7 dead in Chamoli ...

He also visited the 12 injured workers admitted to a hospital in Chamoli.

The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP), police, and other technical and specialist teams are engaged in the search and rescue operation. Due to debris and water in the tunnel, the operation is being carried out with utmost caution and coordination. Garhwal range Inspector General of Police Rajiv Swaroop said that difficulties are being faced in the rescue operation due to continuous rain, but they are confident that the operation will be successful. The district minister, along with Garhwal MP Anil Balmi, is monitoring the rescue operation at the site. The DM has directed officials to ensure the effective use of all necessary resources and technical assistance to search for the missing people.

Basoya extradited

Reacting on the extradition Union Minister for Home Affairs, Amit Shah posted on X: "Modi Govt is relentlessly deep. He was hiding abroad and destroying their entire ecosystem with a ruthless approach. Virender Singh Basoya from the UAE. By tracing the criminal through a top-to-bottom and bottom-to-top approach, our agencies have once again proven that no matter where drug traffickers hide, they cannot escape the long arm of Indian law."

Investigators say 50-year-old Basoya, a businessman based in Dubai and originally from Delhi's Sarojini Nagar, allegedly funded and ran a transnational drug syndicate. In 2024, Delhi Police seized 1.289 kg of cocaine and 40 kg of hydropionic Thai marijuana. The drugs were reportedly smuggled through pharmaceutical companies in south India and Gujarat, using five real firms and three shell companies, and then sent as medicine packages to Delhi-NCR.

NIA seizes Punjab plots...

"By using anti-terror laws instead of regular crime statutes to target these assets, the NIA is making it clear that the financial side of narco-terrorism is now a main focus. The investigation is still ongoing, with attention on the remaining because the aircraft and sea links that have kept this network running for almost ten years", senior officials said.

What began as a small drug bust by Gujarat ATS in 2018 has now uncovered a complex international network that reaches Pakistan, Dubai, Italy, Australia, the UAE, Thailand, Iran, and Afghanistan. Pakistani fishing boats brought about 500 kg of high-purity heroin, worth 71,500 crore internationally, into the waters near Jakhau and Salaya between March and May 2018. From Gujarat, the drugs moved north to Punjab, where local groups stored, processed, and distributed them. The NIA says Dubai was the main handling centre. Pakistani dealers, especially Haji Saab, also known as Bhajjan, led the operation.

The NIA identified key overseas players, such as Simranjeet Singh Sandhu in Italy and Tanvir Singh Bedi in Australia, who managed logistics. Indian operatives took care of warehouses and hawala transfers, turning drug profits into funds for Let Anwar Masih managed the Punjab side of the network and was named in a 2022 chargesheet for distribution offences.

The Special Task Force (STF) of Punjab Police had already arrested Masih in 2020 for another case involving 194 kg of heroin linked to a processing facility in the same Akash Vihar area. Now, investigators have connected some assets to the larger terror-financing network, turning a local drug case into a national security issue.

This is the second major property seizure in this case this year. In June, the NIA seized a house in Amritsar's Holy City area linked to another suspect, Ankush Kapoor. So far, 26 people have been arrested, and several more chargesheets have been filed in Ahmedabad. The NIA has used its findings to put financial pressure on the network. However, leaders based in other countries remain free, showing how difficult it is to dismantle networks that span borders.

The children of 1947 remember the day...

The Chopra family boarded a train for Delhi, a journey that took a full week in those chaotic days. What awaited them was not relief but refugee camps and a new kind of struggle. The struggle to simply begin again.

For flourishing businessman, Jasbir Pal Singh, memories carry a different texture, though the fear runs just as deep. He was hiding abroad and destroying their entire ecosystem with a ruthless approach. Creating a new milestone in the policy of zero tolerance against narcotics, the NCB secured the return of fugitive drug kingpin

Muslim friends who quietly saved them. Those quiet bonds helped the family slip out of Peshawar and reach Dehradun. But safety brought its own battles. Jasbir knew only Urdu and Gurmukhi, languages that meant nothing in a Dehradun classroom. He struggled, along with an alphabet that refused to make sense. And then he topped his class.

For Tilak Raj Madan, the story of partition is not something he learned from history books. It is a story he heard from his father, Laxmi Chand, in the form of *Ioriyan* (bedtime stories and memories) that were passed down to him when he was young. Those stories began in a refugee tent near Kalkaji Mandir in south Delhi, where the family had arrived after losing almost everything in the Partition of India in 1947.

What may have sounded like a story before sleep was, in reality, the painful truth of a family uprooted from its home, separated from loved ones and forced to begin life again from nothing.

The Madan family originally belonged to Shorkot, Khanewal, in the Jhang-Migayana district, now in Pakistan. Before the partition, theirs was a settled and respectable life. Tilak Raj's father, Laxmi Chand, was engaged in the cotton business and also ran a popular sweet shop. The announcement of partition transformed that certainty into

fear and displacement. Almost overnight, a place that had been home for generations became a place from which the family was forced to flee.

Laxmi Chand left with his three brothers and three sisters, along with his wife, Krishnamawati. There was no a to gather everything they owned or to make plans for a new life. They had to leave behind their home, businesses, possessions, memories and the community that had shaped their lives.

They did not leave because they wanted to start afresh. They left because they had no choice. "We had everything in our village," Tilak Raj remembers with emotion his father told him the story of partition. Among the deepest wounds carried by the family was the separation from one of their sisters, who remained behind in Pakistan during the migration. For those who crossed the border, the journey to India meant leaving behind not only property but people. Some separations lasted years. Some lasted forever. Reaching India did not mean the suffering was over. The family arrived in Delhi as refugees and spent their early years around the Kalkaji Mandir area, living in a refugee camp. Seven members of the family, including their mother and three sisters, endured difficult conditions. They lived in tents and struggled for food and the basic necessities of life.
